#### IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

## No. 16 of 1956.

Between Merchant Service Guild of Australasia, Western Australian Section Union of Workers, Fremantle, Applicant, and the Fremantle Har-bour Trust Commissioners, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conformed and have arrived at agreement on all matters. ferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

# Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.-Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include 'Agreement.'')

## 1.-Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to the berthing master's assistant in the employ of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, and shall operate over that area within the boundaries of the Port of Fremantle vested in the Commissioners of the Fremantle Harbour Trust.

## 2.—Definitions.

"Employers" means the Fremantle Harbour Trust and includes the Commissioners constituted under the Act and in office for the time being. "Employee" means any person employed under

the provisions of this Award.

### 3.—Hours of Duty.

(a) Forty hours shall constitute a week's work. The daily hours shall not exceed eight per day and shall be worked on any five days of the week between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.

A meal break of one hour shall be granted between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m. for dinner, and between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. for tea. Should work commence before 6 a.m., a break of one hour for breakfast shall be allowed between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m.

(b) Except when on authorised leave, or when the employee is absent from work for any other reason, the employee shall be rostered off duty for two days each week (midnight to midnight).

(c) For the purpose of this Award the week's work shall be deemed to commence at 12 midnight each Friday and conclude at 12 midnight on the

each Friday and conclude at 12 midnight on the following Friday.

# 4.—Overtime and Special Rates.

- (a) Overtime shall mean and include all time worked:
  - (i) in excess of eight (8) hours on any working day,
  - (ii) outside of the daily spread of hours prescribed in Clause 3 of this Award,
    (iii) in excess of forty (40) hours in any one
  - week.

Overtime worked consecutively with ordinary hours of duty shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Employees recalled to duty outside of the prescribed spread of hours shall be paid overtime at the rate of double time for the period of recall with a minimum of two (2) hours,

- (c) Where there is a second call back on any night, and the break from the time of actually ceasing duty in respect of the first call back to the time of recommencement of duty is less than two (2) hours, overtime shall be allowed continuously as if no break had occurred.
- (d) An employee required for duty on his rostered day off shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours, and double time thereafter, with a minimum payment as for four (4) hours at time and a half: Provided that for all work preformed between noon on Saturday and midnight on Sunday he shall be paid a minimum of four (4) hours at the rate of double time: Provided further that where an employee is required for duty before noon on Saturday and such duty extends beyond noon, he shall be paid a minimum of four (4) hours at time and a half, but double time shall be paid for all work actually performed after 12 noon.
- (e) Employees called on to start work within an hour and a half of starting time shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half until starting time.
- (f) Employees who have been instructed to make themselves available at their homes for the purpose of being in attendance at a stated time and who are subsequently informed at their homes that their services are not required, shall be paid two (2) hours' pay at ordinary rates.
- (g) An employee who has done continuous duty for twenty-four (24) hours shall not be required to do further duty until he has had, for the purpose of rest, a period of eight (8) consecutive hours off duty, exclusive of any meal hours.

For the purpose of this subclause, "continuous duty" shall mean any period of twenty-hour (24) hours during which the employee has not been free of duty for a period in excess of four (4) consecutive hours which may include one meal time.

(h) In the event of the requirements of the work being such that a break of one hour for the taking of meals cannot be granted during the appropriate periods specified in clause 3 (a) hereof, the employee shall be paid a special allowance of 5s. in respect of dinner and 3s. 6d. in respect of breakfast and tea: Provided that this allowance shall not be payable when work begins or is resumed at or during a meal period.

#### 6.-Saturday and Sunday Time.

- (a) The time worked on Saturdays up to a maximum of eight (8) hours shall be included in the ordinary week's work, but employees required to work on Saturdays other than those finishing work commenced on the previous Friday, or commencing duty for Sunday's work, shall be paid an extra half day's pay in addition to the week's earnings: Provided that this payment shall be deemed to have been complied with by the addition of four and a half per cent(4.5%) to the ordinary weekly wage for forty (40) hours' work, the amount so arrived at representing the average weekly payment during the year for Saturday work.
- (b) The time worked on Sundays in accordance with weekly rosters of duty prepared by the employers shall be included in the ordinary week's work, but employees required to work on Sundays other than those finishing a shift commenced earlier than 11 p.m. on the preceding Saturday, or employees commencing duty at 11 p.m. on Sunday shall be paid an extra threequarter day's pay in addition to the week's earnings: Provided that this payment shall be deemed to have been complied with by the addition of six and threequarters per cent. (6.75%) to the ordinary weekly wage for forty (40) hours' work, the amount so arrived at represents the average weekly payment during the year for Sunday work,

#### 7.—Annual Leave.

At the completion of twelve months' continuous service, the employee shall be granted leave of absence on full pay for a period of thirty days. Such leave shall at all times be taken at the convenience of the employers.

#### 8 .- Long Service Leave.

After each seven years' continuous service the employee shall be granted three months' long service leave on full pay, but periods of absence on long service leave shall not count as service qualifying towards the next grant of such leave.

#### 9.—Contract of Service.

The employee shall be deemed to be engaged on a monthly basis, and one month's notice shall be given on either side to terminate such engagement: Provided that the employee may be instantly suspended or dismissed, without notice, for insobriety, misconduct or neglect of duty.

#### 10.-Uniforms.

The employers shall provide the employee with uniforms free of cost after each eight months' continuous service, an oilskin coat and sou'-wester cach year, and a greatcoat every four years. Uniforms shall belong to the employers and shall be worn by the employee when on duty. Should the service of any employee terminate within one month from the date of issue of uniforms or any portion of them, all the issue last made to the employee shall be returned to the employers before the employee shall be entitled to be paid any moneys which may be due to him.

#### 11.-Sick Leave.

- (a) When the employee is incapacitated through sickness or injury other than that arising out of or in the course of his employment, he may be granted sick leave with pay for a period of or periods not exceeding in the aggregate one month in any year, upon production within 48 hours of the commencement of any such period of absence of a medical certificate as to his incapacity.
- (b) Where such incapacity arises through the wilful act or misconduct of the employee, or where a medical certificate is not furnished as required, or where the employee has already had sick leave with pay for a period of or periods aggregating one month during the preceding twelve months, the employee shall not be entitled to any pay for the period he is absent from duty.
- (c) Upon the period of absence in any instance exceeding one month, or in the case of paragraph (b) hereof, immediately the employee absents himself the contract of service shall be deemed to have been terminated without requiring further notice by the employers, who shall thereby be relieved of any further obligation to the employee: Provided that any such period of incapacity may, at the discretion of the employers, be regarded as leave without pay.

## 12.-Sickness or Accident arising out of Duty.

- (a) An employee who, while on duty or acting under the instructions of the employer, receives an injury arising out of, or in the course of his employment, or contracts an illness due to the nature of and attributable to such employment and is thereby incapacitated from duty in circumstances which entitle him to the benefits prescribed under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1952, shall be entitled to receive in addition to such benefits a weekly sum equal to the difference between the compensation provided for under that Act and the wages prescribed in this Award, from the date of the commencement of his said incapacity up to and including the date of his recovery as certified by his medical attendant: Provided that the employers' liability hereunder shall in no case exceed three calendar months in respect of each separate injury or illness.
- (b) All amounts payable under this clause shall be paid in the manner provided for the payment of wages.

### 13.—Rate of Pay when on Leave.

#### 14.—Use of Bicycles, etc.

An employee required to use his own bicycle or other vehicle during the course of his duties shall receive a special allowance of 5s. per week as compensation for wear and tear. Such allowance, which shall be payable monthly, will not accrue while the employee is absent from duty for any cause whatsoever for a period of a complete week or longer. or longer.

#### 15.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three years from the date hereof.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to Section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

## Memorandum of Agreement.

(NOTE: Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein, it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement".)

#### 1.--Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Fruit and Produce Market Employees Award" and replaces Award No. 20 of 1949.

#### 3.-Area.

This Award shall operate over the area comprised within a fifteen (15) mile radius from the General Post Office, Perth.

#### 4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of two (2) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

### 5.- Definitions.

- (a) "Weekly worker" shall mean a worker engaged by the week and whose contract of service shall be terminated by not less than one week's notice on either side, which may be given at any time. Such week's notice cannot be continued from week to week.
- (b) "Head storeman" shall mean a person performing the duties of a storeman and who is in charge of two or more men.
- (c) "Casual worker" means a worker engaged by the hour and who may be put off or leave the by the hour and who may be put off or leave the employer's service at any moment without notice; Provided that, when engaged on Tuesdays, Thursdays, or Saturdays, a casual worker shall receive a minimum payment of not less than two (2) hours' pay. If engaged on Mondays, Wednesdays or Fridays, a casual worker shall receive a minimum payment of not less than four (4) hours' pay.

## 6.—Scope.

This Award shall apply in respect of all work This Award shall apply in respect of all work performed by any employee who in the course of his duties is employed principally as a storeman in businesses such as those conducted by the parties to this Award, but shall not apply in respect of any employee who is employed in the terms of the Road Transport Workers' Award.

#### 7 —Homs.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work, which shall be worked by weekly workers as fol-

- (1) In Fruit and Produce Markets (including Poultry and Carcase Meat Markets), other than Fremantle:-
  - (a) On Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays—between 4 a.m. and 5 p.m.: Provided that the spread of hours on those days shall not, in respect of any worker, exceed twelve (12) hours, inclusive of meal times.

Meal times: In respect of weekly workers not less than forty-five (45) minutes shall be allowed for lunch, such period to be completed not later than 2 pm. In respect of weekly workers commencing duty before 5.30 a.m., not less than fifteen (15) minutes shall be allowed for breakfast, to be completed not later than 8 a.m.

In respect of casual workers, not less than half an hour shall be allowed for lunch, such period to be completed not later than 2 p.m. In respect of casual workers commencing duty before 5.30 a.m. not less than fifteen (15) minutes shall be allowed for breakfast, to be completed not later than

(b) On Tuesdays and Thursdays-between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Meal times: Three-quarters of an hour shall be allowed for lunch, to be completed not later than 2 p.m.

- On Saturdays—between 8 a.m. and 12 noon. Provided that any weekly worker required to work on Monday, Wednesday, (c) On Saturdays-between 8 a.m. required to work on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday in any one week shall be entitled to a full Tuesday or Thursday off during that week, but this shall not apply to any weekly worker who is not, on any day except Friday in that week, called upon to start work before 7 a.m. and who on that Friday is not called upon to start work before 6 a.m.
- (2) Provided that, in Fremantle Fruit and Produce Markets, the hours and conditions stated in subclause (1) hereof shall not apply, but the following shall apply:
  - (a) On Mondays and Thursdays—between 5.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. Provided that during the week immediately preceding Xmas Day and during the week immediately preceding Easter Sunday the long days of the week may be varied to suit the convenience of the employer's business.

Meal times: Not less than one half-hour shall be allowed for lunch, to be completed not later than 2 p.m. In respect of workers commencing duty before 5 a.m. not less than fifteen (15) minutes shall be allowed for breakfast, to be completed not later than 8.30 a.m.

- (b) On Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Fridays—between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.
  Meal times: One (1) hour shall be allowed, to be completed not later than 2 p.m.
  (c) On Saturdays—between 8 a.m. and 12
- (3) In respect of the employees of Wholesale Fruit and Produce Packers, the following hours shall apply:
  - (a) On Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays-
  - between 6.40 a.m. and 5 p.m.
    (b) On Tuesdays and Thursdays—between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Meal times: On any of the days specified in subclauses (3) (a) and (b), one (1) hour shall be allowed for lunch between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

(c) On Saturdays—between 8 a.m. and 12 noon. Provided that the said hours may be worked in five (5) days at the option of the employer.

## 8.—Overtime.

For all time worked by weekly or casual workers:-

- (a) After 12 noon on Saturdays and on the holidays specified in clause (9) (a) hereof, and in respect of casual workers on the holidays specified in clause 9 (a) hereof—double time shall be paid.
- (b) For all time worked prior to the specified starting or after the specified finishing times, or in excess of the specified spread in any one day, or in excess of forty (40) hours in any one week shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award:
  - (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at over-time rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
  - (ii) No organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

#### 9.-Holidays.

(a) For weekly workers the following days or the days observed in lieu thereof shall, subject to clause 8 (a) hereof be allowed as holidays without

- deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anxac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Xmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

#### 10.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (c) of this clause to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (f) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (g) When a worker is entitled to holidays under this clause, he shall receive at least two (2) weeks' notice from his employer of the date when it will be convenient to the employer that such worker should take his holidays.
- (h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

#### 11.-Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Award shall be as follows:-

(d) Adult Casual Workers .... 8 2-9/20

(e) Junior Casual Workers shall receive 15 per cent. in addition to the ordinary rates prescribed herein for junior workers.

#### 12.-Proportion of Juniors.

Junior workers may be employed in the proportion of one junior to every three (3) or fraction of three adults employed.

# 13.—Higher Duties.

A worker relieving for a period of not less than two days continuously another worker who is engaged on a higher class of work carrying a higher rate of wage under this Award shall be paid the higher minimum rate appropriate to the position whilst so employed.

#### 14.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep and enter up, or cause to be kept and entered up, a record, containing the names of each of his workers to whom this Award applies, the class of work performed by and the wages paid to each worker, the age of each junior worker, and the time during which each worker has been employed. Such record shall be open to inspection by a representative of the union between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. on any working day from Monday to Friday inclusive.

### 15.—Meal Money.

Workers who are required to work for more than one half hour after the prescribed finishing times in clause (7) Hours, shall be paid three shillings (3s.) meal money.

# 16.—Under-rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the union and the employer.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
  (c) After application has been made to the
- Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

#### 17.-Junior Workers Certificate.

Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:-

(1) Name in full.(2) Age and date of birth.

The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages, in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate; Provided that this subclause shall operate only for the first three (3) months from the date of the worker's first engagement, thereby enabling the employer, if he so desires to obtain proof of the junior worker's

## 18.—Payment for Sickness.

- 18.—Payment for Sickness.

  (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance, on the ground of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, with the course of his employment, or for any accident, with the course with the cou wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

#### 19.-Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award the functions of.
  - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpreta-tions of the provision of the Award or any of them;
  - (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such board from time to time.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose, are embodied in this Award.

#### 20.-Basic Wage Variations.

The hourly rate as set out in subclause (d) of clause 11 is subject to adjustment in accordance with any variations in the basic wage which may be ordered by the Court from time to time.
