WHEREAS it is enacted by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted), that the Governor may, by proclamation, declare any Crown Lands to be Reserves for Natives and abolish any reserve so declared; and whereas by proclamation issued under the Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, and published in the Government Gazette on the 8th day of March, 1940, the Lieutenant-Governor declared an area at Moorumbine Spring more particularly described as Reserve No. 6799 and defined in the Schedule to such proclamation, to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said reserve: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted), do hereby abolish the Reserve for Natives as declared and described and defined in the hereinbefore mentioned proclamation published in the Govern-ment Gazette on the 8th day of March, 1940, as aforesaid.

WHEREAS by section 28A of the Main Roads Act, 1930-1952, it is provided that where the Commissioner is of opinion that a controlled access road should be provided and should be entered and departed from at specified places only, he shall make a recommendation to the Governor accordingly and that if of opinion that the recommendation should be given effect the Governor may, by Proclamation, proclaim the controlled access road and the places only at which the controlled access road may be entered or departed from; and whereas the Commissioner is of opinion that a controlled access road should be provided as hereinafter described and should be entered and departed from at the places specified hereunder only and has made a recommendation to the Governor accordingly; and whereas I, the Governor of the said State am of opinion that such recommendation should be given effect: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby proclaim that the parcels of land coloured gfeen and portions of Public Roads coloured green in Plan M.R.D., W.A., No. 2457 respectively and which together are more particularly described in Schedule 1 hereto shall be a Controlled Access Road and that the places specified in Schedule 2 hereto shall be the only places the places of the at which such Controlled Access Roads may be entered or departed from.

Schedule 1.

A strip of land generally five chains wide commencing at the South boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 55 and extending in a South-South-Westerly direction through the Eastern side of Cockburn Sound Location 121; thence extending in a Southerly direction and including the Eastern portion of Cockburn Sound Location 138, and the Western portion of Cockburn Sound Location 49; widening to, and including portion of Wellard Road (road No. 313) and the North-Eastern corner of Cockburn Sound Location 153; thence continuing five chains wide, in a Southerly direction along the Western boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 17 to opposite Cockburn Sound Location 202; thence deviating to the West of South through the West-ern portion of Cockburn Sound Location 17 and the Eastern portions of Cockburn Sound Locations 202 and 201; ending at the Northern boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 42 as shown coloured green in Plan M.R.D., W.A., 2457.

ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1951.

Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board. By-laws relating to Quarrying and Excavations.

L.G. 24/52

WHEREAS by the Road Disticts Act, 1919-1948, the road board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any purpose in the said Act mentioned, the Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board, in pursuance of the powers aforesaid of the said Board, under and by virtue of the said Act and of any other authority enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

- 1. No person without first obtaining the license of the said Board shall on any land other than Crown land within the Armadale-Kelmscott Road District—
 - (a) quarry for stone, gravel, sand or other material; or
 - (b) carry on, for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, sand or other material, any operation whereby an excavation is made, created or enlarged.
- 2. No person for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, sand or other material, shall quarry or excavate on any land within 66 yards or such greater distance (measured at right angles) as the Board in any particular case may specify, of either side of any road situate in the said road district.
- 3. Any excavation made for the quarrying of stone, gavel, sand or other material shall be kept free of stagnant water.
- 4. Where quarrying is carried on for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, sand or other material, the excavation shall be securely fenced and the gateways locked when not actually in use by the licensee so as to permit only authorised persons to enter the enclosed excavation.
- 5. All applications for a license must be accompanied by a plan of the area proposed to be excavated, such plan to show details of the levels, area of the proposed pits and approximate depth of material to be excavated. Any other information required by the Board in connection with the site shall be supplied on request by the applicant.
- 6. Before any license is issued for any quarrying or excavations, the applicant must deposit with the Board an amount not exceeding one hundred pounds (£100), such amount to be fixed by resolution of the Board and to be retained in trust by the Board until the requirements of paragraph 8 are complied with, and should any licensee fail to carry out such requirements, it shall be competent for the Board to have the necessary work carried out and deduct the cost thereof from the deposit held.

- 7. Persons holding licenses issued by the Board shall operate under the conditions set out in these by-laws and any non-compliance therewith shall render any such license null and void.
- 8. When the removal of materials from any excavation is completed the fioor of the excavated area shall be graded and levelled to an even surface and the sides shall be sloped down to a suitable batter to the satisfaction of the Board.

The removal of materials from an excavation shall be deemed to be completed—

- (a) when the area has been excavated to the extent of and in accordance with the area and depth shown on the plan accompanying the application for the license, or
- (b) if no material has been removed from the site for a period of two years from the date of the granting of the license or the last removal of material.
- 9. If any person, either by act or omission shall contravene these by-laws, or being the owner or occupier of property within the said road district, shall knowingly permit any act or omission on any property owned or occupied by him in contravention of these by-laws, he shall be guilty of an offence under these by-laws, and on conviction for such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).
