ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 1457/49.

WHEREAS by section 30 of the Health Act, 1911-1952, the Commissioner of Public Health may require the local authorities of two or more districts to join in the appointment of an inspector, and in remunerating him; and whereas, in the case where the local authorities do not appoint the inspector as required, the Commissioner of Public Health, with the approval of the Governor, may appoint such inspector, and fix the proportional part of his remuneration to be paid by each local authority: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby approve of the Commissioner of Public Health appointing Edward John Burrows to be health inspector to the several local authorities mentioned in the schedule hereto, and fixing the proportional part of the remuneration to be paid to the inspector as set forth in the schedule.
