## PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1952.

Prices Control Order No. 870.

Imported Onions—Sales by Wholesale.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 870.

2. Prices Control Order No. 684 is hereby amended by omitting paragraph 4 thereof and inserting in its stead the following:—

## Maximum Wholesale Prices.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which imported onions may be sold by any person by wholesale to be—

- (a) in respect of any sale of such onions ex wholesaler's store—50s. 1½d. per cwt.;
- (b) in respect of any sale of such onions delivered free on rail by the wholesale seller—50s. 7½d. per cwt.;
- (c) in respect of any sale of such onions delivered by the wholesale seller to a retailer's store—50s. 10½d. per cwt.

## PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1952.

Prices Control Order No. 871.

Portland Cement (Grey).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 871.

2. Prices Control Order No. 776, as amended by Prices Control Orders Nos. 839, 842 and 856, is hereby further amended by omitting the First Schedule thereto as amended and inserting in its stead the Schedule to this Order.

## The Schedule.

Prices Control Order No. 872.

## Safety Matches.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

## Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 872.

## Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 735 is hereby revoked.

## Definitions.

3. In this Order—

“Perth Metropolitan Area” means all that area comprised within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office at Perth;

“Albany area” means all that area comprised within a radius of five miles from the principal post office at Albany.

## Sales by Manufacturers.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which safety matches may be sold by any manufacturer thereof or his agent to be the price fixed by me by notice in writing to such manufacturer or agent.

## Sales by Wholesale by Persons other than Manufacturers.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which safety matches may be sold by wholesale by any person other than the manufacturers thereof or such manufacturer's agent to be 20s. 3d. per gross. Provided that where such safety matches are sold from stock purchased from the manufacturer thereof or such manufacturer's agent in “loose” gross packages, then the maximum price specified in the previous provisions of this paragraph shall be reduced to 20s. 2d. per gross. Provided, further, that where payment of the purchase price of such safety matches is made—

- (i) before delivery, on delivery, or not more than 10 days from the date of delivery, such maximum price shall be reduced by 3 per centum thereof;
- (ii) more than 10 days after delivery, but not later than the last day of the calendar month following the month during which delivery is made, such maximum prices shall be reduced by 2½ per centum thereof;
- (iii) at any time during the second calendar month following the calendar month during which delivery is made, such maximum price shall be reduced by 1¼ per centum thereof.

6. The maximum prices fixed by the previous provisions of this Order for the sale of safety matches are maximum prices for the sale of safety matches, inclusive of delivery, as follows:—

- (a) Where the purchaser's place of business is situated within the Perth Metropolitan Area—delivery “free into purchaser's store.”
- (b) Where the purchaser's place of business is not situated within the Perth Metropolitan Area—delivery “free on rail” or “free on wharf” within the Perth Metropolitan Area.

7. I fix and declare the maximum price at which safety matches may be sold by wholesale by any person other than a manufacturer or manufacturer's agent on any other terms of delivery than those specified in paragraphs 5 and 6 of this Order, to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to such person and until such notice in writing aforesaid is given the maximum price at which any safety matches shall be sold by wholesale by such person shall be 18s. 4d. per gross.

## Sales by Retail.

8. I fix and declare the maximum price at which safety matches may be sold by any person by retail to be—

- (a) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated within the Perth Metropolitan Area or Albany area—

- (b) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated South of the 26th parallel of South latitude and in other than the Perth Metropolitan Area or Albany Area—

- (c) in respect of sales by any person whose place of business is situated North of the 26th parallel of South latitude—

## Discounts.

9. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order, where a seller of safety matches has customarily allowed any difference in price—

- (a) to any person or to persons included in any class of persons;
- (b) in respect of sales of certain quantities of safety matches; or
- (c) in respect of sales of safety matches under certain conditions of sale, or upon certain terms of payment, the maximum price fixed by or under this Order in respect of those safety matches shall, in the case of sales to any such person or persons, or of such quantities, or under such conditions, or upon such terms of payment, be reduced by the allowance of that difference.

## Exhibition of Price List.

10. Every person who sells or has for sale by retail safety matches the maximum price of which is fixed by or under the provisions of this Order, shall exhibit in a prominent position in his place of business, or if he has more than one place of business, in each of his places of business, and in such manner as to be easily legible to persons contemplating making any purchase or conducting any business at his place or places of business, particulars of the maximum prices fixed by or under the provisions of this Order for the sale by him of those safety matches.

## Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

11. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any safety matches specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.
