#### 9.—Contract of Service.

(a) The contract of service other than for casual workers shall be by the week and shall be terminated by one week's notice on either side.

(b) The contract of service for casual workers shall be by the hour and shall be terminated by one hour notice on either side.

(c) Wages shall be paid weekly, on a day mutually agreed upon between the employer and the worker.

### 10.-Breakdowns.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award, the employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day that the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other Association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause that the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

## 11.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the employer and the Union.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

#### 12.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu shall, subject to subclause (b) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) All work performed on the holidays prescribed herein shall be paid for at the rate of double time. (c) (i) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday.

(c) A worker may be rostered off and granted annual leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed prior to his having completed a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service, in which case should the services of such worker terminate or be terminated prior to the completion of twelve (12) months' continuous service, the employer may deduct from any moneys due to such worker or the said worker shall refund to the employer the difference between the amount received by him for wages in respect of the period of his annual leave and the amount which would have accrued to him by reason of the length of his service up to the date of the termination of his services.

(d) If after one month's continuous services. (d) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period, a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(e) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(f) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (h) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(g) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(h) This clause shall not apply to casual workers.

## 14.—Absence through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-tweifth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative on the job, of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion shall not be entitled to payment of any further absence in the same year, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(f) This clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 15.—Time and Wages Record.

(a) The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, a record containing the following particulars:—
(a) The name of the worker; (b) the class of work performed by him; (c) the starting and finishing time each day; (d) the wages and overtime (if any) paid to him each week.

(b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union, during the usual office hours, at the employer's head office, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

#### 16.—Inspection.

Any officer authorised by the Union may, on any day, for the purpose of investigating any alleged breaches of this Award, and after giving notice in writing to the company or its agent, enter the premises on which the operations covered by this Award are carried on and inspect such operations and speak to workers; provided that such permission shall not in any way be exercised so as to cause any delay in such operations.

#### 17.—Accommodation.

Suitable accommodation shall be provided for workers to change in. Hot and cold water showers shall be provided. A suitably furnished crib room shall also be provided.

#### 18.—First Aid.

A suitable first aid kit shall be provided and maintained by the employer.

#### 19.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court hereby appoints, for the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference. The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

(b) There are assigned to the Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;

Liberty is reserved to the parties to this Award to apply to the Court of Arbitration for an amend-ment to this clause to insert rates for female workers should such workers be employed in the industry.

#### 10.-Shift Work.

(a) An employer may, if he so desires, work his establishment on shifts, but before doing so shall give notice of his intention to the Union.

(b) Work other than day shift shall not be recognised as afternoon or night shift unless in either case five (5) consecutive afternoons or nights are worked, but shall be deemed to be overtime; on completion of the fifth (5th) consecutive after-noon's or night's work the worker shall be deemed to have been employed on afternoon or night shift, as the case may be, during the preceding four (d) afternoons or nights, and thereafter during any subsequent consecutive afternoons or nights he is so employed.

(c) Subject to weekly rotation, the loading on the ordinary rates of pay for shift work shall be five per cent. (5%).

(d) The sequence of shift work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding para-graphs (b) and (c) by reason of the fact that the works are closed on a Sunday or on any public holiday.

#### 11.—Higher Duties.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker. who in any calendar year, has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only, or less, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence of one day only or less, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(g) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his em-ployer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this sub-clause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 17.-Young and Female Workers.

(a) No person under the age of seventeen years shall be employed in any cellar or room in which wines or spirits are drawn, broken down, or bottled.

(b) Females may only be employed capsuling, labelling, wiping, wrapping and packing into containers.

(c) No female shall be employed under sub-clause (b) of this clause to displace any adult male worker who is employed in the industry at the date of this Award.

#### 18.—Record.

(a) Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages record wherein shall be entered-

- (i) the name of each worker;
  (ii) the nature of his employment;
  (iii) the time he commences and finishes work each day
- (iv) the total hours worked each day and each week;
- (v) the wages (and overtime, if any) received therefore;
- (vi) the ages of junior workers.

(b) Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed a compliance with this clause to the extent of the information recorded.

(c) Such record shall be entered up each day in legible English characters and shall be signed weekly only if correct by each worker.

(d) The record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union at the employer's office during ordinary office hours.

## 19.-Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

#### 20.—Proportion of Male Junior Workers.

Junior workers seventeen years of age and under twenty-one years of age shall be allowed in the proportion of one (1) junior worker to every four (4) or fraction of four (4) adult male workers employed.

#### 21.—Junior Worker's Certificate.

(a) Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate from their parent, guardian or a responsible person, contain-ing the following particulars:--

(1) Name in full.

(2) Age and date of birth.

(b) No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any junior worker shall wilfully mis-state his age in the above certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

22.-Board of Reference.

(a) For the purposes of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall con-sist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreemnt being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.
