WHEREAS under section 2 of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1954, "Native Institution" means and includes any mission, reformatory, orphanage, school, home, station, reserve, or other institutions for the benefit, protection or care of the native inhabitants benefit, protection or care of the native inhabitants of the State declared by Proclamation to be a native institution for the purpose of this Act: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred by section 2 of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1954, do hereby cancel the existing Proclamation, as published in the Government Gazette on the 24th December, 1937, declaring the Children's Cottage Home, Queen's Park, to be an institution within the meaning of the said section.

# Workers' Compensation Act. 1912-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1954, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under this Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas The Mutual Life and Citizens' Assurance Company Limited, of 179a St. George's Terrace Peuth being on employer within the meaning race, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the Act and as such subject to the section and having made application in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder for exemption from the operation of section 13, has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by it, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Commonwealth Government Securities of the value of five thousand pounds (£5,000): Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt The Mutual Life and Citizens' Assurance Company Limited from the operaof the Act and as such subject to the section and

# INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

No. 8 of 1956.

Registered: 28th May, 1956.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 25th day of May, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-six, between Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Union"), of the one part, and Triplett and Sons Pty. Ltd. (hereinafter called "the employer") of the other part witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:-

#### 1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the "Oil Pipe Line Denso Wrapping Agreement."

#### 2.—Airangement.

- 1. Title.
- 2. Arrangement.
- 3. Area and scope.
- 4. Term. Hours of duty.
- Overtime.
- 7. Contract of service.
- 8. Annual leave.9. Public holidays.
- 10. Absence through sickness.11. Payment of wages.
- 12. Board of Reference. 13. Tools.
- 14. Casual workers.
- 15. Records.
- 16. Interviewing workers.
- 17. Preference.
- 18. Wages.

# Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all workers employed by the respondent in the Denso Wrapping by hand of Oil Pipe Lines situated within the quayside of Fremantle Harbour.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of one (1) year from the date hereof.

#### 5.-Hours of Duty.

The ordinary hours of work shall not exceed forty (40) hours per week and shall be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours per day, Monday to Friday inclusive.

# 6.—Overtime.

- (a) All time worked outside of or in excess of the usual working hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and one half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) Where work is done on Saturdays, it shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours, and double time thereafter: Provided that workers called out for duty at or after 5 p.m. on Saturdays shall be paid double time.

- (c) If the employer requires an employee to work on Sunday, such employee shall be paid at the rate of double time.
- (d) If an employee is recalled to work after leaving his job he shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at overtime rates.

#### 7.—Contract of Service.

- (a) Except in the case of a casual worker whose engagement shall be by the hour, the contract of service of every worker shall be a daily contract terminable on either side by one (1) day's notice given on any day. If the required notice is not given one (1) day's wages shall be paid or forfeited
- (b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance subject to the provisions of clause 10 (sick leave) or such absence as is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Agreement.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct.
- (d) The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for one day or portion of a day upon which a worker (including an apprentice) cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

#### 8.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying 12-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (c) of this clause to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (g) When a worker is entitled to holidays under this clause, he shall receive at least two (2) weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such worker should take his holidays.
- (h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 9.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to clause 6 hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday,

- Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) All work performed on any of the abovementioned days shall be paid at the rate of double time.
- (d) Payment shall not be made for any holiday which occurs whilst a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay, or sickness, including accidents off duty, excepting time for which he is entitled to sick pay.
- (e) When a worker is on duty or available for duty on the whole of the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty or is available for duty on the whole of the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in subclause (a) he shall be paid for such holiday.
- (f) A casual worker shall not be entitled to any payment for any day observed as a holiday, except that when work is performed on any such day payment shall be made therefore at the rate of double time.

#### 10.-Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

## 11.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid at least once weekly within 10 minutes of the usual knock-off time.

#### 12.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The court appoints for the purpose of this Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement, the functions of—
  - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;
  - (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, which, for this purpose, are embodied in this Agreement.

#### 13.—Tools.

All tools required by employees shall be supplied by the employer free of charge.

#### 14.--Casual Workers.

A "Casual Worker" is one for whom less than one (1) week's continuous work is provided. Casual workers shall be entitled to receive ten per cent. (10%) in excess of the rates prescribed herein.

# 15.—Records.

The wages book (or wages sheets) of the employer shall be open for inspection by the secretary, or an accredited representative of the Union, at the office of the Company during working hours, upon reasonable notice being given of the desire to inspect same.

#### 16.—Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Agreement, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour and at the change of shift, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised, without the consent of the employer, more than once in any one (1) week.

#### 17.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union and who produces proof of such membership shall be entitled to equal preference. Provided also, be entitled to equal preference. Provided also, that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of the said Union shall within 14 days of commencing employment under this Agreement make and complete an application for membership of the said Union, and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another industrial union, shall, upon the expiration of his current membership with such other union, within 14 days of such expiry, make and complete an application for membership with the Australian Workers' Union.

#### 18.-Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Agreement shall be as follows:-

And it is further expressly agreed and declared that the rates set out herein include allowances for all disabilities which might be incurred by a worker in the execution of his duties.

# IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

#### No. 12 of 1956

Between the Royal Australian Nursing Federation Western Australian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, Perth, Applicant, and The Silver Cliain District and Bush Nursing Association Incorporated, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference and whereas the parties have this description. difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

#### Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement").

#### 1.--Title.

This Award shall be known as the Nurses' (Silver Chain Association) Award and replaces Agreement No. 15 of 1952.

# Scope.

This Award shall apply to all nurses employed by the employer in the vocations set out herein.

#### 4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect throughout the State of Western Australia.

#### 5.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of three years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

## 6.—Definitions.

- (a) "Nurse" shall mean and include one who is registered in Western Australia or entitled to be registered in Western Australia under the Nurses Registration Act, 1921-1953.
- (b) "Sister" shall mean and include a nurse performing duties among the sick of a community in their homes.
- (c) "Bush Nursing Centre" shall mean a nursing centre established by the employer in a country town where there is no resident doctor or district hospital, and at which the sick of the community may attend for advice and/or treatment. The centre shall include free lodgings for the sister in charge.

(d) "Bush Nursing Sister" shall mean and include the nurse in charge of a "Bush Nursing Centre". In addition to giving advice or attention to persons calling upon her for advice or attention she shall, where necessary, perform duties among the sick of a community in their homes.

#### 7.---Wages.

- (a) Salaries shall be paid at least twice per calendar month, or fortnightly, at the option of the employer; provided that by agreement between the employer and the worker, the salary may in any particular case be paid monthly.
- (b) The minimum rate of wages payable to workers covered by this Award shall be as follows:—

# 8.—Absence Through Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-sixth (1/6th) of a week for each completed month of service. Provided that, subject to sub-clause (e) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to two (2) weeks in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from her employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of her employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of her own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless she produces proof satisfactory to her employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of sub-clause (c) hereof, a worker who in any calendar year, has already been allowed sick leave on one occasion shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless she produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that she was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.
- (e) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by her employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by her employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this sub-clause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years, but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.
- (f) For the purpose of assessing a worker's entitlement to accumulated sick pay, sub-clause (e) hereof shall be deemed to have become operative as from the first day of July, 1956.

# 9.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

- (a) Christmas Day and Good Friday shall be observed as holidays without deduction of pay.
- (b) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of four (4) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed anually to a worker by the employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with the employer.
- (c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves her employment, or her employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-third (1/3rd) of a week's pay at her ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which she is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining her right to holidays.
- (e) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs her contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
  - (f) This clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 10.—Dismissals.

- (a) No worker shall be dismissed (except for misconduct) unless she has received fourteen (14) days' previous notice of her dismissal or pay for such period in lieu thereof.
- (b) No worker shall, without the consent of her employer, resign without first having given fourteen (14) days' previous notice of her intention to do so; and in the absence of such notice the employer may withold holiday, or other pay up to the amount of fourteen (14) days' wages.
- (c) This clause shall not apply to casual or part-time workers.

#### 11.—Engagement.

- (a) When a nurse is engaged for service in a centre or place outside the area within a radius of twenty (20) miles of the General Post Office, Perth, she shall be entitled to first-class accommodation and travelling allowance as above from her home to the place of employment.
- (b) If such worker remains in such service for the period for which she was engaged, and, if none is stipulated, then for the six (6) months, she shall receive first-class accommodation and allowance as above to return to her home.
- (c) If she is dismissed before such time as aforesaid (except for proved misconduct), she shall be entitled to first-class accommodation and travelling allowance as above to return to her home.
- (d) Any worker whose duties require her to travel shall be entitled to first-class travelling accommodation at the expense of her employer.

#### 12.-Laundry and Uniforms.

- (a) Each employee shall be paid an allowance of three shillings and sixPence (3s. 6d.) per week to cover laundering.
- (b) The employer shall supply an employee with all uniforms required; provided that in lieu of supplying uniforms, the employer may make an allowance of four shillings (4s.) per week.

#### 13.--Casuals.

A nurse employed for a period of less than two weeks shall be deemed a casual employee and be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates prescribed herein.

If a casual employee is still required at the end of two (2) weeks, she may be re-employed as a casual with payment as aforesaid for another two (2) weeks.

# 14.—Part-time Workers.

(a) Notwithstanding anything contained herein an employer shall be at liberty to regularly employ part-time workers.

- (b) A part-time worker means a worker engaged on an hourly contract of service who regularly works less than the normal hours per week.
- (c) Part-time workers shall be paid a pro-rata amount of the wages specified in clause 7 hereof depending upon the number of hours worked and shall be entitled to pro-rata payment for annual and sick leave.

#### 15.-Motor Car Allowance.

Where an employee maintains a motor car and is authorised in writing by her employer to use her car in the performance of her duties, she shall be paid at the rate of sevenpence (7d.) for each mile she uses her car on official business.

#### 16.—Telephone.

Where a nurse is required to use a telephone on her private premises in the performance of her duties, the employer shall pay the rental charge of such telephone.

#### 17.-No Reduction.

Nothing herein contained shall entitle the employer to reduce the salary of any worker who at the date of this Award is being paid a higher rate of salary than the minimum prescribed for her class of work, or to deprive her of any privileges relating to her employment which are enjoyed by her at the date hereof.
