To Leslie Arthur Logan, George Edward Jeffery and Francis Drake Willmott, members of the Legislative Council:

I, THE said Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint you, Leslie Arthur Logan, George Edward Jeffery and Francis Drake Willmott, members of the Legislative Council, to be an honorary Royal Commission without payment of remuneration to do the following things, namely:—

- (a) to continue and complete the inquiries commenced by you as a Select Committee of the Legislative Council, into the War Service Land Settlement Scheme in Western Australia;
- (b) having completed those inquiries, to make your report to me in writing upon that scheme, and to recommend such changes in procedure and methods as to you may seem desirable to ensure the early success of that Scheme.

And I hereby appoint you the said Leslie Arthur Logan to be Chairman of the said Royal Commission.

And I hereby declare that by virtue of this Commission you may, in the execution of this Commission, do all such acts, matters and things and exercise all such powers as a Royal Commission or members of a Royal Commission may lawfully do and exercise whether under or pursuant to the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902 (as amended) or otherwise.

At a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chambers at Perth this 5th day of December, 1956, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Land Drainage Act, 1925-1954.

Amendment to Wilson-Torbay Drainage District.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 12 of the Land Drainage Act, 1925-1954, it is provided that the Governor may at any time by Order in Council extend any district by the addition thereto of any land that has not theretofore formed part of a district, and may vary or amend any of the provisions of any previous order relating to the said district: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby vary and amend the boundaries of the Wilson-Torbay Drainage District, so as to include the whole of the land described in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

Wilson-Torbay Drainage District.

All that portion of land bounded by lines starting at the Northernmost corner of Plantagenet Location 2880 and extending generally South-Easterly along the North-Eastern boundaries of locations 2880, 4944 (reserve 22822) and 3475 to a point situate in prolongation Westerly of the Southern boundary of location 6017; thence generally Easterly to and along that boundary and onwards to and along that of location 3801 and again onwards to the Western boundary of location 3094; thence Southerly along that boundary; thence generally East-North-Easterly along the Southern boundaries of locations 3094, 3224, 2696, 479 and 790; thence Northerly, Easterly, again Northerly and again Easterly along the Western and Northern boundaries of locations 1424 and 3241; thence East-South-Easterly to the North-Western corner of location 2827; thence Easterly, Southerly and again Easterly along boundaries of location 2827 and reserve 1998 to the latter's North-Eastern corner; thence Northerly, Easterly and Southerly along boundaries of location 2446 to the North-Western corner of location 2447; thence Easterly and Southerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the Southern side of a one chain road passing along the Southern boundaries of that

location; thence generally Easterly along that side and that of road No. 8560 to the Northern boundary of reserve 801; thence Easterly along that boundary to the North-Western side of the Great Southern Railway Reserve; thence South-Westerly along that side to the Southern side of road No. 8560 aforesaid; thence generally East-South-Easterly along that side and that of Marbellup Road to the North-Eastern corner of location 226; thence Southerly along the Easternmost boundary of that location and onwards along the Eastern boundary of location 122 to a point situate in prolongation Westerly of the Northern boundary of location 167; thence Easterly, South-Easterly and Southerly to and along boundaries of that location and onwards along the Western side of McKeown Road to the Northern side of Ince Street; thence Westerly along that side and onwards to the Eastern boundary of location 2; thence Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of that location to the Easternmost North-Eastern corner of location 33; thence Southerly along the Easternmost boundary of that location to the shore of Princess Royal Harbour; thence generally South-Westerly along that shore to a point situate in prolongation South-Easterly of a line parallel to and two chains South-Westerly from a North-Eastern boundary of lot 83 of location 33 (L.T.O. Plan 3570); thence generally North-Westerly to and along the line parallel to and two chains South-Westerly from the North-Eastern boundaries of lots 83 and 98 to the North-Western boundary of the latter lot; thence North-Easterly along that boundary; thence generally North-Westerly and generally North-Easterly along boundaries of lots 101 and lot (L.T.O. Plan 3571) to a point situate in prolongation South-Easterly of the North-Eastern boundary of lot 62 (L.T.O. Plan 3570 aforesaid); thence North-Westerly and South-Westerly to and along boundaries of that lot; thence North-Westerly and generally South-Westerly along boundaries of lot 34; thence North-Westerly, Westerly and Northerly along boundaries of location 33 aforesaid to the South-Eastern corner of location 5350; thence Westerly along the Southern boundaries of location 5350, 5351, 5352 3131, 2419, 525 and 508; thence Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of location 478 and onwards to the Eastern boundary of location 3103; thence Southerly, Westerly, again Southerly and again Westerly along boundaries of locations 3103, 536 and 2736 to the North-Eastern corner of location 506; thence Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of locations 506, 487, 843, 472 and 1148 (reserve 20367) and onwards to the Eastern shore of Torbay Inlet; thence generally South-Westerly along that shore and the Western shores of Torbay to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of Torbay Agricultural Area lot 46 (A class reserve 24547); thence Westerly, Southerly, again Westerly and North-Westerly to and along boundaries of lots 46, 45 and 44 (A class reserve 7557) to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of lot 40; thence Westerly to and along that boundary and that of lot 47 to the Easternmost North-Eastern corner of Plantagenet Location 1794; thence Southerly, Westerly, again Southerly, generally South-Westerly and again Westerly along boundaries of locations 1794 and 3988 to the North-Eastern corner of location 3599; thence Southerly along the Eastern boundary of that location and onwards to the low water mark of the Southern Ocean; thence generally North-Westerly along that low water mark to a point situate in prolongation Southerly of the Eastern boundary of location 3422 (reserve 17464); thence Northerly and Westerly to and along boundaries of that location; thence Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of location 4530; thence Southerly and Westerly along boundaries of locations 2969 and 2968 and onwards to the North-Eastern corner of location 2965; thence Southerly, generally South-Westerly, Westerly and Northerly along boundaries of that location to the South-Eastern corner of location 2964; thence Westerly and Northerly along boundaries of locations 2964 to 2960 inclusive and onwards to the South-Eastern boundary of location 2955; thence South-Westerly, North-Westerly and generally North-Easterly along boundaries of lo-

cations 2955 and 2956 to a point situate in prolongation Southerly of the Western boundary of location 2954; thence Northerly to and along that boundary; thence Westerly and Northerly along boundaries of location 2952 and onwards to a South-Eastern boundary of location 3725; thence generally South-Westerly and generally North-Westerly along the Southern and Western boundaries of locations 3725, 2842, 3724, 3723, 3720, 3721, 3722 and 3712 to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of location 4824; thence Westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the Easternmost boundary of location 3180 (reserve 16769); thence Northerly, Westerly, again Northerly, again Westerly, again Northerly, Easterly, again Northerly, again Westerly and Southerly along boundaries of that location to the Southernmost corner of location 3102; thence generally North-Westerly along the Southern boundaries of locations 3102, 1990, 1991, 1992 and 1828 to the Eastern boundary of Nullaki Point Townsite; thence Southerly, generally South-Westerly, generally North-Westerly, generally North-Easterly and generally South-Easterly along boundaries of that townsite and the Southern shores of Wilson Inlet to the entrance of Nenamup Inlet; thence generally Northerly, generally Southerly, generally Easterly, again generally Northerly and generally Westerly along the shores of that inlet to a point situate South of the Southernmost South-Western corner of location 1088; thence North to that corner; thence generally Northerly along the Western boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation Easterly of the Southern boundary of location 37; thence Westerly, Northerly and again Westerly to and along boundaries of locations 37 and 145 to the Easternmost corner of location 1775; thence South-Westerly, Westerly, North-Westerly, and generally North-Easterly along boundaries of that location; thence Westerly along the Southern boundary of location 39; thence generally North-Easterly along the South-Eastern shores of Wilson Inlet aforesaid to a point situate in prolongation Westerly of the Southern boundary of location 3766; thence Easterly, Northerly and Westerly to and along boundaries of that location to the South-Western corner of location 775; and thence Northerly, Easterly and again Northerly along boundaries of locations 775 and 2880 aforesaid to the starting point; as shown bordered red on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 35285.

Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954.

Construction of Cunderdin to Minnivale Section of the Cunderdin-Minnivale-Kokardine Pipe Line.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 185/56.

WHEREAS by the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-54, it is provided that before undertaking the construction of water works, the Minister shall submit plans, descriptions, books of reference and estimates of the proposed works to the Governor for approval, and that if they are approved, the Governor may forthwith by Order in Council, empower the Minister to undertake the construction of the proposed works: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice of the Executive Council hereby approves of the plans, descriptions, books of reference and estimates marked on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 35041, for the construction of the Cunderdin to Minnivale Section of the Cunderdin-Minnivale-Kokardine Pipe Line which was duly submitted for approval, and hereby empowers the Minister to undertake the construction of the said works.

Mount Magnet Town Water Supply.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 40 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, it is enacted that subject to the provisions of the said Act a Water Board shall have power to construct water works for the purposes of the said Act; and whereas it is provided by section 41 of the said Act that the Governor may exempt reticulation works from the operation of certain sections of the said Act; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the works referred to in the following Schedule shall be exempt from the operations of the said sections of the said Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act and of all other powers in this behalf enabling him doth hereby exempt from the operations of section 41, 42, 43, 44 and 45 of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, the reticulation works included in the following Schedule:—

Laying of a 3in. water supply pipe line together with all necessary valves and fittings and pumping equipment from the Hesperus Dawn well on reserve 22960 to the Golden Stream shaft, as shown on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 35441.

Water Boards Act, 1904-1954.

Mount Magnet Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, to alter or extend the boundaries of a Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the boundaries of the Mount Magnet Water Area by adding thereto the area described in the Schedule hereto.

Traffic Act, 1919-1954.

Merredin Road Board.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 3266/52.

HIS Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order under section 49

of the Traffic Act, 1919-1955, namely, that the Merredin Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:—

(1) Clause (a) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads, and the use of footpaths.

(2) Clause (y) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, providing for the placing, erection or installation on roads, or footpaths of traffic signs, lights and directions for the control and direction of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian, and including the driving of animals, for the marking on roads or footpaths of signs for the control and direction of the traffic and for the regulation and prohibition of the traffic in relation to the signs, lights and directions.

(3) Clause (zd) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, appointing stands and parking places for different classes of vehicles and regulate the use thereof.

(4) Clause (zl) and (zm) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles or vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads, or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times, and prescribing a penalty for any breach thereof.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has prior to notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.
