WHEREAS it is enacted by section 17, subsection (2) of the Charitable Collections Act, 1946-1949, that the moneys, securities for moneys or goods vested in the Minister by a proclamation made under the section shall be held upon the trusts upon which they were held prior to being vested in the Minister; and whereas the Governor may by proclamation vary the trusts and may by the same or any subsequent proclamation vest the said moneys, securities and goods or any part thereof in such persons and for such charitable purposes as the Governor shall specify; and whereas by proclamation published in the Government Gazette all moneys and securities for money held by any person for the purposes of the Grant's Patch Hall Fund were vested in the Chief Secretary, the Minister of the Grown to whom for the time being the ter of the Crown to whom for the time being the administration of the Act is committed: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim-

- (a) that the said trusts are varied; and
- (b) that all moneys and securities for moneys held by any person for the purposes of the Grant's Patch Hall Fund vested in the Minister, shall now vest in the Trustees for the time being of the Grant's Patch Progress Association for public purposes beneficial to the community at Grant's Patch.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 19 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council do hereby declare as follows:-

- (a) That with respect to nets known as or called "set nets," nets of not more than 500 yards in length having meshes throughout of not less than 2½in. shall when used or intended to be used in the waters of Peel's Inlet and Harvey Estuary, be lawful nets.
- (b) That with respect to nets known as or called "hauling nets" when used or intended to be used for the catching of mullet and yellow-eye mullet, nets of not more than 800 yards in length having meshes throughout of not less than 2in. shall when used or intended to be used in the waters of Peel's Inlet and Harvey Estuary, be lawful nets.
- (c) That with respect to nets known as or called "whiting set nets" for catching whiting, nets of not more than 300 yards in length having meshes throughout of 13 in. and of not more than 33 meshes in depth shall when used or intended to be used in the waters of Peel's Inlet and Harvey Estuary, be lawful nets.
- (d) That with respect to nets known as or called "whiting hauling nets" for catching whiting, nets of not more than 120 yards in length, having meshes throughout of 1\frac{3}{1}\text{in.}, shall when used or intended to be used in the waters of Peel's Inlet and Harvey Estuary, be lawful nets. It shall be lawful for nets known as or called "whiting hauling nets" to be used in conjunction with nets known as or called used in conjunction with nets known as or called "mullet and yellow-eye mullet nets."

(e) That with respect to nets known as or called "garfish nets" for the catching of garfish, nets or not more than 60 yards in length having meshes throughout of not less than 11 in. shall when used or intended to be used in the waters of Peel's Inlet and Harvey Estuary, be lawful nets. It shall be lawful for nets known as or called "garfish nets" to be used in conjunction with nets known as or called "mullet and yellow-eye mullet hauling nets."

The proclamations dated 11th May, 1939; 19th March, 1941; 27th January, 1950, and 10th March, 1952, and published in the Government Gazettes of 19th May, 1939, 21st March, 1941 (No. 11) of 10th February, 1950, and (No. 34) of 21st March, 1952, are hereby cancelled.

- (5) repair and replace where necessary any steps or handrails thereof which may be in disrepair;
- (6) repair or replace any fiashings which may become in disrepair;
- (7) replace any ant stops which shall be missing or in disrepair;
 (8) repair or renew any ventilators which shall become in disrepair or missing;
- (9) keep all floors even in surface and free from cracks;
- (10) replace or repair all skirtings, architraves and fixtures which may become a harbourage for vermin;
- (11) keep all walls, ceilings and the plaster and wall paper thereon in good repair, and repair any cracks and renew any plaster or wall paper which may become dilapidated
- or in disrepair;
 (12) refit and repair any doors which may become in disrepair or which shall cease
- to fit properly;

 (13) repair or replace with new, any window frames or sash cords which may become broken or in disrepair and reglass any windows which may become broken or cracked:
- (14) keep all water service in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the provisions of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act and regulations and by-laws
- made thereunder;
 (15) keep all electric wiring and fittings in such state of repair and condition as shall comply in all respects with all of the requirements of the Fire Underwriters' Association of W.A.;

- (16) retain all natural lighting free from any obstruction which would reduce the natural lighting below the ratio of one square foot of lighting to each 10 square feet of fioor





HIS Excellency the Governor in Executive Council, acting under the provisions of the Cemeteries Act, 1897-1946, has been pleased to approve of the bylaws, made by the Tableland Road Board as trustees of the Wittenoom Gorge Public Cemetery and set forth in the Schedule hereunder.

Schedule.

By virtue of all the powers in that behalf vested in the trustees of the Wittenoom Gorge Public Cemetery, the said trustees hereby make the following by-laws in respect of the said cemetery:—

- 1. All fees and charges payable to the trustees as set forth in Schedule "A" shall be paid at the times and manner therein mentioned unless otherwise ordered.
- 2. The "secretary" as referred to in these bylaws, means the person for the time being employed by the trustees as the secretary of the cemetery, and such person shall, subject to the trustees, exercise a general supervision and control over all matters pertaining to the cemetery, and to the carrying out and enforcement of these by-laws and the direction of such person shall in all cases and for all purposes be presumed to be and to have been the direction of the trustees.
- 3. A plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, sections, situation and number of grave, and a register of all certificates of Rights of Burial, shall be kept at the office of the trustees.
- 4. Any person desiring to inter any dead body in the cemetery shall make an application in the form contained in Schedule "F."
- 5. All applications for interment shall be made at the office of the trustees in such time as to allow at least eight working hours' notice being given to the secretary at the office prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made.
- 6. The trustees shall cause all graves to be dug, and vaults, brick graves to be reopened as and when required.
- 7. Every coffin shall have upon the lid an approved metal plate bearing the name of the deceased, stamped or otherwise indelibly inscribed in legible characters thereon. A coffin which does not comply with this by-law shall not be admitted to or be interred in the cemetery.
- 8. Every grave shall be at least 6ft. deep at the first interment and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than 3ft. from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the surrounding ground, but in the case of the Australian War Cemetery, every grave shall be at least 5ft. deep, and one interment shall take place in each grave.

- 9. In the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which the deceased had no claim during life, the written and verified consent of the grantee shall be handed in with the application.
- 10. No burial shall be allowed to take place in the cemetery unless a certificate from a District Registrar of Deaths that the death has been registered, or a coroner's order for burial is handed to the secretary. Such certificate shall be retained by the secretary, but any coroner's order shall be returned to the person delivering the same.
- 11. No interment shall be allowed on Sunday except when it is certified in writing by a medical officer of health that for sanitary or special religious reasons it is necessary or advisable that the burial take place on that day.
- 12. The hours for burial shall be as follows:—Week days, from 8 a.m. to 4.30 p.m., Sundays, from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m., and no burial be allowed to take place, nor any coffin enter the cemetery at any other hour except by permission of the trustees. No burial shall take place on Christmas Day or Good Friday.
- 13. The time fixed for any burial shall be the time at which the funeral is to arrive at the cemetery gates, and, if not punctually observed, the undertaker responsible shall be liable to a fine of 10s. 6d.
- 14. Every funeral shall enter by the principal entrance, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to enter the cemetery or stand opposite the entrance gates.
- 15. If applications be made to the trustees to exhume any corpse for the purpose of examination or identification, or for the purpose of its being buried elsewhere in accordance with the wishes of the deceased or his family, an order from the Governor or the warrant of a coroner or of a Justice of Peace issued in accordance with the law authorising the Board to permit of the exhumation must be attached to the application form.
- 16. Children under the age of 10 years entering the cemetery must be in the charge of some responsible person.
- 17. Smoking shall not be allowed within the cemetery, nor may any fireworks be discharged therein.
- 18. No dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery, and any found therein shall be liable to be destroyed.
- 19. Any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border, grave, or any erection, or in anyway infringing these bylaws, shall be expelled from the cemetery.
- 20. No person shall remove any plant, tree, shrub, flower (other than withered flowers) or any article from any grave without first obtaining a permit from the trustees or their representatives.
- 21. No person shall pluck any tree, shrub, plant, or flower growing in any portion of the cemetery.
- 22. No person shall remove or carry out of the cemetery any tree, plant, flower or shrub without the written authority of the trustees or their representatives.
- 23. No person shall promote or advertise, or carry on within the cemetery any trade, business or calling either by solicitation, distribution of circulars, by cards or otherwise, or by any other system of advertising whatsoever, without the written consent of the trustees, and any person infringing this by-law shall be expelled from the cemetery.
- 24. No person employed by or under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever nor shall he be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery, other than the remuneration he receives from the trustees, and any such person proved guilty of accepting any gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to summary dismissal.
- 25. Any person requiring an Exclusive Right of Burial in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees, in writing, specifying the location of

- the grave. If it is proposed to inter therein the remains of any already deceased person the name of such person must be shown in the application. If the application is approved by the trustees a Grant of Exclusive Right of Burial shall be issued in the form Schedule "C."
- 26. No brick grave or vault shall be constructed in any plot in respect of which a Grant of Exclusive Right of Burial has been issued without the authority of the trustees first being obtained, and subject also to the approval by the said trustees of the plans and specifications of the proposed work and the execution thereof.
- 27. Every such grant of Exclusive Right of Burial shall be subject to the by-laws for the time being, and no interment in any such grave or vault shall be allowed unless upon production of the grant aforesaid, nor shall any such grave or vault be opened, unless with the consent of the trustees.
- 28. Every coffin placed in any such grave or vault shall be bricked in, cemented, and any space surrounding such coffin to be filled in with charcoal dry earth, or other suitable material, and covered with a slab of stone, slate or iron, unless special written exemption be obtained from the trustees.
- 29. In the event of such exemption being obtained from the trustees, each coffin placed in any brick grave or vault shall be properly lead lined and hermetically sealed.
- 30. If application be made for an interment in any grave or vault, of the remains of any person other than the person to whom the grant was issued, or his registered assign, the written and verified consent of such grantee or assignee shall be produced, together with the Grant of Right of Burial.
- 31. Should the grantee be unable to produce the Grant of Right of Burial on making application for a grave to be re-opened for the purpose of interment, through having lost same, the said grantee shall make a sworn declaration to this effect, and shall pay the fee for a copy of such Grant of Right of Burial, as prescribed in Schedule "A," before the interment takes place.
- 32. Any person desiring to place or erect, or to alter or add to any monument, tombstone, or any enclosure in any part of the cemetery, must first obtain the written consent and approval of the trustees, and otherwise comply with section 23 of the Cemeteries Act, 1897-1946.
- 33. Every tombstone, monument, or enclosure shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations, which if required by the trustees or their officers, shall extend to the bottom of the Grave.
- 34. The materials used in every such erection shall be subject to the approval of the secretary or other officer appointed by the trustees, and any material rejected shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the contractor for the erection. All refuse and other rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be immediately removed from the cemetery by the person causing same.
- 35. Should any work by masons or others be not completed before a Sunday, they shall be required to leave the work in a neat and safe condition to the satisfaction of the secretary.
- 36. Monumental masons and other tradesmen shall, before commencing work within the cemetery, deposit with the secretary to the trustees the sum of 10s. which shall be forfeited if the provisions of either of the two preceding by-laws be not complied with to the satisfaction of the secretary.
- 37. All materials required in the erection and completion of any work shall, as far as is possible, be prepared before taken to the cemetery; and all materials required by tradesmen shall be admitted at the main entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than 4in, broad shall be permitted to enter the cemetery.
- 38. Monumental masons shall not be permitted to carry on work within the cemetery during other than the hours specified for the opening and closing of the gates on week days, Saturday and Sunday excepted, when no work is to be done from noon

on Saturday to the opening of gates on the Monday morning, without the written consent of the

- 39. Subject to the approval of the trustees, each applicant for an Order for Burial shall, within three months from the date of the application cause to be placed thereon a number plate bearing the number of the grave or vault. Every grave, vault monu-ment, tombstone, kerbing or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition, and at the expense of the grantee. Should the grantee's residence not be known, or be out of the State, the trustees to have the power to do the work and keep an account against the grantee.
- 40. No wooden fence, railing, cross or other wooden erection shall be allowed on or around any grave or vault.
- 41. No trees or shrubs shall be planted on any grave except such as shall be approved by the secretary.
- 42. All workmen, whether employed by the trustees or by any other person shall at all times whilst within the boundaries of the cemetery be subject to the supervision of the secretary, and shall obey such directions as that officer may find it necessary to give; and any workmen permitting any breach of these regulations and by-laws, or refusing or neglecting to comply with any directions of the said secretary, shall be removable from the cemetery.
- 43. Any person taking part in dressing or attending to any grave shall comply with the following rules:
 - (a) No rubbish, soil, sand or other material removed in dressing a grave shall be placed on any other grave, and if placed on any adjoining ground shall be removed immediately the work is completed.
 - (b) No sand, soil or loam shall be taken from any portion of the cemetery for the purpose of dressing any grave, except with the permission of the secretary.
 (c) The dressing of all graves, and the wheelers are continuously as the secretary.
 - ing and carting of any material shall be subject to the supervision of the secretary.
 - (d) Work in all cases to be carried on with the due despatch, and only during regulation
- 44. Prior to conducting any interment within the cemetery or making use of the cemetery for any purpose connected with interments, every undertaker shall pay to the trustees an annual fee as prescribed in Schedule "A," and shall at the time of making such payment, give his assent in writing to such conditions as the trustees may deem fit to impose . Upon such assent being given and fit to impose. Upon such assent being given, and payment of the fee made, he shall receive a permit, to hold good during good behaviour and until the first day of July following, and unless in the possession of such permit no undertaker shall be allowed to engage in or carry out any duty or work within the cemetery.
- 45. The trustees may decorate graves from time to time, when desired by the grantees so to do. If the grantees do not desire the trustees to carry out this work, the grantees may either do it themselves or employ any person licensed by the trustees for that purpose.
- 46. No person, except the relatives of the deceased, the trustees or those licensed by the trustees shall be permitted to decorate any grave.
- 47. If for the purpose of re-opening a grave the trustees find it necessary to remove edging tiles, plants, grass, shrubs, etc., from off the grave, the person so ordering the re-opening shall pay to the trustees the charges laid down in Schedule "A."
- 48. Notwithstanding anything contained in the by-laws to the contrary, permission may be granted to the Defence Department of the Commonwealth to erect headstones on the graves of the deceased soldiers without payment of any fee.
- 49. Free ground may be granted if it is proved to the satisfaction of the trustees-
 - (a) that the deceased was a returned soldier, and that he died as the result of injuries received on active service;

- (b) that the relatives of the deceased are in necessitous circumstances. Provided that such grant shall be made subject to the condition that only the remains of de-ceased soldiers shall be interred in the grave.
- Any person committing any breach of any by-laws or regulations or of any other rules, regulations, or by-laws lawfully made under the authority of any act relating to cemeteries, shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds, and in any case of a continuing breach a further sum not exceeding one pound for every day during which such breach continues.
- 51. Any person committing a breach of any bylaw shall in addition to being liable to a penalty under any by-law be liable to be forthwith removed from the cemetery by the trustees or the secretary or other employee of the trustees or by any police constable. If such person resists removal from the cemetery, or if and as often as such person as removed colors. such person so removed shall, unless with the consent of the secretary, again enter the cemetery within 24 hours of his removal therefrom, he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

By-laws Regulating the Erection and Use of Petrol Service Stations and Petrol Pumps.

LG 1274/52.

A By-law of the Municipality of Boulder made under Section 180 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-53, and numbered 111 for Regulating the Erection and Use of Petrol Service Stations and Petrol Pumps.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the said Act, the Mayor and Councillors of the Municipality of Boulder order as follows:—

- 1. These regulations shall apply to any petrol pump, tank, cistern, pipes and installations which are so placed that the point of delivery of petrol from the pump or from any extension is within any street or way or is within 10ft. from the building alignment.
- 2. No person shall erect or lay or alter the position of or use any petrol pump, tanks, cisterns, pipes and installations in or near any street or way within the abovementioned limits unless licensed by the Council so to do.

All applications for licenses so to do must be accompanied by a ground plan or sketch to scale setting out the position and depths of all intended petrol pumps, tanks, cisterns, pipes and installations and of all joints and connections.

In the case of pumps, tanks, cisterns, pipes and installations existing and installed at the date hereof the plan and/or sketch may be waived or modified by the Council. Subject to the compliance with these by-laws, such licenses may be granted on payment of the prescribed fee.

- 3. No petrol pump shall be placed within four (4) feet of the boundary of the adjoining premises not in the same occupation.
- 4. It shall be lawful for the Council to refuse an application for permission to instal petrol pumps, tanks, cisterns, pipes and/or installations and the decision of the Council in this regard shall be final and binding.
- 5. It shall be lawful for the Council to cancel any license or refuse to issue or renew any license at any time.
- 6. Any applicant who is licensed to operate a petrol pump or pumps shall not interfere in any way with any road or footpath surfaces, or undermine such road or footpath without having first obtained the written consent of the Council and in the event of such permission being granted, the licensee must reinstate such road or footpath on demand in such manner as the Council or its officers may direct.
- 7. If required, the applicant shall lodge such deposit as the Council or its officers may deem necessary to ensure that the work is carried out to the satisfaction of the Council or its officers.
- 8. An inspector appointed by the Council shall have the right at all reasonable time to make an inspection of pumps licensed by the Council (including tanks, cisterns, pipes and installations) to ascertain if these by-laws are being observed.
- 9. The licensee or his servant shall, whenever required by the Council, give practical demonstrations of the working or security of each pump (including all tanks, cisterns, pipes and installations).
- 10. The licensee or his servant shall see that all fittings and pipes connecting the pump or pumps with the supply tanks and other pipes and fittings through which petrol or infiammable liquid flows, either to or from the supply tanks, shall be so constructed and maintained that there is no escape of infiammable liquid in the form of liquid or vapour.
- 11. The licensee or his servant must ensure that all tanks and cisterns used to supply the petroleum spirit to the pumps shall be fitted with ventilating pipes which shall be carried to a position in the open air not less than twelve (12) feet above the ground, and shall there terminate in one or

- more bends. The opening in the end vent pipe to be covered with brass wire gauze of not less than twenty-eight (28) meshes to the lineal inch secured in such manner that the gauze may be removed for examination and cleaning.
- 12. The licensee or his servant shall see that no petroleum spirit is allowed to remain in the visible (or measuring) container of any manual pump, except when the pump is actually in use.
- 13. The licensee or his servant shall instal and keep in good working order in a convenient position not more than twenty (20) feet from such pump an approved fire extinguisher approved by the W.A. Fire Brigades Board.
- 14. No person shall use any petrol pump whilst there is any light capable of igniting petrol vapour within ten (10) feet of any container whilst same is being filled with petrol from any pump.
- 15. No person shall deliver petrol, or permit petrol to be delivered from any pump to the fuel tank of any motor vehicle when the engine of such motor vehicle is running.
- 16. The licensee or his servant shall not permit any lighting appliances to be used in connection with the pumps or tanks except electric light.
- 17. The licensee shall indemnify and hold harmless the Council from all claims, losses, damage, and costs of all persons whomsoever for injury to person or property sustained by reason of the damage by the installation of the said pump or pumps, tank or tanks, cistern or cisterns, pipes and installations, or any of the appliances thereof.

Every licensee shall, if so directed by the Council, take out an indemnifying insurance with an approved insurance company for such amount as the Council may consider necessary. The premiums on any such policy of indemnity shall be paid by the licensee or his servant.

- 18. The licensee or operator of any petrol pump shall at all times take all reasonable precautions to protect all persons and property from injury or damage.
- 19. Every applicant for a license under this by-law shall make application in the form of "Schedule A" hereto and at the same time there shall be lodged a plan or sketch as herein provided.

If the Council so directs the applicant shall be issued with a license in the form of Schedule "B" hereto, subject to the payment of the following fees—5s. per single pump and 7s. 6d. per dual pump per annum. Such charges to operate as from the 1st day of January of each year, and to terminate on the 31st day of December of each year.

Renewals of license fees shall be paid not later than the 31st day of January in each year. It shall be competent for the Council to waive all or any part of the license fee if it is satisfied that due to circumstances beyond the control of a licensee the pump is empty and has not been used for six (6) months.

- 20. The Council may, in its absolute discretion and on the written application of the licensee, transfer a license to the person named in such application, on payment of a fee of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.)
- 21. If at any time a license is cancelled or not renewed then the Council may by notice in writing, order a previous licensee to remove the pump or pumps, tank or tanks, cistern or cisterns, pipes and installations within seven (7) days and in default of obeyance of such order it shall be lawful for the Council or its agents or servants to remove the said pump or pumps, tank or tanks, cistern or cisterns, pipes and installations and recover the cost of the removal thereof from such person.
- 22. Notwithstanding anything in the foregoing by-laws, the Council may recover the amount of any outstanding license fees in any Court of competent jurisdiction.
- 23. No licenses shall be issued for the erection and conduct of any new service station for the sale of motor spirit from bowsers—

- (a) in any street frontage where there is already established on the same or opposite side of the street a service station within 1 mile of the selected site;
- (b) in the area bounded by Hamilton Street in the East, Richardson Street in the South, Brookman Street in the West, and Wittenoom Street in the North.
- All service station buildings shall be constructed in accordance with the Council's building by-laws.
- 25. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this by-law shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay for each offence the penalty of not less than one pound (£1) nor more than twenty pounds (£20).

By-Laws relating to the Control and Management of Halls.

L.G. 2230/52.

THE Dalwallinu Road Board under and by virtue of the powers conferred on it by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, and all other powers enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby order that the by-laws for the control and management of Halls as published in the Government Gazette on the 7th day of September, 1934, and amendments published in

the Government Gazette on the 25th day of February, 1938, and the 20th day of September, 1940, be repealed and the following By-Laws adopted in lieu thereof:—

Interpretation Clauses—In the construction of these by-laws "Hirer" shall mean any person making application or arrangements for the hire of any hall owned by the Dalwallinu Road Board, or for the use of furniture or crockery; "Board" shall mean the Dalwallinu Road Board; "Hall" shall mean any hall or part thereof owned by the Dalwallinu Road Board.

- 1. The rent of the said halls or any part thereof or furniture, or crockery, shall be as set forth in schedule hereto.
- 2. Applications for the use of the halls shall state the period for which the halls are required, also the crockery requirements.
- 3. All charges for the use of halls and crockery shall be paid in advance.
- 4. The hours for which hiring may be effected at day time rates shall be between the hours of 8.0 a.m. and 7.0 p.m. Night rates shall commence at 7.0 p.m.
- 5. The hirer shall be responsible for any damage to the Hall, fittings, furniture or crockery while in his use or charge, and shall pay to the Board the amount of such damage as assessed by the Board.
- 6. The hirer shall, when the use of the Hall crockery is allowed return all such crockery in a clean sound condition, and any article not accounted for or in a cracked condition must be paid for at current rates.
- 7. The Board reserves the right to refuse to let the Halls, furniture, or crockery to any applicant for the hiring of the same without assigning any reason for such refusal.
- 8. The Board may at any time cancel any arrangement made for the hire of the halls, furniture, or crockery under the following circumstances:—
 - (1) If in the opinion of the Board or of the Board's Health Inspector it is in the interests of Public Health.
 - (2) If in the opinion of the Board or of the Board's Health Inspector the Halls or any part thereof are unsafe for use.
 - (3) If in the opinion of the Board the Halls are required urgently by the Board for a matter of Public importance.
- 9. The hirer of any Hall shall comply with the provisions of the Health Act, Entertainments Act and any other Act in force for the time being, applicable to such hiring and use of Hall. If in the opinion of the Board all the necessary actions have not been taken to comply with the provisions of the Acts abovementioned, the Board may at any time prior to or during the term of the engagement forbid and prevent the use of the Hall. In the event of the use of the Hall being prevented under this By-Law the hirer shall forfeit the full amount payable for the hire of the Hall as if the hire had been duly fulfilled and the Board shall not be responsible to the hirer for any loss or damage incurred by the hirer.
- 10. No spirituous liquors, wine, ale or other intoxicating drink shall be brought into or consumed in the Hall during the term of the engagement, except when permitted by the Board in writing.
- 11. The Board will not permit the consumption of spirituous liquors, wine ale or other intoxicating drink in the Halls on Sundays.
- 12. No person under the age of 21 years shall at any time consume any spirituous liquors, wine, ale or other intoxicating drink in any hall.
- 13. Dogs, whether under control or otherwise will no be allowed to enter the Halls.
- 14. No person shall enter or be allowed to enter into any part of the Halls while intoxicated.
 - 15. No person shall:-
 - (a) damage, mark or deface any wall or other part of the Halls.
 - (b) use profane or improper language in the Halls or within hearing of persons using same.

- 16. No offensive impersonations or representations of living persons or anything calculated to produce a riot, or breach of the peace shall be permitted in the Halls.
- 17. The hirer of any of the Halls or parts thereof shall be responsible for:—
 - (a) Maintaining good order and seeing that persons comply with these by-laws.
 - (b) Payment for any damage done to the Hall, fittings, furniture, fixtures, crockery ware, or other property of the Board.
- 18. No person shall remove or replace any electrical fitting without the permission of the Board.
- 19. The Secretary or other duly authorised officer of the Board, or a Police Officer, shall be permitted to enter the Halls or parts thereof during the term of the engagement, and every facility shall be given them for the enforcement of these by-laws.
- 20. Hirers may decorate any Hall, but no person shall drive a nail into part of the walls, windows, floors, doors, etc.
- 21. Every person who does, permits or suffers any act, or thing contrary to any of these by-laws or commits or permits any breach thereof, shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence under these by-laws, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each offence.
- 22. Nothing herein contained shall in any way prevent the Board from entering into an agreement in writing with any proposed hirer of any of the Halls or any part thereof and from including such terms and conditions therein as the parties may agree upon which are not inconsistent with the Road Districts Act. None of these by-laws shall apply to any such agreement except such of them as may be expressly adopted in such agreement.
- 23. That a reduction of 50% be made in charge when the number of Minors attending the function is in a majority.
- 24. That a deposit of £1 be lodged with the Board prior to any entertainment, same to be refunded if Hall is left in a clean condition otherwise the deposit will be paid to person cleaning Hall.

Amendment to Safety Bay Townsite Zoning By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers in that behalf contained in the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, and the Town Planning and Development Act. 1928-1947, and all other powers thereto them enabling, the Rockingham Road Board do make the following by-law:-

The By-laws published in the Government Gazette on the 17th August, 1951, page 2280 are hereby amended as follows:-

Residential Areas.

Add to Clause 2.—"No person shall use any land within the area of the first schedule for any purpose other than that described in this Clause, and the erection or alteration of any building or structure in such area other than that described in this Clause is prohibited.'

Business Areas.

Add to Clause 6 after the word "concrete" in line 4.—"or structural steel. Provided that buildings erected in structural steel shall have frontages of brick, stone or concrete. On corner blocks of land side walls of structural steel buildings shall be erected of brick, stone or concrete if within 30ft. of road boundary. Where the side walls are over 30ft. from the road boundary they shall be erected of brick, stone, concrete or asbestos.'

General Provisions.

Clause 8. Delete after the word "prohibited" in line 4 the following words:—"provided that this by-law shall not apply to signs indicating professions, names, trades, or callings exhibited on the land or buildings thereon, or in which, such pro-fessions, trade or calling is conducted."

After the figures 664 in line 4 add the following -"and not included in the Second Schedule, words :except as provided therein.'

Second Schedule.

Delete all that portion of 2 (c) after the figures 5887 in line 2 and in lieu thereof insert Lot 247 Rae Road.

Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board.

By-laws Relating to Quarrying and Excavations. L.G. 24/52.

WHEREAS by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1951, the Road Board of any district is empowered to make by-laws for all or any of the purposes in the said Act mentioned.

And whereas the said Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board on the 23rd day of December, 1953, made and published certain by-laws relating to quarrying and excavations.

And whereas it is desirable to repeal the said by-laws and substitute new by-laws in lieu thereof: Now, therefore, the said Armadale-Kelmscott Road Board in pursuance of the powers aforesaid of the said Board under and by virtue of the said Act and of any other authority enabling it in that behalf doth hereby repeal the said by-laws relating to quarrying and excavations gazetted in the Government Gazette on the 23rd day of December, 1953, and doth hereby make and publish the following by-laws.

- 1. No person without first obtaining the license of the said Board shall on any land other than Crown land within the Armadale-Kelmscott Road District.
 - (a) quarry for stone, gravel, sand or other material; or
 - (b) carry on, for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, sand or other material, any operation whereby an excavation is made created or enlarged.
- 2. All applications for a license must be accompanied by a plan of the area proposed to be excavated, such plan to show details of the levels,

- area of the proposed pits and the depth of the area to be excavated. Any other information required by the Board in connection with the site shall be supplied on request by the applicant.
- 3. The duration of any license which may be granted by the Board shall be one year.
- 4. No person for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, sand or other material, shall quarry or excavate on any land within 66 yards or such greater distance (measured at right angles) as the Board in any particular case may specify, of either side of any road situate in the said road district.
- 5. Any excavation made for the quarrying of stone, gravel, sand or other material shall be kept free of stagnant water.
- 6. Where quarrying is carried on for the purpose of recovering any stone, gravel, sand or other material, the excavation shall be securely fenced and the gateways locked when not actually in use by the licensee so as to permit only authorised persons to enter the enclosed excavation.
- 7. The fee payable to the Board for any such license shall be the sum calculated at the rate of 3d. per cubic yard of the total area is respect of which any such license may be granted: Provided that where the fee payable by this by-law has been paid for a license in respect of any area and an application is made within 12 months of the granting of such license for a further license in respect of the same area or part thereof no fee shall be payable in respect of any area included in the license upon which the fee has already been paid.
- 8. Before any license is issued for any quarrying or excavations, the applicant must deposit with the Board an amount not exceeding one hundred pounds (£100) such amount to be fixed by resolution of the Board and to be retained in trust by the Board until the requirements of the next succeeding paragraph are complied with, and should any licensee fail to carry out such requirements it shall be competent for the Board to have the necessary work carried out and deduct the cost thereof from the deposit held.
- 9. When the removal of materials from any excavation is completed the floor of the excavated area shall be graded and levelled to an even surface and the sides shall be sloped down to a suitable batter to the satisfaction of the Board.

The removal of materials from an excavation shall be deemed to be completed.

- (a) when the license has expired; or
- (b) when the area has been excavated to the extent of and in accordance with the area and depth shown on the plan accompanying the application for the license.
- 10. Persons holding licenses issued by the Board shall operate under the conditions set out in these by-laws and any con-compliance therewith shall render any such license null and void.
- 11. If any person, either by act or omission shall contravene these by-laws, or being the owner or occupier of property within the said Road District, shall knowingly permit any act or omission on any property owned or occupied by him in contravention of these by-laws, he shall be guilty of an offence under these by-laws, and on conviction for such offence shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding twenty pounds (£20).
