IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit the taking by any means whatsoever of the fish known as or called "Crayfish" in all Western Australian waters lying between the 30th and 33rd parallels of South latitude from the 1st day of September to the 19th day of November in each and every year.

The proclamation dated 19th August, 1953 (published in the *Government Gazette* No. 83 of 4th September, 1953) is hereby revoked.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice

and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit the taking by any means whatsoever of the fish known as or called "Crayfish" in all Western Australian waters specified in the schedule hereto from 1st November, 1954, to 30th July, 1955; from 1st August, 1955, to 30th July, 1956, and from 1st August, 1956, to 30th July, 1957, all dates inclusive.

Schedule.

All that portion of Western Australian waters lying between Knobby Head on the Western Australian coastline at approximate latitude 29° 40' 00" South, and North Head (Jurien Bay) at approximate latitude 30° 14' South including the Western Australian waters of the adjacent islands of that area.

Marketing of Onions Act, 1938-1953.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 4 of the Marketing of Onions Act, 1938-1953, that the Governor may at any time, on the application of The Western Australian Onion Marketing Board, provide and declare by proclamation that the property in all onions belonging to growers shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the proclamation or on or from some other date specified therein, be divested from the growers thereof and become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board as the owner thereof, and that any onions belonging to the growers thereafter coming into existence within a time specified in the proclamation shall become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board, and may by such proclamation make such further provision as will enable the Board effectively to obtain possession of such onions, and to deal with the same, as may be deemed necessary or convenient, in order to give full effect to the objects and purposes for which the Board has been constituted; and whereas the Board has made application for the issue of a proclamation accordingly, and it is deemed desirable and expedient that such proclamation shall be issued: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and pursuant to

the application of The Western Australian Onion Marketing Board, and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Act, do hereby provide and declare, for the purposes of the Act, that forthwith, upon the date of publication of this proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, the property in all onions then belonging to growers within the meaning of the Act shall, subject to all lawful exceptions and to any exemptions which may be lawfully granted by the Board, be divested from the growers thereof, and shall become vested in and be the absolute property of The Western Australian Onion Marketing Board as the owner thereof, and also that, subject to the exceptions and exemptions aforesaid, any onions belonging to the growers after the date of the publication of this proclamation in the *Government Gazette* and coming into existence within the period commencing on the said date and ending on the 30th day of September, 1955, shall, as from the time when they come into existence as aforesaid, become vested in and be the absolute property of the Board, and that as from the date of publication of this proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and whilst it continues in operation, the Board may, but subject to the regulations at any time or from time to time in force, do such lawful acts and things, and take such lawful means, as the owner thereof to obtain effectively possession of the onions which by virtue of this proclamation are the absolute property of the Board and to deal with the same, as the Board may deem necessary or convenient, in order to give full effect to the objects and purposes for which the Board has been constituted.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council, held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 3rd day of November, 1954, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by subsection (3) of section 14 of the Reciprocal Enforcement of Maintenance Orders Act, 1921, as amended by Acts No. 29 of 1923 and No. 7 of 1936, the Governor may, upon being satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made or are about to be made by the legislation of any part of the Queen's Dominions or other competent authority, for the enforcement within that part of maintenance orders made by Courts within this State by Order in Council, extend the said Act to that part of the Queen's Dominions; and whereas the Governor is satisfied that such reciprocal provisions have been made by Northern Rhodesia: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the said Act to Northern Rhodesia.

Constitution Act, 1889-1950.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS the enactment contained in section 74 of the Constitution Act, 1889-1950, by which the appointment of all public officers under the Government of the State is vested in the Governor in Council, does not apply to minor appointments which by Order in Council are vested in heads of departments or other officers or persons within the State; and whereas it is desirable that the minor appointments of persons who are exempt from the

provisions of the Public Service Act, 1904, employed by the Department of Lands and Surveys should be vested in James Alfred Davis and Harold Joseph Murphy as from 1st October, 1954, and that the like powers vested in Harold Duncan Black by Order in Council dated 2nd June, 1948, shall be cancelled: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor in Council by and with the advice of the Executive Council hereby declares that the power of making such minor appointments shall vest and the same is hereby vested in James Alfred Davis and Harold Joseph Murphy as from 1st October, 1954, and that the like powers vested in Harold Duncan Black by Order in Council dated 2nd June, 1948, shall be cancelled accordingly.

Land Act, 1933-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1954, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed or grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such board to make, repeal, and alter by-laws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the *Government Gazette*; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corr. No. 3492/14—That reserve No. 15605 (Plantagenet Location 3800), for the purpose of Gravel, should be placed under the control of the Albany Road Board as a board of management.

Corr. No. 2594/97, Vol 2.—That reserve No. 4134 at Mogumber, for the purpose of Public Utility, should be placed under the control of the Victoria Plains Road Board as a board of management.

Corr. No. 5270/50—That reserve No. 23138 (Avon Location 17794), for the purpose of Flora, should be placed under the control of the Kellerberrin Road Board as a board of management.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned reserves under the control of the above road boards as boards of management, and doth empower such boards to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserves; for prescribing fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected and disposed of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Bunbury Water Board.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1953, it is provided that before undertaking the construction of works in the Water Area the Minister shall submit plans, descriptions, books of reference, and estimates of the proposed works to the Governor for approval; and if they are approved the Governor may forthwith make an Order empowering the Water Board to undertake the construction of the works: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council hereby approves of the Bunbury Water Board Plan B.W.B. 125, descriptions, books of reference and estimates for the construction of water works within the Bunbury Water Area, which are duly submitted for approval, and hereby empowers the Bunbury Water Board to undertake the construction of the said works.

Tambellup Water Area.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 533/54.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1953, and the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912, the Governor is empowered by Order in Council to constitute the district of a local authority or two or more local authorities or any part or parts of such district or districts a Water Area, under such name as may be directed; and whereas, under

the provisions of the said Acts, the Governor may authorise the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage, to exercise within a Water Area all the functions of a Water Board: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute an area, having the boundaries described in the Schedule hereunder, a water area for the purposes of the said Acts, under the name of the Tambellup Water Area, and doth hereby appoint the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage, to exercise all the functions of a Water Board under the Acts in such Area.

Schedule.

All the land contained within the boundaries as follows:—

(a) Commencing at the North-West corner of Kojonup Location 1334 and proceeding North along a West boundary of location 1542 and its prolongation for 65 chains; thence East through locations 1542 and 1615 for 73 chains; thence South through locations 1615 and 1287 for 32 chains; thence South-West through location 1287 for 30 chains; thence South and West along boundaries of Kojonup Location 1352 and along a South boundary of location 1542 to the point of commencement.

(b) Twenty-five links on each side of a line commencing at the South-West corner of Kojonup Location 1352 and proceeding in a general South-Westerly direction to a point on the North boundary of the Tambellup townsite approximately 36 chains from its North-Eastern corner.

City of Perth and Canning Road District.
Adjustment of Boundaries.
ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS under the provisions of section 26 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1953, the Governor is empowered to alter, for the purposes of adjustment, the boundaries of any conterminous municipal district and road district; and whereas it is desirable that the boundary between the City of Perth Municipal District and the Canning Road District should be altered for the purposes of adjustment: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of the said Act and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, doth hereby order that the boundaries between the City of Perth Municipal District and the Canning Road District shall be altered for the purpose of adjustment as set out in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

1. Transfer of territory from Canning Road District to City of Perth.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the present common boundary and the prolongation North-Westerly of the North-Eastern side of Taree Street and extending South-Easterly to and along that side to a point in prolongation North-Easterly of the South-Eastern side of Reen Street; thence generally South-Westerly to and along that side to the present common boundary and thence North-Easterly along that common boundary to the starting point.

2. Transfer of territory from City of Perth to Canning Road District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Southern side of Reen Street and the present common boundary and extending South-Westerly along that common

boundary to the Eastern side of Hillview Terrace; thence Northerly along that side to a point in prolongation Westerly of the Southern side of Reen Street aforesaid and thence Easterly to and along that side to the starting point.

Traffic Act, 1919-1953.
Phillips River Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 426/54.

HIS Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order under the authority of section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1953, namely that the Phillips River Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of—

(1) Clause (a) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads.

(2) Clause (y) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, providing for the placing, erection or installation on roads or footpaths of traffic signs and directions, and for the marking on roads or footpaths of signs for the direction of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian.

(3) Clause (zl) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has, prior to notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette* been submitted to and approved by the Governor.

THE Port Hedland Road Board, under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it in that behalf by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws:—

1. In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the Port Hedland Road Board.

(b) "Continuous service" means service in the employment of the Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than 10 days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full time service with the armed forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere, between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and 3rd March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Board, provided that the requisite proof is produced.

2. All present and future employees of the Board shall, after each period of 10 years continuous service as permanent full-time employees

thereof, commencing as from 1st day of January, 1936, be entitled to thirteen (13) week's long service leave, and the employee shall be entitled to full pay for the said 13 weeks.

3. Long service leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, which will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employees, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months' notice.

4. Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, provided the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

5. Where any employee resigns, retires, or in the event of death of an employee, the Board may pay to the employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representative, or if there be none, to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement, or death, or if the Board, after consideration of all the circumstances, directs that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.

6. An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

7. (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wages for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Board may, at its discretion, either—

- (i) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave; or
- (ii) pay to the employee in advance a sum representing the amount of his wages or salary for the period of his long service leave.

8. All annual leave to which an employee is entitled before the expiration of his long service leave shall be taken by the employee in conjunction with his long service leave, but any public holidays which may occur during the taking of his long service leave are not to be paid for over and above the long service leave, but are to form part of such long service leave.

9. Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service, with a view to fitting the employee for a further term, and during such leave no employee shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward, unless by special permission of the Board. Any contravention of this by-law shall entitle the Board to dismiss the employee from its service, and to cease paying or to recover any amounts paid in advance on account of long service leave.

Provided that where any employee leaves the service of the Board, who has served continuously for one period of 10 years next before his retirement, he shall be paid long service leave pro rata for any additional period of service.

(1) In the interpretation of these by-laws the following words shall have the meanings assigned to them hereunder:—

(a) "Board" means the Mullewa Road Board.

(b) "Continuous Service" means service in the employment of this Board during which an employee has not been absent from the service of the Board for a continuous period of more than two days or an aggregate period of more than ten days without leave of absence being granted by the Board, provided that an employee who was employed by the Board on a permanent basis immediately prior to entering continuous full-time service with the armed forces of the Commonwealth of Australia, or who was directed by the Manpower Directorate to serve elsewhere, between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and 3rd March, 1947, shall have such service counted as continuous service with this Board provided that the requisite proof is produced.

(2) All present and future employees of the Board shall, after each period of ten years continuous service as permanent full-time employees thereof, commencing as from the 22nd day of February, 1947, be entitled to thirteen (13) weeks long service leave, and the employee shall be entitled to full pay for the said 13 weeks. Provided that where any employee leaves the service of the Board, who has served continuously for at least three years next before his retirement, he shall be paid for long service leave pro rata for the period of this employment.

(3) Long Service Leave shall be taken at the convenience of the Board, which will, as far as possible, meet with the wishes of the employee, but the Board may require the employee to take leave by giving not less than three months notice.

(4) Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed to be a break in continuity of service, provided the period of absence shall not exceed three months in any year, unless otherwise decided by the Board.

(5) Where any employee resigns, retires or in the event of the death of an employee, the Board may pay to the employee (or in the case of death, to his personal representatives, or if there be none, to his dependants) a sum of money equal to his wages or salary for the period of long service leave which the Board was empowered under these by-laws to grant to such employee at the date of his resignation, retirement, or death, or if the Board, after consideration of all the circumstances, directs that the death of an employee be presumed, the Board may authorise the payment to the dependants of the employee a sum equivalent to the amount of wages or salary which would under this by-law have been granted the employee immediately prior to the date of his death, such date to be determined by the Board.

(6) An employee dismissed by the Board, except in the matter of retrenchment, shall not be paid any sum in pursuance of the preceding by-law.

(7) (a) Employees due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary or wages for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the salary paid in the week immediately preceding the taking of long service leave.

(b) The Board may, at its discretion, either:—

- (i) pay to an employee his wages or salary periodically during long service leave, or

Bassendean Road District.

Bassendean Zoning By-laws.

L.G. 351/54.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, and the Town Planning and Development Act, 1929-1953, and all other powers thereto them enabling, the Bassendean Road Board to make the following by-law:—

1. That portion of the Bassendean Road Board District gazetted on the 28th August, 1936, pages 1347 and 1348, as the Bassendean Townsite is hereby classified into districts for residential, business, and industrial purposes as described in the schedules hereunder in accordance with Clause 3 of the Second Schedule of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1953.

Residential Areas.

2. All lands within the area of the First Schedule shall be available for residential use and may include residences, hostels, tenements and flats, boarding houses, churches, schools, road board buildings and other public and institutional buildings with the approval of the Board by resolution, but shall not include any industry, trade, manufactory or business.

3. No lot or land shall be built on until the land is drained to the satisfaction of the Board and provision made for the disposal of roof water and house sullage.

Industrial Area.

4. All lands within the area of the Second Schedule shall be available for industry, trade or manufactory, but not for residences.

4a. Where the Board is satisfied that the provision of a dwelling is necessary for the proper working or maintenance of an industry, it may approve of it by resolution.

Business Areas.

5. All lands within the area of the Third Schedule shall be available for Business purposes as follows:—

Shops, shops and dwellings combined, but not dwellings alone, offices, service stations and garages, hotels, cinemas, theatres, dance halls, and workrooms in connection with a business where not more than 50% of the building is so occupied. Churches, road board buildings, and other public and institutional buildings.

General Provision.

6. The erection of buildings for, or the carrying on of noxious trades or offensive trades (as described in the Health Act) are prohibited within the area of the gazetted townsite.

7. Within the area of the First and Third Schedule hereunder the erection and maintenance of any advertising device, advertisement hoardings or structure for advertising purposes is prohibited, provided that this by-law shall not apply to signs indicating professions, names, trades or callings exhibited on the land buildings on or in which such profession, trade or calling is conducted.

8. The minimum area on which a dwelling or shop with dwelling attachment may be erected is 6,000 square feet, provided that before a second house is erected on any given lot a subdivision shall be approved by the Town Planning Board so that each house shall stand on a separate lot.

9. Any person who shall erect any building or structure or who shall structurally alter any building or maintain any structure or building in contravention of these by-laws shall, on conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20.

10. Claim for compensation by reason of the operation of these by-laws shall be made not later than six months from the date on which these by-laws are first published in the *Government Gazette*.

11. If at the time when this by-law shall come into operation any building or land is being used for a purpose other than is permitted by this by-law (hereinafter called "a non-conforming use") such building or land may continue to be used for such non-conforming use and the Board may in its discretion subject to conformity with the building by-laws permit such building to be added to or altered so as to cover so much of the block on which it stands and/or any adjoining land as may be otherwise lawfully built upon which may be owned by the proprietor of such building at the time when this by-law shall come into operation.

When a non-conforming use has been discontinued or changed to a conforming one, such non-conforming use shall not thereafter be recommenced.

No building which has been damaged by fire, by act of God or other casualty to the extent of 75% or more of its cubic extent, shall be repaired or rebuilt except in conformity with the provisions of this by-law unless by special permission of the Board.

First Schedule—Residential Areas.

All lots or parcels of land situated in the Bassendean Townsite as gazetted on the 28th August, 1936, and not included in the Second or Third Schedule, except as provided therein.

Second Schedule—Industrial Areas.

That portion of the Bassendean Townsite as is enclosed within the following boundaries:—

The Bayswater Road Board boundary on the West.

The northern boundaries of lots 956, 957, 958, 959, 960 and 932 on the North.
Troy Street and Scadden Streets on the East, and Railway Avenue on the South.

Third Schedule—Business Areas.

- (1) Walter Road—Ida Street—Lots 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, being previously known as Lots 663-662.
- (2) Chapman Street—Lots 30, 31, 32.
- (3) West Road—Lots 262, 263, 264, and 265.
- (4) Guildford Road—From Whitfield Street to Kenny Street, only all those lots facing the Guildford Road.
- (5) Anzac Terrace—Panzance Street Intersection—Lot 940.
- (6) Broadway—Railway Avenue—Lots 735, 736, 737, 738, 739, 740, 741, 742, 743, 744, 745; Lots 363, 364, 365; Lots 807, 808.
- (7) Ashfield—Lots 224, 225 and 226, at corner of Maidos Street and Coulston Road.

Port Hedland Road Board By-laws.

PURSUANT to an Order in Council promulgated in the *Government Gazette* on the 28th August, 1953, under section 35A of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, and in exercise of all other powers thereto enabling it, the Port Hedland Road Board doth hereby make

and publish the following by-laws for the establishment of a dog pound and the control of dogs within the area of the Port Hedland Road Board.

1. In these by-laws the term "Board" shall mean the Port Hedland Road Board.

2. The Board may establish and maintain a pound or pounds for the impounding of dogs seized pursuant to the provisions of the Dog Act, 1903-1948.

3. A dog seized by the police or by an officer authorised by the Board may be placed in a pound.

4. Where a dog has been seized or placed in a pound the keeper of the pound or other officer authorised by the Board shall, if the owner or person usually in charge of the dog is known to him, forthwith notify such person that the dog has been impounded.

5. If the owner or person apparently acting on behalf of the owner of a dog seized or impounded shall claim such dog then upon payment of the fees specified in the Schedule hereto, the dog shall be released to such person.

6. The pound keeper shall be in attendance at the pound for the release of dogs at such times and on such days of the week as shall from time to time be determined by the Board.

7. Any person applying for the release of a dog seized or impounded shall prove to the satisfaction of the pound keeper or other officer authorised by the Board, the ownership of the dog and his authority to take delivery of it. The pound keeper or officer may accept such proof as he considers satisfactory and no person shall have any right of action against him or the Board in respect of the delivery of a dog in good faith.

8. If a dog shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of its being seized, or if a dog having a collar around its neck with a registration label for the current year affixed thereto shall not be claimed and the said fees paid within 48 hours of the service of a notice upon the registered owner the pound keeper or other officer authorised by the Board may sell such dog.

9. Upon the sale of a dog the proceeds of the sale shall be the property of the Board and may be disposed of in such manner as the Board thinks fit. The owner of a dog sold pursuant to these by-laws shall have no claim against the Board in respect of the proceeds thereof.

10. If within the time mentioned in by-law 8 hereof or at any time before the destruction of a dog the dog has not been claimed as aforesaid, and the said fees paid, and if no offer has been received for its purchase, the dog may be destroyed.

11. Notwithstanding anything herein contained but subject to the provisions of section 19 of the Dog Act, 1903-1948, any dog seized or impounded may at any time, be destroyed upon the authority of the Secretary of the Board if, in the opinion of the secretary, the dog is too savage or noisy to be kept or is suffering from an injury, disease or sickness.

12. If the Board shall destroy a dog at the request of its owner, whether such dog shall have been seized or impounded or not, the owner shall pay the Board the fee specified in the Schedule hereto.

13. No person shall—

(a) unless a pound keeper or other officer of the Board duly authorised in that regard, release or attempt to release a dog from a pound;

(b) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any pound;

(c) destroy, break into, damage, or in any way interfere with or render not dog-proof any cart, vehicle or container used for the purpose of catching, holding, or conveying dogs which have been seized.

14. The owner of a dog shall keep such dog chained or under effective control from sunset to sunrise.

15. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places:—

- (a) A public building.
- (b) A theatre or picture garden.
- (c) A house of worship.
- (d) A shop or other public business premises.

16. The owner of a dog shall prevent that dog from entering or being in any of the following places unless on a leash held by a person:—

- (a) A sports ground.
- (b) An area set aside for public recreation including Swimming Baths.
- (c) A car Park.
- (d) A school.
- (e) Any land invested in or under the control of the Board other than a road.

17. No person shall obstruct or hinder an employee of the Board or member of the Police Force in the performance of anything authorised by the provisions of the Dog Act 1903-1948, or the regulations made in pursuance of those provisions.

18. The payment of fees in respect of the seizure, care, detention or destruction of a dog shall not relieve the owner of it of liability to a penalty under any of the provisions of these by-laws.

19. Any person who shall commit a breach of these by-laws shall, upon conviction, be liable to a penalty not exceeding £5.

1. Regulation 36 is amended—
 - (i) by adding after the word "hours" in line seven the words "Where the milk passes the standard prescribed for first grade, subsequent deliveries prior to the next succeeding test shall be deemed to be first grade"; and
 - (ii) by adding after the word "hours" in line nine the words "Where the milk is of the standard prescribed for second grade subsequent deliveries shall be tested at each delivery until the milk reaches the standard prescribed for first grade."
2. Regulation 38 is amended—
 - (i) by deleting subregulation (2) and substituting the following:—
 - (2) Subject to subregulation (4) of this regulation, a sample of milk from each supplier shall be subjected to the Methylene Blue Reductose Test as follows:—
 - (a) The milk shall be sampled at intervals of not more than five days, or at such lesser intervals as an inspector may require.
 - (b) Where the evening and the morning milk are delivered together samples shall be taken from the mixed milk.
 - (c) Where the milk is delivered twice daily the sample may be taken from either one delivery.
 - (d) The samples shall be tested immediately except that where the samples are held at a temperature between 32°F. and 50°F. they may be kept for a period not exceeding 16 hours.

(ii) by deleting from paragraph (b) all the words commencing from "A solution" in line two down to the word "millilitres" in line eight and substituting the following words:—

Methylene blue tablets manufactured under arrangements made by the Minister for Food or the Minister for Health, England, shall be used for the test. A solution shall be prepared by adding one tablet to two hundred millilitres of cold sterile, glass-distilled water, shaking until the tablet is completely dissolved and making up to eight hundred millilitres with cold, glass-distilled water.
