WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1953, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the

purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corr. No. 2353/89—That reserve No. 1856 at Carnarvon should vest in and be held by the Carnarvon Municipal Council in trust for the purpose of a Recreation Ground.

Corr. No. 4843/53—That reserve No. 23952 (Peel Estate Lot 310) at Baldivis should vest in and be held by the Rockingham Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation and Parklands.

Corr. No. 5407/47—That reserve No. 23956 (Collie Lot 1745) should vest in and be held by the Collie Coalfields Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

Corr. No. 3323/53—That reserve No. 23955 (Cadoux Lot 41) should vest in and be held by the Wongan-Ballidu Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation (Children's Playground).
