PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1952.

Prices Control Order No. 877.

Bran, Pollard, Flaky Bran, Ground Wheat,
Branato and Pollato.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 877.

2. Prices Control Order No. 775, as amended by Prices Control Order No. 789, is hereby further amended by omitting the Second and Third Schedules thereto and inserting in their stead respectively the First and Second Schedules to this Order.

The First Schedule.

(New Schedule—The Second Schedule—Prices Control Order No. 775 as amended by Prices Control Order No. 789 and now by this Order further amended.)

Retail Margins for Sale of Bran, Pollard, Flaky Bran, Ground Wheat, Branato or Pollato in Places South of the 26th Parallel of South Latitude.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1952.

Prices Control Order No. 879.

Prepared Stock and Poultry Foods.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 879.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 722 is hereby revoked.

Definitions and Interpretations.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

“bushel” means 20 lb.;

“ton” means 2,000 lb.;

“Perth Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office, Perth;

“cost of transport” in relation to any sale of any prepared stock or poultry food, means the cost of transport actually incurred and properly attributable to transporting such food: Provided that such cost of transport shall not be allowed unless it is recorded on an invoice for the food delivered to the seller;

"point of delivery" means, in relation to the sale of prepared stock or poultry food by any person, the place at which liability for payment of transport charges passes to the purchaser from the person from whom such food was purchased;

"by wholesale" means, in relation to any sale of prepared stock or poultry food, that such prepared stock or poultry food is sold to the purchaser for the purpose of resale and shall also be deemed to apply to sales to users who purchase at each delivery a total of not less than one ton;

"by retail" means, in relation to any sale of prepared stock or poultry food, that such sale is not a sale by wholesale as defined in the preceding clause of this paragraph;

"cost per ton into store" means the price paid or payable per ton for the prepared stock or poultry food, plus the cost of transport from the point of delivery to the seller to the seller's store;

"cost per bushel into store" means the price paid or payable per bushel for the prepared stock or poultry food, plus the cost of transport from the point of delivery to the seller to the seller's store.

Maximum Wholesale Price.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which prepared stock or poultry food may be sold by wholesale to be the sum of—

- the cost per ton into store of the wholesale seller and
- (i) where sold ex store, the margin specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per ton into store, or
 - where delivered to the purchaser's premises or free on rail or free on wharf, the margin specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per ton into store, plus 12s. 6d. per ton, or
 - where delivered free on board ship, the margin specified in the second column of the First Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per ton into store, plus 22s. 6d. per ton.

Maximum Retail Price—Bag Lots.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which prepared stock or poultry food may be sold by retail in bag lots to be the sum of—

- the cost per bushel into store of the retail seller, and
- (i) where sold ex store, the margin specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per bushel into store;
- where delivered to the purchaser's premises, or free on rail or free on wharf, the margin specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per bushel into store, plus 1½d. per bushel;
- where delivered free on board ship, the margin specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per bushel into store, plus 2½d. per bushel.

Maximum Retail Price—Less than Bag Lots.

6. I fix and declare the maximum price at which prepared stock or poultry food may be sold by retail in less than bag lots to be the sum of—

- the cost per bushel into store of the retail seller, and
- the margin specified in the third column of the Second Schedule to this Order, according to the cost per bushel into store, irrespective of the point of delivery.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

7. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which any prepared stock or poultry food specified in a notice given in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as fixed by the Commissioner by notice in writing to that person.

PRICES CONTROL ACT, 1948-1952.

Prices Control Order No. 880.

Whole Wheat.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Prices Control Regulations, 1949, I, Constantin Paul Mathea, Prices Control Commissioner, hereby make the following Order:—

Citation.

1. This Order may be cited as Prices Control Order No. 880.

Revocation.

2. Prices Control Order No. 675, as amended by Prices Control Orders Nos. 783, 790 and 865, is hereby revoked.

Definitions.

3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears—

"bushel" means 60 lb.;

"ton" means 2,240 lb.;

"by wholesale" means, in relation to any sale of whole wheat, that such whole wheat is sold to the purchaser for the purposes of resale and shall also be deemed to apply to sales to users who purchase at each delivery a total of not less than one ton;

“by retail” means, in relation to any sale of whole wheat, that such sale is not a sale by wholesale as defined in the preceding clause of this paragraph;

“nearest railway station or siding” means the railway station or siding nearest the wholesale seller’s store;

“Perth Metropolitan Area” means all that area of Western Australia comprised within a radius of 12 miles from the General Post Office at Perth;

“retail seller’s cost-into-store” means the sum of—

- (a) the price paid or payable for that wheat;
- (b) cost of transport from the point of delivery to the retail seller to the retail seller’s store, and
- (c) where the wheat is purchased by the retail seller in bulk, 5d. per bushel for bagging, plus the cost of the bag in which the whole wheat is packed.

Sales by Wholesale.

4. I fix and declare the maximum price at which whole wheat may be sold by any person by wholesale to be—

- (a) in respect of sales within the Perth Metropolitan Area, the price specified in the First Schedule to this Order;
- (b) in respect of sales outside the Perth Metropolitan Area, the price paid or payable for the whole wheat in bags or bulk, as the case may be, ex rail truck, at the nearest railway station or siding, plus—
 - (i) where purchased in bulk and sold in bulk—a margin of 4d. per bushel, when sold ex rail truck, or a margin of 4d. per bushel plus cost of cartage from rail to point of delivery to the purchaser when sold other than ex rail truck; or
 - (ii) where purchased in bulk and sold in bags—the cost of cartage from rail to the wholesale seller’s store and the cost of the bag in which it is packed, and a margin at the rate of—
 - (i) seventeen pence per bushel for sales ex store, or
 - (ii) twenty-one pence per bushel delivered free on rail, free on wharf or to purchaser’s premises; or
 - (iii) twenty-four pence and one halfpenny per bushel delivered free on board ship; or
 - (iii) where purchased in bags and sold in bags—the cost of cartage from rail to the wholesale seller’s store, and a margin at the rate of—
 - (i) twelvepence per bushel for sales ex store; or

- (ii) sixteen pence per bushel delivered free on rail, free on wharf or to purchaser’s premises; or
- (iii) nineteen pence and one halfpenny per bushel delivered free on board ship.

Sales by Retail.

5. I fix and declare the maximum price at which whole wheat may be sold by any person by retail to be the retail seller’s cost-into-store plus the margin set out in the Second Schedule to this Order, according to the quantity sold and the point of delivery.

Variation of Maximum Prices by Notice.

6. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, I declare the maximum price at which whole wheat specified in a notice in pursuance of this paragraph may be sold by any person to whom such notice is given to be such price as is fixed by the Commission by notice in writing to that person.
