IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from 1st January, 1955, to 31st December, 1960, inclusive.

Schedule.

1. The whole of the waters of the Channel Entrance to Peel's Inlet (Mandurah) bounded on the North by a line drawn in an Easterly direction from the extremity of the Western point of entrance (at the bar) to a point on the mainland on the Eastern shore, and on the South by lines drawn in an Easterly direction from the South-Eastern corner of Murray Location No. 5 to the Southern extremity of Channel Island; thence to the South-Western extremity of Creery Island and by its Southern foreshore to the Eastern extremity of that island; thence by a line drawn in a North-Easterly direction to a point on the foreshore of the mainland.

2. The whole of the waters of the Serpentine River, the Murray River and the Dandalup River (including estuaries, tributaries, lakes and lagoons the waters of which during any time of the year have access directly or indirectly to the sea) lying North, East and South-East of a line drawn from a point on the Eastern foreshore of Peel's Inlet situated East of the Southernmost point of Goonoolup Island and extending in a Westerly direction half-a-mile; thence in a Northerly direction to the foreshore of Peel's Inlet to a point lying West of the Western side of the entrance to the Serpentine River.

3. The whole of the waters of the Harvey River and that portion of the Harvey Estuary South of a line, being the prolongation Easterly to the Eastern shore of the estuary of the Northern boundary of Murray Location No. 479.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in any of the portions of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto for a period of five years from date of publication of this proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

Schedule.

All that area of water bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Northern side of the Denison Townsite Jetty and the shore of the Indian Ocean and extending generally North-Easterly and North along the foreshore to the mouth of the Irwin River thence West for a distance of 20 chains then generally South and South-Westerly parallel to the shoreline to a point 20 chains West of the intersection of the Northern side of the

Denison Townsite Jetty and the shore of the Indian Ocean thence East to the starting point. (Public Plans Denison Townsite and 124B/40.)

The Proclamation dated 8th February, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 9) of 26th February, 1954, is hereby cancelled.

WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Administration Act, 1905-1947 (reprinted), it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to declare any Crown Lands to be a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable that a Reserve for Natives be declared in the Pingelly district: Now, therefore, I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby declare the area more particularly described in the Schedule hereto to be a Reserve for Natives.

Schedule.

Pingelly District—Reserve 13982 (Natives).

All that portion of land being Pingelly Lots 573, 574 and 567 to 570 inclusive and comprising about 22 acres.

Alteration of Common Boundary and Redescription of the Gascoyne-Minilya Road District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 3332/52.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, under the provisions of section 8 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, doth hereby:—

(1) Alter the common boundary between the Gascoyne-Minilya and Upper Gascoyne Road Districts by severing that portion of the Gascoyne-Minilya Road District as described in Schedule "A" hereto and annexing it to the Upper Gascoyne Road District.

(2) Redescribe the district boundaries of the Gascoyne-Minilya Road District as described in Schedule "B" hereto.

394/447 and Location 61 (Reserve 16528) to the Northern boundary of Pastoral Lease 394/487; thence East and South along boundaries of that pastoral lease to the right bank of the Wooramel River; thence generally South-Easterly upwards along that bank to a point in prolongation North of the West boundary of Pastoral Lease 394/522; thence South to and along that boundary to the South-East corner of late Pastoral Lease 394/691 (Callatharra Station); thence West, North and again West along boundaries of that late pastoral lease and onwards to and along the North boundary of Pastoral Lease 394/1235 to the South-East corner of the Northern portion of Pastoral Lease 394/895; thence North and West along boundaries of that pastoral lease to the North-East corner of Pastoral Lease 394/1362; thence South, West, again South, again West and North along boundaries of Pastoral Leases 394/1362 and 394/1383 to a South-East corner of Pastoral Lease 394/549; thence West along a South boundary of that pastoral lease to the South-East corner of late Pastoral Lease 2985/96; thence North, West and South along boundaries of that late pastoral lease to a point in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of reserve 11076; thence Westerly to and along that boundary to the low-water mark of the Indian Ocean; thence generally Northerly along that low water mark to a point in prolongation Westerly of the Southern boundary of Carnarvon Town Lot 566 (Reserve 22753), thence Easterly to and along that boundary and onwards to a point in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of Gascoyne Location 32; thence Northerly to and along the Western boundaries of locations 32, 27, 9, 74 and 8 and onwards to the Southern boundary of location 99, thence generally North-Westerly and generally North-Easterly along boundaries of that location to a point in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of location 50; thence Northerly along that prolongation to the South-Eastern corner of location 182; thence North-Westerly along the South-Western boundaries of locations 182 and 183 to a point in prolongation North-Easterly of the South-Eastern boundary of location 184; thence South-Westerly, North-Westerly and again South-Westerly to and along the Southern boundaries of locations 184, 185 and 211 to 204 inclusive to the Eastern boundary of location 186; thence Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of locations 186 and 187 to the South-Western corner of the latter locations; thence South-Westerly to the South-Eastern corner of location 220; thence Easterly along the prolongation of the Southern boundary of that location to the right bank of the Gascoyne River, thence generally Westerly downwards along that bank to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean and thence generally Northerly and generally Southerly along the low water mark of the Indian Ocean and Exmouth Gulf to the starting point. Corrigin Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 1359/52.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following order under the authority of section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1953, namely, that the Corrigin Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of—

- (1) clause (v) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting the use of any specified road by any vehicle, or by any person riding, driving, or in charge of any animal, except when proceeding in a prescribed direction;

- (2) clause (w) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the routes to be followed by all classes of traffic, or of any particular class of traffic or vehicle, from one specified point to another, either generally or between any specified time;
- (3) clause (y) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, providing for the placing, erection or installation on roads or footpaths of traffic signs and directions, and for the marking on roads or footpaths of signs for the direction of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian;
- (4) clause (zd) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, appointing stands and parking places for different classes of vehicles and regulate the use thereof, and to appoint officers to take charge thereof;
- (5) clause (zl) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has, prior to notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.

AT a meeting of the Board of Management of the Wiluna District Hospital held on the 31st day of July, 1953, the following resolution was passed:—

Whereas under the provisions of section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927-1953, a Board may itself establish and manage a medical fund, the object of which shall be to secure for its subscribers medical attendance, hospital treatment, or other similar benefits and may by by-laws provide for the regulation and control of such fund; and whereas the Board of Management of the Wiluna District Hospital has established a medical fund and has made by-laws for the control and management thereof as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of May, 1942, and further amended by notices published in the *Government Gazette* on the 15th day of March, 1945, and on the 3rd day of October, 1947; and whereas the said Board of Management now deems it expedient to cancel the said by-laws and substitute the by-laws set forth in the Schedule hereunder: Now, therefore, the said Board of Management of the Wiluna District Hospital, acting pursuant to section 23 of the Hospitals Act, 1927-1953, doth hereby cancel the by-laws for the control and management of its said medical fund hereinbefore mentioned and substitute the by-laws set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

1. The term "Subscriber" shall mean any person, male or female, who has paid his or her subscription and is financial, and has paid at least two weeks' subscription prior to seeking any benefits or privileges and shall include, as far as benefits are concerned, all dependants of the subscriber.

2. Any person who subscribes nine pence (9d.) per week or the sum of 9s. 9d. per quarter shall be termed a subscriber. Male and female persons earning in excess of three pounds (£3) per week, who are under the age of 16 years, must subscribe at the above approved rate.

3. The word "dependant" shall mean the wife, a female relative occupying the position as head of the household, brothers and sisters not over

the age of 16 years, and the sons and daughters who are actually residing with and wholly dependent on him at the time of the treatment received at the Wiluna District Hospital. If the medical officer or matron is not aware or is in doubt as to whether any person is or is not a dependant, he or she may refer the matter to the secretary and be guided by his decision.

4. Every subscriber and his dependants shall be entitled to out-patient treatment only, and to medicines, dressings and appliances, subject to the conditions and limitations set forth in these by-laws for as long as the medical officer or matron deems necessary, free of charge.

5. Subscribers shall not receive free treatment in any of the following cases:—

- (a) Incurable diseases.
- (b) Disorders for the cure of which other establishments are provided.
- (c) Any person requiring food and not medicine and who is more properly the subject for the benevolent institution.
- (d) Venereal disease.
- (e) Alcoholism, or conditions resulting therefrom.
- (f) Dentistry.
- (g) Insanity.
- (h) Any person for any condition for which he is already covered by insurance under the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1953.
- (i) Pathological examination fees.
- (j) No patent medicines or any medicines prepared and sold under any proprietary name will be supplied free of charge to any subscriber or his dependants, unless the Board of Management decide that any particular medicine may be included as a benefit. In all other cases any patent medicine or proprietary line prescribed by the medical officer or matron must be paid for by the subscriber at the price to be fixed by the Board of Management.
- (k) "Accouchements or miscarriages." Subscribers or their dependants who attend hospital as an out-patient for treatment.
- (l) Dental attention—extractions.
- (m) The following surgical procedures if performed without a general anaesthetic shall be deemed minor operations and be free of charge:—Opening boils, abscesses, suturing wounds, setting minor fractures and other such minor operations.

6. The Wiluna District Hospital Out-patient Medical Fund is only effective within the Wiluna District, and any medical expenses incurred by subscribers outside such district will not be recognised or met from such fund.

7. Subscribers and their dependants requiring out-patient treatment shall attend the Wiluna District Hospital between the hours of 10 a.m. to 12 noon and from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m., and from 6 p.m. to 7 p.m.

8. At any general meeting of subscribers five per cent. of the subscribers who are registered in the register of subscribers shall be a quorum.

- (a) by deleting the words "as and" in line three of clause five and substituting the words "in the first course of training commencing at the Teachers' College following the completion of the bursary"; and
- (b) by deleting paragraph (b) of clause eight and substituting the following:—
 - (b) If the student teacher is judged unsuitable by the Director of Education during the first six months of the course of training no claim will be made by the Minister for allowances received by the student while a Bursar or while undergoing Teacher Training."

2. The Agreement for a Course of Training at Teachers' College Male Student, contained in Appendix 8 is amended—
