WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Muni-cipal Corporations Act, 1906-1954 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thence-forth from the date of such Proclamation, become forth, from the date of such Proclamation, become forth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the City of Perth Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which have been reserved for streets or ways within the City of Perth, be declared public highways: Now, therefore I, the said Lieutenant-Governor and Ad-ministrator, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclama-tion. declare the said lands to be public highways. tion, declare the said lands to be public highways, and such lands shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be absolutely dedicated to the public as highways within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.
