BUSH FIRES ACT, 1954.

Suspension of Prohibited Burning Times.

Bush Fires Board,
Perth, 17th December, 1956.

IT is hereby notified for general information, that the Hon. Minister for Lands, acting under the powers conferred by section 17, subsection (3) of the Bush Fires Act, 1954, has approved of the suspension of all declarations of prohibited burning times made under section 17, subsection (1) of the said Act so far as such declarations extend

to any land used for railway purposes in the road districts and municipalities mentioned and for the periods stated in the Schedule hereunder. Any burning undertaken on railway land under the provisions of this suspension shall be subject to the following conditions:—

No burning shall be undertaken on days when the fire hazard forecast issued by the Perth Weather Bureau is "high," "severe" or "dangerous." At least three men shall be constantly in attendance at every fire and until it has been completely extinguished including all smouldering logs, timber, disused sleepers and other inflammable material. Each man shall be provided with a heavy fire rake and each three men with at least one knapsack spray with sufficient water for its operation. Any burning carried out under the provisions of this suspension shall comply with section 18 and all other relevant provisions of the Bush Fires Act, 1954.
