The currency of this Award shall be for three (3) years from the date hereof, excepting as otherwise prescribed in clause 24 and subject to amendment made pursuant to the provisions of Part XIII of the Mining Act.

5.—Scope.

- (b) The above rates are based on the basic wage of £12 0s. 6d. per week as fixed by the State Arbitration Court of Western Australia which took effect from midnight on 26th January, 1953, and represents £2 3s. 8 8/11d. per shift based on the standard of 11 shifts per fortnight. Such basic wage and rate per shift shall be automatically adjusted upwards or downwards in accordance with fluctuations in the basic wage, declared from time to time by the State Arbitration Court.
- (c) Workers other than welders employed on oxy-acetylene or electric welding plants shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per shift in addition to the ordinary rate of pay whilst so engaged.
- (d) A leading hand, when in charge of other employees, shall be paid the following rate in excess of the rate fixed for employees under his control.

7.—Special Rates and Provisions.

- (a) Water Money.—(i) Where in the course of his duties an employee's clothing becomes wet through no fault of his own, he shall be paid water money at 2s. 6d. per shift.
- (ii) A place shall not be considered a wet place unless the employee, as soon as possible, notifies the manager or his representative, who will have the place inspected as soon as practicable and arrive at a decision without reasonable delay.
- (iii) Where employees are called upon to work in places which are excessively wet, an amount not exceeding 3s. 6d. per shift additional may be paid to such employees concerned for the period of excessive wetness. The precise amount to be paid for such period may be determined by agreement between the parties; failing agreement the amount (if any) shall, within the limitation prescribed, be determined by the appropriate Board of Reference.

- (iv) Should any dispute arise in connection with water money, it shall in the first instance be dealt with by the manager or his representative and the employee or employees concerned; failing an agreement it shall be dealt with by the manager and the representative of the Union concerned, and in the event of them being unable to arrive at an agreement, the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference; in the meantime the employees shall continue to work.
- (b) Dirt Money.—Dirt money at the rate of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per shift shall be paid to all workers whilst engaged in stripping and replacing gear wheels of pumps and haulages which are covered with oil or grease; also stripping, repairing and replacing sprocket wheel of creeper chains and for work on creeper chains, screens, and coal conveyors, whilst in position and which are covered with oil or grease, and for work done inside crank-case engines and generally for all work of a similar nature where the parts are covered with oil or grease.

No dirt money shall be paid to blacksmiths or their assistants while they work in the shop, or to fitters and turners or assistants whilst working on the bench, lathes, or other machines.

- (c) Underground Work.—An employee who works underground on any day or part of a day on day, afternoon, night shift or otherwise, shall be paid an underground allowance of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.).
- (d) A blacksmith and his assistant shall each be paid an extra amount equal to one-eighth of the rate for a shift for their services on any day upon which they are required to shoe a horse or horses affected with greasy heels.
- (e) When more than one of the disabilities entitling a worker to extra rates exist in the same shift, the employer shall be bound to pay only one rate, namely, the highest, except when work is done in the sump involving the removal of the upper garments.
- (f) Damage to Clothing and Tools.—Compensation to the extent of the damage sustained shall be made where, in the course of the work, clothing or tools are damaged or destroyed by fire or molten metal, or through the use of corrosive substances: Provided that the employer's liability in respect of tools shall be limited to such tools of trade as are ordinarily required for the performance of the employee's duties.

8.—Higher Duties.

In the event of a worker being called upon to work in a grade higher than that in which he is usually employed, for more than two (2) hours in any one day, he shall be paid the higher rate for that day.

9.—Definitions.

(i) "Casual worker" means a worker whose engagement is terminated before the expiration of six (6) consecutive working days. In construing the term "working days," Sundays and holidays and all other days upon which workers under this Award do not usually work shall be excluded, except work which is actually done by the worker engaged, in which case such day shall count as part of the six (6) consecutive working days.

A casual worker shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed in clause 3.

(ii) A "lamp room mechanic" means a person who maintains and repairs electric safety lamps.(iii) "Tribunal" means the West Australian Coal Industry Tribunal.

10.—Hours of Duty.

Thirty-five (35) hours shall constitute a week's work in pay week and forty-two (42) hours in the back week. No day's work shall exceed seven (7) hours. If pay-Saturday is worked, five (5) hours shall constitute a full shift and shall be paid for as seven (7) hours. These hours shall be inclusive of crib-time. The starting time shall be such as may be mutually agreed upon between the applicant Unions and each of the respondent companies,

and in default of such agreement such time as may be decided by the Board of Reference constituted under clause 22 of the Award.

In the case of a worker being permanently employed underground, his time shall be computed from bank to bank. In the event of a shop hand being engaged on underground work of a casual nature, his time shall be computed from shop to shop.

11.—Overtime.

(a) All time worked in excess of or outside the ordinary working hours prescribed by this Award shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

for the first four hours and double time thereafter.

(b) When overtime work is necessary, it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that employees have at least seven consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

An employee who works so much overtime between the termination of his ordinary work on one day and the commencement of his ordinary work on the next day that he has not at least seven consecutive hours off duty between those times shall, subject to this subclause, be released after completion of such overtime until he has had seven consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

If on the instructions of his employer such an employee resumes or continues work without having had such seven consecutive hours off duty, he shall be paid at double rates until he is released from duty for such period, and he shall then be entitled to be absent until he has had seven consecutive hours off duty without loss of pay for ordinary working time occurring during such absence.

- (c) (i) All work performed on Sundays shall be paid at the rate of double time.
- (ii) For all work performed on a recognised holiday during hours which on a day other than a holiday would be regarded as ordinary hours of work without payment of overtime, shall be time and one-quarter in addition to a sum equal to the amount of the payment prescribed for an employee not required to work on a public holiday, and that where on such holiday an employee continues to work additional time outside such hours, he shall be paid for such additional time at the rate of double time on ordinary rates.
- (iii) An employee called to work on a Sunday shall be paid for at least four hours at ordinary rates. An employee called on to work on a recognised holiday shall be paid at least four hours at ordinary rates in addition to a sum equal to the amount of the payment prescribed for an employee not required to work on a public holiday.
- (d) An employee recalled to work overtime after leaving his employer's business premises (whether notified before or after leaving the premises) shall be paid for a minimum of three hours work at the appropriate rate for each day upon which he is so recalled; provided that, except in the case of unforeseen circumstances arising, the employee shall not be required to work the full three hours if the job he was recalled to perform is completed within a shorter period. This subclause shall not apply in cases where it is customary for an employee to return to his employer's premises to perform a specific job outside his ordinary working hours, or where the overtime is continuous (subject to a reasonable meal break) with the completion or commencement of ordinary working time.

Overtime worked in the circumstances specified in this subclause shall not be regarded as overtime for the purposes of subclause (b) of this clause where the actual time worked is less than three hours on such recall or on each of such recalls.

(e) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after the ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time he so holds himself in readiness. Provided that, in cases where the worker is notified that he will be required to commence work at a specified time, then he shall be paid at least three hours at overtime rates.

(f) For work done during his usual meal time and thereafter until a meal break is allowed, an employee shall be paid at overtime rates. An employee shall not be compelled to work for more than six hours without a break for a meal.

(g) An employee required to work overtime in excess of two hours after the completion of a shift shall be allowed at least 30 minutes for a meal without deduction of pay, and unless notified the previous day that he will be required to work overtime shall either be supplied with a meal by the employer or be paid four shillings in lieu thereof, provided that this payment need not be made to an employee who can reasonably go home for a

After each four hours of such overtime following a meal break, an employee shall be allowed a further 30 minutes without deduction of pay, and either be supplied with a meal by the employer or be paid four shillings in lieu thereof.

12.-Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as paid holidays:—New Year's Day, Australia Day (January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day (June), Christmas Day, Boxing Day or any day, excepting Easter Saturday, when such holiday falls on a back Saturday, observed by the public in Western Australia in lieu thereof, together with all other days gazetted from time to time as public holidays which are observed generally by the public in Western Australia: Provided that any employee who without good and sufficient reason fails to work on the working day immediately preceding a holiday or the first working day following such holiday. Easter Saturday, when such holiday falls on a back Saturday, shall be deemed to be an unpaid holiday.

Saturday, when such holiday falls on a back Saturday, shall be deemed to be an unpaid holiday.

(b) Each worker shall be entitled to 16½ days' annual leave on full pay at his rate of wages per shift payable at the time he takes such holiday; provided that the worker has worked the full number of shifts which his mine has worked for the production of coal and which he would have normally worked during the preceding 12 months, and should he have worked less than the said number of shifts when the said holiday is taken, or at the termination of his employment, he shall receive or be paid for a proportionate number of holidays; provided, further, that where the worker is dismissed for wilful misconduct, he shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this subclause. Annual holidays for each year shall be granted and taken between 1st October and 30th April next ensuing.

(c) (i) Shifts lost on account of compensatable accidents sustained during the course of employment (not exceeding one month at a time) shall be regarded, for the purpose of calculation of the extent of annual leave, as shifts of actual attendance during those days for which the mine has worked for the production of each

worked for the production of coal.

(ii) Shifts lost by an employee through absence on paid sick leave, or shifts lost by a Union official bona fide absent from his employment with the permission of the management to attend to Union business, shall be regarded for the purpose of this clause as shifts worked.

(d) Any employee not required to work on a recognised holiday who changed his employment from one employer to another after the working day immediately preceding but before the first working day following such holiday shall, subject to provisions of subclause (a) hereof, receive payment for such holiday from the employer by whom he is employed on the first working day following the holiday, and the said employer shall have the right to recover from the employer by whom the employee was employed on the working day immediately preceding the holiday 80 per centum of the amount of the payment made to the employee.

(e) An employee not required to work on a recognised holiday who through the operation of Mine Workers' Pensions Legislation is required to vacate his employment after the working day immediately preceding but before the first working day following such holiday, shall be entitled to payment for such holiday unless without good and sufficient reason he fails to work on the working day immediately preceding the holiday.

13.—Sick Leave.

As from the first day of September, 1947, any employee who is absent from his work with an employer on account of personal illness, or on account of injury sustained without his own default or wilful act, shall be entitled to paid leave of absence subject to the following conditions and limitations: limitations:

(a) Each worker shall be entitled to sick leave on full pay on the basis of one day for each com-

pleted month of service.

(b) Where a worker has worked less than the full number of shifts which his mine has worked for the production of coal, he shall be allowed to accumulate sick leave only on the proportion of days worked by him to the number of days worked by the mine for the period over which the sick leave has accumulated.

(c) Leave allowable under this clause which is not availed of by an employee during the time it accrues shall be allowed to accumulate to a period

of 60 days.

- (d) Any sick leave taken shall be deducted from the sick leave accumulated, the balance, if any, remaining to the credit of the employee and to commence to accumulate again upon his resumption of work.
- (e) Where practical, within 24 hours, but not later than 72 hours of the commencement of such absence, the employee shall inform the employer of his inability to attend for duty and, as far as practicable, state the nature of the injury or illness and the estimated duration of the absence.
- (f) The employee shall prove to the satisfaction of his employer (or in the event of a dispute, of the appropriate industrial authority) that he was unable on account of such illness or injury to attend for duty on the day or days for which sick leave is claimed.
- (g) An employee shall not be entitled to paid sick leave of absence for any period in respect of which he is entitled to workers' compensation.
- (h) The employee shall be paid for each day of leave allowable under this clause at the appropriate rate for his class of work or, in the case of a contract miner, the minimum rate for his grade.
- (i) For the purpose of calculation of sick leave, any absence from work on account of annual leave as prescribed in clause 9 hereof shall be regarded as shifts of actual attendance.
- (j) Provided that any employee who changes his employment and maintains continuity of em-ployment in the Coal Mining Industry shall only be entitled to credit by his new employer of up to five days for leave accumulated but not availed of by him in his former employment.

14.—Shift Work.

(a) For all time worked on afternoon or night

cent. shall be added to ordinary rates.

(b) For all time worked on afternoon or night shift by employees on other than continuous work, 10 per cent. shall be added to ordinary rates.

(c) An employee who-

(i) during a period of engagement on shift works night shift only; or

(ii) remains on night shift for a longer period

than four consecutive weeks; or
(iii) works on a night shift which does not rotate or alternate with another shift, or with day work so as to give him at least one-third of his working time off night shift in each shift cycle,

shall during such engagement period or cycle be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for all time worked during ordinary working hours on such night shifts.

(d) If an employee who ordinarily works on day shift only is required to work on at least three successive working days, he shall be paid at overtime rates for the first afternoon or night shift he works and thereafter he shall be paid in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this clause for such other shifts. If such employee be required to work shift work for a period less than three consecutive working days, overtime rates shall be paid for such afternoon or night shift

work unless such overtime be caused by the failure of any other employee to come on duty at the proper time.

proper time.

(e) For all work done on afternoon or night shift at open cut workings in the State of Western Australia an employee who by virtue of subclause (b) of this clause is entitled to a shift allowance of 10 per cent. shall in addition to that allowance be paid at the rate of 2s. per shift for all work done on afternoon shift and for all work done on might shift at the rate of 4s per shift. night shift at the rate of 4s. per shift.

15.—Existing Custom and Conditions.

This Award is based on existing custom and conditions not inconsistent with this Award.

16.—Reduction of Hands.

In the event of a reduction of hands at a mine. In the event of a reduction of names at a name, the last worker employed in the particular class of work shall be the first to be dismissed, but this provision shall not apply to any worker dismissed for gross misconduct or refusal to obey lawful orders, or for incapacity, the proof of which, if disputed, shall lie upon the employer. If a worker has been shifted from one class of work to another. has been shifted from one class of work to another, then his length of service for the purpose of determining seniority shall be deemed to date from the last time he signed on at the mine during his current period of employment.

17.-Record Book.

A record or time book shall be kept by each employer, in which record or time book shall be entered the name of each worker, the nature of the work he is doing, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages earned by him each fortnight; the said record or time book shall be open to the inspection of the accredited representative of the Union at any time during the working hours; and he shall be allowed to take necessary extracts therefrom.

18.—Preference.

All workers under this Award must be members of one of the Unions mentioned therein. All workers engaged by the employer shall make application to become members of one of the Unions within three (3) weeks of their engagement. The Union shall accept them as members, provided that they are persons of good character and tender the entrance fees and subscriptions in accordance with the rules of the Union.

Provided that this shall not oblige where its rules so provide, to accept as a tradesmanmember anyone other than a person who has duly served his time as an apprentice or is otherwise considered to be a competent tradesman.

Provided, further, that this clause does not apply where temporary assistance is being rendered by a member of the Miners' Union to workers provided

for under this Award.

19.—Absence from Duty.

In the event of a worker being absent from work through any cause, he shall notify the manage-ment on the day prior to his intended resumption that he is returning to his work the following day. Failing such notification, there shall be no obligation on the part of the management to provide him with work for the day on which he returns, if the employer is under an obligation to pay another worker for such day.

20.—Deductions from Wages.

The employer may deduct from the worker's wages the amounts agreed upon on account of contributions for medical benefits, contributions to the Accident Relief Fund and the Aged and Infirm Coal Miners' Superannuation Fund, and any other contribution agreed to by both parties.

21.—Pay Day.

The wages shall be paid to all workers on every alternate Friday.

22.—Board of Reference.

Board of References to be appointed in accordance with section 322 of the Mining Act.

23.—Apprentices.

(a) The employer taking an apprentice or probationer shall, within fourteen (14) days thereafter register such apprentice or probationer, by giving notice thereof to the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration on the prescribed form. A probationary period of three (3) months previous to being bound shall be allowed. Such probationary period to be deemed part of the apprenticeship.

(b) The number of apprentices allowed to the employer shall be in the proportion of one apprentice to three (3) or part of three (3) tradesmen employed by him on the particular branch of work. The term of apprenticeship shall be five (5) years. Apprenticeship shall not commence before apprentice is fifteen (15) years of age.

(c) Should the employer, from unforeseen circumstances, be unable to carry out his obligations to his apprentice, he shall be allowed to transfer the apprentice to complete his term of apprenticeship to another employer, but it shall be encumbent on the former employer to notify the Clerk of the Court of Arbitration of the date of the said transfer on the prescribed form. It shall not be obligatory upon the employer to find the appren-It shall not tice another employer if he shall so misconduct himself as to entitle the employer to discharge him. When an apprentice cannot be usefully employed because of a strike, the employer shall be relieved

of his obligations under the apprenticeship contract during the period of the strike.

(d) Slackness of work may form a proper ground of transferring an apprentice to an employer willing to take the responsibility of teaching him. When an apprentice is discharged, notice in the prescribed form attached hereto shall be given to the Clark of the Court of Arbitration

Clerk of the Court of Arbitration.

(e) (i) The rates of pay for apprentices shall be as under:-

The wartime loading is not adjustable in accordance with any rise or fall in the basic wage.

Provided that where an apprentice is 21 years of age or over at the commencement of his fifth year, he shall be paid the full basic wage and that when an apprentice becomes 21 years of age in the course of his fifth year he shall be paid the full basic wage for the period following his 21st birthday: Provided, further, that the fore-going provisions shall not apply where the appren-ticeship has been revived under the Re-establish-ment and Employment Act, 1945, and the apprentice is in receipt of the tradesmen's rate through Government supplementation.

(ii) Apprentices employed on afternoon or night shift shall be covered by the shift work conditions

set out in clause 10.

(f) Every apprentice shall be bound to attend such classes at the Technical School or continuation of classes, as are provided for in his trade.

(g) The period during which apprentices are to attend such Technical School or classes shall be four (4) hours per week, if instruction is available: Provided, if technical instruction is not available in Collie and is available by correspondence at reasonable cost, to be approved by the Court, the Court may prescribe such correspondence course as the technical instruction to be taken by the apprentice and paid for by the employer.

(h) Every apprentice shall be bound to submit himself to examination at the places and times

prescribed by the Court.

(i) Every apprentice shall, prior to submitting himself to examination, produce to the examiners a certificate that he has made at least 70 per cent. of attendances at the Technical School or other place of instruction, unless he is exempted from such attendance for good cause.

(j) The Clerk of the Court shall notify the examiners of the names and addresses of the

apprentices required to submit themselves to

examination.

- (k) The employer shall place at the disposal of the examiners such materials and machinery on his premises as may be required by them, and shall in all ways facilitate the conduct of the examinations.
- (1) The Board of Examiners shall consist of persons skilled in the industry. It shall comprise equal numbers of representatives nominated by the employers and workers in the particular trades. Failing such nomination or nominations, the Court may appoint such person or persons as it may deem fit. In the event of a disagreement between the examiners the matters in dispute shall be referred to a third person agreed to by them or nominated by the Court or the President, at the request of any of the examiners, and the decision of such person shall be final and conclusive.
- (m) It shall be the duty of the examiners to examine the work, require the production of the examine the work, require the production of the certificate of attendance, inquire into the diligence of each apprentice, and as to the opportunities provided by the employer for each apprentice to learn and submit a report to the Court in writing as to the result of the examination within one (1) month from the date of holding the examination, but this period may be extended by the Court.
- (n) Such examinations shall, where include theory and practice as applied to the trade, industry, craft, occupation or calling to which the apprentice is indentured.
- (o) The Registrar shall, after the examination, issue a certificate to each apprentice indicating his degree of proficiency, taking into consideration the term of apprenticeship served. A duplicate of such certificate shall be lodged by each apprentice with his employer and the Secretary of the Union each of whom shall keep the same in safe custody and produce the same for inspection by the Industrial Inspector whenever demanded by the latter to do so. When the final examination has been passed, the certificate shall be signed by the examiners.
- (p) The examiners shall each be entitled to the following fees, namely, for every five or fraction of five (5) apprentices examined, two guineas, with a minimum fee of three guineas per day, and a maximum fee of four guineas per day, providing further that the fee for conducting a special examination approved by the Registrar shall be one guinea for each apprentice examined which the Registrar may direct to be paid by the apprentice or the Union concerned.

In addition to the foregoing fees, where examiners in the performance of their duties as such are required to travel, they will be entitled to reimbursement of all fares and necessary expenses actually incurred, particulars of which must be submitted and approved by the Registrar before payment is made.

- (q) Whenever it is possible to do so, the examiners, before entering upon the examination following the issue of these Regulations, shall draw up a syllabus showing what, in their opinion, is the state of proficiency which an apprentice should attain at each of the examinations prescribed. The syllabus shall be subject to review by the Court at any time, and shall be kept as a record by the Clerk of the Court and a copy handed to the examiners before each examination. The said syllabus may be subject to alteration from time to time by the examiners, who shall forthwith notify the Clerk of the Court thereof.
- (r) In lieu of the Board of Examiners above referred to, the Court may appoint in substitution thereof, wholly or partly, examiners to be appointed by the Director of Technical Education for the whole or any portion of the subjects of instruction.
- (s) Apprentices shall be allowed to the following trades:—(i) Fitter and turner; (ii) machinist; (iii) blacksmith; (iv) electrical fitter; (v) millwright; (vi) welder.
- (t) The employer shall pay the apprentice for all time lost through sickness or the holidays prescribed by this Award, provided-
 - (i) payment for such sickness shall not exceed a total of one (1) month in each year;

- (ii) where the time lost through sickness exceeds four (4) consecutive working days, the employer may demand from the apprentice the production of a medical certificate and a further certificate or certificates may be required if any time is lost through sickness within seven (7) days from the date of resumption of duty, the cost, if any, of such certificate of certificates not exceeding five shillings (5s.) to be borne by the employer;
- (iii) an apprentice shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident, not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident or sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (u) In the event of, and whilst work is not available, for an apprentice in the calling to which he is bound, he may be employed in some other occupation connected with this Award during such period; provided, however, that this provision shall not be deemed to authorise any action on the part of the employer that might jeopardise the training of the apprentice in his proper calling.
- (v) The training of apprentices to blacksmithing, fitting and turning shall include in their fourth and fifth years, instruction in electric welding and/or oxy acetylene welding as far as is practicable with the facilities available in the shop in which they are trained.

The provisions of clause 6 (c) of this Award shall not apply to apprentices while they are receiving such instruction.

24.—Attendance Allowance.

- (1) Each member of the Amalgamated Engineering Union of Workers, Collie Branch, and the Australasian Society of Engineers, Collie River Districts Branch, who works for the eleven award working days comprising a pay period shall, in respect of that period, if the Colliery at which he works has been in production on each of the eleven ordinary working days, be entitled (in addition to his ordinary earnings) to payment as for a shift at the appropriate rate for him.
- (b) Each member of the Amalgamated Engineering Union of Workers, Collie Branch, and the Australasian Society of Engineers, Collie River Districts Branch, who is absent from work for a portion of a pay period on paid sick leave or on workers' compensation, but who works on all other award working days during the said period shall, in respect of that period, if the colliery at which he works has been in production on each of the eleven ordinary working days of the pay period, be entitled (in addition to his ordinary earnings) to payment of one-eleventh of a shift at the appropriate rate for him for each day worked by him.
- (2) (a) Where during a pay period the colliery has been out of production through the occurrence of a recognised holiday, a mechanical breakdown, a fire, a flood or through a strike by members of another Union, subject to it having worked for the production of coal on all other ordinary working days during the said period, each member of the Amalgamated Engineering Union of Workers, Collie Branch, and the Australasian Society of Engineers, Collie River Districts Branch, who on all of the award working days comprising the said pay period attends for work and is available to perform such work as the management may reasonably require, shall be entitled in respect of that period (in addition to his ordinary earnings) to payment of one-eleventh of a shift at the appropriate rate for him for each production day worked by him.
- (b) Where during a pay period the colliery has been out of production through the occurrence of a recognised holiday, a mechanical breakdown, a fire, a flood or through a strike by members of another Union, subject to it having worked for the production of coal on all other ordinary working days during the said period, each member of the Amalgamated Engineering Union of Workers, Collie Branch, and the Australasian Society of Engineers, Collie River Districts Branch, who is absent from

work for portion of the said pay period on paid sick leave or workers' compensation, but who on all other award working days of the said period attends for work and is available to perform such work as the management may reasonably require, shall be entitled to in respect of that period (in addition to his ordinary earnings) to payment of one-eleventh of a shift at the appropriate rate for him for each production day worked by him.

(3) This clause shall be deemed to have commenced to operate on and from the beginning of the pay period current on 3rd May, 1951, and shall remain in force until further order.

HAVING heard Mr. V. Ulrich on behalf of the applicant and Mr. A. S. Cowan on behalf of the respondents and by consent, I, the undersigned, Conciliation Commissioner of the Court of Arbitration, in pursuance of a remission to me by the Court of Arbitration and in pursuance of the powers contained in section 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, do hereby order and declare that Award No. 41 of 1947, as amended, be and the same is hereby further amended in the manner following:—

(1) Clause 1—Scope is amended as follows:—By deleting the clause and inserting a new clause as follows:—

This Award shall apply to all Local Authorities (the City of Perth Municipality, The Kalgoorlie Municipality, Boulder Municipality, City of Fremantle Municipality and Kalgoorlie Road Board excepted) throughout the State of Western Australia.

- (2) Clause 3—Definitions, subclause (e) be amended by deleting subclause (e) and inserting a new subclause as follows:—
 - "Local Authority" shall mean any Municipality (the City of Perth, Kalgoorlie, Boulder and City of Fremantle Municipalities excepted) Road Board (Kalgoorlie Road Board excepted) Health Board, Water Board, Vermin Board or Drainage Board.
- (3) Liberty to apply is granted in respect of any further amendment to Clauses 1 and 3.
