IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from January 1, 1954, to December 31, 1958, both dates inclusive.

Schedule.

(1) The whole of the waters of the King River (Albany), including its tributaries, North of a line drawn in a North-Easterly direction from a point on the Western foreshore of Oyster Harbour 25 chains South from the Southern extremity of the Lower King River Bridge to a point on the Northern foreshore of Oyster Harbour 57 chains East of the Northern extremity of the said bridge.

(2) All that portion of Oyster Harbour and the Kalgan River and its tributaries lying North of a line starting at a post situate at the junction of the Northern shore of the said Oyster Harbour and the right bank of the said Kalgan River and extend-

ing South-Westerly for a distance of about 23 chains to a spit post marking the edge of the channel and thence Southerly to the Westernmost extremity of Swan Point. (Public Plan 451C/40.)

(3) The waters of the channel entrance between King George's Sound and Oyster Harbour (Albany), downwards from a line drawn in an Easterly direction from a point on the foreshore 10 chains North of Emu Point to a line drawn in an Easterly direction from a point on the foreshore 10 chains South of Emu Point.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 14 (2) of the Fauna Protection Act, 1950, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby declare an open season in respect of wild ducks from 5 o'clock in the forenoon of December 20, 1953, to May 31, 1954, in the whole of the State of Western Australia, with the exception of those areas defined in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

(a) The whole of the area within a radius of 20 miles of the General Post Office at Perth.

(b) All municipalities and townsites within the boundaries of the South-West Land Division.

(c) The whole of the Rockingham Road District.

(d) The whole of the waters of Lakes Leschenaultia, Yealering and Seppings and Bambun, Wagin, Nambung, Mungala, Nannerup and Wardering Lakes and all those portions of land lying within 20 chains of the shore of the said lakes.

(e) The whole of the waters of Leschenault, Vasse and Wonnerup Estuaries and all those portions of land lying within 20 chains of the shores of the said estuaries.

(f) The whole of the waters of the Vasse, King and Kalgan Rivers, and all those portions of land lying within 20 chains of the banks of the said rivers.

(g) All that portion of the waters of the Capel River lying between the Capel and Stirling Bridges and all the land lying within 20 chains of the shore of the said portion of the said river.

(h) The whole of the waters of Oyster Harbour and Princess Royal Harbour and all those portions of land lying within a radius of 20 chains of the shores of the said harbours.

(i) The whole of the area of the Yanchep Caves Reserve No. A9868.

(j) The whole of the Harvey catchment area.

(k) The whole of the area lying within a radius of two miles of the Post Office at Mandurah.

WHEREAS by section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, it is provided that the Governor may, by Proclamation, prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, proclaim and declare as follows:—That all those portions of Western Australian waters defined in the Schedule hereto shall be closed against the use of fishing nets, and also against the use of fish traps, for a period of three years as from January 1, 1954, to December 31, 1958, both dates inclusive.

All that portion of the Avon River starting from the centre of Sinclair Crossing at Dumbarton and extending generally North-Westerly downwards to the centre of the crossing of the Toodyay-Bolgart Road near the Toodyay Townsite boundary.

ments and particulars specified in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of subsection (1) of section 329 of the Companies Act, 1943-1951: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Council, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by paragraph (7) proviso (a) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1951, doth hereby authorise the Registrar to register Lanes Pty. Ltd. as a foreign company.

under their liability aforesaid; Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Act, doth hereby exempt Bunning Bros. Pty. Ltd., Perth Jarrah Mills Pty. Ltd., Nyamup Sawmills Pty. Ltd., Donnelly Sawmills Pty. Ltd., and Henry Martin & Co. Pty. Ltd., from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, for a period expiring on the 30th day of June, 1955.

The Associations Regulations, 1953.

1. These Regulations may be cited as The Associations Regulations, 1953.
2. In these Regulations and in the forms in Schedule I to these Regulations—

- (a) "the Act" means the Associations Incorporation Act, 1895-1953;
- (b) "Registrar" means the Registrar as defined in Section 2 of the Act;
- (c) without affecting the generality of the term "document" includes notice, affidavit and memorial.

Preparation of Documents.

3. All documents prepared for filing with the Registrar shall—
 - (a) be accompanied when filed by the appropriate fee;
 - (b) be legibly and clearly written, typewritten or printed;
 - (c) be prepared on paper of medium weight and good quality and in a clean and unmutilated condition, and (with the exception of the Rules, Regulations or Constitution of an association) on paper of foolscap folio size;
 - (d) where the document comprises two or more sheets be secured together in a sufficient manner.
4. Except by special leave of the Registrar granted upon such conditions as he may think fit, a document which does not comply with regulation 3 of these regulations shall not be received by the Registrar.
5. The Registrar may require fresh copies of any document which is improperly filled in or which shows traces of erasures or which contains any alterations and the fresh copies shall be prepared and signed in the manner prescribed by the Act or by these regulations in respect of the original document. Every alteration made in any document or form shall be initialled by the person who signed the document or form in which the alteration has been made and by the witness, if any.
6. Where the Attorney General issues a certificate pursuant to section 2 or section 7A of the Act that certificate shall be filed with the Registrar with the memorial for incorporation or the notice of change of objects, as the case may be.
7. Where any document or part thereof required to be filed with the Registrar is not written in the English language that document or part, unless the Registrar otherwise directs, shall be accompanied by a translation thereof certified by the statutory declaration of a person approved by the Registrar.

Prescribed Forms.

8. The forms set out in Schedule I to these regulations, or forms to the like effect, shall be used for the purposes for which they are respectively appropriate and the particulars contained therein are hereby prescribed as the particulars required in the Act. The directions contained in any such form for the completion thereof shall be observed.
9. The forms prescribed by these regulations may be modified in a particular case by authority of the Registrar. Any document or form not provided for in these regulations may be provided for and any irregularity in procedure may be corrected in such form or manner as the Registrar may direct.

Prescribed Fees.

10. (1) The fees set out in Schedule II to these regulations shall be paid to the Registrar for the several matters therein referred to.
- (2) Any person or corporation furnishing to the Registrar any document required by the Act or these regulations without payment of the prescribed fee, and failing or neglecting to pay such fee forthwith after being called upon by the Registrar by notice in writing to do so shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Traffic Act, 1919-1952, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

1. In these regulations the Traffic Regulations, 1936, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 26th day of August, 1936, and duly amended from time to time thereafter, are referred to as the principal regulations.

2. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 136 a new Division to Part V numbered (3A) containing the new sub-heading and regulations as follow:—

Division (3A).

Traffic Control Light Signals.

136A. In this Division—

“traffic control light signal” means an illuminated traffic sign installed or erected with the authority of the Minister on or near a road for the regulation and control thereon of vehicular and pedestrian traffic and the driving of animals.

136B. A person who contravenes or fails to comply with the directions of a traffic control light signal commits a breach of these regulations.

136C. (1) The display by a traffic control light signal at, or at an approach to, a junction or an intersection of—

- (a) the colour red by itself is a direction that a vehicle or an animal facing the colour so displayed and approaching, or about to be driven over the stop line appropriate to the signal, shall be driven as near as practicable to but not past that line, and shall then, if necessary, be halted, until the signal changes so as to display the colour green;
- (b) the colour red and a green arrow pointing to the left is a direction that the vehicle or animal may, subject to these regulations, without being halted as aforesaid, be driven over the stop line appropriate to the signal, only if it is to be turned to the left at that junction or intersection;
- (c) the colour green by itself is a direction that a vehicle or an animal facing the colour so displayed, and driven over, or approaching, or about to be driven over the stop line appropriate to the signal shall, subject to these regulations, be driven so as to proceed forthwith over the junction or intersection;
- (d) the colour amber by itself is a direction that—
 - (i) a vehicle or an animal facing the colour so displayed and which has crossed the stop line appropriate to that signal or has approached so near thereto that it cannot be stopped with safety before reaching the stop line shall, subject to these regulations, be driven over the junction or intersection at a reasonable speed, and
 - (ii) any other vehicle or animal facing the colour so displayed and about to cross the stop line appropriate to that signal shall be driven as near as practicable to but not past that line, and shall if necessary be halted, until the signal changes so as to display the colour green;
- (e) the illuminated words “No Right Turn” is a direction that a vehicle or an animal approaching the words so displayed shall not, at the junction or intersection, be turned to the right.

(2) In this regulation the stop line appropriate to a signal is the white line adjacent thereto and marked across or partly across the roadway at an approach to a junction or an intersection.

136D. A person driving a vehicle or an animal, having entered a junction or an intersection at which traffic control light signals are operating, shall not turn the vehicle or animal to the right or left at that junction or intersection in contravention of these regulations nor unless he could do so with safety to the public.

136E. Where a member of the Police Force is directing traffic at a junction or an intersection where a traffic control light signal is also operating, the directions of the member of the Police Force shall prevail over those of the traffic control light signal.

136F. (1) The display by a traffic control light signal of—

- (a) the colour red or amber is a direction that a pedestrian facing the colour so displayed shall, notwithstanding the provisions of regulations 312, 321 and 321A, not enter or cross the intervening carriageway of the road towards the signal unless he can do so without obstructing the passage of any vehicle or animal, but where the pedestrian entered and commenced to cross the carriageway before either of those colours was displayed, he shall, subject to subregulation (2) hereof continue across the carriageway;

- (b) the colour green is a direction that a pedestrian facing the colour so displayed and about to cross the intervening carriageway towards the signal may commence to so cross, and having so commenced, shall, notwithstanding a change in the colour of the signal but subject to subregulation (2) hereof, complete the crossing.

(2) If, while a pedestrian is crossing the carriageway of a road, the colour of a traffic control light signal towards which he is proceeding changes to either red or amber, and there is a safety zone between him and the signal, he shall not proceed beyond the safety zone unless he can do so without obstructing the passage of any vehicle or animal driven thereon or until the colour of the signal changes to green.

Melville Road Board.

By-laws for the Management, Use and Letting of Applecross District Hall.

L.G. 83/52.

WHEREAS by virtue of the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, the Road Board of every district is empowered to make, publish, alter, modify, amend or repeal by-laws for any purpose of the said Act mentioned; and whereas the Road Board is desirous of repealing By-laws Nos. 107 to 117 (inclusive) (Road Board Halls) they being portion of the By-laws as published in the *Government Gazette* on 22nd June, 1922, and of passing the following by-laws in lieu thereof: Now therefore, the Melville Road Board doth hereby repeal the abovementioned By-laws and make and publish the following By-laws in lieu thereof:

In exercise of the powers vested in it by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951 the Melville Road Board doth hereby make the following By-laws for the management, use and letting of the Applecross District Hall.

Interpretation Clauses—In the construction of these by-laws "Hirer" shall mean any person making application or arrangements for the hire of the Applecross District Hall, furniture, or crockery, or to whom the use of same is granted; "Board" shall mean the Melville Road Board; "Hall" shall mean the Applecross District Hall or any part thereof.

1. The rent of the said hall or any part thereof, or furniture, or crockery, shall be as set forth in Schedule hereto.

2. Application for the hire of the hall, furniture, or crockery shall be made in writing to the Secretary of the Board not less than 14 days before the time such hall, furniture, or crockery is required. The name and place of abode of the actual responsible person or persons hiring the hall, furniture, or crockery shall be given in such application.

3. The hours for which hiring may be effected at day time rates shall be between the hours of 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. Night rates shall commence at 6.30 p.m.

4. The Board may at any time demand that the hirer shall, prior to the term of the engagement, deposit with the Secretary an amount estimated to cover hall hire and any damage that may occur during the term of the engagement.

5. The hirer shall be responsible for any damage to the Hall, fittings, furniture, or crockery while in his use or charge, and shall pay to the Board the amount of such damage as assessed by the Board.

6. The hirer shall, when the use of the Hall crockery is allowed, as soon as possible after the term of engagement, deliver all such crockery in a clean and sound condition, and any article not accounted for or in a cracked condition must be paid for at current rates.

7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let the Hall, furniture, or crockery to any applicant for the hiring of the same, without assigning any reason for such refusal.

8. The Board may at any time cancel any arrangement made for the hire of the Hall, furniture or crockery under the following circumstances:

- (i) If in the opinion of the Board or of the Board's Health Inspector it is in the interests of Public Health;
- (ii) If in the opinion of the Board or of the Board's Health Inspector the Hall or any part of it is unsafe for use;
- (iii) If in the opinion of the Board the Hall is required urgently by the Board for a matter of Public importance.

9. In the event of two or more applications being made for the hire of the Hall, furniture or crockery for the same date and hour, the Board may without considering the priority of the application, determine to which applicant the Hall may be granted.

10. The hirer of the Hall shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainments Act, and any other Act in force for the time being, applicable to such hiring and use of Hall. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts abovementioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of the engagement forbid and prevent the use of the Hall. In the event of the use of the Hall being prevented under this By-law, the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of the Hall as if the hire had been duly fulfilled and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.

11. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale or other intoxicating drink shall be brought into or consumed in the Hall during the term of the engagement, except when permitted by the Board in writing.

12. No smoking of tobacco, cigarettes or cigars or other matter shall be permitted in the Hall, except by permission from the Board.

13. Dogs, whether under control or otherwise will not be allowed to enter the Hall.

14. No person shall in any part of the Hall enter or be—

- (a) allowed to enter in any part of the Hall while intoxicated;
- (b) guilty of any misbehaviour whatever.

15. No person shall—

- (a) damage, mark or deface any wall or other part of the Hall;
- (b) use profane or improper language in the Hall or within hearing of persons using same;
- (c) stand, loiter, or cause any obstruction whatsoever in the passage-ways of the Hall.

16. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons or anything calculated to produce a riot, or breach of the peace shall be permitted in the Hall.

17. The hirer of the Hall shall be responsible for—

- (a) Maintaining good order and seeing that patrons comply with these by-laws;
- (b) any damage done to the Hall, fittings, furniture, fixtures, crockery ware, or other property of the Board.

18. No person shall remove or replace any electrical fittings without the permission of the Board.

19. The Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or a police officer, shall be permitted to have ingress to the Hall or any part thereof during the term of the engagement, and every facility shall be given them for the enforcing of these by-laws.

20. Hirers may decorate any hall, using only fixtures specially provided for that purpose, and no person shall drive a nail into part of the walls, windows, floors, doors, etc.

21. Decorations may be done in daylight free of charge, when the hall is not otherwise engaged, and at such times as the Board may permit. If the decorations are done at night, such charges may be made as the Board determines. All decorations must be removed from the premises within 24 hours from the commencement of the hiring period.

22. Every person who does, permits, or suffers any act, matter, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws or commits or permits any breach thereof, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence against these by-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.

23. Nothing herein contained shall in any way prevent the Board from entering into an agreement in writing with any proposed hirer of the said Hall or any part thereof and from including such terms and conditions therein as the parties may agree which are not inconsistent with the Road Districts Act. None of these by-laws shall apply to any such agreement except such of them as may be expressly adopted in such agreement.

Darling Range Road Board.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be Granted to Employees of the Darling Range Road Board.

L.G. 2249/52.

THE Darling Range Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of the by-laws, the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means Darling Range Road Board. "Employee" means and includes all persons employed in any capacity by the Board, and who are in the regular and fulltime employ of the Board.

(b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of the Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10

days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and the 3rd day of March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with the Board, provided the requisite proof is produced.

2. All present and future employees of the Board, shall, after each period of ten (10) years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees commencing from the 1st day of January, 1945, be entitled to three (3) months' long service leave and no long service leave will be granted to any employee without a qualifying period of ten (10) years being first completed. All employees who qualify for long service leave on the 1st day of January, 1955, shall be entitled thereto and all other employees shall be entitled thereto as from the commencing date of their employment with the Board.

3. (a) The Board may grant long service leave to an employee of the Board who has been granted long service leave for 10 years' continuous service if, before a further period of 10 years' continuous service is reached, such employee retires from the Board's service owing to have reached the retiring age of 65 years, or if retired on the grounds of ill-health, or dismissed through staff retrenchments, in which case the long service leave may be adjusted pro rata.

Provided that no such grant shall be made to an employee of the Board who prior to completing a further period of 10 years' continuous service resigns his employment with the Board.

(b) The long service leave which may be granted under this by-law shall be for a period not exceeding one and three-tenths weeks for every completed year of service since the conclusion of the period of service which qualified the employee for his previous long service leave, and shall be on full pay.

4. An employee dismissed by the Board for neglect of duty or for irregular practices shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

5. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

6. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far as possible meet the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

7. In the event of the retirement or death of an employee, the Board may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representatives or if there be none, to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board is empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his retirement or death, or if the Board after consideration of all the circumstances, direct that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.

8. (a) Employees taking long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate of pay equivalent to their permanent positions held immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Board may, at its discretion, either (1) pay to any employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

9. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form part of such long service leave.

10. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this sub-clause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

DOG ACT, 1903-1948.

PURSUANT to an Order in Council promulgated in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th day of August, 1953, under section 35A of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, and in exercise of all other powers thereto enabling it, the Darling Range Road Board doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws for the establishment of a Dog Pound and the control of dogs within the area of the Darling Range Road Board.

1. In these by-laws the term "Board" shall mean the Darling Range Road Board.

2. The Board may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1949.

3. A dog seized by the police or by an officer authorised by the Board may be placed in a pound.

4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound, the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Board shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.

5. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.

6. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Board.

7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Board the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The poundkeeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Board in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.

8. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being seized, or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner, the poundkeeper or other officer authorised by the Board may sell such dog.

9. Upon the sale of a dog, the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Board and may be disposed of in such manner as the Board thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Board in respect of the proceeds thereof.

10. If within the times mentioned in by-law 8 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid and the said fees paid, and if no offer has been received for its purchase, the dog may be destroyed.

11. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the Secretary of the Board if in the opinion of the Secretary the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.

12. If the Board shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner, whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Board the fee specified in the Schedule hereto.

13. No person shall—

- (a) unless a poundkeeper or other officer of the Board duly authorised in that regard, release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;

(b) destroy, break into, damage or in any way interfere with or render not dog proof any pound;

(c) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog proof any dog cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.

14. The owner of a dog shall keep such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.

15. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

(a) A public building.

(b) A theatre or picture gardens.

(c) A house of worship.

(d) A shop or other public business premises.

16. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

(a) A sports ground.

(b) An area set aside for public recreation.

(c) A car park.

(d) A school.

(e) Any land vested in or under the control of the Board, other than a road.

17. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Board or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.

18. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these by-laws.

19. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

WHEREAS application having been made under section 21 of the above Act for variation of Award No. 2 of 1951, dated 21st July, 1951, the Railways Classification Board doth order and prescribe that the Award made in this matter be varied in the manner following, that is to say:—

Award No. 6 of 1953.

Clause 3—Interpretations.

Delete first paragraph and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

For the purpose of this Award—Head of Branch shall mean Secretary for Railways, Chief Traffic Manager, Chief Civil Engineer,

Chief Mechanical Engineer, Comptroller of Accounts and Audit, Comptroller of Stores and Industrial and Staff Manager, or such other Head of Branch as may hereinafter be appointed.

Clause 5—Hours of Duty.

Subclause (e)—Delete this subclause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

(e) (i) There shall be no fixed hours of duty for inspectors or other officers who are required to travel in the performance of their duties. Provided that the total number of hours worked per fortnight by any such officer shall not exceed 96 hours inclusive of travelling time. Provided also that this subclause shall not apply to pay officers.

(ii) For the purpose of this subclause, the term "fortnight" shall be deemed to mean "pay fortnight."

Subclause (o)—Delete the figures "5½d." and "3d." and insert in lieu thereof the figures "7d." and "3½d." respectively.

Clause 7—Overtime.

Subclause (e) (ii)—Delete this subclause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

(e) (ii) Except as provided for in subclause (b) (ii) and (b) (iii) the first two hours' overtime or any portion thereof in any one day may be adjusted within the week it is worked. Such adjustment shall take place by being brought on later or booked off earlier. Any overtime beyond the two hours will stand alone and be paid for as provided for in subclause (b).

Subclause (f) (iv)—Delete this subclause and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

(iv) Foremen and subforemen employed at the Midland Junction Workshops, also subforemen fitters and subforemen boilermakers employed in running sheds.

Clause 9—Leave of Absence—Annual.

Subclauses (a) and (b)—Delete these subclauses and insert in lieu thereof the following:—

(a) (i) After 12 months' continuous service all officers, other than those referred to in paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of this subclause, shall be entitled to annual paid leave of two (2) weeks and public service holidays or days in lieu thereof.

(ii) After 12 months' continuous service, the following officers shall be entitled to annual paid leave of three weeks and public service holidays or days in lieu thereof.

Those officers referred to in clause 5 (e) of this Award.

Transit Officers and Assistant Transit Officers, Perth.

Transport and Assistant Transport Clerks at District Offices, also foremen and subforemen and their reliefs supervising work of guards, shunters or enginemen and who regularly rotate two or more shifts or who regularly work other than day shift.

(iii) As from the 1st July, 1954, all officers having 10 years' adult service or longer and who do not normally work the five-day week shall commence to accrue annual paid leave of three weeks and public service holidays or days in lieu thereof. An officer shall not be deemed to work a five day week normally who in the case of the annual qualifying period has worked six or more shifts per week on more than 22 occasions.

(iv) Days in lieu of Christmas Day and Good Friday will not be granted where double time has been paid in respect of work performed on those days pursuant to the provisions of clause 8 (a) of this Award.

(v) Officers relieving those officers mentioned in paragraph (ii) shall receive the additional week's leave on a pro rata basis in respect of any period of relief broken or continuous exceeding two months in any financial year.

(vi) If any public service holiday falls within an officer's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(b) Officers stationed at Yalgoo and Goon-garrie and North and East thereof, and between Norseman and Esperance shall be allowed two days extra when clearing annual leave.

Subclause (e).—Insert the word "service" between the word "public" and "holidays."
