WESTERN AUSTRALIA, TO WIT, CHARLES HENRY GAIRDNER, Governor. [L.S.]

By His Excellency Lieutenant-General Sir Charles Henry Gairdner, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Commander of the Royal Victorian Order, Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Batth, Commander of the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire, Governor in and over the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Dustralia.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1954, that for the purposes of the said Act the word "Town" or "Townsite" means and includes inter alia any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit as he is thereby empowered to declare by Proclamation, to be a Town or Townsite for the purpose of the said Act; and whereas all that land, situated within the Canning Road District, more particularly described, defined and delineated in the Schedule hereunder, is land which the Governor may by virtue of section 5 of the said Act declare by Proclamation to be a town or townsite for the purposes of the said Act. Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the said Act, and of all other powers in this behalf enabling me, do hereby declare that all that land situated within the Canning Road District, shall be a Townsite, the Canning Road District, shall be a Townsite, to be known as the "Townsite of Canning," within the meaning and for the purpose of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1954.

Given under my hand and the Public Seal of the said State, at Perth, this 25th day of January. 1956.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1951.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1951, that the municipal and road districts mentioned in the Second Schedule road districts mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Act are, for the purposes of the Act, constituted fire districts by the names as in the said Schedule stated, and that the Governor may, by Order in Council, (a) constitute the district of any other local authority a fire district, assign a name to any such fire district, and include the same in Part II or Part III or Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act; and (b) excise from any fire district any specified portion thereof, and thereupon such portion shall, for the purposes of the Act, be no longer included in or be part of such district. Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby—

- (1) constitute the Cunderdin Road District a fire district; assign the name of Cunder-din Fire District to the fire district and order and direct that the fire district be, and the same is hereby included in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act; and
- (2) excise from the Cunderdin Fire District all the land contained within the boundaries of the Cunderdin Road District with the exception of all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Eastern side of road No. 2456 and the Southern side of road No. 10366 and extending Easterly along that of the latter to the North-Eastern corner of lot 1 of Avon Location 2222 (as shown on Land Titles Office Plan 2296); thence Southerly along the Eastern boundary of that lot and onwards to the Northern side of Forrest Street (road No. 7122); thence generally Easterly along that side to a point situate in prolongation Northerly of point situate in prolongation Northerly of

the Eastern side of Coronation Street; thence Southerly to and along that side to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Northern side of Sixth Street; thence Westerly to and along that side to the Eastern side of Cubbine Street; thence generally Northerly along that side to the Southern side of Fifth Street; thence generally Westerly to and along the Southern side of Watts Street to the Western side of Togo Street; thence Northerly along that side and onwards to the Northern side of Forrest Street aforesaid; thence Easterly along that side to a point situate in prolongation Southerly of the Eastern side of road No. 2456 aforesaid; and thence Northerly to and along that side to the starting point.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1951.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1951, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, inter alia, (a) adjust the boundaries of a fire district where the boundaries of a local authority are altered pursuant to the provisions of the Act under which the local authority is constituted; and (b) excise from any fire district any specified portion thereof, and thereupon such portion shall, for the purposes of the Act, be no longer included in or be part of such district: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby—

- (i) adjust the boundaries of the Geraldton Fire District so as to include that portion of land annexed to the Geraldton Municipal District pursuant to an Order in Council issued under the provisions of the Road Districts Act, 1919, dated the 19th day of December, 1951, and published in the Government Gazette on the 21st day of December, 1951; and
- (ii) excise from the Geraldton Fire District all the land contained within the boundaries of the Geraldton Fire District with the exception of all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at a point on the low water mark of the Indian Ocean situate in prolongation Westerly of the Southern boundary of Victoria Location 2113 and extending Easterly to and along the Southern boundaries of locations 2113, 1713 and 1712 to the North-Western corner of location 2276; thence Southerly along the Western boundaries of locations 2276 and 1954 and onwards to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Northernmost boundary of location 2048; thence Westerly to and along that boundary to the North-Western corner of that location; thence Southerly along the Western boundary of that location and onwards to the Northern boundary of location 1956; thence Easterly and Southerly along boundaries of locations 1956 and 8987 and onwards to the Northern boundary of location 1040; thence Easterly and Southerly along boundaries of that location to the Northern boundary of location 1050; thence Westerly along the Northern boundary of location 2045; thence Easterly and Southerly along the Northern boundary of location 2045; thence Easterly and Southerly along the Northern boundary of location 2045; thence Southerly, Westerly, again Southerly, again Westerly and Northerly to and along boundaries of that location to the South-Eastern corner of location 8982; thence Westerly along the Southern boundaries of locations 8982, 8071 and 673 and onwards to the Eastern

boundary of location 8056; thence Southerly, South-Westerly and Westerly along boundaries of that location to the Eastern boundary of reserve 21856; thence Southerly along that boundary to the Northern boundary of location 4940; thence Westerly and Southerly along boundaries of locations 4940 and 181 to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean aforesaid; and thence generally North-Westerly and generally North-Easterly along that low water mark to the starting point.

Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1951. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

- (1) constitute the Kwinana Road District a fire district; assign the name of Kwinana Fire District to the fire district and order and direct that the fire district be, and the same is hereby included in Part IV of the Second Schedule to the Act; and
- the land contained within the boundaries of the Kwinana Road District with the exception of all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at a point on the North-Western side of Thomas Road situate North of the intersection of the South-Western side of Medina Avenue and a South-Eastern side of Thomas Road aforesaid and extending generally Easterly along the Northern sides of the latter to a point situate in prolongation Northerly of an Eastern side of Gilmore Avenue; thence South-South-Easterly to and along the Eastern sides of that avenue to a point situate East of the Southernmost South-Eastern corner of Kwinana Lot M983; thence East for a distance of about 19 chains; thence South for a distance of about 51 chains; thence West for a distance of about 24 chains 75 links; thence South to a South-Western side of Wellard Road; thence generally North-Westerly along the South-Western sides of that road to the Eastern boundary of Cockburn Sound Location 349; thence Northerly along that boundary to a point situate in prolongation South-Easterly of the South-Western side of Westbrook Street; thence generally North-North-Western side of Summerton Road; thence South-Western sides of that street to the South-Eastern side of Summerton Road; thence South-Westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation South-Easterly of a North-Eastern boundary of Kwinana Town Lot 115; thence North-Westerly, North-Easterly and generally North-Westerly to and along boundaries of that lot to its Northernmost corner and onwards for a distance of 30 links; thence generally

North-Easterly to and along the North-Western sides of Tucker Street and Bingfield Road to the South-Western side of Medina Avenue aforesaid; thence North-Westerly along that side to the South-Eastern side of Thomas Road aforesaid; and thence North to the starting point.

- (3) de-describe the district boundary of the Albany Road District as described in the Schedule "C" hereto.

Transfer of Territory from the Albany Road District to the Plantagenet Road District.

To the Woogenellup Ward-

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the South-Eastern corner of reserve 1090, a point on the Albany Road District boundary, and extending Southerly along the prolongation of the Eastern boundary of that reserve to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of Plantagenet Location 2585; thence Westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to a point situate in prolongation Northerly of the Eastern boundary of Location 5680; thence Southerly to and along that boundary and onwards to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of location 4546; thence Westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to a point situate in prolongation Northerly of the Eastern boundary of location 5667; thence Southerly to and along the Eastern boundaries of locations 5667, 5668 and 5945; thence Westerly along the Southern All that portion of land bounded by lines starting and 5945; thence Westerly along the Southern boundaries of locations 5945, 5946, 5947, and 5948 and onwards to the Eastern boundary of location 5949; thence Northerly, Westerly, again Northerly, again Westerly, again Northerly and again Westerly along boundaries of locations 5949, 41 and 54 to the left bank of the Kalgan River; thence generally Southerly, downwards along that bank to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Northpoint situate in prolongation Easterly of the Northern boundary of location 1610; thence Westerly along that prolongation to the right bank of the Kalgan River aforesaid, a point on the Albany Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence generally North-Easterly along that boundary to the starting point. To the East Ward-

Also all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Albany Road District boundary and the North-Western boundary District boundary and the North-Western boundary of Plantagenet Location 5973 and extending South-Westerly along the latter to a point situate East of the South-Easternmost corner of location 5971; thence generally Westerly to and along the Southernmost boundaries of that location to the Eastern boundary of reserve 1023, a point on the Albany Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence Northerly and Easterly along that boundary to the starting point. 3. To the South Ward-

(Public Plan 451C/40 and 451D/40.)
- (d) Also all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the Northernmost North-Western corner of reserve 18739, a point on the Albany Road District boundary, and extending Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of that reserve to the Eastern boundary of Plantagenet Location 5743; thence Northerly along that boundary to the Albany Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence Easterly along that boundary to the starting point. (Public Plan 451D/40.)
- (e) Also all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Albany Road District boundary and the Southern boundary of Plantagenet Location 5217 and extending Westerly and Northerly along boundaries of locations 5217, 5216, 5215, and 5737 to the Albany Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence Easterly and Southerly along that boundary to the starting point. (Public Plan 451D/40.)
- (f) Also all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the Southernmost corner of Plantagenet Location 5736, a point on the Albany Road District boundary, and extending South-Westerly along the prolongation of the South-Eastern boundary of that location to the South-Western side of Albany Highway (road No. 6963); thence North-Westerly along that side to the Albany Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence Easterly and South-Easterly along that boundary to the starting point. (Public Plan 451D/40.)
- (g) Also all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the Northernmost North-Western corner of Plantagenet Location 4664, a point on the Albany Road District boundary, and extending generally Southerly along the Western boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Northern boundary of location 2926; thence Westerly, Southerly, again Westerly and Northerly to and along boundaries of locations 2926 and 4934 to the Albany Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence Easterly along that boundary to the starting point. (Public Plan 451D/40.)

- (c) Also all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the South-Western corner of Plantagenet Location 5801, a point on the Albany Road District boundary, and extending Northerly and Easterly along boundaries of locations 5801, 5798, 5793, 5791, 5396 (reserve 18931) and again 5791 to the Albany Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence Southerly and Westerly along that boundary to the starting point. (Public Plan 451B/40.)

2. To the King Ward-

- (a) Also all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the intersection of the Albany Road District boundary and the Northern boundary of Plantagenet Location 5743 and extending Easterly and Southerly along boundaries of that location to the Albany Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence Westerly and Northerly along that boundary to the starting point. (Public Plan 451D/40.)
- (b) Also all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the North-Western corner of Plantagenet Location 5737, a point on the Albany Road District boundary and extending North-Easterly and Southerly along boundaries of that location to the Albany Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence Westerly and North-Westerly along that boundary to the starting point. (Public Plan 451D/40.)
- (c) Also all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at a point on the Albany Road District boundary situate in prolongation Southerly of the Eastern boundary of Plantagenet Location 4461 and extending Northerly to and along the latter to a point situate in prolongation Westerly of the Northern boundary of location 5738; thence Easterly and South-Easterly to and along boundaries of that location to the Albany Road District boundary aforesaid; and thence Westerly along that boundary to the starting point. (Public Plan 451D/40.)

Between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Appli-cant, and Minister for Works and others, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dis-pute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court; Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act. 1912-1952 and all other powers therein tion Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum here-under written have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

This Award shall be known as the Divers and Tenders' Award, 1955, and replaces Award No. 1 of 1949.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to divers' attendants employed by the Minister for Works, the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, the Bunbury Harbour Board, the Albany Harbour Board and The Western Australian Government Railways Commission, and shall operate throughout the State of Western Australia and its coastal waters.

4.---Term.

The term of this Award shall be three (3) years as from its date.

5.—Hours of Duty.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work. A shift on Monday to Friday inclusive shall consist of six (6) hours' diving, half an hour each forenoon and afternoon for smoke, and one hour for dressing, undressing, preparing and returning gear.

6.—Overtime.

- (a) Should a diver or tender be required to continue work after the usual finishing time he shall be paid on an hourly basis at the rate of time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) (i) If a diver or tender be called out to work between 5 p.m. and midnight, he shall be paid a shift and a half for a shift or part thereof and, if a diver or tender be called out to work between midnight and the usual starting time, he shall be paid a double shift for a shift or part thereof.

- (ii) Should a diver or tender be required to work on a Saturday, he shall be paid a shift and a half for the shift or part thereof up to 12 noon, but should work continue beyond that hour, or a shift commence at or after 12 noon, he shall be paid a double shift for the whole shift.
- (c) The maximum amount of actual diving in any one shift shall be six (6) hours.
- (d) Double shift shall be paid for each shift or part thereof for work done on Sundays.
- (e) (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) The Union or any worker or workers covered by this Award shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- (iii) This subclause shall remain in operation until otherwise determined by the Court.

- (a) Divers shall be paid, when diving, at the following rate per shift:— Margin over basic wage—£2 14s. 6d.
- (b) When not actually engaged in diving, a diver shall be entitled to be paid the margin over the basic wage provided in the appropriate Industrial Award or Agreement for the particular work he may be employed upon: Provided always that such work entitled him to a margin of at least forty-five shillings (45s.) per week over the basic wage. If the work upon which he is employed does not provide a margin of forty-five shillings (45s.) he shall be paid such a retaining allowance as will bring his margin over the basic wage up to an amount of forty-five shillings (45s.) per week over the basic wage.
- (c) Tenders shall be paid at the following rate per shift, when attending on a diver:-Margin over basic wage—18s.
- (d) When not actually engaged in attending on a diver, a tender shall be entitled to be paid the margin over the basic wage propaid the margin over the basic wage provided in the appropriate Industrial Award or Agreement for the particular work he may be employed upon: Provided always that such work entitles him to a margin of at least twenty-two shillings and sixpence (22s. 6d.) per week over the basic wage. If the work upon which he is employed does not provide a margin of twenty ployed does not provide a margin of twentytwo shillings and sixpence (22s. 6d.), he shall be paid such a retaining allowance as will bring his margin over the basic wage up to an amount of twenty-two shillings and sixpence (22s. 6d.) per week over the basic wage.
- (e) Divers and tenders shall be entitled to the amounts provided respectively for a shift, even though the diver only takes one dip during the course of the shift: Provided that divers and tenders shall, if required, perform any other duties in addition to diving and tending in order to complete the full shift, without any addition to the shift rate herein prescribed shift rate herein prescribed.

8.—Holidays.

(a) The holiday and annual leave provisions of the appropriate Award under which the divers and divers' attendants are employed when on work other than that herein prescribed, shall apply.

(b) In the event of a diver and tender working for three (3) days immediately prior to a holiday prescribed in Awards referred to in subclause (a) hereof, and the work is to continue after the holiday, they shall receive a divers' and tenders' pay for the holidays, but if the diving job is finished before the holiday, they will not receive the divers' and tenders' rate of pay for the holiday.

9.-Travelling Time.

- (a) The employer shall pay all fares, including sleeper, if available. Fares shall be first class. When travelling by coastal boat, saloon fares shall be paid.
- (b) A worker travelling to work away from or returning to his usual place of employment shall be paid for the actual travelling time in his ordinwe paid for the actual travelling time in his ordinary working hours, and in addition thereto his actual travelling time outside his ordinary working hours shall be paid at ordinary rates up to a maximum of eight (8) hours in any one day. The ordinary rates of pay in this connection shall mean the rate payable when not diving or when not tending tending.
- (c) Sunday travelling time shall be paid for at the same rates and on the same conditions as on
- (d) In respect of a worker who is provided with a sleeper berth, travelling time shall not count between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. Provided that this shall not operate to reduce the travelling time when paid for below eight (8) hours in any one day.

10.-Country Work.

When a worker is called up to proceed on duty away from the place where he is then or usually employed to any place where he cannot return to his own abode at night, the employer shall pay an allowance of fourteen shillings (14s.) for each twenty-four (24) hours, or provide board and lodgings.

11.-Sick Leave.

- (a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.
- (ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker, but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate, and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year vear.
- (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (b) The clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954.
- No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.
- (d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.
- (e) (i) Periods of service less than one (1) month shall not be included as service for the computation of sick leave.
- (ii) Periods of one (1) month and over shall be totalled as payment for sick leave computed on the total of such service during the year.
 - (f) This clause shall not apply to casual workers.
- (g) Should any worker be unable to report for duty owing to illness, he shall notify the officer in charge without delay.

12.—Payment of Wages.

- (a) Workers shall be paid weekly when practicable
- (b) All men whose employment is terminated shall be paid within four (4) office hours from the time of the termination of employment. If this period is exceeded, they shall be paid at ordinary rates from the time of the termination of employment until they are paid.
- (c) When a worker leaves his employment before the usual pay day, he shall, on giving notice of his intention to leave, be paid his full wages on the day he leaves.

13.-Conveyance of Men.

Any worker called on to work on the side of the river opposite the usual place of work shall be ferried across or his fare refunded by the employer: Provided that the practice existing at the date of this Award shall continue.

14.—Meal Hours.

For all work performed during meal hours, time and a half at hourly rates shall be paid; time and a half to be continuous until men are knocked off for meals.

Meal hours shall be-Breakfast, the hour preceding the ordinary starting time; dinner, between the hours of 12 noon and 1 p.m.; tea hour, between 5 p.m. and 6.30 p.m.

15.—Oilskins.

Tenders shall be supplied with oilskins and sea boots while tending.

16.—General.

All manually operated air pumps shall be manned with two pumpers and the diver shall have the right to select one of the two men thus employed.

The diver shall select his own tender.

The diving gear, whether in or out of use, shall not be interfered with except by the diver or his tender

17.—Preference.

Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, qualified to perform the work to be done, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union of workers, who is qualified to perform the work to be done and who produces the proof of such membership, shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided, also, that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of another recognised Union shall, within fourteen (14) days of commencing employment under this Award, make and complete an application for membership of the and complete an application for membership of the said Union.

18.-Board of Reference.

The Board of Reference shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives nominated by the parties.

There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of-

- (i) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any machine, occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award:
- (ii) adjusting any difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

Application of Other Awards.

The general conditions of Awards under which divers and divers' attendants are employed when on work other than that herein prescribed, shall apply insofar as the said Awards do not conflict with the terms of this Award.

20.—District Allowance.

District allowance calculated on the rate specified below shall be paid in the undermentioned areas.

(a) Clause 14—Piecework.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

14.-Piecework.

- (a) (i) The rate of pay for machine compositors on piecework shall be 17.35d. per thousand (1,000) ens for matter actually set and corrected. To the earnings of a piecework operator employed on night work shall be added in each week the sum of fifteen shillings (15s.); if he works less than five (5) shifts in any week the sum to be added shall be proportionately reduced.
- (ii) The rate specified above has been fixed on a basic wage of twelve pounds six shillings and sixpence (£12 6s, 6d.) and consequent upon any fluctuation of the basic wage the amount of the increase or decrease shall be added to or deducted from the earnings of a pieceworker.
- (b) Guarantee—Pieceworkers working day or night to be guaranteed twenty-five (25) hours' work per week to be worked over five (5) shifts.

In the event of more or less shifts being worked in any week the guarantee shall be increased or decreased by five (5) hours for each shift. Time worked short of the guarantee shall be paid for at the machine compositor's hourly rate computed on the basis of thirty-six (36) hours a week for day work and thirty-four (34) hours a week for night work.

- (c) Any time worked in excess of seven and a quarter (7½) hours in any one day or night shall be paid for at overtime rates.
- (d) The cast-up shall be according to the points system. Providing that the minimum multiplier for any line shall be 43.
- (e) Pieceworkers shall be paid on the "flat" system, and shall not charge for white lines, leads, or other matter added by the "House."
- (f) Instruction shall be written on the first slip of copy on the left hand corner.
- (g) The insertion of all corrected slugs shall be done by the "House." The "House" may at its discretion correct on time the errors in proofs and revises.
- (h) Corrections if not on ordinary galleyproof or if on scraps to be pasted on proof paper. Indentions and divisions in multipleslug matter to be marked.
- (i) No undue advantage shall be permitted to one pieceworker over another.
- (j) Pencil copy or subedited copy shall not be acceptable unless a special black subbing pencil be used.
 - (k) All lines cast shall be charged full lines.
- (1) All catch-lines shall be charged by the pieceworker.
- (m) Correcting page proofs—Broadsheet, twelve (12) lines; half broadsheet, six (6) lines; quarter broadsheet, three (3) lines in addition to the charge for corrections.
- (n) The pieceworker shall charge two lines for every line of housemark corrections done by him. Alterations in standing advertisements constituting less than twelve (12) consecutive lines, when given out on piecework, shall be charged as housemarks.
- (o) All first proofs and revise correction marks left undone by the pieceworker in the first proof shall be done by the pieceworker. All fresh errors imported into corrected matter by the pieceworker shall, if not corrected by him, be charged against him at the rate of housemarks.

- (p) If a machine be changed by order to a different type the pieceworker shall not be required to change back again to make corrections which shall be done by the house machine corrector, and all such corrections, mechanical and circled errors excepted, shall be charged against the pieceworker at the rate of housemarks.
- (q) All machine errors—to be countersigned by the mechanic—shall be charged as house-marks. Provided that when a pieceworker has obviously continued setting without drawing the attention of the mechanic to the faulty working of the machine the charges shall be disallowed.
- (r) Standing time shall be charged at the time operator's rate; every minute to count. Standing time for machine delays to be countersigned by the mechanic. When a pieceworker is being paid standing time he may be called upon to perform other work.
- (s) Not less than twelve (12) lines shall constitute a "take" of copy. Provided that the copy given out at any time, whether referring to different articles or not, shall constitute one "take."
- (t) The following charges for machine changes shall apply:—Change of liners, twelve (12) lines each way; change of gauge, four (4) lines each way to be calculated on the basis of measure next to be set.
- (u) No pieceworker shall be required to set reprint copy of a type size smaller than seven point where practicable. This clause does not apply to reprint advertisements.
- (v) The total charge for setting consecutive articles or "take" in the middle of a "take" shall be twenty-four (24) lines; stop press items are excluded from this clause and do not carry a penalty charge.
- (w) Tabular matter cast on one bar—Two columns justifications, one-third extra; three columns, one half extra; four or more columns, double.
- (x) Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to amend this clause.
- (b) Delete from end of Award "Specimens of Extra Charges."
