Order Restricting the Use of Water. (By-law 283A.)

I, JOHN TREZISE TONKIN, Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage, acting in exercise of the power conferred upon me by by-law 283A of the by-laws made and in force under the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1941, and on the advice of the Under Secretary for Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage, that in order to conserve the water supply some restriction of the use of water by consumers is necessary, do hereby order as follows:—

1. As from and including the 8th day of January,  $1954-\!\!\!\!$ 

(a) no person shall use water supplied under the Act in any place for watering any private lawn or garden by means of any mechanical or fixed sprinkler or fixed hose except between the hours of 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. and between the hours of 7 p.m. and 9 p.m., but during the remainder of

the day and night water supplied under the Act may be used for watering private lawns and gardens provided that the hose is held in the hand;

- (b) no local authority shall use water supplied under the Act on any day for watering garden or grass plots in streets within the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Area as constituted under the said Act, that is to say, the Metropolitan Area lying between Greenmount and Fremantle (both inclusive) and Armadale by means of any mechanical or fixed by means of any mechanical or fixed sprinkler or fixed hose, except between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon, but during the remainder of the day and night water may be used by hose held in the hand.
- (c) This order does not apply to market gar-dens, nurseries, bowling greens and tennis courts.

This order shall continue in full force and 2 operation until revoked by a subsequent order made by me under the said by-law 283A.

THE West Arthur Road Board under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

(1) In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the West Arthur Road Board.

(b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the armed forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere, between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and 3rd March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Board, provided that the requisite proof is produced.

(2) All present and future employees of the Board shall, after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof, commencing as from 15th day of September, 1949, be entitled to thirteen (13) weeks' long service leave, and the employee shall be entitled to full pay for the said 13 weeks.

(3) Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, which will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employees, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

(4) Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, provided the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

(5) Where any employee resigns, retires, or in the event of the death of an employee, the Board may pay to the employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representatives, or if there be none, to his dependants), a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under these bylaws to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement, or death, or if the Board, after consideration of all the circumstances, directs that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.

(6) An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

(7) (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wages for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Board may, at its discretion, either—

- (i) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave; or
- (ii) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

(8) All annual leave to which an employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form part of such long service leave. (9) Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this by-law shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

Provided that where any employee leaves the service of the Board, who has served continuously for one period of 10 years next before his retirement, he shall be paid long service leave pro rata for any additional period of service.



## IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

#### No. 26 of 1953.

## Between Musicians Association of Western Australia Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and His Majesty's Theatre Co., Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

#### Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

#### 1.---Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Musicians' Award."

## 3.--Scope.

This Award shall apply to musicians employed in or in connection with theatrical and vaudeville production and/or the production of concerts, general amusements and entertainments.

#### 4.—Area.

This Award shall apply within that portion of the State of Western Australia South of the 24th parallel of latitude.

#### 5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

## 6.—Definitions.

"Weekly employee" means a worker engaged for at least six (6) performances and/or rehearsals weekly.

"Conductor leader" means a member of an orchestra who plays and directs the orchestra.

"Casual employee" means a worker engaged otherwise than as a weekly employee.

"Leader" is the first and principal violin or other nominated player in an orchestra where there is a conductor.

#### 7.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service for weekly employees shall be by the week, and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side.

(b) All workers shall attend any performance and/or rehearsal as required by the employer.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this Award, a worker may be dismissed without notice for misconduct which, without limiting its general meaning shall include malingering, inefficiency or neglect of duty.

(d) Where a member of the orchestra is unable to attend any performance he shall arrange for a deputy, approved by the employer, to take his place. Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this Award, a deputy shall be paid the same rates as the member of the orchestra would have been paid had he attended for duty.

(e) Any member of the orchestra may be called upon to play on the stage during any performance, and shall be entitled to receive three shillings and threepence (3s. 3d.) extra per performance.

#### 8.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

## 9.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid weekly except in the case of casual workers who shall be paid on the completion of the work which they are engaged to do.

## 10.—Duration of Performances.

(a) Except on the first and last night of each programme the duration of the performance for which rates are prescribed in clause 14 hereof shall not exceed three (3) hours.

(b) (i) The performance shall be deemed to start at the time advertised for starting the performance, but if all the members of the orchestra (other than the conductor) are not present and ready to start at such time the performance shall be deemed to start only when each member of the orchestra actually starts playing.

(ii) Payment may be deducted from the wage of any worker for any time of non-attendance at any performance.

(c) The employer shall retain the right to check the score by replaying at the close of any per-formance. Where such replay occurs within the limit of three (3) hours set out in (a) above no extra payment shall be made provided that if the three hours are exceeded it shall be necessary to obtain the agreement of the orchestra to such replay and such time shall be paid for as provided in clause 12 hereof.

#### 11.—Duration of Rehearsals.

(a) The duration of any rehearsal shall not exceed three hours. Such rehearsal shall be held on any day in such periods as are agreed between the employer and the employees concerned. Where agreement is reached under this subclause the rehearsal shall be paid for at ordinary rates. A minimum of two hours shall be paid for each re-hearsal provided that the minimum for the first rehearsal for a complete change of programme shall be thus bours be three hours.

(b) (i) The rehearsal shall be deemed to start at the time notified by the employer as the starting time, but if all members of the orchestra (other than the conductor) are not present and ready to start at such time, the rehearsal shall be deemed to start only when the orchestra actually starts playing.

(ii) Payment may be deducted from the wage of any worker for any time of non-attendance at any rehearsal.

(c) Where a rehearsal exceeds two hours in duration an interval of at least ten minutes shall be allowed during the rehearsal. The period of such interval shall be counted as time worked.

## 12.—Overtime.

(a) Except where provided in clauses 10 and 11 and in subclause (b) hereof, any time worked outside the limit of any performance or rehearsal shall be paid for at the rate of twenty per cent. (20%) in addition to the ordinary rate for any perform-ance or rehearsal, with a minimum payment of fifteen minutes.

(b) Where the limit of any performance or re-hearsal is exceeded by five minutes or less such period shall not be counted as overtime worked.

#### 13.—Sundays and Public Holidays.

(a) Except as provided for in subclause (c) and in clause 11 (a) hereof all work done on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, Labour Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(b) Except as provided for in subclause (c) and in clause 11 (a) hereof, all work done on New Year's Day, Australia Day, Easter Monday, State Foundation Day, Anastana Day, Easter Monday, State Foundation Day, Anzac Day, Boxing Day, and any other day proclaimed as a public holiday through-out the State under the Factories and Shops Act, 1920-1952, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

(c) Where the regular rehearsal is held on a Sunday or holiday, the payment to be made in respect thereof shall be five shillings (5s.) in addition to the ordinary wage covering such rehearsal. Provided that for the purposes of this subclause, a regular rehearsal shall be deemed to be one agreed upon between the employer and the workers concerned or in default of such agreement with the Executive of the Union.

#### 14.—Wages.

The minimum rate of wages payable to workers covered by this Award shall be as follows:-

(4) Provided that, in respect to any basic wage variations which may occur from time to time, the margins prescribed for female employees shall be increased or decreased by the amount required to enable the total wage prescribed for female em-ployees to increase or decrease by the same amount that the basic wage for male employees is increased or decreased as a result of such variation in order that the rates for male and female employees shall remain equal.

(5) Each three hour rehearsal not included by the option of the employer in a week's work in (1), (2) or (3) above shall be paid for at the rate of seven and a half per cent.  $(7\frac{1}{2}\%)$  of the rate set out in (2) (a) above.

(6) Casual employees shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed herein.

(7) Doubling.—Where an employee plays one or more extra instruments he shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per performance in addition to the rates prescribed herein. Provided that the flute and prescribed herein. Provided that the flute and piccolo are not extra to each other nor are other instruments extra to each other which the Union and the employer agree are not to be considered extra.

(8) Relaying.—Except as hereinafter provided, where an employee is engaged in any perform-ance in a place of entertainment and such performance is relayed, he shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per performance in addition to the rates prescribed herein. Provided that this amount shall only be paid when the relay is sponsored and the employer receives payment to cover the payment of such five shillings.

(9) (a) Conductor-leaders shall be paid thirtyfive per cent. (35%) in addition to the rates pre-scribed in subclause (1) (a), (2) (a), (3) (a) hereof for a member of the orchestra.

(b) Leaders in an orchestra where there is a conductor shall be paid twenty per cent. (20%) in addition to the rates prescribed in subclauses (1) (a), (2) (a) and (3) (a) hereof for a member of the orchestra.

(10) Pianist Playing Alone.—A pianist being a regular member of the orchestra employed addition-ally for voice trials and similar work shall be paid 1/30th of the rates set out in (2) (a) above per hour. A pianist so employed, not being a regular member of the orchestra, shall be paid 2s. 9d. per hour in addition to the foregoing rate. A minimum payment of one hour shall be made if the pianist is a member of the orchestra and is required to attend immediately before or after a general rehearsal for the orchestra, and a minimum of two hours in other cases: Provided that in the case of vaudeville revue playing not less than four consecutive weeks, an employer may enter into an agreement with a pianist where more than one of such rehearsals is required or where circumstances will not permit a normal rehearsal to be conducted to pay on a basis satisfactory to both parties: Provided further that any such agreement shall pro-vide for a minimum rate per hour not less than the amounts set out above.

## 15.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any holiday prescribed in this Award falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after thirteen (13) weeks' continuous serworker lawfully leaves his employment, or his em-ployment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(e) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 16 — Travelling

(a) When an employee is engaged to perform work outside a thirty (30) mile radius of the city or town where engagement is made the employer shall pay all fares. Fares shall be first class, except when travelling by coastal boat, when saloon fares shall be paid.

(b) Employees when travelling by train at night shall be provided with sleeping accommodation.

(c) When an employee is engaged at such a distance that he cannot return to his home each night, he shall be paid a living allowance of £5 5s. per week, or if the period is less than one week at the rate of £1 1s. per day of twenty-four (24) hours. Provided that where meals are supplied when travelling by boat, train or air the foregoing rates shall be halved.

(d) Where an employee is engaged for a con-tinuous period of thirteen (13) weeks or more in one city or town the employee shall only be entitled to the allowance prescribed in subclause (c) hereof for the first fourteen (14) days of such period.

(e) The employer shall pay the reasonable costs of safely transporting the double bass, drums or other bulky instruments of a similar nature when such instruments are to be used for the purpose of the employment.

#### 17.—Uniforms.

Where an employee is required to wear special uniform other than evening dress, such uniform shall be supplied by the employer.

## 18.—Time and Wages Record.

(a) Each employer shall keep a time and wages book showing the name of each worker, the nature of his employment, the hours worked each day and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

(b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union during usual office hours. One day's notice shall be given to the employer of any intended inspection.

## 19.—No Discrimination.

(a) When engaging a musician, the employer shall not discriminate against the members of the Union.

(b) The employer shall at all times give preference of employment to members of the Union.

#### IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

#### No. 28 of 1953

Between West Australian Municipal, Road Board, Parks and Racecourse Employees' Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and The Karra-katta Cemetery Board and The Fremantle Cemetery Board, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dis-pute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

(Note.--Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement".)

#### 1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Cemetery Employees' Award, 1953," and replaces Award No. 42 of 1951

#### 3.-Scope.

This Award shall apply to the workers employed by the Respondents following the vocations prescribed in clause 11 of this Award.

#### 4.—Area.

This Award shall operate over a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

#### 5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one (1) year from the date hereof.

#### 6.—Hours.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five (5) or five and one half  $(5\frac{1}{2})$  days at the option of the employer.

(b) Such hours shall be worked between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, and between 8 a.m. and 12 o'clock noon on Saturday.

(c) The lunch break shall not exceed one (1) hour and shall be taken between 12 o'clock noon and 1 p.m.

(d) The starting and finishing times shall be such as are mutually agreed upon between the employer and his workers.

## 7.—Overtime.

(a) Subject to clause 8 all time worked outside the ordinary hours of duty shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four () hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—

- (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
- (ii) no organisation, party to this Award or or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause;
- (iii) this subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

8.—Saturday, Sunday and Holiday Work.

- (a) Saturdays:-
  - (i) Five-day week workers recalled for work on Saturday mornings shall be paid overtime rates with a minimum of two (2) hours.
  - (ii) All time worked after 12 o'clock noon on Saturdays shall be paid for at overtime rates with a minimum of two (2) hours: Provided that the two (2) hour minimum payment shall not apply where such work after 12 o'clock noon consists merely of finishing off a task.
- (iii) All time between the time of commencing duty and finally ceasing duty for the day shall, with the exception of the meal break, count as time worked.

(b) Sunday and Holiday Work:

- (i) Workers recalled for work on Sundays and/or any of the holidays named in clause
  9 shall be paid double time rates with a minimum of two (2) hours.
- (ii) All time between the time of commencing duty and finally ceasing duty for the day shall, with the exception of the meal break. count as time worked.

#### 9.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to clause 7 (b) and clause 8 (b) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(d) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 10.—Exhumations.

(a) For each body lifted the sum of two pounds  $(\pounds 2)$  shall be paid provided that this shall not apply to stillborn exhumations where the sum of ten shillings (10s.) shall be paid for each body lifted.

(b) In the case of two or more workers being required to perform the tasks referred to in subclause (a) of this clause, the prescribed amounts shall be equally divided.

#### 12.—Higher Duties.

A worker called upon to perform higher duties for which a higher rate is prescribed than that which such worker is in receipt of, shall be paid the higher rate for such time as the worker actually performs such higher duties.

#### 13.—Casual Worker.

A worker employed for a period of less than one (1) week (exclusive of overtime worked) shall be classed as a casual worker, and shall be paid five per cent. (5%) in addition to the rates herein prescribed: Provided that this provision shall not apply in the case of a worker dismissed for misconduct or incompetence.

#### 14.—Part-time Workers.

Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this Award workers may be employed on a parttime basis and the following conditions shall apply:—

(a) The Union shall be advised in writing by the employer immediately such worker is engaged and the advice shall state the approximate hours such worker shall be employed.

(b) Part-time workers shall be paid on an hourly basis, the hourly rate being one-fortieth (1/40th) of the rates prescribed in clause 11.

(c) Payment of annual leave, public holidays and sick pay shall be strictly related proportionately in accordance with the number of hours worked to the conditions prescribed for full-time workers.

(d) Work performed on Sundays or on any of the holidays prescribed by this Award shall be paid for at double time rates.

(e) Leave is granted to either party to apply at any time during the currency of this Award to amend, add to or delete any or all of the provisions of this clause.

## 15.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wages than the minimum prescribed for his class of work.

#### 16.—Clothing.

Grave diggers and truck drivers shall be supplied with oilskin coats for their use in the performance of their duties in winter months. Such coats shall remain the property of the employer and if required shall be returned to the employer at the cessation of work each day.

#### 17.-Contract of Service.

Except in the case of casual workers and parttime workers one week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the contract of service: Provided that an employer may at any time summarily dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct or if after receiving the prescribed notice he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to receiving such notice.

#### 18.—Record.

(a) The employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his office a record containing:—

- (i) The name of each worker employed by him and to whom this Award applies.
- (ii) The class of work performed by each worker.
- (iii) The hours during which the worker is employed and the wages, overtime and allowances paid to such worker.

(b) Such record may be inspected at any time during working hours by the Secretary of the Union or other authorised person. (c) The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the correct posting of the record daily.

#### 19.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid in the employers' time at times mutually agreed upon between the workers and their respective employers.

## 20.-Sick Leave.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker's compensation Act. (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence in the same year, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

## 21.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

#### 22.-Board of Reference.

For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute the function of :—

(a) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award or any of them.

(b) Dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.
