IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from 1st November in each of the years 1953, 1954 and 1955 to 30th April of each succeeding year, respectively.

Schedule.

All that portion of Oyster Harbour bounded by lines starting at a point on the Western shore of Oyster Harbour aforesaid situate in prolongation Easterly of the Northern boundary of lot 57 of Plantagenet Location 7 and extending Easterly to a point known as "Kalgan Stake"; thence South-erly to the Easternmost extremity of Green Island; thence South-South-Easterly passing through a point known as the "Wreck" and onwards to the Northern boundary of reserve 22698 and thence generally Westerly and generally Northerly along the shores of the said Oyster Harbour to the starting point.

Excluded from the above described area are two areas known as the "Catholic Hole" and "Naval Base."

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1950, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Dog Act, 1903-1948.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 2403/52.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 35A of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, that by Order in Council the Governor may subject to such conditions and restrictions as may be specified in the Order, empower any local authority to exercise as a power to make by-laws to have effect within the municipal district or road district as the case may be, in respect of which it is constituted any power of making regulations conferred upon the Governor by the provisions of the Act, and the Order, until revoked or amended, may be acted upon by the local authority in the manner and subject to any conditions and restrictions specified in the Order. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 35A of the Act doth hereby empower all local authorities to exercise as a power to make by-laws to have effect within the respective municipal districts or road districts, as the case may be, in respect of which they are constituted, all or any of the powers set forth in section 35 of the Act.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

W.C.B. 455/51.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas Midland Railway Company of Western Australia

Limited of Midland Junction, Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of the Act, and having duly made application in accordance with the Act and regulations made thereunder for exemption from the operation of section 13 has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the liability aforesaid and that it has deposited at the Treasury securities to wit a bond for ten thousand pounds charged with all payments to become due under the liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Act, doth hereby exempt Midland Railway Company of Western Australia Limited aforesaid from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, for a period expiring on the 7th August, 1955.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas Millars' Timber and Trading Company Limited, of St. George's House, Perth, Western Australia, being an employer within the meaning of section 13, has in accordance with the regulations, duly made application that it be exempted from the operation of the section and has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by it and has deposited at the Treasury securities to wit, the sum of ten thousand pounds (£10,000) charged with all payments to become due from the Company under the liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act doth exempt Millars' Timber and Trading Company Limited, as such employer aforesaid from the operations of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, for a period expiring on the 15th day of September, 1955.

Provided that between the hours of 11.45 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and between the hours of 4.45 p.m. and 5.30 p.m. on any week day and between the hours of 11.45 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on any Saturday, no person in charge of any vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand on any portion of the East side of Spencer Street between Stirling Street and Forrest Avenue.

2. No person in charge of any vehicle shall cause or permit such vehicle to stand on any portion of any of the sections of streets listed hereunder, within the Municipality of Bunbury:—

Stirling Street between the West side of Parkfield Street and a point distant 132 feet West therefrom.

Ocean Drive between Wellington Street and Hayward Street.

Spencer Street between Forrest Avenue and a point 50 feet North therefrom.

Forrest Avenue between Spencer Street and a point 50 feet South-East therefrom.

Wellington Street between Russell Esplanade and Ocean Drive.

A By-law of the City of Fremantle made under Section 180 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1951, and numbered 210 for Regulating the Granting of Long Service Leave to Employees.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of the City of Fremantle order as follows:—

1. In the interpretation of this by-law the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

- (a) "Council" means the City of Fremantle.
- (b) "Employee" means and includes all persons employed in any capacity by the Council, and who are in the regular and full-time employ of the Council.
- (c) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of the Council during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Council for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Council and has not been absent on long service leave and has not been absent, without pay, for a period exceeding four weeks: Provided that an employee who was employed by the Council on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering a continuous full-time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and the 3rd day of March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with the Council, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. All present and future employees of the Council shall, after each period of ten (10) years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees, be entitled to three (3) months' long service leave and no long service leave will be granted to any employee without a qualifying period of ten (10) years being first completed. All employees who qualify for long service leave on the 31st day of October, 1949, shall be entitled thereto and all other employees shall be entitled thereto as from the commencing date of their employment with the Council.

3. (a) The Council may grant long service leave to an employee of the Council who has been granted long service leave for ten (10) years' continuous service if, before a further period of ten (10) years' continuous service is reached such employee retires from the Council's service owing to having reached the retiring age of sixty-five (65) years, or is retired on the grounds of ill-health, or dismissed through staff retrenchments, in which case the long service leave may be adjusted *pro rata*.

Provided that no such grant shall be made to an employee of the Council who prior to completing a further period of ten (10) years' continuous service resigns his employment with the Council.

(b) The long service leave which may be granted under this by-law shall be for a period not exceeding one and three-tenths weeks for every completed year of service since the conclusion of the period of service which qualified the employee for his previous long service leave and shall be on full pay.

4. An employee dismissed by the Council for neglect of duty or for irregular practices shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

5. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Council, who will, as far as possible meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Council may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three (3) months' notice. Long service leave shall be taken in the first place in accordance with a roster prepared by the Town Clerk and prepared so far as possible to enable the employees to take long service leave in order of the length of their service with the Council.

6. In the event of the death of an employee who has served a period of at least two (2) years' continuous service the Council may pay to his personal representatives, or if there be none, to his dependants a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Council would have been empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his death, if he had retired after ten (10) years' continuous service, or if the Council after consideration of all the circumstances, direct that the death of an employee be presumed, the Council may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Council.

7. (a) Employees taking long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the permanent rate of pay excluding conditional margins or higher duty payments, equivalent to the salary or wage paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Council shall pay to any employee his salary or wages during his period of long service leave weekly provided that it may at its discretion pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his salary or wages for the period of his long service leave upon written application being made to the Council for payment in such manner.

8. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave but are to form part of such long service leave.

9. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Council. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Council to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 5th day of August, 1953, between the Chairman and members of the Dundas Road Board (hereinafter termed the Employer) of the first part and The Eastern Gold-fields Municipal and Roads Board Labourers' Union of Workers, being a union of workers registered under the provisions of the Industrial Conciliation and Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 (hereinafter termed the Employee) of the other part, whereby the said parties are mutually agreed as follows:—

The basic wage at the rate of £12 9s. 4d. per week.

The minimum rates of wages shall be paid by the Employer to the Employee shall be:—

1a.—Definitions.

(a) "Casual hand" shall mean a worker employed less than five (5) consecutive days, where a five day week is worked, or for less than six (6) consecutive working days, where a six day week is worked. This clause shall not apply to workers mentioned in clause (1a)-(b).

(b) "Wet ground" shall mean ground in which in the opinion of the chief executive officer or such other person as may be authorised by him, it is impracticable for workers to work without getting wet feet.

(c) "Concretor" shall mean any worker engaged in mixing, wheeling, or packing concrete, including machine mixing.

(d) "Permanent yard or depot" shall be deemed to mean and include a permanent place wherein are stored or kept plant, equipment and materials, or a place where vehicles are parked. The expression shall also be deemed to mean and include a place wherein are stored plant, equipment and materials, or where vehicles are parked away from a permanent yard or depot, when workers are engaged on work which necessitates their camping on the job.

(e) "Road worker" shall for the purpose of clause 1a and without limiting the rights of the parties under clause 15 (a) (ii) in respect of any class of worker which is not now existing in the industry, mean a worker engaged in all or any of the following classifications:—

- (1) Scoopmen.
- (2) Rubbish-tip men.
- (3) Wood kerber.
- (4) Stone kerber.
- (5) Concrete slab layer.
- (6) Concrete kerb layer.
- (7) Concrete slab or kerbmaker.
- (8) Concrete pipemaker.
- (9) Concrete slab, kerb, or pipemaker's assistant.
- (10) Roadmen, forming or constructing roads and streets surface, including footpaths.
- (11) Hammer and gad men and hammer and drill men.
- (12) Spallers and knappers on roads.
- (13) Stone pitchers.
- (14) Men screening gravel or stone.
- (15) Men throwing material over six feet up into trucks or vehicles.
- (16) Spallers (quarries).
- (17) Quarry jumpmen.
- (18) Gravelpit men.
- (19) Sandpit men.
- (20) Drainage workers.
- (21) Pipe joiners.
- (22) Treepullers.
- (23) Bridge builders.
- (24) Culvert builders.
- (25) Grave diggers.
- (26) Poison carter.
- (27) Axemen (sapping, or lopping, not grubbing, unless such grubbing entails the cutting of roots of over 12 inches in diameter), where the major portion of the bush to be cut is more than 12 inches in diameter.

2.—Scope.

This agreement shall apply to workers eligible to belong to the applicant Union and employed in any of the classifications mentioned in clause (1) hereof.

3.—Area.

This Agreement shall have effect over the area comprised within that portion of the State outside the South-West Land Division over which the Dundas Road Board has local governing authority.

4.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for one (1) year as from the 5th day of August, 1953.

5.—Contract of Service.

The contract of service of all workers in clause (1a) shall be a daily one.

Should any worker not be notified before leaving work that his services will not be required on the next day, he shall be paid for that day, if he duly presents himself for work at the appointed time provided that, if he can not be employed on account of wet weather, he shall be notified accordingly and shall be entitled to two hours' pay. The decision as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest with the Chief Executive Officer, or such other person as may be authorised by him.

6.—Conditions.

(i) One shilling and two pence (1s. 2d.) per day extra shall be paid to the following workers:—

- (a) Casual workers.
- (b) Concretors other than slab, curb, or pipe makers.
- (c) Men engaged on tar or bitumen work and who come into contact with tar or bitumen.
- (d) Men working in wet ground.
- (e) When an employee is working outside of a radius of seven miles from the registered office of the Dundas Road Board, under camping conditions, he shall be paid five shillings in addition to his ordinary wages, as camping out allowance.

(ii) Three shillings (3s.) extra per day shall be paid to workers cleaning bitumen tanks or boiler, when so employed; provided that such worker shall not be entitled to be paid in addition the allowance by clause (6) (i) (e).

(iii) Leading hands in charge of not less than three (3) other workers shall—

- (a) where the leading hand is himself performing the work of a "road board worker" be entitled to be paid at the rate of fifteen shillings (15s.) per week in addition to the rate prescribed for a "Road Worker";
- (b) where the leading hand is himself performing any class of work other than that of a road worker be entitled to be paid at the rate of six shillings (6s.) in addition to the rate prescribed for the class of work he is performing.

7.—Payment of Wages.

(a) When a worker has been discharged or has resigned before the usual pay day he shall be paid all wages due within twenty-four (24) hours of the time when he has been discharged or has resigned.

(b) Payment of wages shall be made once weekly or once fortnightly at the discretion of the Employer.

(c) No Employer shall keep more than two (2) days' pay in hand.

8.—Special Provision.

(a) Camping on the Job.—(i) On work which necessitates camping on the job, all reasonable goods and camping outfits to be collected at the depot and returned to the depot at the completion of the job.

(ii) Shifting Camp.—All shifting of camp to be done in the Employers' time.

(b) Travelling.—Where the workers are engaged on a job which is more than one and one-half (1½) miles from a permanent yard or depot, such workers shall be provided with travelling facilities or be reimbursed any fares necessarily incurred.

(ba) A conveyance to be made available for the return of the employees to the Norseman depot at week-ends from out camps up to a distance of approximately seventy (70) miles, at the pleasure of the Employer.

(c) Sanitary Arrangements.—Proper sanitary arrangements shall be made on each job for the convenience of all workers.

(d) Supplying Tools.—All tools required by the worker in the performance of his work shall be supplied without charge by the Employer.

(e) Workers working in isolated places.—A driver of a roller, grader or tractor shall not work alone on construction work in isolated places.

(f) Medicine Chest and First-aid Equipment.—(i) When workers are engaged on work which necessitates camping on a job a medicine chest and first-aid equipment shall be supplied by the Employer.

(ii) First-aid equipment shall be kept in a permanent yard or depot.

9.—Hours.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work for all workers to be worked in five days.

(b) The hours of work for all workers whose ordinary duties are carried out during daylight hours shall be performed between 7.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m., provided that these hours may be varied by agreement between the Employer and the Union.

10.—Overtime.

(a) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job on any of the named holidays prescribed in clause (2) or on Sundays he shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours' at penalty rates.

(b) If a worker is required to work during the recognised meal period, does not in consequence obtain a full continuous meal period, or loses any portion of the meal period, he shall be paid at double time rates for the period not obtained, or any portion lost.

(c) All time worked before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half, for the first two hours, and double time thereafter.

(d) Any worker called upon to work on any of the holidays mentioned in clause (12) shall be paid at the rate of double time, except where the employer and the worker mutually agree that any of such days shall not be observed as a holiday, in which case work may be done at ordinary rates, and an extra day added to the annual leave as prescribed by clause (13) for each day so worked.

(e) Work done on Saturdays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(f) All work performed on Sundays shall be paid at double time rates.

(g) When computing overtime, the District allowance shall not be computed as an addition to the day's pay.

11.—Holidays.

Subject to clause 10 (d) the following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be paid holidays, namely:—Christmas Day, New Years Day, Labour Day, and Easter Monday.

12.—Annual Leave.

(a) In addition to the holidays prescribed in clause 11 hereof, three weeks leave on full pay shall be allowed to all workers on completion of each twelve months' continuous service: Provided that, should the period of continuous service be less than twelve months the worker shall be entitled to pay in lieu of leave in the proportion that his length of service bears to the full year's employment.

(b) Where practicable, annual leave shall be granted at Christmas time.

(c) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay in accordance with clause 13 shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

(d) This clause does not apply to casual hands.

13.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay at the Award rate for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week's pay in each calendar year. Payment hereunder shall be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) Sick pay, not availed of may accumulate to the extent of a maximum of eighteen (18) days to be drawn upon at such times as absence on account of sickness warrants; but the said eighteen (18) days shall be the maximum which can be claimed in any one year in respect of the years worked without a sick claim, provided that if employment is determined, no payment shall be made for sick leave not taken.

(c) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or any accident, wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(d) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

13a.—Long Service Recreational Leave.

(1) All full-time workers after serving the Chairman and members of the Dundas Road Board continuously for ten (10) years will be entitled, subject

to the following condition, to three (3) months long service leave on full pay, to be granted at the convenience of the employer.

In regards to workers engaged at the time of this agreement, with the Dundas Road Board, continuous services as from the 1st of January, 1946, shall be deemed to be service for the purpose of this agreement: Provided also that any employee leaving the service of the Employer, who has served continuously for at least three (3) years next before his retirement shall be paid long service leave *pro rata* for the period of his employment no period or periods of continuous service shall count for the purpose of calculating long service leave if the worker is out of the employ of the Dundas Road Board for any period exceeding six months at any one time.

(2) Workers will be similarly entitled to a further period of three months long service leave for every subsequent ten (10) years' service.

(3) Long service leave is granted solely for recuperative purposes. During long service leave no worker shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward; contravention of this condition will be followed by instant dismissal.

(4) Workers shall be paid their salary in advance at the rate equal to the average daily rate over the preceding twelve (12) months.

(5) Any worker who is eligible for long service leave and who resigns or is retired from the service of the employer, shall be paid for such long service due.

(6) If a deceased worker would have been entitled to long service leave at the time of his death the amount of payment in lieu thereof shall be paid on claim to the next-of-kin.

(7) District allowance will not be paid during the period of long service leave, except when the worker or the abovementioned dependants of the worker remain in the district.

14.—Board of Reference.

(a) For the purpose of this agreement a Board of Reference consisting of a Chairman and two (2) representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, to be assigned to each such board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties of this agreement, the functions of—

(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the agreement or any of them;

(ii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the agreement;

(iii) deciding any other matter that the court may refer to such board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the condition prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which, for this purpose are embodied in this agreement.

15.—Under-rate Worker.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

16.—Record.

(a) A readily intelligible record shall be kept by each employer, containing the following particulars:—

(i) The name of each worker.

(ii) The time he starts and finishes work each day.

(iii) All overtime work.

(iv) Total number of hours worked.

(v) The wages (and overtime, if any) paid to each worker.

(vi) The amount of fares and special allowance (if any) paid.

(b) Such records shall be signed by the worker and shall be open for inspection, during office hours by the secretary or an accredited representative of the Union, and such person may take extract therefrom.

17.—Posting Copies of the Award and Union Notices.

The accredited Union representative shall not be prevented from posting a copy of this Award, or any notice of the Union, not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches, in a suitable place agreed upon between the Employer and the Union. Failing agreement in this connection, the Board of Reference shall decide where the copy of the Award or the said notice shall be posted.

18.—Leave of Absence.

For the purpose of this Award leave of absence from duty, without prejudice, shall be granted to the president of the Union or president or secretary of any branch of the Union, or any steward duly authorised by the Union, without pay: Provided that they shall first find satisfactory substitutes, if so required by the Employer.

19.—Mixed Functions.

Any employees using tradesmen's tools and doing the work of a tradesman shall be paid the ruling rate in the district for the class of work on which he is employed, and in the case of an employee taking the place of a higher paid employee or doing work classed at a higher rate of pay such employee shall be paid the higher rate of wages. If employed at the higher rate of wages for two or more hours he shall be paid the higher rate for the whole of that shift.

20.—District Allowance.

In addition to wages prescribed in clause (1) hereof an allowance of five shillings (5s.) per week shall be paid to all workers plus the Gold Allowance for the district as applied in the gold mining industry.

Terms of Agreement.

This Agreement shall come into force on the day of the date herein and shall remain in force for the period of one (1) year thence next ensuing, and thereafter subject to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and shall apply to all works and undertakings carried out by the said Employer in the Eastern Goldfields District.
