WHEREAS it is enacted by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted) that the Governor may, by Proclamation, declare any

Corr. No. 7/49—That reserve No. 23879 (Gabbin Lot 40) should vest in and be held by the Mount Marshall Road Board in trust for the purpose of a Sheep Dip Site.

Corr. No. 7924/00, V3—That class "A" reserve No. 4813 (excluding Cockburn Sound Location 1717) at Point Walter should vest in and be held by the Melville Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation.††

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned Road Boards in trust for the aforesaid purposes, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

TRAFFIC ACT, 1919-1952.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting pursuant to the powers conferred by the Traffic Act, 1919-1952, has been pleased to make the regulations set out in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

- 1. In these regulations the Traffic Regulations, 1936, as published in the Government Gazette on the 26th day of August, 1936, and duly amended from time to time thereafter, are referred to as the principal regulations.
- The principal regulations are amended by adding a regulation numbered 43A to follow regulation 43 as follows:
 - (1) A person shall not drive or stand or use on a road a motor vehicle registered for the first time on or after the first day of January, 1955, unless the glass, if any, fitted to the windshield or any window or interior partition of the vehicle is safety glass.
 - (2) In this regulation "safety glass" means glass of a quality known or reputed, within the motor trade, to be so manufactured, constructed or treated that, when fractured, the broken pieces thereof will tend to hold together and not scatter or break into sharp fragments likely to cause injury to any person.

 (3) This regulation does not apply to the rear window of a motor
 - car designed to seat seven passengers or less.
- 3. The principal regulations are amended by adding a regulation numbered 54B, to follow regulation 54A as follows:
 - 54B. On and after the 31st day of March, 1954, a person shall not drive or stand or in any manner use on a road a vehicle which, together with the equipment or load (if any) thereon, is seven feet or more in width, and which has a body of the tray type, unless there is displayed by painting or otherwise, a band of white or silver colour having a uniform width of at least three inches and extending horizontally along the full extent of the rearmost side of the vehicle.
- The principal regulations are amended by adding a regulation numbered 69A to follow regulation 69 as follows:-
 - 69A. A person shall not drive a vehicle on a road through smoke, fog or mist, unless he has the headlamp or headlamps of the vehicle alight and he intermittently sounds the horn of the vehicle.
- The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation 298 and substituting therefor the following regulation:-
 - 298. No person shall drive a hard of cattle or flock of sheep on a road within a radius of three miles of the Town Hall in the City of Perth or within a radius of one and a half miles of the Town Hall in the City of Fremantle.
 - 6. Regulations 301 and 301A of the principal regulations are revoked.
- The principal regulations are amended by revoking regulation 305DD and substituting therefor the following regulation:-
 - A person shall not drive a vehicle, other than a motor car, motor cycle or push cycle, over any of the bridges described hereunder and situated within the Armadale-Kelmscott Road District:
 - (i) The bridge over the Canning River on Road No. 2051 known as Turner Road.
 - (ii) The bridge over the Canning River on Road No. 1320 Orlando Street (near Kelmscott Police Station) and also known as Canning Mills Road.

By-law No. 69 (Buildings)—Amendment.

L.G. 201/53.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1953, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Bunbury hereby order that by-law No. 69 (Buildings) be amended as follows, by adding after clause 45 (d) of Part 2:—

- 45A. (i) No person shall erect any verandah over any public footway within the Municipality of Bunbury without having first obtained the consent of the Council, to be signified by the issue of a license in the form of Appendix C hereto.
- (ii) Any person desiring to obtain the consent of the Council to the erection of such a verandah, shall deposit with the Building Surveyor a plan, elevation, section, and specification showing in detail the proposed construction of such verandah, and the manner in which it is proposed to secure it to the building to which it is proposed to be attached.
- (iii) No such verandah shall hereafter be erected unless it conforms to the standard design, which has been settled and approved by the Council and deposited in the office of the building surveyor: Provided that the strength of the materials used in the construction of any such verandah and the design thereof may, subject to the approval of the building surveyor, be varied according to circumstances.
- (iv) The minimum height of any verandah hereafter erected shall be 11ft. from the top of the kerb to the underside of the signboard. In the case of sloping ground the height shall be measured at the centre of the frontage: Provided that if the frontage shall exceed 20ft., a break in the verandah shall be made if so directed by the building surveyor.
- (v) All verandahs in a street shall be erected of a uniform height and width. Subject to the last preceding section, the standard height and width of verandahs in each street shall be fixed by the
- (vi) In the construction of every such verandah the following conditions shall be complied with:—
 - (a) The roof shall be covered with 24-gauge galvanised corrugated iron. The gutters shall be lined with galvanised plain iron not lighter than 24-gauge, and shall be of a capacity sufficient to carry off all rain or storm-water. Such capacity shall in no case be less than 27 square inches.
 - (b) Down-pipes shall be of 24-gauge galvanised iron, with a minimum area of nine square inches. The inlets from the gutters to the down-pipes shall be at least twice the area of the downpipes and shall be funnel-shaped. Special provisions shall be made for the head of the downpipes; the lower length of such downpipes shall be 18-gauge at least, and to a height of 6ft. above the footpath shall be of cast iron or concrete, and the portion thereof carrying water under the footpath shall be of wrought iron or concrete.
 - (c) The ceiling shall be of approved non-inflammable materials securely fixed to the wood joists, which shall be of 4in x 2in spaced not more than 2ft centres, running parallel with the footpath and secured to the steel framing. All ceilings to be flat and level.

(d) The hanging bolts are to be 13in, in diameter attached to the framing, as shown, and securely bolted to the building and provided with a union screw, all quite

(vii) The fascia or signboard of every such verandah is to be framed as shown in the Council's standard design as referred to in subclause (iii) hereof and covered with 24-gauge galvanised iron neatly fitted over the framing, and a flashing of 5 lb. lead must be fixed over the factory. the top as shown.

(viii) Whenever a proposed verandah will abut on to an existing verandah, it shall be so finished as to prevent rain from falling between such verandans. Provided that when the existing verandah is shorter by not more than 1ft, than the frontage of the building to which it is attached, the person erecting the new verandah shall make the necessary extension to the existing one.

- (ix) Whenever the end of a verandah abuts on to the end of a right-of-way, street, or public place, the signboard shall be curved and returned along such end to the satisfaction of the building surveyor, but so that no part of the verandah shall be within 6in of the boundary of any such rightof-way, street, or public place.
- (x) No writing, printing, or trade notice of any description shall be exhibited on any portion of the verandah, except on the outer face of the signboard and/or upon signboards under the ceiling of the verandah securely and rigidly fixed to the ceiling at right angles to the building line and having a maximum depth of 12in. and at a dis-tance of 12ft. between one another. No paper, bill, or calico sign shall be placed or exhibited on any verandah unless the consent in writing of the building surveyor shall have been first obtained.
- (xi) The owner or occupier for the time being of any building against or in front of which there is any verandah, whether constructed before or after the passing of this by-law, shall keep the verandah clean, painted, and in good repair, and it shall be lawful for the surveyor to give notice to the owner or occupier of the said building to clean, paint, or repair such verandah whenever in his opinion such cleaning, painting or repairing is required.

Augusta-Margaret River Road Board.

By-laws governing Long Service Leave to be granted to Employees of the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board.

L.G. 346/52.

THE Augusta-Margaret River Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

- 1. In the interpretation of the by-laws, the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—
 - (a) "Board" means the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board. "Employee" means and includes all persons employed in any capacity by the Board, and who are in the regular and full-time employ of the Board.
 - (b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of the Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board.
- 2. All present and future employees of the Board shall, after each period of 10 years' continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof commencing from 11th August, 1951, be entitled to three months' long service leave, and no long service leave shall be granted to an employee without a qualifying period of 10 years being first completed.
- 3. (a) The Board may grant long service leave to an employee of the Board who has been granted long service leave for 10 years' continuous service if, before a further period of 10 years' continuous service is reached, such employee retires from the Board's service owing to having reached the retiring age of 65 years, or is retired on the grounds of ill-health, or dismissed through staff retrenchments, in which case the long service leave may be adjusted pro rata.

Provided that no such grant shall be made to an employee of the Board who prior to completing a further period of 10 years' continuous service resigns his employment with the Board.

- (b) The long service leave which may be granted under this by-law shall be for a period not exceeding one and three-tenths weeks for every completed year of service since the conclusion of the period of service which qualified the employee for list previous long service leave, and shall be on full pay.
- 4. An employee dismissed by the Board for neglect of duty or for irregular practices shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.
- 5. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.
- 6. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far possible meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.
- 7. In the event of the retirement or death of an employee, the Board may pay to such employee (or in case of death, to his personal representatives, or if there be none, to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board is empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his retirement or death, or if the Board after consideration of all the circumstances, direct that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee of a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.
- 8. (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.
- (b) The Board may, at its discretion, either (1) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.
- 9. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form part of such long service leave.
- 10. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the employee for a further term and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this by-law shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave
