Water Boards Act, 1904-1951. Bunbury Water Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Ex. Co. No. 688.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 113, subsection (5), of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1951, that where a water board does not comply with the requirements of any condition imposed pursuant to the provisions of subsections (2), (3) and (4) of the section, then by virtue of the provisions of subsection (5) the Governor's approval for a water board to borrow money for any of the purposes set out in subsection (1) of section 113 shall, unless the Governor orders otherwise he cancelled and the Governor orders otherwise, be cancelled, and if the whole or any part of the amount has been

borrowed, so much of that amount as remains unexpended shall not be used for any purpose other than such as the Governor in Council may, by further order direct; and whereas approval was given by the Governor in Order in Council dated the 24th day of October, 1950, and published in the Government Gazette on the 3rd day of November, 1950, for the borrowing by the Bunbury Water Board of the sum of twenty-four thousand pounds (£24,000) for the purpose of carrying out the works as shown in the Schedule to that Order in Council; and whereas the Board has not expended the total amount so borrowed and is desirous of expending the amount as remains unexpended: Now, there-fore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council hereby directs and consent of the Executive Council hereby directs that the amount as remains unexpended of the twenty-four thousand pounds (£24,000) borrowed by the Board shall be used for the purpose of the purchase and installation of one turbine type "Pomona" pump complete with 80 h.p. electric motor and starter, and all necessary fittings and accessories at No. 1 Pumping Station in Wittenoom Street, Bunbury.

Traffic Act, 1919-1952. Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G.D. 2661/52.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Order under the authority of section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1952, namely that the Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:

- (1) Clause (a) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads.
- (2) Clause (w) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the routes to be followed by all classes of traffic, or of any particular class of traffic or vehicle, from one specified point to another; either generally or between any specified times.
- (3) Clause (z1) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times.

Subject to the condition, that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has prior to notification of its making being published in the Government Gazette, been submitted to, and approved by the Governor.

Reserve Funds (Local Authorities) Act, 1950. Dumbleyung Road Board. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

HEALTH ACT, 1911-1952.
Bunbury Municipal Council.
Model By-laws—Part I.
Amendment of By-law No. 29.

Ex. Co. No. 702.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1952, a local authority may make or accept by-laws: Now, therefore, the Bunbury Municipal Council, being a local health authority and having adopted Model By-laws, Series "A," as published in

the Government Gazette on the 8th day of April, 1927, and amended from time to time thereafter, doth hereby amend the said adopted by-laws in the manner set forth hereunder:—

By adding after paragraph (d) of by-law 29 a new paragraph as follows:—

(e) Fowl houses of not more than 200 square feet in area, and not more than 6ft. in height may be erected at rear of dwellings, provided that the nearest portion of any run or yard is at least 30 feet from any building used or intended to be used as a dwelling.

Fowl houses of larger area may be erected if at a distance of at least 100ft. from any street and 100ft. from any dwelling, and at least 20ft. from the boundary of land not in the same occupation. These must be of fireresisting materials and the building shall not be more than 7ft. high.
