Barker, more particularly described as reserve No. 22492 and defined in the Schedule to such Proclamation to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said reserve: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by section 11 of the Native WHEREAS it is enacted by section 11 of the Native that behalf conferred by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted), do hereby abolish the Reserve for Natives as declared

and defined in the herein beforementioned Proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 11th day of January, 1946, as aforesaid.
