IN pursuance of the provisions of section 9 of the Fisheries Act, 1905-1951, I, the Governor of the State of Western Australia, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby prohibit the taking of the fish known as or called "crayfish" by means of craypots, cribs, traps or any fixed engine in all that portion of Western Australian waters specified in the Schedule hereto from January 15, 1957, to November 15, 1957.

All that portion of the Indian Ocean being a strip of its waters 80 chains wide from its high water mark starting from an East-West line situate five miles North of Green Head and extending generally South-South-Easterly and Southerly to an East-West line situate 22 miles South of Cape Bouvard.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1140/50.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposals dated the 23rd day of November, 1950, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown Lands as State Forest; And whereas after such proposals had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposals should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor with the advice and consent of the Executive Council doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown Lands as State Forest No. 51 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the Schedule hereto.

Brunswick Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, the Governor is empowered, by Order in Council, to alter or extend the boundaries of a Water Area: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby alter the boundaries of the Brunswick Water Area so as to include the whole of the lands as described in the Schedules hereto.

Plan 3020); thence Southerly to and along that boundary and onwards to and along the Western-most boundary of lot 172; thence Easterly, South-South-Westerly and Westerly along boundaries of lot 162 and onwards to and along the Southern side of Reading Street and again onwards for a distance of 4 chains 35 links; and thence West-North-Westerly to the starting point, as shown bordered red on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 35392, Sheet No. 3.

TOWN PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT ACT,
1928-1955.

Bayswater Road Board Town Planning Scheme.

1. The Bayswater Town Planning Scheme published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th day of April, 1935, including all amendments to that Scheme gazetted since that date is hereby revoked.

Part 1—General.

2. In this Scheme:—

"Board" means the Bayswater Road Board.

"Commercial Buildings" means offices, premises in which business or professional services are rendered, banks, clubs, hotels, fire stations, police stations, departmental stores, shops used for sale at retail of food, dry goods and other articles of general merchandise, workrooms attached to departmental stores and shops in which not more than 50 per cent. of the total floor area of the building is devoted to such work rooms, but not buildings used for the supply of motor engine fuel or the servicing repair or wrecking of vehicles.

"Flats" means residential buildings comprising two or more separate tenements.

"Public Buildings" means places of public worship, public halls, libraries, museums, concert rooms and other halls used for exhibition or instruction, theatres, hospitals, charitable institutions and schools other than riding schools.

"Residences" means residential buildings comprising one tenement.

"Road District" means the Bayswater Road District.

"Service Station" means a motor engine retail fuel supply station and premises used for the servicing of vehicles, but not buildings used for the wrecking and/or repairing of vehicles.

3. This Scheme shall apply throughout the Road District and the Board is the responsible authority for enforcing the observance of this Scheme.

4. The time limited for the making of claims in respect of injurious affection of land or property by reason of the operation of this scheme is six months from the date when notice of the approval of the scheme is published in the prescribed manner.

Part 2.—Zoning.

For the purpose of this scheme the Road District is divided into districts of the following classifications:—

- (a) Residential.
- (b) Flats.
- (c) Business.
- (d) Service Stations.
- (e) Rural.
- (f) Offensive Trades.
- (g) Industrial.

5. (1) The limits and descriptions of the residential districts are as set out in Schedule A hereto and uncoloured on the Scheme Map.

(2) The limits and descriptions of the flats district are as set out in Schedule B hereto and coloured dark brown on the Scheme Map.

(3) The limits and descriptions of the business district are as set out in Schedule C hereto and coloured blue on the Scheme Map.

(4) The limits and descriptions of the Service Stations district are as set out in Schedule D hereto and coloured red on the Scheme Map.

(5) The limits and descriptions of the rural district are as set out in Schedule E hereto and edged yellow on the Scheme Map.

(6) The limits and descriptions of the offensive trades district are as set out in Schedule F hereto and edged purple hatched black on the Scheme Map.

(7) The limits and descriptions of the industrial district are as set out in Schedule G hereto and edged purple on the Scheme Map.

6. Except as provided in clause 7 hereof no building shall hereafter be erected or altered and no building or land shall be used or adapted to be used for any purpose other than a use permitted in the district in which the building or land is located.

7. (1) If at the time when this Scheme comes into operation any building or land is being lawfully used for purposes other than those permitted by this Scheme (hereinafter called a "non-conforming use") such building or land may continue to be used for such non-conforming use and subject to any Act or to any other scheme or by-law limiting such extension it may be extended so as to cover the whole of the subdivisional lot on which it stands at the aforesaid date.

(2) When a non-conforming use has been discontinued it shall not thereafter be recommenced.

(3) No building which is damaged by fire or other casualty to the extent of more than 75 per cent. of its value shall be repaired or rebuilt or thereafter used except in conformity with this Scheme unless the express permission of the Board is first obtained.

8. No land in a residential district shall be used for any purpose other than the following:—

- (a) Residences.
- (b) Public Buildings with the exception of motion picture theatres and gardens.
- (c) Parks, recreation grounds and recreational club buildings.
- (d) Private gardens.
- (e) Electric sub-stations and other public utility building to which no storeyard or depot is attached other than such as is required by the nature of such public utility.
- (f) Private garages and outbuildings reasonably necessary to buildings permitted in the district and on the same subdivisional lot and in which no business or industry is carried on or commercial or industrial machinery installed.

9. No land in a flats district shall be used for any purpose other than the following:—

- (a) Any purpose permitted in a residential district.
- (b) Flats.

10. No land in a business district shall be used for any purpose other than the following:—

- (a) Commercial buildings.
- (b) Residences provided that such buildings are attached to and constructed at the same time as a commercial building.
- (c) Public buildings.
- (d) Private garages and outbuildings reasonably necessary to buildings permitted in the district and on the same subdivisional lot.

11. No land in the service stations district shall be used for any purpose other than service stations.

12. No land in a rural district shall be used for any purposes other than the following:—

- (a) Any purpose permitted in a residential district.
- (b) Agricultural and rural purposes.

13. No land in an offensive trades district shall be used for any purpose other than the following:—

- (a) Residences where in the opinion of the Board such buildings are essential for the proper supervision and conduct of an offensive trade.
- (b) Offensive trades (within the meaning of the Health Act, 1911, and its amendments) subject to the approval and requirements of the Board.

14. No land in an industrial district shall be used for any of the following purposes:—

- (a) Residences except where in the opinion of the Board such buildings are essential for the proper supervision or conduct of any industry.
- (b) Flats.
- (c) Public buildings.
- (d) Commercial buildings.
- (e) Any purpose which in the opinion of the Board causes or is likely to cause a nuisance to adjoining occupiers by reason of smoke, fumes, smell, noise or vibration.

15. No offensive trade (within the meaning of the Health Act, 1911, and its amendments) shall hereafter be established within the Road District except as hereinbefore provided and also with the exception of fish shops, laundries, cleaning establishments and dyeworks and then only subject to the provisions of the Health Act and within the business district.

21. Where the road or street alignment is curved, irregular or not at right angles to the side boundaries of the land a building may be erected in front of the building line provided that the mean of the greatest and least distance of the building from the road or street is not less than the distance fixed for the appropriate building line.

22. Where a subdivisional lot has a frontage to more than one road or street, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a) In a residential district and in a flats district a building (other than flats) may be erected nearer to one only of the roads or streets than the building line, but not nearer than ten (10) feet to that road or street.
- (b) No flats shall be erected unless the building is not nearer than twenty (20) feet from one road or street and not nearer than ten (10) feet from the other road or street.
- (c) In a business district a building may be erected nearer to the less important of the two roads or streets than the building line, but not nearer than eight (8) feet three (3) inches to such road or street.

23. If in the case of any subdivisional lot buildings have been erected on the lots adjoining on both sides and one or both of these buildings is in front of the building line, the Board may permit a building to be erected on that subdivisional lot in front of the building line, but not nearer to the road or street than the foremost of the two buildings, but in any case not nearer to the road or street than eight (8) feet three (3) inches.

24. Any service station erected hereafter on a subdivisional lot which adjoins land within the residential district shall be located at a distance of ten feet from such of the rear and/or side boundaries of the lot on which it is to be erected which abut on to such residential lot.

25. No fence shall hereafter be erected on any land which abuts on to any intersection or junction of roads unless provision be made—

- (a) in the case of a right angle corner for the cut off at the corner of such land formed by the boundary roads to be of a minimum of 30 links, or 50 links radius tangential; or
- (b) in any other case that the boundary resultant from truncation be not less than 42.4 links or that resulting from a 50 links radius tangential.

Part V.—Subdivision.

26. Every plan of new subdivision or re-subdivision of land comprised in the rural district and in the offensive trades district shall provide a minimum area of 4½ acres for each subdivisional lot.
