GOD SAVE THE QUEEN ! ! !

that the Toodyay Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of section 35 of the said Act, to have effect within the Toodyay Road District:—(1) Empowering it, subject to the provisions of the Act under which it is constituted to establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Act; (2) for the care, detention, release, disposal and destruction of dogs so seized; (3) prescribing fees to be payable in respect of the seizing, care, detention, release, disposal and destruction of dogs so seized; (4) prescribing the liability of any person in respect of payment of the fees referred to in the last preceding paragraph; (5) prohibiting the release from any pound of any dog except in accordance with the regulations; (6) prohibiting the obstruction or hindrance of any employee of the Toodyay Road Board or any member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Act or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions; (7) imposing as an absolute prohibition an obligation on the owner of any dog that the dog shall not enter or be in—(i) such places as may be prescribed in any circumstances whatever, or (ii) such places as may be prescribed, unless on a leash held by a person.

To order any person who has in his possession or under his control for sale or resale any desiccated coconut produced or reasonably suspected of having been produced in or received from Papua (whether such coconut exists in free form or mixed with anything) to deliver such desiccated coconut to such person at such place and within such time as shall be specified in the order.

To destroy or order the destruction of all such desiccated coconut which is within the State, whether existing in free form or mixed with anything, and anything reasonably suspected of being or containing desiccated coconut produced in Papua; and also desiccated coconut produced or reasonably suspected of having been produced in Papua which may arrive in the State within the next six months.

Amendment to Health By-laws.

Ex. Co. No. 1436.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1952, a local health authority may make or adopt by-laws and may amend, repeal or alter any by-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore, the Merredin Road Board, being a local health authority and having adopted Model By-laws, Series "A," as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 4th day of December, 1944, and amended from time to time thereafter, doth hereby amend the said adopted by-laws in the manner set forth hereunder:—

By adding after by-law 35 of Part I of Model By-laws new subheadings as follows:—

Repairs to Houses.

35 (a) The owner of every house used for human habitation shall maintain such house and any laundries, bathrooms, lavatories attached to or used

in connection therewith in good order and condition and properly repaired and fit for use and in particular shall—

- (1) repair or replace any roof or part thereof, which shall become in disrepair;
- (2) repair any brick or stone work which shall show signs of fretting and treat or repair any walls which may become damp;
- (3) replace all decayed or ant-eaten timber therein;
