IN pursuance of the provisions of section 19 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

(a) That with respect to nets known as or called "set nets" for catching all species of marine fish, nets of 100 fathoms in length having meshes throughout of 2½ inches shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters of Leschenault Inlet, be lawful nets.

(b) That with respect to nets known as or called "pilchard nets," for catching yellow-eye mullet or pilchard, nets of 100 fathoms in length having meshes throughout of 2 inches shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters of Leschenault Inlet, be lawful nets.

(c) That with respect to nets known as or called "whiting nets" for catching all species of whiting, nets of 50 fathoms in length having meshes throughout of 2 inches shall, when used or intended to be used in the waters of Leschenault Inlet, be lawful nets.

The proclamation dated 20th February, 1952, and published in the *Government Gazette* of 29th February, 1952, is hereby revoked.

(1) IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in those portions of Western Australian waters described in Schedules A, B, C and D hereto, for the term of five years from date of publication of this proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

(2) In pursuance of the provisions of the section aforesaid, I prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever by means of fishing nets in that portion of Western Australian waters described in Schedule E hereto, during the periods commencing at 8 o'clock in the afternoon of Thursday in each week and ending at 8 o'clock in the forenoon of the Sunday next following for the term of five years from date of publication of this proclamation in the *Government Gazette*.

Schedules.  
Schedule A.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet (including its tributaries) upwards from the Railway Bridge at Point McLeod to a line drawn due North from a point marked by a post in Point Mornington, to a point marked by a post on the Western shore of Leschenault Inlet.

Schedule B.

The whole of the waters of the Collie River and all its tributaries and all that portion of Leschenault Inlet lying within a radius of 30 chains of the Northernmost extremity of Bar Island.

## Schedule C.

The whole of the coastal waters in the vicinity of Bunbury known as "Hungry Hollow," being those waters lying between the Westerly extensions of Clifton Street and Beach Road, in the Municipality of Bunbury, and within a distance measured rectangularly from the foreshore of  $\frac{1}{2}$  mile.

## Schedule D.

The whole of the waters of that part of Koombana Bay lying within a radius of  $\frac{1}{4}$  mile of the Groyne adjacent to the channel connecting Leschenault Inlet with the Indian Ocean.

## Schedule E.

The whole of the waters of Leschenault Inlet lying to the North of a line drawn from a point marked by a post in Point Mornington to a point marked by a post on the Western shore of Leschenault Inlet.

The proclamation dated 21st July, 1955, and published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 65) of 5th August, 1955, is hereby revoked.

WHEREAS by section 31 of the Land Act, 1933-1954, the Governor may by proclamation and subject to such conditions as may be expressed therein, classify as of Class "A" any lands of the Crown reserved to Her Majesty for any of the purposes specified in the said section; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the reserve described in the schedule hereto should be classified as of Class "A": Now, therefore I, the Governor, with the advice of Executive Council, do by this my proclamation classify as of Class "A" the reserve described hereunder.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 1898/32.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1954, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any

municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 23973 (Sussex Location 2481) should vest in and be held by the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation and Hallsite: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Augusta-Margaret River Road Board in trust for Recreation and Hallsite, with power to the said Augusta-Margaret River Road Board, subject to the approval in writing of the Minister for Lands being first obtained, to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding twenty-one (21) years from the date of the lease.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1954, it is, *inter alia*, made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, to direct that any land reserved pursuant to the provisions of this Act shall be granted in fee simple to any person (as defined in the said section) subject to the condition that the person shall not lease or mortgage the whole or any part of the land without the consent of the Governor and subject to such other conditions and limitations as the Governor shall deem necessary to ensure that the land is used for the purpose for which the land is reserved as aforesaid; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corres. No. 1375/47—That reserve No. 22807 (Walpole Lot 13) should be granted in fee simple to The Returned Sailors', Soldiers' & Airmen's Imperial League of Australia, W.A. Branch, to be held in trust for the purpose of a Hallsite (R.S.L.).

Corres. No. 1409/49—That reserve No. 22910 (Swan Location 5236) should, subject as aforesaid, be granted in fee simple to the Karrakatta Cemetery Board to be held in trust for the purpose of a Cemetery.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the before-mentioned reserves shall be granted in fee simple to the abovementioned bodies to be held in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject to the condition that the land shall not be leased or mortgaged in whole or in part without the consent of the Governor.

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for

insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 13; and whereas Australian Mutual Provident Society, Western Australia Branch, being an employer within the meaning of the section has duly, in accordance with the regulations, made application for exemption from the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Certificate of Title Volume 478, Folio 98, in which is comprised an estate in fee simple in all that piece of land being portion of Perth Town Lot G1, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt the Australian Mutual Provident Society, Western Australia Branch, from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, for a period expiring on the 17th day of November, 1957.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas The National Bank of Australasia Limited, of St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of section 13 of the Act and as such subject to the provisions of section 13, has duly, in accordance with the regulations made under the Act, made application for exemption from the operation of section 13 aforesaid, and has proved to the satisfaction of the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability under the Act and has deposited at the Treasury securities, to wit, a bond for £5,000 charged with all payments to become due under the liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt The National Bank of Australasia Limited from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, for a period expiring on the 31st day of December, 1957.
