WHEREAS it is enacted by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted) that the Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted) that the Governor may, by proclamation, declare any Crown lands to be Reserves for Natives under the Native Administration Act, 1905-1936, and abolish any reserve so declared; and whereas by proclamation issued and published in the Government Gazette on the 20th day of November, 1936, the Lieutenant-Governor declared an area at Moora more particularly described as reserve No. 16359 and defined in the schedule to such proclamation, to be a Reserve for Natives: and whereas it is now deemed desirfor Natives; and whereas it is now deemed desirable and expedient to abolish the said reserve: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905–1947 (Reprinted), do hereby abolish the Reserve for Natives as declared and described and defined in the hemispheres. in the hereinbefore mentioned proclamation pub-lished in the Government Gazette of the 20th day of November, 1936, as aforesaid.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule

hereto for a period of five years from date of publication of this proclamation in the Government Gazette.

#### Schedule.

All that area of water bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Northern side of the Denison Townsite jetty and the shore of the Indian Ocean and extending generally North-Easterly along that shoreline to a point West of the Northernmost corner of Denison Sub Lot 48; thence West for a distance of 20 chains; thence generally South-West-erly, parallel to the shoreline, to a point 20 chains West of the Northernmost extremity of Leander Point; thence East to that point and thence generally North-Easterly along the shoreline as aforesaid to the starting point. ### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for inthat such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at surance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury, securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 13; and whereas Australian Mutual Provident Society, Western Aus-tralian Branch, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly, in accordance with the regulations, made application for exemption from the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Certificate of Title Volume 478, Folio 98, in which is comprised an estate in fee simple in all that piece of land being portion of Perth Town Lot G1, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt the Australian Mutual Provident Society, Western Australia Branch, from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, for a period expiring on the 17th day of November, 1955.

## Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay comensation under this Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas The National Bank of Australasia Limited whereas The National Bank of Australasia Limited of St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of section 13 of the Act and as such subject to the provisions of section 13 has duly, in accordance with the regulations made under duly, in accordance with the regulations made under the Act, made application for exemption from the operation of section 13 aforesaid, and has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the Act and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond for £5,000 charged with all payments to become due under the liability. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt The National Bank of Australasia Limited from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, for a period expiring on the 31st day of December, 1955.

## Forests Act, 1918. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 814/49.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:-

(a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.

(b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposals dated the 24th day of September, 1949, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposals had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposals should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest No. 16 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the Schedule hereto.

#### Schedule.

All that portion of State Forest No. 16 comprising about 38 acres bounded by lines commencing at the North-Eastern corner of Wellington Location 1116 and extending Westerly 510.7 links along the Northernmost boundary of that location; thence Northerly 3,912 links and Easterly 1,432 links along part of the Eastern boundary of location 918 and part of the Southern boundary of location 1113 to the South-Eastern corner of the latter location; thence South-Westerly about 4,019.6 links to the starting point. (Subject to survey.) (Plan 383D/40, AB4.)

Constitution Act, 1889.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889, whereby the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which by Act of Legislature or by Order in Council may be vested in the heads of departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the appointment of persons as employees of the Forests Department and its branches at a daily or weekly rate of wages should be vested in Owen William Loneragan or any person appointed to temporarily act in place of such officer: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby vests in Owen William Loneragan and any person appointed temporarily to act in place of such officer the appointment of persons as employees of the Forests Department and its branches at a daily or weekly rate of wages.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order under the authority of section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1953, namely, that the Municipality of Kalgoorlie is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:—

- (5) Paragraph (xiv) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act imposing a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds or imprisonment not exceeding one month with or without hard labour for the breach of any regulation.

## EMERGENCY NOTICE TO MARINERS.

Western Australia-Port of Fremantle.

Royal Visit, 1954.

Issued under the Authority of the Naval Officer in Charge, West Australian Area, and the Fremantle Harbour Trust.

#### 1.—General.

During the visit of Her Majesty the Queen and His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh to Western Australia certain special arrangements for the control of water traffic in the Port of Fremantle will be necessary. These special arrangements are detailed below and the instructions contained therein must be observed by all masters and owners of ships and vessels and skippers and owners of small craft.

#### 2.—S.S. Gothic—Security Arrangements.

(a) Passes Required to Board.—During the period Monday, 29th March, 1954, to Thursday, 1st April, 1954 (inclusive) S.S. Gothic will be berthed between B and C berths, Victoria Quay. The berth will be

barricaded off on the landward side and only those persons having official business on board and holding a special pass issued by competent authority will be permitted to pass the barricades or board the vessel. Persons (other than Service personnel) whose business requires them to pass the barricades or board the vessel should apply to the ship's agents (Shaw, Savill and Albion Co. Ltd.) by 15/3/1954; Service personnel should apply to the Naval Officer in Charge.

(b) Approach of Craft Prohibited.—During the period given in (a) above, a prohibited area extending approximately 100ft. to seaward of the vessel will be established, marked by buoys and patrolled by an armed naval launch. No vessel or craft, unless specially authorised to do so by the Naval Officer in Charge, may enter the prohibited area.

3.—Departure of Her Majesty the Queen and His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh.

(a) Port to be Closed.

(i) The inner harbour of Fremantle will be closed to all movements of shipping from 12 noon on Thursday, 1st April, until about 6 p.m. on that day. The "Port Closed" signal (three black balls one below the other, and 6ft. apart), will be hoisted

at the Signal Station at 12 noon and hauled down when the port is re-opened after S.S. Gothic and the naval escort are clear of the harbour.

(ii) During this period no vessel or craft other than those specially authorised to do so by the Naval Officer in Charge or the Fremantle Harbour Trust and small craft taking part in the marine farewell (see paragraph 4 below) may move within the inner harbour.

#### (b) Prohibited Area in Vicinity of Saluting Battery.

A gun salute will be fired from a battery at the outer extremity of the north mole as Her Majesty departs in S.S. Gothic. All craft are prohibited from approaching within 200 yards to seaward of the battery from 4.30 p.m. on 1st April, 1954, until completion of the salute.

## (c) Vessels and Craft to keep clear of S.S. Gothic and Naval Escort.

The naval escort will commence leaving the inner harbour at 3.45 p.m. and will form up in Gage Roads. S.S. Gothic with Her Majesty on board will proceed about 5.10 p.m. Mariners and others concerned are warned that while proceeding and taking up escort formation the vessels will not be fully free to manoeuvre and care is to be taken not to impede their mercents. (See also The not to impede their movements. (See also Prohibited Area, paragraph 6 below.)

## 4.—Special Arrangements for Yachts and Small Craft.

#### Special Notice to be Issued.

Arrangements have been made for a marine farewell to Her Majesty to take place on Thursday, 1st April, with a rehearsal on Sunday, 21st March, 1954. A special notice giving full details of these arrangements will be issued, but the following outline in the state of the second state of the second state. line is published for the information of those concerned.

## 5.—Area set apart for Small Craft.

#### (a) For Craft at Anchor.

(i) Between No. 1 berth, North Wharf, and No. 5 berth, North Wharf, and within a line parallel to the wharf marked by buoys laid 150ft. from the face of the wharf.

(ii) Between the South Mole and the beacon and buoys marking the southern edge of the shipping

channel.

#### (b) For Craft under Way.

(i) The area to the eastward of an imaginary line drawn from the light tower on the North Mole to Hall Bank buoy and thence to a position one mile eastward of Fairway buey and thence to the shore but excluding the prohibited area in the vicinity of the North Mole saluting battery. (See paragraph 3 (b) above.)

(ii) The area to the southward of an imaginary line formed by the transit of the light tower on the South Mole and the war memorial extended to a point  $261^{\circ}$  (true) one to three miles from the light tower and to the eastward of a line drawn from this point northwards to a position one mile west of Hall Bank buoy and thence to a position one mile westward of Fairway buoy.

-In the event of adverse weather being experienced it may be necessary to close certain of the above areas. Instructions in this regard will be given by the patrol craft to all concerned.

### 6.—Prohibited Area for Vessels and Small Craft.

From 3.30 p.m. on Thursday, 1st April, 1954, until S.S. Gothic and the escort are clear, the area delineated below is prohibited to vessels and small craft.

The area enclosed by imaginary lines drawn from the light tower on the North Mole to Hall Bank buoy thence in a northerly direction to a position one mile eastward of Fairway buoy thence in a Westerly direction to a position one mile westward of Fairway buoy thence in a southerly direction to a point one mile westward of Hall Bank buoy thence in a south-easterly direction to a point 261° (true) to these miles from the light tower on the one to three miles from the light tower on the South Mole thence in an easterly direction to the light tower on South Mole.

#### Patrol Craft.

Patrol craft (to be distinguished by a white fiag with the letter "M" in red in the centre) will patrol the areas allocated to small craft and the prohibition area and instructions issued by the officers in charge of these craft are to be followed by all concerned. The officers in charge are authorised to remove, by force if necessary, any craft failing to carry out instructions to carry out instructions.

## 8.—Craft to be Seaworthy, etc.

All craft taking part in the marine farewell are All craft taking part in the marine farewell are to be in a seaworthy condition and provided with efficient anchors and ground tackle sufficient for anchoring in 40ft. of water. The officers in charge of patrol craft are authorised to remove any craft considered to be overloaded, or otherwise unseaworthy or without adequate anchors.

#### 9.—Closing of Harbour Bridge.

The railway bridge will be closed to all water traffic (other than official craft specially authorised) from 3 p.m. on Thursday, 1st April, until S.S. Gothic is clear of the inner harbour. All craft from up river wanting to take part in the marine farewell must clear the bridge by 3 p.m.

## 10.—Departure of S.S. Gothic.

A close escort of naval work-boats will be provided for S.S. Gothic as the vessel leaves the harbour. No other craft is to approach within 100 yards of the vessel and all craft are to take particular care not to impede her safe navigation and to carry out immediately any instructions given by efficer in charge of the close escort or patrol craft.

#### 11.—Dispersal of Small Craft.

At approximately 5.30 p.m. the dispersal signal for small craft (a large black cone from the north yardarm) will be exhibited from the Signal Station. Small craft will then be required to clear the inner harbour and entrance channel as soon as possible.

- 1. As from and including the 22nd day of February, 1954—
  - (a) no person shall use water supplied under the Act in any place for watering any private lawn or garden within the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Area as constituted under the said Act, that is to say, the metropolitan area lying between Greenmount and Fremantle (both inclusive) and Armadale by means of any mechanical or fixed sprinkler or fixed hose except between the hours of 6 a.m. and 8 a.m. and between the hours of 7 p.m. and 9 p.m.; watering by hose held in the hand is permitted at any time;
  - (b) No local authority or other body shall use water supplied under the Act on any day for watering gardens or grass plots in the streets within the metropolitan area by means of any mechanical or fixed sprinkler or fixed hose except between the hours of 8 a.m. and 12 noon; watering by hose held in the hand is permitted at any time.
  - (c) This order does not apply to market gardens, nurseries, bowling greens and tennis courts.
- 2. This order shall continue in full force and operation until revoked by a subsequent order made by me under the said by-law 283A.

## ROAD DISTRICTS ACT, 1919-1951. Mundaring Road Board.

By-laws Governing Long Service Leave to be Granted to Employees of the Mundaring Road Board.

L.G. 903/53.

THE Mundaring Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, and all other powers enabling it, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

- 1. In the interpretation of the by-laws, the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—
- (a) "Board" means the Mundaring Road Board. "Employee" means and includes all persons employed in any capacity by the Board, and who are in the regular and full-time employ of the Board.
- (b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of the Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board.
- 2. All present and future employees of the Board shall, after each period of 10 years continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof commencing from the 1st day of January, 1944, be entitled to three months' long service leave, and no long service leave shall be granted to an employee without a qualifying period of 10 years being first completed.
- 3. (a) The Board may grant long service leave to an employee of the Board who has been granted long service leave for 10 years' continuous service if, before a further period of 10 years' continuous service is reached, such employee retires from the Board's service owing to having reached the retiring age of 65 years, or is retired on the grounds of ill-health, or dismissed through staff retrenchments, in which case the long service leave may be adjusted pro rata.

Provided that no such grant shall be made to an employee of the Board who prior to completing a further period of 10 years' continuous service resigns his employment with the Board.

(b) The long service leave which may be granted under this by-law shall be for a period not exceeding one and three-tenths weeks for every completed year of service since the conclusion of the period of service which qualified the employee for his previous long service leave, and shall be on full pay.

- 4. An employee dismissed by the Board for neglect of duty or for irregular practices shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.
- 5. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, providing the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.
- 6a. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, who will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.
- 6b. Long service leave shall be taken by every employee within 12 months of its becoming due, and if not so taken, the employee shall not begin to qualify for further long service leave until resumption of duty after taking the long service leave already due to him. Provided that with the express approval of the Board, an employee may be allowed to accumulate long service leave up to, but not exceeding six months.
- 7. In the event of the retirement or death of an employee, the Board may pay to such employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representatives, or if there be none, to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board is empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his retirement or death, or if the Board after consideration of all the circumstances, direct that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.
- 8. (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wage for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.
- (b) The Board may, at its discretion, either (1) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or (2) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.
- 9. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled or will become entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form part of such long service leave.
- 10. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this subclause shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

#### DOG ACT, 1903-1948.

Rockingham Road Board—By-law.

#### L.G. 1383/52.

PURSUANT to an Order in Council promulgated in the Government Gazette on the 23rd October, 1953, under section 35A of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, and in exercise of all other powers thereto enabling it the Rockingham Road Board doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws for the establishment of a dog pound and the control of dogs within the area of the Rockingham Road Board.

- 1. In these by-laws the term "Board" shall mean the Rockingham Road Board.
- 2. The Board may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1948.
- 3. A dog seized by the Police or by an officer authorised by the Board may be placed in a pound.
- 4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Board shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.
- 5. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog, then upon payment of the fees specified in the Schedule hereto the dog shall be released to such person.
- 6. The poundkeeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Board.
- 7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the pound keeper or other officer authorised by the Board the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The pound keeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Board in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.
- 8. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being seized or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner the pound keeper or other officer authorised by the Board may sell such dog.
- 9. Upon the sale of a dog the proceeds of sale shall be the property of the Board and may be disposed of in such manner as the Board thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Board in respect of the proceeds thereof.
- 10. If within the times mentioned in by-law 8 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid and the said fees paid and if no offer has been received for its purchase the dog may be destroyed.
- 11. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, any dog seized or impounded may at any time be destroyed upon the authority of the Secretary of the Board if in the opinion of the Secretary the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease, or sickness.
- 12. If the Board shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner, whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay to the Board the fee specified in the Schedule hereto.
  - 13. No person shall-
    - (a) unless a pound keeper or other officer of the Board duly authorised in that regard release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;
    - (b) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;

- (c) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dogproof any dog cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding or conveying dogs which have been seized.
- 14. The owner of a dog shall keep such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.
- 15. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—
  - (a) A public building.
  - (b) A theatre or picture gardens.
  - (c) A house of worship.
  - (d) A shop or other public business premises.
- 16. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—
  - (a) A sports ground.
  - (b) An area set aside for public recreation.
  - (c) A car park.
  - (d) A school.
  - (e) Any land vested in or under the control of the Board other than a road.
- 17. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Board or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.
- 18. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these bylaws.
- 19. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall upon conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.
