WHEREAS it is enacted by section 43 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947, that the Governor may, by any subsequent proclamation, revoke or vary any proclamation under that section. Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, I have the market the proclamation dated the 12th do hereby revoke the proclamation dated the 18th day of April, 1945, and published in the Government Gazette on the 27th day of April, 1945, whereby the townsite of Mount Magnet was declared an area in which it was unlawful for natives not in lawful employment to be or remain.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the First Schedule hereto for a term of five years from the 1st May,

1954, and from any portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Second Schedule hereto from 1st August, 1954 to 31st December, 1954, and from 1st January to 30th April and 1st August to 31st December in each of the years 1955, 1956, 1957 and 1958 and from 1st January to 30th April, 1959, all dates inclusive.

### Schedule 1.

That portion of the Indian Ocean, including Parakeet, Geordie, Longreach and Thompson Bays bounded by lines starting from North Point on Rottnest Island, and extending North 40 chains; thence East 153 chains; thence South-East 135 chains; thence South-West about 40 chains to Phillip Point, and thence generally North-Westerly and Westerly along the high water mark of the said Island to the starting point.

### Schedule 2.

That portion of the Indian Ocean within the sea limits of half a mile of the foreshore of Rottnest Island bounded by lines starting from Phillip Point and extending East 40 chains thence South-West, North-West, West, South-West, West, North, thence in a North-Easterly direction to a point 40 being Market Philadelphia. chains North of North Point and thence South to the foreshore at North Point.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 27 of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1953, that the Governor, without constituting any irrigation district under Part IV of the said Act, may, on the recommendation of the Minister and acting with the advice of the Commissioners, at any time and from time to time by proclamation declare that Part III of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to any river, stream, watercourse, legoon leke systems or march specified in the page lagoon, lake, swamp or marsh specified in the pro-clamation to which immediately prior to the issue of the proclamation the said Part III does not apply but that no such declaration shall be made until after the expiration of 30 days after notice of intention to make such declaration has been given to the local authority or authorities in or through whose district or districts such river, stream, watercourse, lagoon, lake, swamp or marsh runs or is situate to the intent that before the making of such declaration any objection by such local authority or local authorities may be considered; and whereas the Minister has recommended and the Commissioners have advised the Governor by proclamation to declare that Part III of the said Act shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Ferguson River and its tributaries to which immediately prior to the issue of the pro-clamation the said Part III does not apply; and whereas after due notice given the local authority or local authorities concerned have not made any objection to the proposed declaration: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and on the recommendation of the Minister and with the advice of the Commissioners and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, do hereby declare that Part III of the Rights in Water and Irrigation Act, 1914-1953, shall apply to and have effect in relation to the Ferguson River and its tributaries thereof as shown marked and defined on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 33981 as kept in the Department of Public Works partment of Public Works.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber at Perth on the 19th day of February, 1954, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Government Employees (Promotions Appeal Board) Act, 1945-1953.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by subsection (1) of section five of the Government Employees (Promotions Appeal Board) Act, 1945-1953, it is enacted that if a vacancy in or a new office created in a department is filled by the promotion (whether with or without transfer) of an employee of that or another department who has been recommended for such vacancy or new office by the recommending authority concerned any employee who applied for appointment to or employment in such vacancy or appointment to or employment in such vacancy or new office and has not been recommended therefor and who considers himself more entitled to the promotion than the employee who has been promoted may in such manner and within such time as is prescribed appeal against such promotion of such other employee to the Promotions Appeal Board established under this Act; and whereas

by paragraph (b) of the proviso to that subsection it is provided that where the terms and conditions of employment appertaining to such vacancy or new office are or will be regulated by the provisions of an award or industrial agreement in force under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, only those employee applicants who, when they make application for appointment to or employment in such vacancy or new office are members of an industrial union which is a party to such award or industrial agreement shall have the right of appeal under this section unless the Governor declares upon special grounds that this paragraph does not apply in respect of the vacancy or new office; and whereas employees who are employed on the wages staff of the Government tramways and Government ferries mentioned in the Western Australian Government Tramways and Ferries Act, 1948-1953 referred to in this Order as the Government tramways and ferries, and who apply for promotion to a vacancy in a salaried office, or to a new salaried office created in the Government tramways and ferries, have no right of appeal against the promotion, of an employee employed in the Government tramways and ferries, whether promoted from the wages staff or salaried staff of the Government tramways and ferries, to the vacancy in, or new, office; and whereas employees employed on the wages staff of the Department mentioned in the Government Railways Act, 1904-1953, have such a right of appeal in respect of a vacancy in a salaried office, or a new salaried office created in that Department; and whereas it is deemed expedient that a declaration should be made under paragraph (b) of that proviso on the special grounds that employees employed on the wages staff of the Government tramways and ferries should have in respect of promotion to a salaried office, or a new salaried office created, in the Government tramways and ferries, similar rights of appeal to those which employees employed on the wages staff of the Department mentioned in the Government Railways Act, 1904-1953, have in respect of promotion to a salaried office, or a new salaried office created, in that Department: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred by paragraph (b) of the proviso to subsection (1) of section five of the Government Employees (Promotions Appeal Board) Act, 1945-1953 hereby declares on the special grounds already mentioned that an employee employed on the wages staff of the Government tramways and ferries who applies for appointment to a vacancy in a salaried office, or to a new salaried office created in the Government tramways and ferries and who considers himself more entitled to promotion to the office than the employee who is promoted whether from the salaried staff or the wages staff of the Government tramways and ferries, to the office may in such manner and within such time as is prescribed appeal against the promotion of such other employee to the Promotions Appeal Board established under the Government Employees (Promotions Appeal Board) Act, 1945-1953, notwithstanding that at the time of making the application the applicant is not a member of an industrial union which is a party to an award or industrial agreement in force under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952. the provisions of which award or agreement regulate the terms and conditions of employment appertaining to the vacancy or new office.



### INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 6 of 1954.

(Registered 8th April, 1954.)

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 30th day of March, 1954, between the Minister for Lands of the one part and the Australian Workers' Union. Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

### 3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to workers employed by the Land Settlement Branch of the Lands Department of Western Australia on developmental and farm work on properties situated in the South West Land Division of the State; provided that it shall not apply to workers already coming within the scope of Award No. 35 of 1952, and provided further that it shall not apply to electrons updo: further that it shall not apply to allottees under the Land Settlement Scheme.

### 4.—Hours.

- (a) The hours of work shall be eighty (80) per fortnight.
- (b) The daily spread of shift shall not exceed twelve (12) hours. The daily spread of shift shall mean the period between the time when the worker first commences work and the time when he finishes work for the day.
- (c) All workers shall be allowed one full day off each week.
  - (d) (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
    - (ii) The Union or any worker or workers covered by this Agreement shall not in any way, whether directly or in directly, be party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the ing of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
    - (iii) This sub-clause shall remain in operation until otherwise determined by the Court.

#### Overtime.

All work performed outside the daily spread or beyond eighty (80) hours per fortnight shall be deemed to be overtime and paid for at the rate of time and a half.

#### 7.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as herinafter provided a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (c) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays. Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.
- (ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.
- (d) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such annual leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.
- (e) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment
- (f) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them.

- (g) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of sub-clause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the
- (h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 8.—Public Helidays.

- (a) Except as herinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day (January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. Provided that by agreement between the union and the employer the local Show Day for the district may be substituted for one of the above holidays.
- (b) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. If he is required to work on a holiday he shall be paid for the time worked as if it was an ordinary working day and shall in addition he allowed a day's learn with new shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees.
- (c) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.
- (d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.
- (e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the working day immediately preceding a holiday or resumes duty, or is available on the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays.
- (f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

# 9.—Camp Allowance.

- (a) Employees who in order to be available for their work have to live in a camp established whether by employers or employees for the purpose whether by employers or employees for the purpose of enabling employees to be so available by living therein, shall be paid a camping allowance of four shillings (4s.) for each day on which they are required to hold themselves and do hold themselves available in a camp throughout the said day, more than or not work is done on the said day, prowhether or not work is done on the said day, provided however that the total amount payable under this provision shall not exceed twenty shillings (20s.) per week.
- (b) When satisfactory accommodation is made available by any respondent the allowance menavailable by any respondent the allowance mentioned in the preceding subclause may be reduced in the case of any worker however short his occupation when the camp location is fixed for a period of six months or longer; the amount of such reduction to be agreed upon by a representative of the respondents concerned and the Union, and in the event of a dispute of difference to be referred to a Board of Reference for determination. Provided that when satisfactory accommodation (other than the provision of tents or buts as referred to than the provision of tents or huts as referred to in clause 10 paragraphs (a) to (d) of subclause (2)) is made available in the case of married men by any respondent, the allowance mentioned in the by any respondent, the anowance mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall not be payable however short his occupation of such accommodation when the camp location is fixed for a period of six months or longer. Such accommodation shall not be deemed satisfactory for the purpose of this subclause unless it is sufficient to responsibly provide subclause unless it is sufficient to reasonably provide for the accommodation of the worker, his wife and any of such worker's dependants who shall be nominated by him. Any dispute as to the accom-modation provided under this subclause may be referred to the Board of Reference.

# 10.—Camping Area.

- (1) When camping areas are necessary for the employees such shall be provided by the employer and the area shall be enclosed with a stockproof fence where necessary.
- (2) (a) When employees camp out the employer shall provide sufficient tent with fly and/or cubicle accommodation at rates to be fixed or failing agreement as decided by a Board of Reference; provided that in the case of tents and flys a minimum rental of 1s. 6d. per week shall be charged for each tent.
- (b) When it is estimated that an employee in the normal course of events will be required to live on the same section of any work for a period estimated to be from the duration of more than one week and less than three months an 8ft. x 10ft. high-sided tent on an interior frame shall be provided for two employees, or if at his own request, for one employee only. A gravel matting malthoid, or other temporary type of flooring shall be provided.
- (c) When it is estimated that an employee in the normal course of events will be required to live on the same section of work for a period estimated to be of a duration of more than three months and less than one year an 8ft x 10ft. high-sided tent on an interior frame with board floor shall be provided for two employees, or if accommodation can reasonably be made available a worker may, at his own request, occupy the accommodation singly.
- (d) When it is estimated that an employee in the normal course of events will be required to live on the same section of any work for a period estimated to be of a duration of more than one year, a framed hut to accommodate one or more men, shall be provided. The fioor space shall be based on 50 square feet per man.
- (3) An enclosed galley with fireplace fitted with fiue shall be supplied where the number of employees exceeds six and the duration of the camp exceeds one month.
- (4) All time occupied in erecting tents or in shifting camp shall be paid for at ordinary rates, two hours to be allowed where camps are already erected and four hours where camps are to be erected, provided that overtime rates shall be paid when the work is performed outside ordinary working hours. In shifting camp provision shall be made by the employer for the transport of the employees living in the camp, together with their personal property free of charge up to 4 cwt.
- (5) The employer shall supply free of charge, wire stretcher, suitably filled palliasse and a hurricane lamp with kerosene as considered reasonable by the officer-in-charge or other suitable lighting as approved by the officer-in-charge for all employees occupying a tent or cubicle.
- (6) The employer shall provide potable water for workers and for authorised boarding houses. Tanks shall be fitted with taps. Boiling water shall also be provided by the employer for the workers' mid-day meal.
- (7) The employer shall provide free of charge on each work, water bags which in the opinion of the officer-in-charge are suitable.

Firewood shall be supplied free of charge where considered necessary by the officer-in-charge.

- (8) The employer shall provide bath-houses fitted with showers, one to every ten employees. Water shall be available for use in the showers or bath where baths are provided at work ceasing time provided an adequate supply of water is available. Where an attendant is provided, hot water shall be provided where practicable.
- (9) In all camps of over fifteen (15) employees and where the duration of camp is not less than three months, the employer shall provide an adequate wash-house equipped with copper and wash troughs or tubs to enable the employees to wash their clothes. In other camps employers shall provide sufficient facilities to enable employees to wash their clothes, such facilities to be as considered necessary by the officer-in-charge.
- (10) The employer shall instal fiyproof sanitary conveniences (one seat to every 10 employees and each seat to be partitioned off) in all camps and on the job, and shall maintain these conveniences

- in a clean condition. Sufficient covering to ensure decency, and shade and protection from the weather shall be provided. The employer shall also supply sufficient and proper material to keep the sanitary accommodation innocuous. Such sanitary accommodation to be so situated as to preclude the possibility of contamination of the water supply and/or foodstuffs of the employees.
- (11) The employer shall provide adequate drainage for all camps.
- (12) The employer shall make provision for the disposal of garbage and night soil, the employer shall keep the camping area reasonably free from undergrowth, long grass and dangerous trees, and where considered necessary by the officer-in-charge, a camp attendant shall be supplied whose duty it shall be to maintain the camp in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (13) The employer shall provide water for horses in the horse camp and on the job, and where necessary suitable containers shall be supplied.
- (14) Horse yards shall not be erected within one-eighth of a mile of the general camp.
- (15) Where a store is not available at the camp to supply commodities to the employees, and where tradespeople do not call, the employer shall provide free transport up to three times per week if necessary, to enable commodities to be obtained by the employees from the nearest town.

Employees shall elect a delegate who shall be responsible for the collection and distribution of orders and supplies.

The employer shall not be liable for loss or damage to stores during transport.

(16) The employer shall, when necessary, give an advance by way of procuration order on the store to the amount of one day's pay against wages earned to a new employee to enable him to obtain foodstuffs.

#### 11.—Cooks.

In all camps containing twenty (20) or more employees, where the camp location is fixed for a period of six (6) months or longer, one of the following methods of catering shall be adopted at the discretion of the employer:—

- (1) (a) The employer shall provide a boarding-house keeper in which case no cooking or eating utensils will be provided.
- (b) Where a boarding-house keeper is provided, full camping allowance as provided in subclause (a) of clause 9 shall be paid to the worker.
- (2) (a) A cook shall be employed by the employer, in which case the employer shall supply cooking and eating utensils.
- (b) A cook so engaged shall be remunerated at the following rates:—
  - (i) A cook required to work seven (7) days per week shall be paid a margin of 20s. plus one-third of the basic wage and margin to cover all overtime and week-end work.
  - (ii) A cook required to work six (6) days per week shall be paid a margin of twenty shillings (20s.) plus one quarter of the basic wage and margin to cover all overtime and week-end work.
  - (iii) A cook required to work five (5) days per week shall be paid a margin of 20s. plus one-sixth (1/6th) of the basic wage and margin to cover all overtime and weekend work
- (c) The number of cooks and cooks' offsiders to be employed shall be in accordance with the following schedule:—

Where the number of employees in the mess does—

Not exceed 15-one cook.

Exceeds 15 but not 30—one cook, one offsider.

Exceeds 30 but not 50—one cook, two off-siders.

For each additional 20—one additional offsider.

- (d) The cook's offsider shall be paid the following rates:-
  - (1) Cook's offsider required to work seven (7) days per week shall be paid the basic wage plus a margin of 6s. plus one-third of the basic wage and margin to cover all overtime and week-end work.
    - (2) Cook's offsider required to work six (6) days per week shall be paid the basic wage plus a margin of six shillings (6s.) plus one-quarter of the basic wage and margin to cover all overtime and week-end work.
    - (3) Cook's offsider required to work five (5) days per week shall be paid basic wage plus a margin of six shillings (6s.) plus onesixth of the basic wage and margin to cover all overtime and week-end work.
- (e) Each mess shall have a committee of management appointed by the workers and such committee shall be responsible for the running and discipline of such mess and the actual engagement of the
- (f) Where a cook is provided each worker shall be deducted two shillings (2s.) per working day from the camping allowance prescribed in sub-clause (a) of clause 9; provided however, the amount payable under this provision shall not ex-ceed ten shillings (10s.) per week.
- (g) The employer shall provide a suitable mess 1'00m.
- (h) The cook and his offsider will be responsible for contributing towards the cost of food in accordance with the formula adopted by the committee.

## 12.—Long Service Leave.

The conditions governing the granting of long service leave to full time Government wages employees generally shall apply to workers covered by this Agreement.

#### 13.—Board of Reference.

- (1) For the purpose of this agreement, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—
  - (a) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;
    (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time

  - (c) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the agreement.
- (2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this agreement.

## 14.—Contract of Service.

- (a) Contract of service shall be by the day, and shall be terminable by one (1) day's notice on either side except in the case of a casual worker when one (1) hour's notice shall suffice.
- (b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked on which the worker is required to present himself for duty except such absence is due to illness and comes within the provision of clause 15 (Sick Leave) or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Agreement.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct and in such cases wages shall be paid up to time of dismissal only.
- (d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union associated with it or through the breakdown of the employer's machin-ery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent with the exception of wet weather in which case the deci-sion as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest

- with the officer-in-charge if available, in his absence the foreman, or in his absence the person under whose direction the men are working.
- (e) The rate of payment in the wages clause is for the purpose of convenience expressed in the weekly amount.

#### 15.—Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth of a week's pay for each completed month of service.
- (ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calender year in respect of each worker but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.
- (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (b) The clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.
- (d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the workers' own fault, neglect or misconduct.

#### 16.—Definitions.

"General farm hand" shall mean a worker called upon the carry out all the duties associated with the various activities of the respondents relating to the operating and servicing of farm machinery and equipment, in addition to other work involved in primary agricultural production.

"Leading hand" shall mean a worker who is a member of a gang of not less than three men who is instructed by the officer in charge to exercise control over the workers with respect to the time of commencement and finishing work.

## 17.-Walking Time.

(a) The worker shall be paid at ordinary rates for time occupied in walking from camp or recognised starting point as laid down by the officer-incharge, to work: Provided that time so allowed shall not exceed twenty (20) minutes per mile. Provided, also, during the months of September to April, inclusive, where the distance exceeds two (2) miles, and during the months of May to August, inclusive, when the distance exceeds 1½ miles, a similar allowance shall be allowed for the distance in excess of two (2) miles and one and a half (1½) miles respectively for return to camp or recognised starting point. Provided that when employees are conveyed to work by a vehicle provided by the employer, the time taken to return to camp or recognised starting point shall not exceed 30 minutes from May to August and shall not exceed forty (40) minutes from September to April. nised starting point as laid down by the officer-in-

Time taken in excess of these stipulated periods shall be paid for at the ordinary rates prescribed.

(b) General.—Time taken by vehicles provided by the employer shall be no more than reasonable, allowing for the speed of the vehicle and the condition of the road. In all cases where vehicles are provided by the employer they shall leave promptly on cessation of work, and an employee the limit of the required to truttle further distance. shall not be required to travel a further distance than is absolutely necessary. Explosives shall not be carried on vehicles which are used for the conveyance of employees.

In all areas outside the metropolitan area it shall be the employer's responsibility to convey new employees from the public transport terminal to

When employees are required to travel to and from work in the employer's vehicle the employer shall, if required, provide the vehicle with seating accommodation, together with a cover to protect the employees from the weather.

## 18.—Tea Breaks.

Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, a rest period of seven (7) minutes from the time of ceasing to the time of resumption of work shall be allowed each morning. This interval shall be counted as time off duty without deduction of pay and shall be arranged at a time and in a manner to and shall be arranged at a time and in a manner to suit the convenience of the employer. Morning tea may be taken by employees during this interval but the period of seven (7) minutes shall not be exceeded under any circumstances. Upon proof of breach by any employee of any provision hereinbefore expressed or implied the Court may grant the employer concerned exemption from liability to allow the rest period aforesaid.

#### 19.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union and who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided also that who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided also, that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of the said Union shall within fourteen (14) days of commencing employment under this agreement make and complete an application for membership of the said Union, and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another industrial union, shall, upon the expiration of his current membership with such other union, within 14 days of such expiry, make and complete within 14 days of such expiry, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union.

# 20.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be one year from the date hereof.

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Appli-cant, and Wilson & Johns Pty. Ltd. and Dawson & Harrison Ltd., Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court; Now therefore the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:-

## Memorandum of Agreement.

## 1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Nurserymen's Award".

## 3.—Area.

This Award shall operate over that area comprised within a radius of twenty-five (25) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

## 4.--Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers who are employed in nurseries by the respondents hereto and who are not covered by any other Industrial Award or Agreement and being persons who are eligible to join the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers.

# 5.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one (1) year from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

# 6.-Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Award shall be as follows:-

# .... 7.—Contract of Service.

....

The contract of service for all workers shall be by the day and shall be terminable by one (1) day's notice on either side; provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for misconduct.

#### 8.—Part-time Workers.

Notwithstanding anything contained elsewhere in this Award workers may be employed on a part time basis and the following conditions shall apply.

- (a) Part-time workers shall be paid on an hourly basis, the hourly rate being cal-culated in proportion to the hours worked in the particular establishment in which they are employed at the rate of wages prescribed in Clause 6 hereof.
- (b) Payment of anuual leave, public holidays and sick pay shall be strictly related proportionately in accordance with the number of hours worked to the conditions prescribed for full-time workers.

# 9.—Weekly Day Off.

All workers shall be allowed one full day off uch week. All work done on this day shall be each week. paid for at the ordinary rate and an additional day on full pay shall be added to the amount of annual leave to which the worker is entitled under Clause 13 hereof for each day so worked, or the day may be observed on any other day by agreement between the employer and the worker: Provided that if only part of the day is worked by the worker, time off shall be granted equivalent only to the time actually worked on the day.

## 10.—Piecework.

- (a) An employer may make a contract with any worker or group of workers for payment by results by piece-work.
- (b) The rate of payment shall be fixed on the basis that it shall be sufficient to yield to a worker of average capacity for a full week's work of the ordinary hours in an establishment, at least ten per cent. (10%) above the minimum time rate of pay as prescribed herein for such week's work.
- (c) A worker working under any system of payment by result shall receive at least time rate of pay as prescribed herein.

## 11. Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

# 12.—Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that pay-ment for absence through such ill-health shall be ment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act. Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

## 13.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

- (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) All work done on the days named in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid for at the ordinary rate and an additional day on full pay shall be added to the amount of annual leave to which the worker is entitled under subclause (e) hereof for each day so worked, or the day may be observed on any other day by agreement between the employer and the worker. Provided that, if only part of a day is worked by the worker on any such day, time off shall be granted equivalent only to the time actually worked on such day.
- (c) Any worker absenting himself from work on the whole or any portion of the working day preceding or on the whole or any portion of the working day succeeding a holiday provided for herein shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.
- (d) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (e) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (f) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as afore-
- (g) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

- (h) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (i) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (g) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (j) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (k) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

# 14.—Wages Record.

- (a) Each employer shall keep a wages book showing the name of each worker and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.
- (b) The wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union, during the usual office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom. The employer's works shall be deemed to be a convenient place for the purpose of this paragraph, and if for any reason the record be not available at the works when the official calls to inspect it, it shall be made available for inspection within twelve (12) hours either at the employer's office or at the works.

15.—Payment of Wages. Wages shall be paid weekly.

## 16.—Under-rate Workers.

- a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

# 17.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award a Board of Reference.
- (b) The Board shall consist of a chairman to be appointed by the Court and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.
- (c) The Board is hereby assigned the following functions in the event of a disagreement between the parties bound by this Award:—
  - (i) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Award or any of them.
  - (ii) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- (d) The provisions of regulation 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, shall be deemed to apply to any Board of Reference appointed hereunder.

# 18.—Lodging.

Where lodging or quarters are supplied to a worker the employer shall be entitled to deduct from the wages of the worker an amount agreed upon between the employer and worker concerned to cover such lodging or quarters.

19.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised, without the consent of the employer, more than once in any one (1) week.

## 20.-No Reduction.

This Award shall not in itself operate to reduce the wages of any worker below the amount actually received by him at the date hereof.
