WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Workers' Compensation Act Amendment Act, 1924, that the Governor may, by Proclamation, limit the operation of section 8 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, so far as it extends to the diseases mentioned in the first column of the Third Schedule set opposite the words "Mining, or quarrying, or stone crushing or cutting" as the description of process to any defined portion of the State,

and may, by any subsequent Proclamation extend the operation as aforesaid of section 8 to any other defined portion of the State; and whereas by Proclamations published in the *Government Gazette* on the 30th January, 1925; 27th February, 1925; 4th June, 1926; 11th June, 1926, and the 24th December, 1926, the operation of section 8 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952 so far as it extends to the diseases mentioned in the first column of the Third Schedule set opposite the words "Mining, or quarrying, or stone crushing or cutting" as the description of process was limited to certain defined portions of the State: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim that the operation of section 8 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, so far as it extends to the diseases mentioned in the first column of the Third Schedule set opposite the words "Mining, or quarrying, or stone crushing or cutting" as the description of process shall extend to the whole of the State other than the area of the Collie River Mining District as constituted under the Mining Act, 1904-1952.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corres. No. 7084/50.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1950, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor by Order in Council to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 23206 (Wongan Hills Lot 1) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to the Wongan-Ballidu Road Board to be held in trust for the

purpose of an Infant Health Clinic: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall be granted in fee simple to the Wongan-Ballidu Road Board to be held in trust for the purpose of an Infant Health Clinic, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 1765/52.

HIS Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order under the authority of section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1952, namely that the Koorda Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:—

(1) Clause (a) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads.

(2) Clause (v) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting the use of any specified road by any vehicle, or by any person riding, driving, or in charge of any vehicle, except when proceeding in a prescribed direction.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has, prior to notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.
