Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1952.

PROCLAMATION

WESTERN AUSTRALIA, By His Excellency The Honourable Sir John TO WIT, JOHN PATRICK DWYER, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator. LL.S.J EL.S.J By His Excellency The Honourable Sir John Most Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia.

WHEREAS under the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1952, it is enacted that the Lieutenant-Governor may by proclamation—(a) revoke any proclamation made under the Act; (b) prohibit, either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations, the bringing into any specified portion of the State from any other specified portion thereof of any specified kind of plant, fruit, or other thing which would in his opinion be likely to introduce any disease into the first-mentioned portion thereof: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, do by this proclamation:-

- (1) Revoke the proclamation made under the Act dated the 23rd day of December, 1936, and published in the Government Gazette on the 31st day of December, 1936.
- (2) Prohibit the bringing into those portions of the State described in the Second and Third Schedules to this proclamation fruit of any kind whatsoever from that portion of the State described in the First Schedule to this proclamation except in accordance with and subject to the relative regulations for the time and subject to the relative regulations. lations for the time being in force.
- (3) Prohibit the bringing into that portion of the State described in the Third Schedule to this proclamation between the 1st day of December and the 30th day of April next following in any yearly period fruit of any kind whatsoever from that portion of the State described in the Second Schedule to this proclamation and from any place in the State outside of the area covered by the First, Second and Third Schedules to this proclamation except in accordance with and subject to the relative regulations for the time being in force.
- (4) Prohibit except in accordance with the relative regulations in force the transport of fruit through that portion of the State described in the Third Schedule to this proclamation from a place within that portion of the State described in the First Schedule to this proclamation to any other portion of the State.

First Schedule.

(Area No. 1.)

All that portion of the State of Western Australia bounded on the South by the 33rd parallel of South latitude from the West coast to a point immediately South of Saddleback Hill, on the East by a straight line drawn from that point to a point midway between Baker's Hill and Clackline; on the North by a straight line drawn at right angles to the Eastern boundary line from the last-mentioned point to the West coast, and on the West by the West coast.

Second Schedule.

(Area No. 2.)

All that portion of the State of Western Australia bounded on the North by the 33rd parallel of South latitude from the West coast to a point 15 miles East of the Great Southern Railway; on the East by a line commencing at such point and running in a Southerly direction parallel with the

Great Southern Railway to a point on the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence where a line drawn from Cape Clairault on the West coast and running due East meets the No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence; on the South by the said last-mentioned line from the said point in No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence to Cape Clairault aforesaid and on the West by the West coast between Cape Clairault aforesaid and the 33rd parallel of South latitude.

Third Schedule.

(Area No. 3.)

All that portion of the State of Western Australia bounded on the North by a line commencing on the West coast at Cape Clairault and running thence in a direct Easterly direction until it reaches No. 2 Rabbit-proof Fence; thence running in a direct Southerly direction until it meets the South coast, thence following the coast in a Westerly and Northerly direction to Cape Clairault aforesaid.

Companies Act, 1943-1953.

Limited, desires to register as a foreign company under the Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by subsection (7) proviso (a) section 28 of the Act doth hereby authorise the Registrar to accept from the Empire Art Company Pty. Limited for filing the documents and particulars specified in paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), (e) and (f) of subsection (1) of section 329 of the Act.

Schedule.

- 1. These regulations may be cited the "Regulations Restricting the Movement of Fruit from Fruit Fly Infested Areas."
- 2. All previous regulations restricting the movement of fruit from fruit fly infested areas contained in the proclamation published in the Government Gazette on the 31st day of December, 1936, and in an Order in Council dated the 23rd day of December, 1936, and published in the Government Gazette on the 31st day of December, 1936, are repealed.
 - 3. In these regulations-
 - "Area No. 1" means that portion of the State more particularly described in the First Schedule to these regulations;
 - "Area No. 2" means that portion of the State more particularly described in the Second Schedule to these regulations;
 - "Area No. 3" means that portion of the State more particularly described in the Third Schedule to these regulations.

- 4. A person who desires to bring or send fruit into Area No. 2 and Area
 - (a) shall make application to an inspector for the fruit to be so brought or sent;
 - (b) shall, if so required by the inspector, furnish the following particulars:-
 - (i) the kind and quantity of the fruit proposed to be carried;
 - (ii) the place where the fruit has been packed for carriage;
 - (iii) the place from which and the place to which the fruit is intended to be carried;
 - (iv) the method of transportation and the proposed route of transportation:
 - (v) whether the cases or coverings in which the fruit is packed for carriage are new or second-hand;
 - (vi) the place where the fruit prior to carriage as proposed may be inspected by the inspector;
 - (vii) the period, if any, for which the fruit has been pre-cooled and the pre-cooling maximum temperature.
 - (c) shall in respect to area No. 2 comply with the provisions of regulations 6 and 7 of these regulations as far as they are applicable;
 - (d) shall in respect to area No. 3 comply with the provisions of regulations 8, 9 and 10 of these regulations as far as they are applicable.
- A person may send fruit of any kind into area No. 1 from any other part of the State.
- 6. Subject to the provisions of regulations 4 and 7 of these regulations a person may send fruit of any kind into area No. 2 from any other part of the State except from area No. 1.
- Notwithstanding the provisions of regulation 6 of these regulations a person may send into area No. 2 from area No. 1-
 - (a) apples, loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, quinces, plantains, pomegranates, guavas, cumquats, mangoes, tacsonias, persimmons, oranges, mandarins or grapefruit if the fruit has been subject to a process of pre-cooling at a maximum temperature of-
 - (i) 31°F, for a period of at least nine days; or
 - (ii) 34°F, for a period of at least 12 days; or
 - (iii) 37°F, for a period of at least 16 days; or
 - (b) lemons, grapes, pineapples, bananas and passionfruit which have been examined by an inspector and found to be free from fruit fly; or
 - (c) tomatoes.
- 8. A person shall not send into area No. 3 from any other part of the State during the period 1st December to the 30th April, fruit of any kind whatsoever except—
 - (a) apples, loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, quinces, plantains, pomegranates, guavas, cumquats, mangoes, tacsonias, persimmons, oranges, mandarins and grapefruit which have been subjected to a process of pre-cooling at a maximum temperature of-

 - (i) 31°F, for a period of at least nine days; (ii) 34°F, for a period of at least 12 days; or (iii) 37°F, for a period of at least 16 days; or
 - (b) lemons, grapes, pineapples, bananas and passionfruit which have been examined by an inspector and found to be free from fruit fly; or
 - (c) tomatoes; or
 - (d) oranges, mandarins and grapefruit from area No. 2 which have been examined by an inspector and found to be free from fruit fly.
- 9. During the period 1st May to the 30th November in any year a person may send into area No. 3 fruit of any kind from any other part of the State except from area No. 1.
- 10. Notwithstanding the provisions of regulation 9 of these regulations during the period 1st May to the 30th November a person may send from area No. 1 to area No. 3-
 - (a) apples, loquats, apricots, peaches, plums, nectarines, figs, pears, quinces, plantains, pomegranates, guavas, cumquats, mangoes, tacsonias, persimmons, oranges, mandarins or grapefruit which have been subjected to a process of pre-cooling at a maximum temperature of-

 - (i) $31^{\circ}F$, for a period of at least nine days; (ii) $34^{\circ}F$, for a period of at least 12 days; or (iii) $37^{\circ}F$, for a period of at least 16 days; or
 - (b) lemons, grapes, pineapples, bananas and passionfruit which have been examined by an inspector and found to be free from fruit fly; or
 - (c) tomatoes.

- 11. A person may transport fruit of any kind through area No. 2 from a place within area No. 1 to another place situated within the State but outside area No. 2 and area No. 3, if the most convenient route for transport lies through area No. 2.
- 12. A person who commits a breach of these regulations is liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five pounds.

First Schedule (Area No. 1).

All that portion of the State of Western Australia bounded on the South by the 33rd parallel of South latitude from the West coast to a point immediately South of Saddleback Hill, on the East by a straight line drawn from that point to a point midway between Baker's Hill and Clackline; on the North by a straight line drawn at right angles to the Eastern boundary line from the lastmentioned point to the West coast, and on the West by the West coast.

Second Schedule (Area No. 2).
