IN pursuance of the provisions of section 19 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby declare as follows:—

(a) That with respect to nets known as or called "set nets," nets of not more than 500 yards in length having meshes throughout of not less than 2½ inches, shall when used or intended to be used in the waters of Peel's Inlet and Harvey Estuary, be lawful nets.

(b) That with respect to nets known as or called "hauling nets," when used or intended to be used for the catching of mullet and yellow-eye mullet, nets of not more than 800 yards in length having meshes throughout of not less than 2 inches shall when used or intended to be used in the waters of Peel's Inlet and Harvey Estuary, be lawful nets.

(c) That with respect to nets known as or called "whiting set nets" for catching whiting, nets of not more than 300 yards in length having meshes throughout of 1½ inches and of not more than 33 meshes in depth, shall when used or intended to be used in those waters of Peel's Inlet and Harvey Estuary which have a depth of not less than 6 feet, be lawful nets.

(d) With respect to nets known as or called "whiting hauling nets" for catching whiting, nets of not more than 120 yards in length, having meshes throughout of 1¾ inches, shall when used or intended to be used in the waters of Peel's Inlet and Harvey Estuary, be lawful nets. It shall be lawful for nets known as or called "whiting hauling nets" to be used in conjunction with nets known as or called "mullet and yellow-eye mullet nets."

(e) That with respect to nets known as or called "garfish nets" for the catching of garfish, nets of not more than 60 yards in length having meshes throughout of not less than 1½ inches shall when used or intended to be used in the waters of Peel's Inlet and Harvey Estuary, be lawful nets. It shall be lawful for nets known as or called "garfish nets" to be used in conjunction with nets known as or called "mullet and yellow-eye mullet hauling nets."

The Proclamation dated 16th December, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* (No. 62) of 24th December, 1954, is hereby revoked.

Ltd. to change its name before complying with the requirements of that Part of the Act and is of the opinion that the circumstances of the case render it expedient: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by proviso (a) to subsection (7) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1954, doth hereby authorise the Registrar of Companies to accept for filing from The Anglo-Australian Corporation Pty. Ltd. the documents and particulars specified in subsection (1) of section 329 of the Act.

W.A. COAL INDUSTRY TRIBUNAL.

Application No. 45 of 1955.

In the matter of the Mining Act Amendment Act, No. 84 of 1948, Part XIII, Division I, and in the matter of an Industrial dispute wherein the Coalminers Industrial Union of Workers of W.A., Collie, applicants, and Amalgamated Collieries of W.A. Ltd., and others, respondents are parties, and in the matter of an application by the union, for an interpretation. (Application No. 45 of 1955 of W.A.C.I.T.).

Decision.

The Miners' Union has asked the following question for interpretation in relation to Award No. 4 of 1953 (W.A.C.I.T.):—

"Is the rate shown opposite item 23 (v) of the wages schedule the correct rate to be paid to a coal-cutting machineman employed around the mechanical units?" (See clause 6 (c)).

The union sought an answer that the correct rate was 19/9-5.11d. to which the advocate for the respondent companies promptly agreed.

The Tribunal confirms this agreement and finds that the rate has been erroneously shown as 18/9-5.11d. whereas it should be 19/9-5.11d. It is altered accordingly.

W.A. COAL INDUSTRY TRIBUNAL.

Application No. 19 of 1956.

In the matter of the Mining Act Amendment Act, No. 84 of 1948, Part XIII, Division I; and in the matter of an industrial dispute wherein the Colliery Managers' Association of W.A., Collie, Applicants and Amalgamated Collieries of W.A. Ltd., and others, Respondents, are parties and in the matter of an application by the Colliery Managers' for Long Service Leave Award. (Application No. 19 of 1956 of W.A.C.I.T.)

Decision.

By this application the Colliery Managers' Association of W.A. Collie sought an order for Long Service Leave based on the New South Wales Award for Colliery Managers (C.R.B. 891.)

Both parties were in agreement as to the terms of the proposed Award a draft of which was annexed to the application. The Tribunal by unanimous decision decided to confirm the agreement between the parties and to issue the Award in the terms of the agreed draft.

Award No. 19 of 1956.

The Tribunal hereby awards, orders and prescribes:—

1. This award shall be binding upon employers in the Coal Mining Industry in respect of each and every colliery manager employed by them in the said industry in the State of Western Australia and upon any such employee.

2. On and from the 19th June, 1949, employees in the Coalmining Industry covered by this award shall be entitled to Long Service Leave, subject to the following conditions and limitations:—

- (i) Thirteen (13) weeks' Long Service Leave with pay shall become due to each employee upon completion by him of (10) years' continuous service in the coal mining industry in Western Australia with one or more employers: Provided that employment in the industry prior to the 19th June, 1949, shall for a person employed in the industry on the 19th June, 1949 be regarded as continuous service to the extent that one week of leave shall be deemed to have accrued to such person for each completed year of such employment with one or more employers; and further provided that periods of such employment

aggregating thirteen (13) years or more shall count as thirteen (13) years' employment only.

- (ii) An additional thirteen (13) weeks' Long Service Leave with pay shall become due to each employee upon completion by him of each additional ten years of continuous service in the coal mining industry commenced on or after the 19th June, 1949.
- (iii) An employee who has served in the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth and who was employed in the Coal Mining Industry prior thereto shall accumulate Long Service Leave at a rate which will make up for him the maximum amount of leave lost on account of his absence from the industry on such service.
- (iv) On or after 1st April, 1953, Long Service Leave may be taken at any time by an employee who has become due for such leave provided the operations of the mine, at which the employee works, will not in the opinion of the employer be affected by the granting of such leave.
- (v) On the last working day prior to the commencement of his Long Service Leave, each employee shall be paid for the leave due at the appropriate rate for him.
- (vi) Where, on or after the 19th June, 1949, the services of an employee are terminated through operation of mineworkers' pensions legislation because of age, or by his employer because of ill-health that employee shall be granted payment on the basis of a week's pay for each week of leave accrued by him and not already taken.
- (vii) Where an employee dies on or after the 19th June, 1949, payment shall be made to the legal personal representative of the deceased employee on the basis of a week's pay for each week of leave accrued by him and not already taken.
- (viii) In the event of a strike at the collieries in Western Australia, the operation of the foregoing subclauses of this clause shall be deemed to be suspended in relation to such of the employees covered by this Award who participate in any such strike and shall continue to be suspended until the Coal Industry Tribunal otherwise orders.
- (ix) For the purpose of this clause service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding:
- (a) any interruption or determination of the employment in the coal-mining industry if such interruption or determination has been made by an employer merely with the intention of avoiding obligations in respect of Long Service Leave.
- (b) any interruption of the employment in the Coal Mining Industry which occurs merely because of a change of employment from one employer to another in the Coal Mining Industry provided any such interruption does not exceed seven days.
- (c) any absence from work on account of injury or absence on recognised holidays, annual leave, sick leave, or attendance for compulsory medical examination in connection with the employment, or attendance at any court.

3. The provisions of this Award shall, subject to provision for reimbursement of respondent employers out of State Long Service Leave Trust Funds commence to operate on and from the date hereof and shall remain in force for a period of five years thereafter or until further order.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 12 of 1956.

Registered: 9th August, 1956.

THIS Agreement made pursuant to the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, of Western Australia, this 27th day of June, 1956, between the West Australian Local Government Officers' Association Union of Workers (hereinafter called "the Association") of the one part and the Municipality of Kalgoorlie (hereinafter called "the local authority") of the other part, witnesseth that for the consideration hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the Kalgoorlie Municipal Council Officers' Agreement, 1956.

2.—Arrangement.

1. Title.
2. Arrangement.
3. Area.
4. Scope.
5. Definitions.
6. Resignations and Dismissals.
7. Hours of Duty.
8. Holidays.
9. Annual Leave.
10. Long Service Leave.
11. Overtime.
12. Minimum Salary of an Officer Acting in a Higher Grade or in a Dual or Multiple Capacity.
13. Sick Leave.
14. Travelling Expenses.
15. Preference to Seniority on Promotion.
16. Board of Reference.
17. Term.
18. Salaries.

3.—Area.

This Agreement shall extend over and include the boundaries of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie and any premises or land upon which any undertakings of the local authority are being carried on.

4.—Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to all officers in the employment of the Municipality of Kalgoorlie but shall not include health inspectors.

5.—Definitions.

"Officer" shall mean an employee eligible to be a member of the Association.

"Permanent Officer" for the purpose of this Agreement is one who is appointed by resolution of the local authority and is given notice of such appointment in writing under the hand of the town clerk.

"Town clerk" shall mean the person appointed to that position in accordance with the Municipal Corporations Act and who may include in his duties the secretaryship of the local board of health, water board, sanitary board or drainage board or of one or more of such boards.

"Local authority" shall mean the Municipality of Kalgoorlie.

"Engineer" shall mean an officer of the local authority (excepting a works supervisor) who is required to prepare estimates and/or specifications and/or to set out, supervise or control and/or inspect the outside work of the local authority.

"Works Supervisor" shall mean an officer who supervises, directs and controls outside work.

"Foreman" shall mean an officer other than engineer who supervises work under the direction of an engineer or works supervisor.

"Senior Typiste" shall mean an officer employed as a typiste who is over the age of 21 years.

6.—Resignations and Dismissals.

Terms of Employment.—Subject to the provisions of the relevant Act or Acts for the time being in force the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a) An officer being a town clerk, engineer, works supervisor, town treasurer, pool manager, traffic inspector, head gardener,

electrical engineer or foreman shall not without the approval of the local authority resign from his position until the expiration of one month's notice in writing of his intention to do so. All other officers to be required to give one week's notice.

- (b) One month's notice shall be given by the local authority to an officer whose services are no longer required provided that this subclause shall not apply to cases of summary dismissal for misconduct.

- (c) Temporary Officers.—One (1) week's notice on either side shall be required to terminate a contract of service except where a temporary officer is engaged for a specified period or job.

7.—Hours of Duty.

- (a) Except as provided in subclauses (b) and (c) the hours of duty shall be from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday both inclusive with a break of one hour for lunch between 12 noon and 2 p.m.

(b) The hours mentioned in subclause (a) may be varied by agreement between the local authority and the Association and where the duties appertaining to any officer cannot be efficiently carried out within the prescribed hours then in default of such agreement the hours of work shall be determined by the Board of Reference. Provided however, that the officer or officers concerned shall not be required to work (except subject to the provisions of the next following clause) a greater number of hours than those included in the hours specified in the said subclause (a).

(c) The hours of duty of the Stores Clerk, formen and overseers who exercise control over non-clerical workers shall be the same as those of the men over whom they exercise control.

8.—Holidays.

The following holidays shall be granted and paid for, namely:—The days observed as New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Goldfields Cup Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and any other days that may be proclaimed as a public holiday in the municipality or may be proclaimed as a holiday for persons employed in the Public Service or under the Public Service Act of the Government of Western Australia. When an officer at the direction of the local authority, works on any of the prescribed holidays he shall have the equivalent time added to his annual leave. This accumulation is limited to five (5) days in one year.

9.—Annual Leave.

(a) After the completion of each year of continuous service all officers shall be entitled to and shall take a minimum of three weeks' annual recreation leave (exclusive of intervening holidays) on full pay. The leave shall be taken at a time mutually convenient to the officer and the local authority at any time within six (6) months of its becoming due.

(b) An officer not completing one year's service shall be granted pay in lieu of holidays in proportion to his length of service.

(c) At least fourteen (14) days' notice shall be given to an officer by the local authority before requiring him to take annual leave.

10.—Long Service Leave.

(a) All officers of the local authority shall after each period of ten (10) years' continuous service as permanent full time officers thereof be entitled to three (3) months' long service leave to be taken at the convenience of the local authority.

(b) In calculating the length of service of any present officer for the purposes of this clause the following shall be deemed to be continuous service as a permanent full time officer of the local authority:—

- (i) Continuous service with the local authority as a permanent officer immediately prior to the date hereof and after the 1st day of January, 1936.

(ii) In the case of an officer employed by the local authority on a permanent full time basis immediately prior to entering thereon continuous full time service with the Armed Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia between the 3rd day of September, 1939, and the 3rd day of March, 1947.

(c) Absence on account of sickness shall not be deemed a break in the continuity of service and periods of absence on account of sickness up to but not exceeding three (3) months' duration in any one (1) year shall be included in the period of service.

(d) Officers due to take long service leave shall be paid their salary for the period thereof at the rate equivalent to the average rate of pay over the preceding twelve (12) months.

(e) Any officer leaving the service of the local authority on account of sickness or retrenchment or for any other cause which the local authority in its discretion thinks reasonable after three (3) years or more continuous service as a permanent full time officer since the date of the commencement of service or since the date on which such officer last became entitled to long service leave hereunder as the case may be and the personal representatives of any deceased officer who dies after a period of service as aforesaid shall be entitled to be paid at the rate hereinbefore provided for such proportion of three (3) months as such period of service as aforesaid bears to ten (10) years.

(f) Long service leave shall be considered as a special period of recuperation after a lengthy term of service with a view to fitting the officer for a further term and during such leave no officer shall undertake any form of employment for hire or reward. Any contravention of the stipulation in this subclause contained shall entitle the local authority to dismiss the officer from its service forthwith.

11.—Overtime.

(a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) all work done outside the hours specified in clause (7) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.

(b) Executive Officers and heads of departments shall receive overtime as specified in paragraph (a) only for work of a special nature in excess of their normal duties.

(c) Where an officer other than a departmental head or executive officer is required to be on duty on any of the holidays mentioned in clause 8 or on Saturdays or Sundays he shall be paid at the rate of double time.

(d) A minimum of two (2) hours shall be paid when overtime is worked.

12.—Minimum Salary of an Officer Acting in a Higher Grade or in a Dual or Multiple

Capacity.

When an officer—

(a) performs the duties of a position of a grade higher for a period of not less than one month than that to which he is appointed, he shall be paid whilst performing the duties of such position the salary awarded to such position. In the event of the absence of a departmental head, this paragraph shall apply to all classified officers who would be called upon as a matter of course to perform work of a higher grade;

(b) carries out the duties of or occupies a dual office he shall be paid the salary pertaining to the higher office;

(c) carries out the duties of or occupies more than two (2) positions he shall be paid in addition to the salary prescribed by subclauses (a) and (b) hereof ten per centum of the salary of each of the other positions occupied whether the salary for such other position or positions is prescribed by this or another Agreement.

13.—Sick Leave.

In the event of absence from duty on account of personal sickness all officers shall be entitled to payment for such absence on full pay as follows:— Ten (10) days' full pay for each year of service with a maximum of sixty (60) days on production of a medical certificate that such leave is necessary.

14.—Travelling Expenses.

(a) The local authority will pay to its officers all reasonable travelling and hotel expenses incurred by an officer in the discharge of his duties on production of the necessary vouchers.

The method and mode of travelling or the vehicle to be supplied shall be mutually arranged between the local authority and the officer concerned provided however that nothing herein contained shall impose an obligation on any officer to provide a method of conveyance at his own expense nor shall it be a condition precedent to the appointment of an officer that he shall provide a conveyance at his own expense.

(b) When by arrangements the officer supplies his own conveyance there shall be added to his expenses the amount equal to fair rental value for the vehicle and an adequate amount for running costs.

(c) If the parties cannot agree upon any question arising under subclauses (a) and (b) hereof the matter may be referred for settlement by either party concerned to the Board of Reference.

15.—Preference to Seniority on Promotion.

Whenever a vacancy occurs in any office preference to fill such vacancy may be given to the senior officer of that department regard being had to his efficiency and long service.

16.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court may appoint for the purpose of the Agreement a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives one to be nominated by each of the parties as prescribed by the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952. There are assigned to each such Board in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to this Agreement the functions of—

(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the whole and/or any of the provisions of the Agreement;

(ii) classifying and fixing wages rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Agreement;

(iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

17.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof.

18.—Salaries.

The following shall be the minimum rate of salaries payable to Officers governed by this Agreement.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF
WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 21 of 1956.

Between Golden Crumpets Co. Pty. Ltd., Applicant,
and Western Australia Pastrycooks and Confectioners' Employees' Union of Workers, Perth,
Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at Agreement on all matters in difference and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court now therefore, the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration

Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:—

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Crumpet Manufacturing Award.

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Area.

This Award shall have effect and operate over that area occupied and controlled by the applicant.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

5.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to workers employed by the applicant in the manufacture of crumpets.

6.—Contract of Service.

Except in the case of casual workers, the contract of service shall be by the week, terminable by one week's notice on either side. In the event of the employer or a worker failing to give the required notice, one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited. Provided that the employer may at any time dismiss a worker for misconduct.

7.—Hours.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work and such hours shall be worked from Monday to Friday inclusive.

8.—Overtime.

All time worked in excess of forty (40) hours in any week or ten (10) hours in any shift, or before the rostered starting time, shall be deemed to be overtime and shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

In the computation of overtime each day shall stand alone.

9.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu thereof shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.

(c) Any worker who is absent from work for any cause other than sickness (proof whereof shall lie on the worker) on the working day immediately before or the working day immediately following any of the days mentioned in subclause (a) hereof, shall not be entitled to payment for the holiday.

(d) All work performed on the holidays prescribed in subclause (a) above shall be paid for at double time.

(e) Except as hereinafter provided a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve months' continuous service with such employer.

(f) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(g) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(h) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed in this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(i) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled subject to subclause (g) of this clause to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.

(j) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(k) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

10.—Absence through Sickness.

A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health, for one-twelfth of one week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week's pay in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness, to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Worker's Compensation Act.

A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause, unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

11.—Time and Wages Record.

The employer shall keep or cause to be kept a time and wages record or records showing the name of each worker, the hours worked each day, the wages and overtime paid each week and the age of each junior worker.

Any system of automatic recording shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded. The Time and Wages book shall be open for inspection by a duly authorised representative of the Union during the ordinary working hours.

12.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no Agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

13.—Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purpose of the Award a Board of Reference.

The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

There are assigned to the Board in the event of no Agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the function of:—

(i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;

(ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of the Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for the purpose are embodied in this Award.

14.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it or by any other association or Union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

15.—Junior Workers Certificate.

Junior workers upon being engaged shall, if practicable, furnish the employer with a certificate containing the following particulars:—

(i) Name in full.

(ii) Age and date of birth.

No worker shall have any claim upon an employer for additional pay in the event of the age of the worker being wrongly stated either on the certificate or, if no such certificate is furnished, verbally to the employer. If any junior worker shall wilfully mis-state his age either verbally to the employer or in the certificate, he alone shall be guilty of a breach of this Award, and in the event of a worker having received a higher rate than that to which he was entitled he shall make restitution to the employer.

16.—Wages.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by this Award shall be as follows:—

(c) Casual hands, namely workers engaged for less than a week, shall be paid at the rate of 10% in addition to the rates prescribed herein.

(f) Leading hands, appointed as such by the employer, shall be paid 1s. 6d. per day in addition to the rates prescribed herein.

(g) It is hereby expressly agreed and declared that the rates prescribed herein have been arrived at without regard for the skill involved or the nature of the work performed and cannot be compared as between themselves or with the rates of pay in any other industry.

17.—Part Time Workers.

Part-time workers may be regularly employed for a lesser period than forty (40) hours per week and shall receive payments for wages, annual leave, holidays and sick leave on a pro-rata basis in the same proportion as the number of hours regularly worked each week bears to forty (40) hours.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 11 of 1956.

Registered 1st August, 1956.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 26th day of July, 1956, between the Swan Brewery Company Limited, the Emu Brewery Limited, and the West Australian Glass Manufacturers Limited, and Union Maltings Proprietary Limited, all of Perth and Fremantle (hereinafter in these presents called "the Employers") of the one part, and the Breweries and Bottle Yards Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, of Western Australia, of Perth being an industrial union of workers registered under the provisions of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952 (hereinafter in these presents called "the Union"), of the other part; whereby it is

mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that the several stipulations, conditions, and provisions set out herein shall, in all cases, be binding upon and shall be faithfully and promptly carried out, observed, performed and complied with according to the true intent and meaning thereof by the parties hereto and it is also hereby mutually agreed by and between the parties hereto that this Agreement shall apply to the whole of the employees embraced in the Schedule herein contained.

1.—Interpretation.

For the purpose of this Agreement—

(a) "Casual hand" shall mean any person who is not employed continually for more than forty ordinary working hours 7.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.

(b) "Cylinder man" whenever used in this Agreement shall mean a worker who is generally employed at a majority of the undermentioned occupations, namely, filling, preparing, carbonating and racking beer from a chilling cylinder, but shall not mean any employee who is casually employed in any one of the last-mentioned processes.

(c) "Bottle-washer" shall mean any person employed washing bottles by hand or machinery.

(d) "Fireman" shall mean a person employed in a stokehold attending a steam boiler or gas-producing plant.

(e) "Nightcellarman and nightmaltsters" shall apply only to cellarman and maltsters who are employed on night duties.

(f) "Leading hands" are employees who are in charge of and responsible for the work of others.

2.—Wages Schedule.

The parties to this Agreement mutually agree that the minimum rate of wages that shall be paid by the employers respectively to the persons employed by such employers in the capacities undermentioned is as follows:—

(a) Basic Wage—within a radius of 15 miles from the G.P.O., Perth—

Workers in cold rooms or cellars with a temperature of less than 45 deg. Fah. shall be paid 5s. per week in addition to the minimum rate.

Maltsters working on permanent night duties at the Swan Malt House shall be paid an allowance of sixteen shillings (16s.) per week in addition to the ordinary rate of pay.

Boiler cleaning which shall include scraping, cleaning and painting cylinders. For all time which they may be employed at this class of work, workers shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per hour in addition to the rates prescribed herein for their ordinary classification.

Ammonia Coils.—For all time which they may be employed chipping, cleaning, scraping, or painting ammonia coils workers shall be entitled to be paid at the rate of one shilling (1s.) per hour in addition to the rates prescribed herein for their ordinary classification, and whilst so engaged shall be supplied free with goggles, pullovers and respirators and allowed reasonable time before the end of each shift to cleanse themselves.

Coal Handling.—Workers employed on breaking, crushing, and handling coal in bunkers or bins shall, for all time whilst so engaged be entitled to be paid at the rate of 6d. per hour in addition to the rates prescribed herein for their ordinary classifications. Boots: The employers agree to supply boots to those workers employed at bottle washing on the tanks, at the tubs, at the filters, at the cask-washing shed, and at the bottlers, to be worn during working hours, same to be supplied free of cost by the employers. Oilers and aprons: The employers agree to provide oilskin coats and leather aprons for carters, to be used whilst the employer's work is being done only. In the case of the employers the Swan Brewery Company Limited, the Emu Brewery Limited and West Australian Glass Manufacturers Limited the above-mentioned minimum rate of wages shall be deemed to have been payable by such employers in respect of all time worked on and after the fourteenth day of December one thousand nine hundred and fifty five and in the case of the employer Union Maltsters Proprietary Limited such minimum rate of wages shall be deemed to have been payable by it in respect of all time worked on and after the twelfth day of December, one thousand nine hundred and fifty five.

3.—Hours.

Forty hours shall constitute an ordinary week's work for all workers. Such hours shall (except as to shift workers) be worked on the following basis:—

(a) All workers other than those mentioned in sub-clauses (b) and (c) hereunder: Five-day week, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, 8 hours per day, to be worked within a spread of hours of 7.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m. with one hour for lunch.

(b) Firemen.—Five-day week, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, 8 hours per day, starting time not before 5 a.m. on any day. The employer may require any fireman to start work at any time after 5 a.m.

(c) Night cellarmen and night maltsters.—Five-day week, Mondays to Fridays inclusive, 8 hours per day, starting time not before 4.30 p.m. nor after 2 a.m. on any ordinary working day.

4.—Shift Work.

(a) Workers may be employed:

(i) On "regular shift work" that is in regular rotation from week to week on two or three shifts spread over 16 or 24 hours respectively, day shift to be worked from 7.30 a.m. to not later than 3.30 p.m., afternoon shift from 3.30 p.m. to not later than 11.30 p.m. and night shift from 11.30 p.m. to not later than 7.30 a.m.

(ii) On "casual shift work" that is on one weekly shift only worked in any department, casual, day, afternoon, and night shifts to start and finish at the times respectively referred to in the preceding paragraph.

(b) In the case of both regular and casual shift work the first shift of the week will begin on Sunday at 11.30 p.m. and the last shift of the week shall finish at 11.30 p.m. on Friday. Duty rosters shall be posted on Friday in each week and shall show the starting and finishing times of each worker during each week. Particulars relating to starting and finishing times shall be rigidly adhered to.

(c) The provisions contained in the previous sub-clauses of this clause may be varied by mutual agreement between any employer and the Union.

(d) All workers employed on regular afternoon and night shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to 10 per cent. of their ordinary weekly rate of pay.

(e) All workers employed on casual night shift work shall be paid an allowance equal to 12½ per cent. of their ordinary weekly rate of pay.

(f) A crib time of 30 minutes shall be allowed to the permanent night maltsters employed at the Swan Malt House and to all workers whether on regular or casual shift. Crib time shall be included in the working time.

(g) The additional allowances mentioned in sub-clauses (d) and (e) hereof shall be taken into consideration in calculating overtime rate for any overtime for work done beyond 8 hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive. Except as aforesaid the above allowances shall not be included for purpose of calculating any other penalty rates under this Agreement.

5.—Overtime.

(a) The following overtime shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half:—All time up to four hours worked:—

(i) Over 8 hours per day on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

(ii) Outside the starting and finishing times mentioned in clause 3 (a) and before the starting time of 5 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. mentioned in clauses 3 (b) and (c) respectively.

(iii) In the case of shift workers outside rostered starting and finishing times.

(iv) On Saturday.

(b) All overtime in excess of four hours worked during the periods referred to in subclause (a) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(c) Subject to any alteration by mutual arrangement all workers on day work engaged in or about a brewery or bottling works shall if required to work more than one hour's overtime after the usual finishing time, be entitled to knock off for one hour after the usual finishing time for refreshments in which event and if notice of overtime has not been given at least twenty-four hours previously tea money shall be paid at the rate of four shillings (4s.) provided that where food is provided by the employer tea money shall be reduced to the rate of three shillings (3s.).

6.—Lunch Intervals.

The lunch intervals of 60 minutes shall be taken between 12 o'clock noon and 1.0 p.m. or between 1.0 p.m. and 2.0 p.m.

7.—Smoke-o.

Ten minutes shall be allowed at 10 o'clock a.m. and again at 3 o'clock p.m. This concession however, does not apply to men working on shifts.

8.—Casual Hands.

Casual hands shall be paid by the hour at the rate of ordinary pay plus two shillings (2s.) per day.

9.—Record.

Each employer shall keep a record of the name of each worker except stablemen, the time he starts and finishes each day, total number of hours worked, overtime worked, and wages paid to each worker, and such record shall be open to the inspection of the secretary of or any other person appointed by the Union during working hours. Each worker shall sign the record kept for all moneys received by him.

10.—Sundays.

All work performed by workers in any department on Sunday and Easter Saturday shall be paid for at the rate of double time. All workers required to work on Sundays shall be allowed one Sunday off per fortnight: Provided that the employer may, in an emergency, require such workers to work on consecutive Sundays.

11.—Holidays.

All work performed by workers in any department on the undermentioned holidays shall be paid for on an hourly basis at a rate equal to one and one half (1½) times the ordinary rate of pay per hour with a minimum of four (4) hours' pay and in addition such workers shall be paid one (1) day's pay for the holiday. All holiday shifts shall rotate. One ordinary day's pay shall be paid for the undermentioned holidays to workers who do not work that day.

The days to be observed as holidays according to the provisions of this Agreement are Christmas Day, Boxing Day, New Year's Day, Anniversary Day (in January), Annual Picnic Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day (in June), Show Day and Sovereign's Birthday. In case any of the above holidays fall on a Saturday or a Sunday the following Monday shall be observed in lieu thereof.

12.—Annual Leave.

Each employee on completion of 12 months' service shall be granted three (3) weeks annual leave, two (2) weeks on double pay and one (1) week on single pay, such leave to be taken at times to be mutually agreed upon between the workers and the employers. The annual leave shall be in addition to the holidays mentioned in clause 11 hereof.

On termination of service of a worker who has been continuously employed for more than three months, he shall receive a pro rata payment in lieu of leave on the basis of two and one-twelfth (2-1/12th) days' pay for each completed month of service. On termination of service of a worker who has been continuously employed for more than one month, but less than three months, he shall receive a pro rata payment in lieu of leave on the basis of one and one quarter (1 1/4) days' pay for each completed month of service.

13.—Annual Bonus.

The employer shall pay such employee receiving wages under this Award, a week's pay by way of bonus in the last week in December in each year. Any employee leaving the employer's service for reasons other than misconduct, dishonesty, or neglect of duty before the payment of such bonus in any year shall, when leaving be paid a pro rata payment in lieu thereof; any employee who shall not have been in the employ of the employer for a year in the first week in December shall receive a part of his week's pay bearing the same proportion to a week's pay as the period of his service bears to a year.

14.—Long Service Leave.

(a) All workers who from time to time shall complete 25 years of continuous service with an employer shall be given long service leave. Such long service leave shall be taken at the conclusion of 25 years of continuous service and shall comprise 13 weeks' leave of absence for recreational purposes.

(b) Should a worker who has completed fifteen years of continuous service be retired compulsorily on medical grounds on the advice of a Medical Officer appointed by the employer or by reason of being over the employer's retiring age or die before completing 25 years' continuous service, there shall be paid by the employer to such worker or to his dependents as the case may require a sum of money bearing the same relation to 13 weeks' pay at his rate as his service with the employer bears to 25 years. "Dependant" shall mean the widow and/or children under the age of 16 years, or any child in fact dependent on any worker and, in the case of a single worker, shall mean such dependant (if any) as such single worker may in writing notify to the employer during his lifetime, accompanied by proper proof of actual dependency.

(c) Continuous service shall include any interval spent on service with Her Majesty's Armed Forces during the duration of any war on which Her Majesty may be engaged, and shall also include any interval spent during the duration of any war on which Her Majesty may be engaged with any National Service into which a worker is compulsorily drafted for defence purposes.

(d) Unless otherwise agreed in individual cases, long service leave shall be taken at such period as shall be mutually agreed upon within two years of it becoming due. In default of agreement it shall be taken at such time within such period of two years as the employer shall determine.

(e) Except in the cases of a worker who, at the time he becomes eligible for long service leave, is of an age exceeding sixty, all long service leave shall be taken by way of actual holiday and not by way of payment in lieu thereof on retirement. A worker who at the time he becomes eligible for long service leave is beyond sixty years of age shall have the option of taking actual holiday under this scheme or of receiving payment in lieu thereof on retirement. Such option shall be exercised by a notice in writing addressed to the employer at the time of becoming eligible for long service leave.

(f) Workers on long service leave shall, while on such leave, continue to be paid at the actual rate (exclusive of overtime or other allowance) enjoyed by them at the commencement of such leave. Except in special circumstances payment shall be at the same times as during normal employment but may be made by cheque by mutual arrangement.

(g) It shall be a condition of every worker's taking long service leave that he (or she):—

- (i) Shall not under any circumstances be engaged in any gainful employment while on such leave.
- (ii) Shall return to the active service of the employer forthwith at the expiration of the leave: and
- (iii) Shall not draw any sick or accident pay simultaneously with long service leave pay.

A breach of condition (i) above will result in immediate discharge from the employer's service accompanied by forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance, or other similar payments or benefits. A breach of condition (ii) above (except as on the grounds of illness necessitating retirement or additional leave on the advice of a Medical Officer appointed by the employer) will result in forfeiture of all rights (if any) to retiring allowance or other similar benefits or payments.

(h) The employer shall have the right in cases of emergency to recall any worker from long service leave, in which case the unexpired leave shall be made up on some mutually convenient date.

(i) In order to avoid confusion and embarrassment workers whilst on long service leave shall not, without the prior permission of the Officer in charge of the particular establishment, visit any of the premises of the employer except for the purpose of collecting pay or transacting genuine business with the employer's officers. Social visits shall not be indulged in. "Establishment" means any brewery, coo-perage or workshop, but does not include hotels or annual picnics or sport or usual weekly competitive sporting activities.

(j) The benefits of long service leave shall be in addition to all benefits at present or hereafter to be enjoyed by workers.

(k) In the event of any governmental or similar long service leave scheme being introduced for industry as a whole, the parties concerned shall meet to consider alterations necessary in order to adjust the scheme to such new conditions.

(l) Notwithstanding anything in this clause contained no worker nor his legal personal representative shall be entitled to any of the benefits by this clause conferred in any of the following circumstances:—

- (i) When, in the opinion of the Directors of an employer a worker has committed fraud upon the employer or any defalcation in relation to the employer or breach of trust or similar act prejudicially affecting or likely to so affect business or interests of the employer and is dismissed.
- (ii) If the worker shall become a bankrupt or insolvent debtor within the meaning of any Act of the Parliament of the Commonwealth of Australia or of the State of Western Australia or shall assign alienate or charge his benefits hereunder or any part thereof or attempt to do so or if through his own act or default or by operation or process of law the same shall become vested in or payable to some other person, firm or company.

15.—Under-Rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at the matter may be referred to the board of reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the board, and pending the board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for or be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

(d) The provisions of regulation 92 of the regulations made under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950 shall be deemed to apply to any board of reference appointed hereunder.

16.—Engagement.

The engagement between employer and worker, except casual hands, shall be weekly, and may be terminated by a week's notice from either party, except in the case of the worker absenting himself without leave, not obeying lawful commands, or being guilty of other misconduct, or of the works of the employer being stopped, through fire or tempest, when such engagement may be terminated immediately.

17.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker who is unable through sickness or accident to attend his duties, shall notify the employer not later than 10 a.m. on the day he first absents himself from duty.

(b) A worker shall be entitled to sick pay in respect of any period of absence on account of sickness after the 1st day of January, 1948 on the basis of one half day's pay for each completed month served with the employer between the said 1st day of January, 1948 and the date of the commencement of such absence provided that in calculating the amount due to a worker in respect of any particular period of absence through sickness there shall be deducted therefrom any sum or sums previously paid to him hereunder.

(c) The term "sickness" shall not include any case where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof of his sickness satisfactory to the employer. This proof shall be in the form of a medical certificate if the absence is for three days or more. The employer shall have the right at any time to have the worker examined by a doctor on behalf of the employer.

(e) Except as aforesaid, a worker shall not be entitled to payment for time lost through sickness or accident.

18.—Contractors.

All work of any employee in the capacity as mentioned in this Agreement in or about a brewery or bottling works or in connection with the business of brewing or bottling beer shall be carried out departmentally by bona fide brewery employees engaged and paid direct by the brewery proprietors and not by agents or contractors. This clause shall not apply to contractors erecting, repairing or making alterations to buildings or machinery or to carriers being engaged for the delivery of goods other than beer as has been the practice or custom prior to this date. But when contractors are employed delivering beer the brewery company shall undertake to see that whilst employed on such work the contractors pay to both the drivers and offsideers the same wages and work under the same conditions as is provided in this Agreement.

19.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply to the area comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

20.—Term.

This Agreement shall be for a term of twelve (12) months from the 12th day of December, 1955.
