> > are occasioned by breakdown or mechanical fault in the vehicle or by accident while travelling on that road, and

> > are necessary to enable the vehicle to be moved to a place other than a road,

- (b) when vehicles or animals, travelling on different roads, would, if they continued on their respective courses con-verge at an intersection and be likely to collide or create a dangerous situation at the intersection-

then the driver of the vehicle or animal from whose right hand side another vehicle or animal is being driven towards such point, junction or intersection, as the case may be, shall not cross such point, junction or intersection without stopping or checking the speed of the vehicle or animal under his control and shall allow the other vehicle or animal to be driven across or past the point, junction or intersection in front of his vehicle or animal.

The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 107 a new regulation as follows:

> 107A. Where pursuant to regulation 188 a sign with the word "STOP" is marked, erected or placed on a road at the approach to a junction or intersection, a person shall not drive a vehicle or animal past that sign into the junction or intersection without first stopping the vehicle or animal and ensuring

in the case of a junction (not being an intersection),

that the junction and approaches thereto on either side of him, and in the case of an intersection

that the intersection and the approach thereto from his right side are sufficiently clear of traffic to allow him to drive with safety past the sign into the junction or intersection.

5. The principal regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 108 the following regulation:-

> 108. Except as otherwise expressly provided in these regulations a person shall not drive a vehicle or an animal into or across any road without first slowing down and taking sufficient precautions to ensure that the road is sufficiently clear of traffic to allow him with safety to drive into or across that road.

6. Regulation 136A of the principal regulations is amended by adding an interpretation as follows:—

"detector pad" means the rubber strip or pad set in a road and stretching along the surface of the road from the vicinity of the kerb towards the middle of the road and which strip or pad is set at an approach to a place where a traffic control light signal is operating.

7. Regulation 136C of the principal regulations is amended by adding a subregulation as follows:—

(3) Except when stopping until a traffic control light signal changes so as to display the colour green, a person shall not stand or cause to stand a vehicle or animal on a road between, and on the same side of the road as, the detector pad and the stop line appropriate to that signal.

8. Regulation 203F of the principal regulations is amended by adding a subregulation as follows:—

(3) A person shall not drive, use, or tow or employ a person to drive, use or tow on a road a vehicle having, together with its load, if any, a greater overall width than eight feet unless he is the holder of a permit issued in accordance with the provisions of section 46A of the Act and of this regulation.

9. Regulation 285C of the principal regulations is revoked and the following regulation substituted therefor:—

 $285\mathrm{C.}$ (1) A person shall not enter an omnibus on a road, nor, having entered an omnibus, remain thereon—

- (a) when it is brought to his notice by the driver or conductor of the omnibus that it is already fully loaded with passengers, or
- (b) if he is under the influence of liquor or dirtily attired and so is causing or is likely to cause annoyance to any passenger.

(2) A person while entering, or having entered an omnibus shall not act in a noisy, violent or abusive manner.

10. The principal regulations are amended by adding after regulation 285D a new regulation as follows:----

285E.~(1) The driver or conductor of an omnibus may request a person who has entered the omnibus to depart therefrom if—

- (a) the omnibus is already fully loaded with passengers, or
- (b) the person is under the influence of liquor or dirtily attired and is causing or is likely to cause annoyance to any passenger, or
- (c) the person continues acting in a noisy, violent or abusive manner after being requested to cease to act in that manner,

and the person shall immediately leave the omnibus.

(2) A person who fails or refuses to depart from an omnibus when requested so to do under the provisions of subregulation (1) of this regulation may be removed from the omnibus by the driver or conductor, or by both, who may use such force against the person as is reasonably necessary to effect his removal.

(3) No person shall erect on any residential lot any building or buildings which will cover more than 50 per cent. of the area of such lot.

(4) No person on any lot or land shall build or erect a building until the land is drained to the satisfaction of the Board and provision made for the disposal of roof water and house sullage.

Business Area.

(5) Within the areas specified in the Second Schedule the following uses shall be permitted:— Offices, shops, service stations and garages, shops onices, shops, service stations and galages, shops and dwellings, shops and offices, hotels, theatres, cinemas and dance halls, churches, schools, and road board buildings and other public buildings, but shall not include any industry, trade or manufactory.

(6) Within the business and shopping areas as defined in the Second Schedule hereunder, no per-son shall erect or add to or extend any building unless the walls of the new structure are in bricks, stone or concrete.

General Provisions.

(7) The erection of buildings for or the carrying on of noxious trades or offensive trades (as de-scribed in the Health Act) is prohibited in the area the subject of these by-laws.

(8) Within the area of the First Schedule here-under the erection and maintenance of any advertising device, advertisement hoarding or structure for advertising purposes is prohibited, providing that this by-law shall not apply to signs indicating professions, names, trades or callings exhibited on the land or buildings on or in which such profession, trade or callings is conducted.

(9) The minimum area on which a dwelling or shop with dwelling attached is 6,000 square feet, provided that before a second house is erected on any given lot, a subdivision shall be approved by the Town Planning Board so that each house shall stand on a separate lot.

(10) Any person who shall erect any building or structure or who shall structurally alter any building or maintain any structure or building in contravention of these by-laws shall on conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

(E) Where any part of the floor is distant from the nearest window more than twice the height of the head of the window above the floor, every such part shall be lighted by roof or ceiling lights, or by artificial lighting.

(F) Every lock-up shop, in which the depth exceeds twice the width thereof, shall be provided with an approved system of mechanical or induced ventilation unless through natural ventilation approved by the surveyor can be obtained.

(G) An approved system or mechanical ventilation shall be provided where adequate natural ventilation cannot be provided.

THIS Agreement, made pursuant to the provisions of Part X of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, of Western Australia, this 12th day of May, 1954, between The Civil Service Association of Western Australia (Incorporated), (hereinafter Western Australia referred to as the Association) of the one part, and the Public Service Commissioner of Western Aus-tralia (hereinafter referred to as the Commissioner) of the other part, witnesseth as follows:-

- (a) the Agreement dated the 20th day of December, 1950, as amended on the 7th day of December, 1951; and

- (a) Male Officers—less than seven hundred and twenty-six pounds (£726) per annum.
- (b) Female Officers—less than six hundred and thirty-one pounds (£631) per annum.

Provided that persons temporarily employed shall be subject to the daily or weekly rates of pay and to the exclusions referred to in clause 20 of this Agreement.

4.—Basic Rate: Interpretation.

(a) In this Agreement, the term "basic rate" means in the case of-

(i) male officers employed in the metropolitan area: the nearest pound (\pounds) to the result obtained by multiplying the male basic wage for that area as declared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration, by fiftytwo and one-sixth (52 1/6th);

- (ii) male officers whose headquarters are in an area for which an independent basic wage is declared: the nearest pound (\pounds) wage is declared, the hearest pound (f) to the result obtained by multiplying the male basic wage for that area as declared from time to time by the Court of Arbitration, by fifty-two and one-sixth (52 1/6th); and
- (iii) female officers: seventy-five per cent.
 (75%) to the nearest pound (£) of the male basic wage rate for the respective areas as determined in paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this clause.

5.—Classes and Grades: Group II Officers.

(a) Except where otherwise provided in this Agreement the classes and grades applicable to Group II officers in the Professional, Clerical and General Divisions shall be as indicated in Schedule A to this Agreement.

(b) The incremental scale expressed as mar-gins over the appropriate basic rate, except where specifically provided for elsewhere in this Agree-ment shall be as follows:---

- Males: £200, £215, £230, £250, £270, £290, £310, £330, £350, £375, £400, £425, £450, £475, £500, £525, £550, £575, £600, £625, £650, £675, £700, £725.

(b) Progression of base grade professional officers through the marginal ranges prescribed in sub-clause (a) will be by annual increments provided that-

- (i) an officer will not be advanced beyond the margin of £350 per annum unless a certificate is furnished by the Permanent Head to the Commissioner stating that the officer has-

 - (a) made satisfactory progress in the practice of his profession; and
 (b) reached the standard of efficiency expected of him and is wholly or professional mainly carrying out professional duties of such quality and import-ance as to warrant the payment of a salary margin in excess of £350 per annum.
- (ii) an officer will not be advanced beyond the margin of £450 per annum unless a certificate is furnished by the Permanent Head to the Commissioner stating that the officer has-
 - (a) continued to make satisfactory progress in the practice of his profession: and
 - (b) maintained efficiency his and developed his capacity to carry out and is in fact wholly or mainly carrying out professional duties of such higher quality and importance as to warrant the payment of a salary margin in excess of £450 per annum.

7.-Professional Division Officers:

- (i) beyond the margin of £250 per annum to in clause 6 (b) (i) is furnished to the Commissioner by the Permanent Head, and
- (ii) beyond the margin of £330 per annum unless a certificate similar to that referred to in clause 6 (b) (ii) is furnished by the Permanent Head to the Commissioner.

(b) A female telephonist or assistant who has completed not less than twenty years of continuous permanent service shall be paid an allowance equivalent to the difference between her rate of pay and the next higher grade in the automatic range as referred to in clause 11 (a) of this Agreement: Provided that payment of this allowance shall be subject to the conditions prescribed in clause 19 (d) (i) of this Agreement.

18.—Allowances: Clerical Division Officers— Males.

(a) Married man's allowance: A male clerk who is a married man or is the support of those related to him, on the approval of the Commissioner. shall be paid an allowance equivalent to the next higher grade in the automatic range than his rate of pay according to age or year of adult service with a maximum margin, inclusive of such allowance, of £185 per annum above the basic rate.

(b) Promotional examination allowance: A male clerk who has passed the promotional examination or has acquired equal or higher qualifications approved by the Commissioner and who is retained on the maximum of the automatic range for one year shall be paid an allowance of fifteen pounds (£15) per annum which shall 'be increased to thirty pounds (£30) and to forty-five pounds (£45) on completion of two and three years' service respectively on the maximum of the automatic range, such allowance to be converted to salary on promotion to a higher position or to cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion. No allowance as provided in this sub-clause shall be payable unless the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties.

(c) Qualifications allowance: A male adult clerk who obtains—

- (i) a Diploma of Commerce at the University of Western Australia, or passes the final examinations in all subjects of a recognised Institute of Accountants, or Secreatries or Cost Accountants or the Commonwealth Institute of Valuers, or obtains a Diploma in Public Administration at the Perth Technical College, or passes in five units (including English I) of a degree course in Arts, Science or Law at the University of Western Australia, or passes the examination in Law prescribed under section 25 of the Public Service Act, or who obtains an equal qualification approved by the Commissioner, shall be paid, whilst in receipt of a margin as expressed in column (a) of Schedule B to this Agreement, an allowance as indicated in column (b) of the said Schedule.
- (ii) a degree at the University of Western Australia in Arts, Science or Law, or who obtains an equal qualification approved by the Commissioner, shall be paid whilst in receipt of a margin as expressed in column (a) of Schedule B to this Agreement an allowance as indicated in column (c) of the said Schedule.

(d) Application of allowances: The allowances prescribed in subclause (c) shall be paid, where applicable, in addition to the allowance prescribed by paragraphs (a) and (b) of this clause.

19.—Allowances: Clerical Division Officers—Females.

(a) Efficiency allowance: An officer within the automatic range as enumerated in clause 11 (a) of this Agreement shall be paid an allowance of $\pounds 15$ per annum provided that—

- (i) in the case of a clerk, clerk-typist or typist she passes an efficiency examination in shorthand writing at a speed of 100 words per minute and typewriting at 50 words per minute.
- (ii) in the case of a machinist she passes an examination in typewriting at a speed of 35 words per minute and in the operation of accounting and listing machines.

Provided further that-

- (i) such allowance shall be converted to salary on promotion to a higher position or to cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion; and
- (ii) an adult who has passed either of the examinations referred to in this subclause and who has been retained on the maximum of the automatic range (excluding allowance) as a permanent officer for four (4) years, shall be paid an allowance to bring her total remuneration to a margin of £120 per annum increasing to a margin of £135 per annum after a further year's service: Provided the Permanent Head certifies as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties; such allowance to be converted to salary on promotion to a higher position or to cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion.
- (b) Allowances for service—automatic range:
 - (i) An adult retained on the maximum of the automatic range as a permanent officer for five (5) years and who is not in receipt of either of the allowances referred to in subclause (a) of this clause shall be paid an allowance of fifteen pounds (£15) per annum: Provided the Permanent Head certifies that such officer is eligible and would be recommended for promotion on the grounds of efficiency and good conduct; such allowance to be converted to salary on promotion to a higher position or to cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion.
 - (ii) An officer who has been retained in the automatic range and who has completed not less than twenty years of continuous permanent service shall, subject to the provisions of subclause (d) hereof, be paid an allowance equivalent to the difference between her rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale, such allowance to be in addition to the allowances referred to in subclauses (a) and (b) (i) hereof.

(c) Allowances for service—Group II officers: An officer who has obtained promotion to either class 1, 2, 3 or 4 as set out in Schedule A to this Agreement—

- (i) shall, subject to the provisions of subclause

 (d) hereof, be paid an allowance equivalent to the difference between her rate of pay and the next higher grade in the incremental scale upon completion of twelve months of continuous service on the maximum of her classification; and
- (ii) shall, subject to the provisions of subclause
 (d) hereof, be paid an allowance equivalent to the difference between her rate of pay and the second higher grade in the incremental scale, provided she has been in receipt of the allowance referred to in paragraph (i) of this subclause for a continuous period of twelve months, and provided further that she has completed twenty years of continuous permanent service.

Provided that an officer who, upon promotion, is in receipt of both of the allowances referred to in paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this subclause shall retain the allowance under paragraph (ii) but shall not be again eligible for the allowance under paragraph (i) until she has completed twelve months of continuous service on the maximum of her new classification.

(d) General.—(i) Payment of any of the allowances referred to in this clause shall be subject to the receipt by the Commissioner of a report from the Permanent Head as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer and continuance of payment of such allowances shall be subject to the receipt by the Commissioner of similar annual reports from the Permanent Head.

(ii) An officer shall not be entitled to receive approval to the payment of more than one allowance under this clause in any period of twelve months.

20.—Temporary Officers.

A person temporarily employed under section 31 of the Public Service Act, 1904-1953, shall be paid at a daily or weekly rate of pay equivalent to the annual rate that would be payable in accordance with this Agreement to a permanent officer should such person temporarily employed be engaged on similar duties, provided that—

- (a) a male adult, temporarily employed in a clerical capacity, shall be paid on appointment an amount at least equivalent to the following rates—
 - (i) under the age of 23 years—the rate prescribed for age in clause 10 (a) of this Agreement;
 - (ii) twenty-three years of age and over —the rate prescribed in clause 10

 (a) of this Agreement for the third year of adult service;
- (b) in no case shall the provisions of clauses 8 (a), provisos (i) and (ii), 8 (b), 9 (d), 10 (b), 11 (b), 12 (c), 13, 15 (b), 16 (b), 17 (b), 18, 19, and 24 of this Agreement apply in respect of a person temporarily employed.

21.—Annual Increments.

Subject to the receipt by the Commissioner of a report from the Permanent Head regarding good conduct, diligence and efficiency, an officer shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of his classification by annual increments according to the grades of such classification.

22.—Fundamental Basis of this Agreement.

(a) The fundamental basis for the determination of the rates of pay in this Agreement is the rate payable to an adult male Clerical Division officer in the automatic range on attaining the age of 27 years or during the seventh year of adult service. This rate was determined on the 18th December, 1950, at the margin of one hundred and eighty-five pounds ($\pounds185$) per annum over the basic rate.

(b) From the 18th December, 1950, whenever necessary and in the manner set out in clause 23, the margin of £185 per annum and all margins in excess of £185 per annum for male officers have been adjusted half-yearly. The adjustments have been effected, as necessary, as from the beginning of the first pay period in January and July in each year. As at the 31st December, 1953, the aggregate of these adjustments had resulted in the addition of twenty-two pounds (£22) per annum to the margin of £185 per annum and all margins in excess of £185 per annum for male officers.

(c) It is hereby agreed that this method of adjustment shall continue provided that—

(a) the first adjustment, if any, subsequent to the date of operation of this Agreement shall have effect as from the beginning of the first pay period in January, 1954; and

23.—Adjustment of Rates of Pay: Marginal Allowance.

The amount of the marginal allowance payable from time to time shall be determined as follows— (1) Males—(a) Margins of £185 per annum and above—as at the 1st January and the 1st July each year, the difference between—

- (i) the average, to the nearest pound (£), of the margin, in each case, between the gross annual salary rate paid on the maximum grade or at age 27 years (whichever occurs first) in the male clerical automatic ranges in the Public Services of Queensland, New South Wales, Victoria, Tasmania and South Australia and the respective annual equivalent of the Commonwealth basic wage for the capital city of each of the aforesaid States; and
- (ii) the margin between the gross annual salary rate payable in the metropolitan area to an officer on the maximum of the automatic range prescribed in clause 10 (a) for male Clerical Division officers and the annual equivalent of the Commonwealth basic wage for Perth.

Provided that if the amount determined would result in an adjustment of less than five pounds (£5) per annum from the last current adjustment, if any, then no variation shall be made.

(b) Margins below £185 per annum—pro rata, to the nearest pound (\pounds) , with the gross rate (margin plus basic rate) payable in the metropolitan area to an adult male Clerical Division officer on the maximum of the automatic range; provided that an allowance of less than three pounds $(\pounds3)$ per annum (as calculated under this subclause) shall not be payable.

(2) Females.—(a) Margins of £90 per annum and above—seventy-five per cent. (75%), to the nearest pound (£), of the allowances applicable to male officers on margins of £185 per annum and above.

(b) Margins below £90 per annum—according to seventy-five per cent. (75%) of any allowances applicable to male officers on the basis of the following table—

(3) General.—Officers whose headquarters are in an area for which an independent basic wage is declared shall, for the purpose of this provision only, be deemed to be employed in the metropolitan area.

24.—Maintenance of Rights of Appeal.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary herein contained or implied, the rights of officers in respect of all appeals under the Public Service Appeal Board Act, 1920-1950, shall be preserved and maintained, subject to any legal rights which the Commissioner or any other respondent may have in relation thereto.

25.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement which replaces and supersedes the Agreements referred to in clause 1 shall operate as from and including the first day of January, 1954, and shall remain in force for a period of five years as from that date, provided that either of the parties may after the thirty-first day of December, 1954, negotiate with the other party to amend or add to this Agreement or approach the Court for an amendment to this Agreement.

HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council under the provisions of the Library Board of Western Australia Act, 1951, has been pleased to make the regulations for the Conduct of Public Libraries set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

FRED ALEXANDER, Chairman.

Schedule.

These regulations may be cited as the Regulations for the conduct of Public Libraries.

In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires-

"Act" means the Library Board of Western Australia Act, 1951; "Board" means The Library Board of Western Australia constituted pursuant to the provisions of the Act;

"library authority" means a local authority which is a participating body pursuant to the provisions of the Act; "library" means a library registered as a free library by the Board in pursuance of the Act and includes any rooms, offices, passages, staircases, entrances and exits whatsoever forming part thereof and adjacent thereto;

and adjacent inerces, ok" includes periodical, newspaper, pamphlet, music score, picture, print, photograph, map, chart, plan, manuscript, film, slide, gramophone record, or any other article of a like nature, forming "book" part of the contents of the library, whether or not the property of the Board or of the library authority; "registered reader" means a person to whom a reader's ticket is issued

in accordance with these regulations by a library authority; "recognised organisation" means any society, association, company, college, school or other organisation whatsoever whether corporate or incorporate, which is permitted to borrow books from a library in accordance with these regulations; "librarian" means the person for the time being holding the office of libarian of a library or his duly appointed representative.

(1) The library authority shall subject to regulation 4 of these regulations open the library on such days and during such hours as it may with the concurrence of the Board from time to time determine.

(2) The library authority shall clearly exhibit and keep so exhibited in or on the library in a conspicuous place a statement of the days and times during which the library will be open.

The library authority shall not open the library on a Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday or any public holiday.

5. A person who is-

- (a) a ratepayer within the meaning of the expression "ratepayer" in either the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1951, or the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951;
- (b) enrolled as an elector on the electoral roll for the district or part of the district of the library authority;
- (c) a registered reader of any other library authority in the State;
- (d) over the age of 14 years, not being a ratepayer or an elector and who is normally resident in the district of the library authority;
- (e) a child of compulsory school age who is resident in the district of the library authority, if he is recommended to the library authority by his parent, guardian or a teacher of the school which he attends;

is entitled, subject to the provisions of these regulations and of any condition made by the library authority pursuant to these regulations, to borrow books from the library for home reading.

6. (1) The library authority may subject to these regulations and to any condition made by the library authority pursuant to these regulations lend books to a person who is—

- (a) over the age of 14 years and who is employed within the district of the library authority subject if so required by the library authority to his obtaining a recommendation to the satisfaction of the library authority from his employer;
- (b) not resident or employed in the district of the library authority but who is attending an educational institution within that district, if he obtains the recommendation of the principal of the institution or his representative;
- (c) not normally resident or employed in the district of a library authority if he pays such sum by way of deposit as the library authority with the concurrence of the Board determines;
- (d) not being a registered reader who presents a current reader's ticket or like authority issued by any other public library in the Commonwealth of Australia.

(2) The deposit referred to in paragraph (c) of sub-regulation (1) of this regulation shall be refunded by the library authority to the person who deposited it, when he notifies the librarian that he no longer desires to borrow books and if at the time of the notification the registered reader is not liable to pay the library authority any moneys, has returned all books to the library authority borrowed from it and is not liable for a breach of these regulations.

7. (1) The library authority may permit any association, society or institution established for the study or practice of arts or science, any school, college or educational institution, any business or any department or agency of the Government of Western Australia or of the Commonwealth of Australia to borrow books which are required for the official business of the organisation.

(2) A recognised organisation desirous of borrowing books shall make application on the appropriate form provided by the library authority signed by an authorised officer of the organisation.

8. No charge shall be made for the registration of a reader, for the issue of a reader's ticket or for the loan of books except—

- (a) the library authority may make a charge not exceeding sixpence for the issue of a ticket to replace one reported lost or destroyed by a registered reader;
- (b) the library authority may charge a subscription on a scale to be determined by the authority with the approval of the Board for the loan of books to a person eligible to borrow books under regulation 6 (c);
- (c) as otherwise provided in these regulations.

9. (1) A person who desires to borrow books from the leading library shall make an application on the appropriate form provided by the library authority.

(2) Where an application form is delivered to the librarian if the form is duly completed by the applicant to the satisfaction of the librarian he shall issue to the applicant one general ticket which entitles the registered reader to books of fiction or non fiction and with the approval of the Board one additional general ticket may be issued at the discretion of the library authority; and the librarian may issue three additional tickets which entitle the registered reader to books of non fiction or such greater number of tickets as the librarian to whom the application is made may determine.

(3) General tickets shall not be issued to a recognised organisation other than an educational institution which requires to borrow fiction for the purposes of study.

10. All tickets (except those held by persons paying a subscription) remain in force for a period of two years from the date of issue unless previously surrendered or cancelled.

11. (1) Registered readers shall not transfer their reader's tickets.

(2) Where books are borrowed on a reader's ticket the person in whose name the ticket is issued shall be held responsible for the books.

(3) Where a reader's ticket is lost or destroyed the person in whose name the ticket is issued shall immedately notify the librarian of the library in which the ticket was issued.

(4) Where a person proves to the satisfaction of the librarian that his reader's ticket has been lost or destroyed the librarian may on payment of the prescribed fee issue that person with a reader's ticket in lieu of the one lost or destroyed but the registered reader is responsible for any book borrowed on the ticket lost or destroyed.

12. A registered reader who changes his address or does not intend to use the library in the future shall notify the librarian immediately and forward his reader's tickets for alteration or cancellation.

13. Before a book is borrowed from the library the person borrowing it shall produce and leave with some responsible officer of the library a reader's ticket.

14. The librarian may decline to issue books to messengers whom he may consider too young or unfit to take care of them and he may also refuse to issue books except to the borrower in person.

15. (1) The time allowed for reading a book is fourteen days exclusive of the day of issue unless otherwise determined by the library authority with the concurrence of the Board.

(2) The librarian may decline to change a book on the day on which it was issued.

16. (1) If a book is not required by another reader the period of loan may be extended for a further period.

(2) An application for an extension of the period of the loan may be made by-

- (a) presenting the book at the library from which it was barrowed in order that it may be redated;
- (b) written application giving the name of the author and the title of the book and the date on which it was due to be returned to the library;
- (c) telephone to the librarian giving the particulars referred to in paragraph (b) of this sub-regulation.

17. (1) A registered reader who retains a book beyond the period of fourteen days from the date of issue, or beyond any period of loan which is extended in accordance with regulation sixteen of these regulations shall pay to the library authority a sum (if any) as may be determined by it not 'exceeding one shilling for each week that the book is retained after the prospective loan period until the book is returned to the library.

(2) The registered reader upon whose reader's ticket a book is borrowed shall pay postage and all other expenses incurred by a library authority in endeavouring to secure the return of the book.

(3) The librarian may at any time refuse to issue books to a registered reader who is in arrear with any payments due under the last preceding regulation without prejudice to the claim of the library authority for payment of any sums then due or to become due.

(4) If a registered reader is frequently guilty of returning books beyond the period of loan the library authority may suspend or cancel his reader's ticket or tickets.

18. The library authority may refuse to permit a registered reader to renew his reader's ticket or may at any time wholly cancel or suspend the ticket, if it deems the holder an unfit person to enjoy the privileges thereby conferred whereupon the ticket shall cease to be in force either wholly or during the period of suspension as the case may be.

19. (1) The librarian may refuse to issue any book to a registered reader who or any members of whose family or household he has reason to believe to be suffering or recovering from any infectious or contagious disorder.

(2) Where a book has been issued to a registered reader if a member of his family or household is suffering from any infectious or contagious disorder, he shall before returning the book notify the librarian of the fact and carry out such direction with regard to the book as the librarian may determine.

20. During the period a book is borrowed from a library by a registered reader he shall—

(a) keep the book clean;

available to him.

(b) not turn down the leaves or make pencil or other marks upon it; and

(c) protect the book from the weather and in all other ways take precautions to prevent any damage to or loss of value to the book.

21. (1) When and as often as a book is returned to a library the registered reader shall deliver or cause it to be delivered to the librarian of the library from which it was borrowed, at the desk or counter set apart for the purpose or the book may be returned to the library in a prepaid postage package addressed to the librarian.

(2) (a) Where a book is not returned after due notice requesting its return has been given by the librarian or is lost whilst being on loan to a registered reader or being so returned is on examination found to have been damaged or to have sustained loss of value, the registered reader who borrowed the book may be required to pay the cost of replacement of the book as determined by the Board and if the book is one volume of a set or series and it is found impracticable to replace that volume, to pay the cost of replacement of the whole work or at the direction of the Board to compensate the library authority and the Board for the loss or damage sustained.

(b) The Board's valuation of the cost of replacement of any book the whole of any work or the loss or damage sustained as provided in this regulation shall be final and conclusive.

22. (1) (a) Where a book is issued in a damaged or imperfect condition the registered reader shall report the fact to the librarian before he takes the book from the library.

(b) Where a book receives damage whilst in the custody of a registered reader he shall on returning the book call the attention of the librarian to any injury it has sustained; and any reader who fails to do so may be held responsible for the injury.

(2) Books stolen or lost remain the property of the Board although replaced or paid for.

(3) Nothing in this regulation is to be construed so as to diminish the effect of regulation number 21 of these regulations.

23. (1) Any book in the stock of the library will be reserved for a registered reader by the librarian on the completion of the appropriate application form.(2) The librarian shall notify the registered reader when the book is

24. (1) A registered reader may apply to the librarian for a book which is not at the time in the stock of the library and which is required by him for purposes of information or study and the librarian shall inform the Board of the reader's application.

(2) The Board may take such steps as are appropriate to supply the book or the information required.

25. Where a book is provided in the library for reference use only it shall not be borrowed from the library unless in the absolute discretion of the librarian the special circumstances of the case warrant that it should be permitted to be taken from the library.

26. (1) A person entering a library shall deposit umbrellas, sticks, bags, parcels and such other articles in such place as may be directed by a notice posted on the entrance to the library and all articles so deposited shall be reclaimed by the depositor before he leaves the library.

(2) The library authority has the right to open any bags or parcels or any other articles so deposited and if any articles so deposited are not claimed within seven days to forward the same to the Police Department.

(3) The library authority is not responsible for any loss of or damage to any articles deposited in the library in accordance with this regulation.

27. (1) Persons under the age of 14 years are eligible to make use of that part of the library or the books which are provided for adults only at the discretion of the librarian.

(2) Young children may be admitted to the library in the care of an adult who is responsible for their behaviour.

(3) Children who are noisy or ill-behaved may be excluded or removed from the library at the discretion of the librarian.

28. The librarian has the general control and charge of the library and is responsible to the library authority for the safe custody of the books and all other property therein or belonging thereto.

29 A person shall comply with any reasonable direction of the librarian and shall not wilfully obstruct any officer or servant of the library authority or the Board in the execution of his duty or wilfully disturb, interrupt or annoy any other person in the proper use of the library.

30 A person shall not cause or permit any dog or any other animal belonging to him or under his control to enter or remain in the library.

31. A person shall not bring into any part of the library a bicycle or other wheeled vehicle or conveyance except with the permission of the librarian.

32. A person other than an officer or servant of the library authority or the Board shall not enter or remain in any part of the library which is not set apart for the use of the public except with the permission of the librarian.

33. A person shall not spit in any part of the library.34. A person shall not lie on the chairs, table, floor or any other part of the library or loiter, sleep or partake of refreshment in the library.

35. A person other than an officer or servant of the library authority shall not affix or post any bill, placard or notice to or upon any part of the library.

36. A person who is offensively unclean in person or in dress or who is suffering from an offensive disease shall not enter or use the library.

37. A person shall not give a false name or address for the purpose of entering any part of the library or obtaining any privilege therefrom.

38. A person other than an officer or servant of the library authority shall not offer anything for sale in the library.

39. A person shall not behave in a disorderly manner, use violent, abusive or obscene language, or bet or gamble in the library.

A person shall not, after proper warning, remain in the library 40. beyond the hours fixed for the closing of the library.

41. A person shall not carelessly, negligently or maliciously soil, tear, cut, deface, damage, injure or destroy any book or other object forming part of the contents of the library whether within the library or elsewhere.

42. A person shall not make a tracing of any book except through a protective screen and with the permission of the librarian.

43. A person shall not without proper authority take or cause to be taken from the library or receive or be in possession of any book forming part of the contents of the library, whether or not the property of the Board or of the library authority.

44. A person shall not misplace or secrete any book or any record of a book in the library with intent to withhold its use from others.

45. (1) The librarian has the power-

(a) to suspend the use of a reader's ticket or tickets;

(b) to refuse books and to deny the use of the library to any person who refuses or neglects to comply with these regulations

(2) A person who is aggrieved by the decision of a librarian made under this section may appeal against the decision to the library authority whose decision on the matter is final.

46. The librarian may exclude or remove from the library-

(a) all disorderly persons;

(b) any person who appears to be intoxicated:

(c) a person who is not using the library for the purposes for which it is intended;

(d) a person who has committed a breach of these regulations if it appears likely that his continued presence in the library may lead to a further breach of the regulations. 47. All sums and penalties that are payable under these regulations may be recovered in any Court of competent jurisdiction by the Board or the library authority as the case may be as a deposit due to the Board or the library authority.

48. A person who commits a breach of these regulations is liable to a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds and in addition to any penalty imposed, the amount of any expense incurred in consequence of the breach shall be paid by the person.
