# ENTERTAINMENTS TAX ASSESSMENT ACT, 1925-1953.

NOTICE is hereby given that the Entertainments Tax Assessment Act, 1925-1953, will come into operation on the 1st October, 1953. On and from that date it will be necessary for:—

- (a) Proprietors of entertainments or persons permitted to conduct any entertainment where the charge exceeds 1s. 6d. for admission to the entertainment, must register the entertainment either at the local post office or with the Commissioner of Taxation not less than seven days before the date on which the entertainment is to be held.
- (b) The owner, lessee or other person for the time being in possession, or entitled to possession of, or having the control of any premises shall not permit, nor cause to be permitted any entertainment to be held on those premises where the admission charge exceeds 1s. 6d., unless he is satisfied that the entertainment has been duly registered.
- (c) No persons shall be admitted to any entertainment for which the charge for admission exceeds 1s. 6d. except where the tax ticket of the appropriate denomination provided by the Commissioner of Taxation is used, unless the proprietor of the entertainment has made arrangements approved by the Commissioner for furnishing returns of the payments for admission to the entertainment and has given security up to an amount and in manner approved by the Commissioner for the payment of the tax. Full particulars regarding security required will be forwarded on application to the Commissioner of Taxation.

Entertainments may be exempt from tax where the whole or the net proceeds of an entertainment are or will be devoted to philanthropic, religious or charitable purposes. Promoters of such entertainments should make application for such exemption and forward full particulars to the Commissioner of Taxation, Treasury Buildings, 60 Barrack Street, Perth.

- 6A. The occupier of any premises shall not deposit or cause, permit, suffer or allow any other person to deposit in any pan used in any privy appurtenant to such premises, any tins, bottles, boxes, refuse or other matter other than urine or nightsoil.
- 2. After by-law 11 insert new by-laws 11A and 11B as follows:—
- 11A. No person other than an officer or contractor to the Collie Coalfields Road Board or person licensed by the said Board shall undertake the removal or disposal of nightsoil, urine or liquid waste within the Town Ward of the Collie Coalfields Health District whilst the said officer or contractor executes or continues the execution of the work or is prepared and willing to execute or continue the execution of the work.
- 11B. No person other than an officer or contractor to the Collie Coalfields Road Board, or person licensed by the said Board, shall undertake the removal or disposal of pig swill within any portion of the Town Ward of the Collie Coalfields Road District as defined in the Government Gazette of the 2nd March, 1951.
- 3. After by-law 35 insert a new by-law 35A as follows:—

#### Repairs to Houses.

- 35A. The owner of every house used for human habitation shall maintain such house and any laundries, bathrooms, lavatories and privies attached to or used in connection therewith in good order and condition and properly repaired and fit for use and in particular shall—
- (1) Repair or replace any roof or part thereof which shall become in disrepair.
- (2) Repair any brick or stone work which shall show signs of fretting and treat or repair any walls which may become damp.
- (3) Replace all decayed or ant-eaten timber therein.
- (4) Repair and replace with new material where necessary any verandah or the roof, floor supports or other parts thereof which may become in disrepair.
- (5) Repair and replace where necessary any steps or handrails thereof which may become in disrepair.
- (6) Repair or replace any flashings which may become in disrepair.
- (7) Replace any ant stops which shall be missing or in disrepair.
- (8) Repair or renew any ventilators which shall become in disrepair or be missing.
- (9) Keep all floors even in surface and free from cracks.
- (10) Replace or repair all skirtings, architraves and fixtures, which may become a harbourage for vermin.
- (11) Keep all walls, ceilings and the plaster and wall paper thereon in good repair, and repair any cracks and renew any plaster or wallpaper which may become dilapidated or in disrepair.

- (12) Refit and repair any doors which may become in disrepair or which shall cease to fit properly.
- (13) Repair or replace with new, any window frames or sash cords which may become broken or in disrepair and reglaze any windows which may become broken or cracked.
- (14) Keep all water service in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the provisions of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act and Regulations and by-laws made thereunder.
- (15) Keep all electric wiring and fittings in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the requirements of the Fire Underwriters' Association of W.A.
- (16) Retain all natural lighting free from any obstruction which would reduce the natural lighting below the ration of one square foot of lighting to each 10 square feet of floor area.

Delete all words after the word "case" in line one thereof and insert in lieu thereof the following words:—

"of any house or public or private place in respect of which the requirements of more than two families, or more than 10 persons have to be provided for, at least two separate sanitary conveniences shall be provided. There shall be additional sanitary conveniences in the proportion of one for every 10 persons or portion of 10.

Provided that this requirement shall not apply to public buildings under Part 6 of this Act, nor to licensed premises under the provisions of the Licensing Act (1911-1951), nor to factories under the provision of the Factories and Shops Act (1920-1937)."

#### (2) Part 1, By-law 3.

Add after paragraph (b) a new paragraph (c) as follows:—

(c) The owner of any premises whereon there is a sanitary convenience, shall maintain such sanitary conveniences and the pedestal pan, cis-

terns and other parts thereof and the water service in good condition and properly repaired and fit for use.

# (3) Part 1—Insert after By-law 41 a New By-law (41A) as follows:—

- 41A. (1) Every hause within the Rockingham Health District shall be provided with an adequate water supply by either—
  - (a) connecting the house to an established water supply and reticulating the water supply to bathroom, kitchen and laundry; or
  - (b) where no established water supply exists, then by the construction or provision of well or wells, properly and efficiently equipped and maintained with a pump or other equivalent and efficient device for raising water and the necessary pipes for reticulating the water to bathroom, kitchen and laundry; or
  - (c) a water storage tank of not less than 1,000 gallons capacity with adequate catchment facilities connected thereto, together with pipes reticulating the water from the tank to bathroom, laundry and kitchen.
- (2) The owner of any house aforesaid shall not use or occupy or permit, allow or suffer to be used or occupied any house unless and until an adequate supply as aforesaid has been provided and maintained.

### (4) Part IV—Dairies and Milk Shops.

After by-law 2 insert a new by-law 2A as follows:

- 2A. (1) For the purpose of these by-laws "dairy" means any farm, dairy, or other place where animals are kept for the purpose of producing milk for sale, and includes every stock-yard, milking yard, paddock, shed, stable, stall, and other place on, in or about a dairy in which animals are kept, depastured or milked, or in which the milk produced in the dairy is stored or treated prior to removal from the dairy.
- (2) The townsites of Safety Bay, Kwinana and Rockingham (excepting that portion thereof consisting of Rockingham Town Lots 318, 319 and 320) within the Rockingham Road District are hereby defined as areas within which it shall not be lawful to establish and carry on any dairy, and the establishment and opening of dairies in such areas is hereby prohibited.
- (3) No person shall open, establish or carry on, a dairy within any of the areas defined in paragraph (2) above, and neither the owner nor the occupier of any land within any of such areas shall permit, suffer or allow any dairy to be established, opened or carried on upon any such land.
