To the Honourable Sir John Patrick Dwyer, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Chief Justice and Lieutenant-Governor of Western Australia:

WHEREAS by clause 14 of the Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom constituting the office of Governor of the State of Western Australia and its Dependencies, bearing date the 29th October, 1900, it is provided that in the event of the Governor having occasion to be temporarily absent from the seat of Government or from the State, he may in every such case, by an instrument under the Public Seal of the State, constitute and appoint the Lieutenant-Governor to be his Deputy during such absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute, for and on behalf of the Governor, during such absence but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor by such Letters Patent as shall in and by such instrument be specified; and whereas I, the said Governor, propose to absent myself temporarily from the State: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in me as aforesaid, do by this instrument under the Public Seal of the State constitute and appoint you the said Sir John Patrick Dwyer as from the date of my departure upon the said absence from the State and during such absence to be my Deputy, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute, for and on my behalf, as such Governor, all the powers and authorities vested in me by the said Letters Patent.

Forests Act, 1918-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

F.D. 1128/45.

WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that a dedication under the said Act of Crown Land as a State Forest may be revoked in whole or in part in the following manner:—

- (a) The Governor shall cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament a proposal for such revocation.
- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament, the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposals dated the 28th day of November, 1945, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown Lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposals had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposals should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown Lands as State Forest No. 30 by excising that portion of such State Forest as is described in the Schedule hereto.

State Forest No. 30—Portion of State Forest now included within the boundaries of Nelson Location 11981 and 11982, together with portion of road No. 4654 as deviated and extending along part of the North-Eastern boundary of Nelson Location 11982. (Plans 414C40, E4 and 439B/40, E1.)

- (b) After such proposal has been laid before Parliament the Governor, on a resolution being passed by both Houses that such proposal be carried out, shall, by Order in Council, revoke such dedication.

And whereas His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor and Administrator did cause to be laid on the Table of each House of Parliament his proposal dated the 1st day of November, 1956, for the revocation in part of the dedication of Crown Lands as State Forest; and whereas after such proposal had been laid before Parliament a resolution was passed by both Houses that such proposal should be carried out: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby revoke in part the dedication of Crown lands as State Forest Nos. 7 and 37 by excising those portions of such State Forest as are described in the Schedule hereto.

Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, and the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, it is provided, *inter alia*, that all water works, sewerage, drainage and irrigation works constructed by the Government and declared by the Governor to be subject to any of the Acts mentioned in the Schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, shall vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage on behalf of Her Majesty unless and until those works are vested in a board; and whereas by section 11 of the Public Works Act, 1902 (as amended), the Governor by Order in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th December, 1954, authorised the Minister for Works to undertake, construct or provide Tambellup Town Supply (Headworks) on land coloured green on Plan P.W.D. W.A. 34435; and whereas by Order in Council dated the 3rd November, 1954, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 12th November, 1954, the Tambellup Water Area was constituted and the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage was appointed to exercise all the functions of a Water Board in that area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers contained in section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, doth hereby declare the Tambellup Water Supply (Headworks) on the land coloured green on Plan P.W.D. W.A. 34435 to be subject to the Water Boards Act, 1904 (being an Act mentioned in the Schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912), and to vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage.

Town Planning Scheme.

This Town Planning Scheme is prepared by the Council of the City of Perth under the provisions of the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1956, and is known as the City of Perth Access Way (King and Murray Streets) Town Planning Scheme.

Part I.—Purposes.

1. The purpose of this Scheme is to provide ways of access for vehicles to the rear of premises on Perth Town Lots G14, G15, G16, G17, G18, G19 and G20 bounded by Murray, William, Hay and King Streets as shown on the Approved Plan, and to ensure the uninterrupted flow of traffic along such ways, including the acquisition of land and the execution of works for that purpose.

Part II.—Definitions.

2. In this Scheme, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Access way” means the series of lanes or ways shown on the Approved Plan and referred to in clause one of this Scheme.

“Act” means the Town Planning and Development Act, 1928-1956.

“Approved Plan” means the Approved Plan (Plan No. 3) prepared and approved for the purpose of this Scheme.

“Council” means the Council of the City of Perth.

“Ingress way” means that part of the access way on Perth Town Lot G16 shown hachured black on the Approved Plan and extending 244 links or thereabouts South from the Southern alignment of Murray Street.

“King Street egress way” means that part of the access way on Perth Town Lot G14 shown hachured red on the Approved Plan and extending 122 links or thereabouts East from the Eastern alignment of King Street.

“Murray Street egress way” means that part of the access way on Perth Town Lot G19 shown hachured green on the Approved Plan and extending 234 and 8-10ths links or thereabouts South from the Southern alignment of Murray Street.

“Town Clerk” means the Town Clerk of the City of Perth or any person acting as such town clerk for the time being.

Part III.—Buildings—Building-lines, etc.

3. (1) The owner for the time being of the building erected to the South of the access way on the land comprised in certificates of title volume 1136, folio 170, and volume 1178, folio 952, shall be entitled to build over the access way, and to maintain such building over the access way, to connect with the building erected to the North of the access way on the land comprised in certificate of title volume 509, folio 165.

Provided that—

- (a) the right hereby given shall subsist only so long as the two buildings so connected are in the same ownership;
- (b) no part of the building over the access way is within 15 feet of the road surface of the access way;
- (c) the width of the building over the access way does not exceed 25 feet measured along the access way;
- (d) the plans and specifications of the building over the access way comply with all relevant Acts, by-laws and regulations.

(2) The owner of the buildings thus connected shall be liable, and if there are more than one such owner they shall be jointly and severally liable, forthwith to remove at his or their own expense any structure built or maintained over the access way otherwise than as permitted by this clause.

4. (1) The owner for the time being of the building erected to the South of the access way on the land comprised in certificate of title volume 1049, folio 121, shall be entitled to build over the access way, and to maintain such building over the access way, to connect with the building erected to the North of the access way on the land comprised in certificate of title volume 1002, folio 643.

Provided that—

- (a) the right hereby given shall subsist only so long as the two buildings so connected are in the same ownership;
- (b) no part of the building over the access way is within 15 feet of the road surface of the access way;
- (c) the width of the building over the access way does not exceed 25 feet measured along the access way;
- (d) the plans and specifications of the building over the access way comply with all relevant Acts, by-laws and regulations.

(2) The owner of the buildings thus connected shall be liable, and if there are more than one such owner they shall be jointly and severally liable, forthwith to remove at his or their own expense any structure built or maintained over the access way otherwise than as permitted by this clause.

5. The owner for the time being of the building erected to the East of the Murray Street egress way on the land comprised in certificate of title volume 1014, folio 615, shall be entitled to maintain the building existing over the access way and to alter add to or re-build such building.

Provided that—

- (a) such building shall not be increased in length over the access way;
- (b) the plans and specifications of any alteration addition or re-building over the access way comply with all relevant Acts, by-laws and regulations.

6. The following building lines are declared as shown on the Approved Plan—

- (a) a line 6.06 links to the West of the Western alignment of and for the full length of the Murray Street egress way;
- (b) a line 6.06 links to the West of the Western alignment of and for the full length of the ingress way;
- (c) a line 6.06 links to the North of the Northern alignment of and for the full length of the King Street egress way.

7. Except with the special permission of the Council no building shall hereafter be constructed and no existing building shall be altered on land lying between the access way and a building line declared by this Scheme.

8. No show window or display window shall be constructed or maintained abutting on or within 20 feet of the access way.

9. No person shall without the approval of the Council signified under the hand of the Town Clerk do anything which causes or is likely to cause an obstruction to the flow of traffic in the access way.

Part IV.—Traffic Control.

10. This Part of this Scheme shall come into operation on such date as the Council shall by notice in the *Government Gazette* fix for the coming into operation of this Part.

11. (1) No vehicle shall enter the ingress way except at the Northern end thereof.

(2) No vehicle shall leave the ingress way except at the Southern end thereof.

12. (1) No vehicle shall travel Eastward on any part of the access way lying to the West of the Western alignment of the ingress way.

(2) No vehicle shall travel Westward on any part of the access way lying to the East of the Eastern alignment of the ingress way.

13. (1) No vehicle shall enter the King Street egress way except at the Eastern end thereof.

(2) No vehicle shall leave the King Street egress way except at the Western end thereof.

14. (1) No vehicle shall enter the Murray Street egress way except at the Southern end thereof or from premises abutting on the Eastern alignment thereof.

(2) No vehicle shall leave the Murray Street egress way except at the Northern end thereof or to enter premises abutting on the Eastern alignment thereof.

(3) No vehicle shall back into the Murray Street egress way from premises abutting on the Eastern alignment thereof.

15. No vehicle shall remain stationary on any part of the access way.

16. (1) No vehicle shall be so driven or left as to interfere with or be likely to interfere with the flow of traffic on any part of the access way.

(2) No thing shall be so placed or left as to interfere with or be likely to interfere with the flow of traffic on any part of the access way.

Part V.—Miscellaneous.

17. The Council shall be the responsible authority under the Act in respect of this Scheme.

18. (1) Any notice required to be given by the Council under subsection (1) of section ten of the Act shall be a one month's written notice, under the hand of the Town Clerk, sent by registered post to the owner and the occupier of the premises affected as appearing in the rate-book of the Council.

(2) The Council may recover expenses under subsection (2) of section ten of the Act in any manner in which the Council is, from time to time, entitled to recover rates levied by the Council.

19. No person shall whether by driving a vehicle or by any other act or omission cause a breach of any of the provisions of this Scheme.
