WHEREAS under section 2 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (Reprinted), "Native Instition" means and includes any mission, reformatory, orphanage, school, home, station, reserve, or other orphanage, school, home, station, reserve, or other institutions for the benefit, protection or care of the native inhabitants of the State declared by proclamation to be a Native Institution for the purpose of this Act: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, hereby declare the Karalundi Mission, via Meekatharra, to be an Institution within the meaning of the said section.

Corr. No. 6538/03.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1953, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed or grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette; and whereas it is deemed expedient that Reserve No. 8789 for the purpose of Recreation should be placed under the control of the Tammin Road Board as a board of management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned reserve under the control of the Tammin Road Board as a board of management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturing there-on or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 2 of 1954.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Mount Barker Co-operative Limited; Westralian Farmers Co-operative Limited and Tropical Traders and Patersons Limited, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include occurs "Agreement").

This Award shall be known as the "Apple and Pear Packing Industry" Award and replaces Award No. 35 of 1947 (as amended).

Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers employed by the employers in the apple and pear packing and storing industry, provided that it shall not apply to any orchardist packing apples and pears on his own property; provided further that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952.

4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over that portion of the State of Western Australia comprised within the South-West Land Division thereof.

5.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of one (1) year commencing as from the beginning of the first pay period after the date hereof.

6.-Contract of Service.

- (a) Except in the case of casual workers one (1) week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the engagement provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders or for misconduct.
- (b) The services of a casual worker, namely, a worker who is employed for less than one week may be terminated by giving one hour's notice, provided that any worker other than a worker who is notified at the end of the day that his services are no longer required, who presents himself for work shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours.
- (c) Casual worker shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed in Clause

7.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised without the consent of the employer, more than once in any one week.

8.—Posting Award and Union Notices.

The shop steward shall not be prevented from posting a copy of this Award or any notice of the Union, not exceeding fourteen (14) inches by nine (9) inches in a suitable place agreed upon between the employer and the Union. Failing agreement in this connection, the Board of Reference shall decide where the copy of the Award or the said notice shall be posted.

9.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a record containing the following particulars:-

- (a) the name of each worker;
- (b) the class of work performed;
- (c) the hours worked each day;
- (d) the wage (and overtime if any) paid;
- (e) the age of each junior worker.

Such record shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the Union.

10.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the Board of Re-

ference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision the worker shall be entitled to work for the employer at the proposed lesser rate.

11.—Higher Duties.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that which he or she usually performs shall be entitled to the higher rate whilst so employed.

12.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers upon being engaged shall if required furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:-

(a) name in full;

(b) age and date of birth;

(c) name of each previous employer and length of service with each employer;

(d) class of work performed for each previous employer.

Such of the foregoing particulars as are within the knowledge of the employer shall be endorsed on the certificate and signed by the employer upon request of the worker. No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age or length of service of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any worker shall wilfully misstate his age or length of service in the above certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

13.—Breakdowns Etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions, affiliated with it or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

14.—No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was beng paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

15.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint for the purpose of this Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each such Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by regulations.

There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Award the functions of:-

- (a) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (b) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 which for the purpose are embodied in this Award.

16.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Worker's Compensation Act.

- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

17.—Hours.

- (a) The ordinary working hours shall not exceed forty (40) per week to be worked in five (5) days, Monday to Friday, inclusive.
- (b) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break for a meal.
- (c) No day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours to be worked between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.: Provided that in the case of cleaners the ordinary hours of work may be performed outside the hours set out above

18.—Shift Work.

- (a) When shift work is worked, the starting and finishing times may be fixed from time to time by agreement in writing between the employer and the union, or failing agreement by the Board of Refer-
- (b) One shilling (1s.) per shift extra shall be paid to shift workers (other than day shift workers) whose shifts do not rotate.
- (c) No worker under sixteen (16) years of age shall be employed as a shift worker.

19.—Overtime.

- (a) Except in the case of pieceworkers, all work performed before the usual starting time or after the usual finishing time or beyond eight (8) hours on any day, Monday to Friday inclusive, and all work performed on Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.
- (b) All work performed on the holidays prescribed in Clause 21 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) All work performed on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time: Provided that in the event of workers being required to work on Saturday, the workers may, if the employer and the workers mutually agree, work on Sunday in lieu of Saturday, in which case payment shall be made at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award-
 - (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
 - (ii) No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
 - (iii) This subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

20.—Meal Money.

When a worker without being notified the previous day is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings (3/-) in lieu thereof: Provided that this Clause shall not apply to a worker living in the same locality as his place of employment who can reasonably return home for a meal.

21.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to Clause 19 be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, State Foundation tion Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a woker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (d) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each care holiday between ary working day for each such holiday, observed as aforesaid.
- (e) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (f) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (g) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (e) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (h) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- The provisions of this clause shall not (i) apply to casual workers.
