WHEREAS by section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, it is provided that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit all persons from taking any fish whatsoever, in every or any specified portion of Western Australian waters, by means of fishing nets and fishing lines, or either of such means of capture, or by any other specified means of capture, for any specified term: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, prohibit the taking, by means of fishing nets, of any fish whatsoever in the Western Australian waters of Shark Lake, situated about eight (8) miles from the town of Esperance about eight (8) miles from the town of Esperance in the Esperance Land District for a period of five (5) years from 1st April, 1956, inclusive.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 10 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice

and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit all persons from taking any fish what-soever, by means of more than two fish traps other than crayfish pots, in that portion of Western Australian waters lying South of 28 deg. 15 min. of South latitude, and West of 114 deg. 10 min. of East longtitude, including the waters surrounding the islands situated therein, for a period of three years from date of publication of this Proclamation in the Government Gazette.

The Proclamation dated 17th September, 1953, and published in the Government Gazette (No. 93) of 2nd October, 1953, is hereby cancelled.

Seal with power to sue and be sued in its corporate name, to acquire, hold, lease and dispose of real and personal property to borrow money with the approval of the Governor and to do and permit to be done all things which are required by the Act to be done by the Board or which are necessary and convenient to be done by the Board for the purpose of giving effect to the Act.

### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1954, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corr. No. 1478/90, V2\*—That reserve No. 1745 should vest in and be held by the Broomehill Road Board in trust for the purpose of Camping.

Corr. No. 6164/19—That reserve No. 24422 should vest in and be held by the Kojonup Road Board in trust for the purpose of Water Supply.

Corr. No. 874/56—That reserve No. 24420 should vest in an be held by the Geraldton-Greenough Road Board in trust for the purpose of Camping and Recreation,

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the above Road Boards in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1954. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the Land Act, 1933-1954, it is made lawful for the Governor, by Order in Council, without issuing any deed or grant, to place any reserve under the control of any municipality, road board, or other person or persons, as a board of management, and to empower such Board to make, repeal, and alter bylaws for the control and management of such reserves, and prescribe fees for depasturing thereon or other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and pubor other use thereof, and for other purposes, such by-laws to be approved by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve No. 23592 for the purpose of Gravel should be placed under the control of the Cockburn Road Board as a board of management: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby place the beforementioned reserve under the control of the Cockburn Road Board as a board of management, and doth empower such Board to make, repeal, or alter by-laws for the control and management of the said reserve; for prescribing fees for depasturising thereon or other use thereof; for directing the manner in which such fees shall be imposed, paid, collected and dispose of, and to impose penalties not exceeding in any case £5 for any breach thereof and £2 a day for a continuing breach, but not more than £20 in the aggregate.

Traffic Act, 1919-1955. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 458/52.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 71 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1955, that the Act applies inter alia to persons and vehicles in the public service of the Crown, or of any local authority but does not apply to any vehicle or class of vehicle or person or class of person to the extent of such exemption as may from time to time be declared by the Governor by Order in Council: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by section 71 of the Act doth hereby declare that vehicles used as road working plant and more particularly described in the Schedule hereto are exempt from the operation of all regulations in force and made from time to time under the provisions of the Act relating to brakes, lamps and lighting equipment but no such vehicle is hereby exempted from any regulation relating to any reflector or reflectors with which it is required to be equipped when used on roads.

Adjustment of Accounts.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 1917/52.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council published in the Government Gazette of the 3rd day of February, 1956, at pages 423 to 425, both inclusive, there was severed from the Albany Road District and annexed to the Plantagenet Road District certain pieces of land and there was likewise severed from the Plantagenet Road District and annexed to the Albany Road District further pieces of land as specified in the said Order; and whereas under the provisions of section 10 of the Road Districts Act it is provided that the Governor may adjust and finally determine all questions relating to the adjustment and sharing of property debts and liabilities, etc. of any local authority affected by the severance of any part of a district; and whereas it is desirable that certain property of the Albany Road Board should be transferred and adjusted as between that Board and the Plantagenet Road Board and likewise that certain property of the Plantagenet Road Board should be transferred and adjusted as between that Board and the Albany Road Board: Now therefore in exercise of the powers conferred by section 10 of the Road Districts Act His Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby transfer from the Albany Road Board to the Plantagenet Road Board to the Plantagenet Road Board the assets set out in Schedule One hereto and from the Plantagenet Road Board to the Albany Road Board the assets set out in Schedule Two hereto.

Declaration Concerning Loans.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 534/55.

WHEREAS, pursuant to section 8 of the Road Districts Act, an Order in Council was published in the Government Gazette of the 17th February. 1956, at page 568, constituting the Nedlands Road District as the Municipality of Nedlands on and from the 1st day of March, 1956; and whereas it is provided in section 10 (1) (iv) of the Road Districts Act that where any local authority affected by an Order in Council under the provisions of section 8 of the Act is indebted by way of moneys advanced to it by way of loan, the Governor may declare that all or any loan rates applicable to such loan or any part thereof shall be levied only on such portion of any district as the Governor shall determine to have been benefited by such loan or such portion thereof; and whereas the Nedlands Road Board raised loans in respect of which it notified that its opinion was that such loans would confer benefits upon specified portions of the District; and whereas it is desirable for the adjustment and determination of the rights of various ratepayers and of the Council in respect of the loans, to declare that loan rates applicable to the loans shall be levied only on the portions of the District declared to have been benefited: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby declare that in respect of loans raised by the former Nedlands Road Board the Municipality of Nedlands shall levy rates as follows:—

(a) Loans in connection with which the Nedlands Road Board did not notify that in its opinion the loan would confer benefits upon any particular portion of the District, the loan rates necessary shall be levied upon all the land within the District.

(b) loans in connection with which the Nedlands Road Board notified that in its opinion the loan would confer benefits upon a portion of the District only, the Municipality of Nedlands shall levy rates only on the land contained in the area so notified as to be benefited.

#### 3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers employed by the employer following the vocations mentioned in clause 6 of this Award: Provided that it shall not apply to workers who are at present provided for in any Award of the Court of Arbitration of Western Australia or in any Industrial Agreement registered in accordance with the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952: Provided, further that this Award shall be limited in its application to establishments which are engaged in biscuit, cake and sponge manufacturing for resale by another business, and icing sugar crushing for use by the employer and/or for re-sale in another business.

## 4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the G.P.O., Perth.

#### 5.-Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of one year as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

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#### 7.—Special Rates.

- (a) Any adult worker, other than a shift worker, called upon to commence work between 12 o'clock midnight and the usual starting time for day workers, on operations which must necessarily commence between those times, shall be paid three shillings (3s.) per day in addition to his ordinary rate.
- (b) Any junior worker, other than a shift worker, called upon to commence work between 12 o'clock midnight and the usual starting time for day workers, on operations which must necessarily commence between those times, shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the weekly rate prescribed in clause 6 bereof

# 8.-Hours of Work.

- (a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work and shall be worked in five (5) days, Monday to Friday, inclusive.
- (b) Where more than one shift is worked, the starting and finishing times shall be as agreed upon between the employers and the Union and failing agreement, the matter shall be referred to the Board of Reference for decision.

#### 9.-Shift Work.

Any worker who works on shift work other than the recognised day shift shall be paid for such shift at the following rates:—

- (a) Five per cent. (5%) in addition to the ordinary rate for afternoon shift.
- (b) Ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the ordinary rate for night shift.

#### 10.—Overtime.

- (a) All time worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day, or subject to clause 7 outside the usual starting and finishing times, shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) All time worked on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) When a worker without being notified the previous day is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings (3s.) in lieu thereof.
- (d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award—
  - (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
  - (ii) no organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause;
  - (iii) this subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

# 11.—Contract of Service.

- (a) Except in the case of a casual worker, whose engagement shall be by the hour, the contract of hiring of every worker shall be weekly contract, terminable on either side by one (1) week's notice given on any day.
- (b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance, subject to the provisions of clause 15 hereof, as to payment for absence on account of illness.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

# 12.-Mixed Functions.

A worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award than that which he or she usually performs, shall be entitled to the higher rate whilst so employed.

# 13.—Holidays.

- (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) All work performed on any of the foregoing days shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

# 14.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.

- (b) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to appear the second of the second to annual leave.
- (e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (c) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service, shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of
- (g) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 15.-Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay under the preceding provision, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to holidays.

# 16.-Junior Worker's Certificate.

Junior workers, upon being engaged shall, if required, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—(1) Name in full; (2) age and date of birth; (3) name of each previous employer and length of service with such employer; (4) class of work performed for each previous employer. previous employer.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay, in the event of the age or length of service of the worker being wrongly stated on the certificate. If any junior worker shall wilfully mis-state his age in the above certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award,

#### 17.—Posting of Award.

The employer shall, upon request of the Union, post a copy of this Award in a conspicuous place in the factory, where it is easily accessible to the workers.

#### 18.-Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep, or cause to be kept, a record containing the following particulars:-

(a) The name of each worker.
(b) The class of work performed.
(c) The hours worked each day.
(d) The wage and overtime (if any) paid.

(e) The age of each junior worker.

Such record shall be open to the inspection of an

accredited representative of the Union.

Any system of automatic recording by machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.

### 19.-No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle an employer to reduce the wage of any worker who at the date of this Award was being paid a higher rate of wage than the minimum prescribed for his or her class of work.

#### 20.-Meal Interval.

No female worker or junior male worker shall be employed for a longer period than five (5) hours without a break for a meal. The time allowed for each meal required shall not be more than one hour.

### 21.-Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid at least once weekly.

#### 22.-Board of Reference.

For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of-

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award, or any of them;
- (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

# 23.—Under Rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for the employer at the proposed lesser rate.

### 24.—Part-Time Workers.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the employer shall be at liberty to employ part-time workers. Where any worker is employed under the provisions of this clause, wages as prescribed in clause 6, annual leave as prescribed in clause 14, and sick pay as prescribed in clause 15, shall be reduced proportionately.

#### 25.—Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it. or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

#### 26.-General Provisions.

(a) No female worker shall be permitted to lift or to carry weights in excess of thirty-five (35) lbs.
(b) Where and when practicable, suitable seating accommodation shall be provided for female workers unless it is physically impossible to carry out the work required in a sitting posture.
(c) A suitable change and mess room shall be provided

#### provided.

### 27.—Inspection by Union.

- (a) The secretary of the Union, or any official thereunto authorised in writing by the Union shall, on production of such authority to the employer or his manager, be allowed once in each week to inspect any part of the employer's works where it is suspected that a breach of this Award has occurred, or is occurring, but such inspection shall be carried out in the company of the employer or someone on his behalf.
- The employer shall provide the necessary facilities for the investigation of the breach, or the supposed breach, of the Award, including access to the time books, sheets or cards referred to in clause 18 hereof.
- (c) The Union official exercising his right under this clause shall not interfere with or inconvenience the work and duties of the workers more than is absolutely necessary for the proper investigation of the breach or supposed breach of the Award.

Between the West Australian Chemical and Allied Trades Industrial Union of Workers, Applicant, and Universal Milling Co. Ltd., Minerals Proprietary Ltd., and R. J. Fletcher, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination and whereas the parties hearing and determination and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court now therefore the Court pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

# MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT.

### 1.—Title.

#### 3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to the process, trade, business or occupation of manufacturing or preparing mineral earths by milling, grinding or pulverising rocks, earths, clays or ores other than metallic ores or coal.

#### 4.—Area.

This Award shall apply over that portion of the State of Western Australia known as the South-West Land Division.

#### 5.-Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

#### 6.—Hours.

- (a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work for ordinary day workers, to be worked in five (5) days, Monday to Friday inclusive.

  (b) For shift workers the ordinary working hours shall not exceed one hundred and twenty (120) in twenty-one (21) consecutive days provided that not more than five (5) shifts shall be worked in each period of seven (7) consecutive days
- (c) Where a worker is called upon to work a quick shift, he shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter for each such quick shift. A "quick shift" shall mean a shift where a worker is brought on to work a full shift before having had at least eight (8) hours off.

#### 7.—Overtime.

- (a) Subject to clause 6, all work performed before the usual starting time or beyond the usual finishing time or beyond eight (8) hours on any one day or shift shall be deemed overtime and be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) Call Back. Where a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.
- (c) Work done in the meal time or any portion thereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half but this shall not apply to cases involving completion of work commenced before such meal time and not occupying more than fifteen (15) minutes from the commencement thereof, in which case the meal time will be extended by such period beyond the ordinary time.
- (d) All work performed on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (e) Any worker who is required to work on Sunday shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at the rate applicable for that day.
- (f) Where a worker without being notified on the previous day is required to continue working the previous day is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) in lieu thereof; provided that this payment need not be made to any worker residing in the same locality as his place of employment, who can reasonably return home for a meal.
- (g) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award-
  - (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
  - (ii) No organisation, party to this Award or No organisation, party to this Award or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

#### 8.-Wages

- (d) No junior worker under 17 years of age shall be employed in wheeling bags of material up an inclined ramp or board.
- (e) No male junior under 18 years of age shall be employed on night shift.
- (f) Any worker employed for less than one week shall be classed as a casual worker and shall be paid at the rate of ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the ordinary wage.
- (g) Any male worker placed by the employer in charge of three or more other male workers shall be paid two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day in addition to the rates prescribed in subclause (b) hereof.

# 9.—Shiftwork.

- (a) Workers employed on afternoon shift shall be paid at the rate of five per cent. (5%) in addition to their ordinary wage. Workers employed on night shift shall be paid at the rate of seven and one half per cent.  $(7\frac{1}{2}\%)$  in addition to their ordinary wage.
- (b) Shift workers shall be allowed twenty (20) minutes for crib in each shift without deduction of pay.
- (c) Crib time shall be taken in relays at such time as not to cause a stoppage of work.
  - (d) Shifts shall rotate weekly.

#### 10.—Higher Duties.

(a) Any worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award for less than half of one day or shift shall be paid the higher rate for the time so employed.

(b) Any worker who is required to do work which is entitled to a higher rate under this Award for one half or more of one day or shift shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift.

#### 11.—Contract of Service.

Except in the case of casual workers the contract of service of each worker covered by this Award shall be a weekly one terminable by one week's notice given on either side.

#### 12.-Breakdowns, etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

#### 13.—Under-Rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of

Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

# 14.-Time and Wages Record.

Each employer shall keep or cause to be kept at his usual place of business, or at each of them, if more than one, a record of the names of all workers employed by him at the particular factory, the class of work performed by each worker, the wages paid to each such worker, the starting and finishing time on each day, and the amount of overtime, if any. Such a book shall be open to inspection by the secretary or such person as may be appointed by the Union, on any day during working hours.

# 15.-Junior Worker's Certificate.

- (a) Junior workers, upon being engaged, shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:—
  - (i) Name in full.
  - (ii) Age and date of birth.
- (b) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.
  (c) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate, nor shall the employer in such case be deemed guilty of a breach of any of the provisions of the Award founded upon an age limitation, except in the case of collusion.
- (d) If any worker shall wilfully mis-state his age in the above certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award.

#### 16.-Holidays.

- (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall subject to subclause (c) hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Easter Saturday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) All work done on any of the holidays specified in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (d) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

- (e) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (f) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefits of the provisions of this clause.
- (j) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

# 17.—Payment for Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. # 18.—General.

- (a) Dust glasses, goggles or respirators shall where necessary be supplied to workers.
- (b) Employers shall provide reasonable washing and sanitary conveniences.

- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Award.
