GOD SAVE THE QUEEN !!

AT a meeting of the Executive Council, held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 1st day of May, 1957, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued.

Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, and the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, it is provided, inter alia, that all water works, sewerage,

drainage and irrigation works constructed by the Government and declared by the Governor to be subject to any of the Acts mentioned in the Schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage, and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, shall vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage on behalf of Her Majesty unless and until those works are vested in a board; and whereas by section 11 of the Public Works Act, 1902 (as amended) the Governor by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 17th December, 1954, authorised the Minister for Works to undertake, construct or provide Dumbleyung Town Supply (Headworks) on land coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 33310; and whereas by Order in Council dated the 10th March, 1952, and published in the Government Gazette on the 14th March, 1952, the Dumbleyung Water Area was constituted and the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage appointed to exercise all the functions of a Water Board in that area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers contained in section 4 of the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912-1950, doth hereby declare the Dumbleyung Water Supply (Headworks) on the land coloured green on Plan P.W.D., W.A. 33310 to be subject to the Water Security of the contained on the contained of the security of the to be subject to the Water Boards Act, 1904 (being an Act mentioned in the Schedule to the Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1912) and to vest in the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage.

Part I.—Preliminary.

3.—Definitions.

- (a) "Bottom man" means a worker in the bottom of a trench or excavation, other than a shaft, excavating, toeing laths, knocking down sets, but does not include workers working in untimbered excavations for low level pumping stations.
- (b) "Braceman" means a worker engaged upon the brace of a shaft looking after the safety of men underground, and the securing of material going below, and the hauling, landing, and tipping of mullock and other material.
- (c) "Casual worker" means one for whom work over a period of five (5) consecutive working days, not counting holidays, is not provided by the employer.
- (d) "Caulker" means a worker who caulks or re-caulks joints on all pipe lines.
- (e) "Concretor" means a worker operating mechanical appliances for handling, weighing, and mixing dry and wet concrete components, engaged in filling in gauge, mixing on the board, or machine mixing, wheeling from the board, or packing concrete (or trucking concrete in a tunnel) or distributing and packing concrete inside of box or forming.
- (f) "Conveyor belt attendant" means a worker who controls the doors on the underground storage bins, maintains the supply of aggregate to storage bins, greases the conveyor belt fittings, and starts and stops motors as required.
 - (g) "Cut and cover man" means a worker-

 - (i) engaged in sinking cuts;
 (ii) holing through in cuts with or without the use of steel shields;
 - removing horizontal box or vertical timbering whilst packing or refilling cuts.
- (h) "Cut and cover work" means excavation by a method in which a series of vertical holes are sunk up to a depth of twenty feet (20ft.) with thorizontal holes excavated between, where the distance between the vertical holes is not greater than eight feet (8ft.) measured from the nearest side of the open cut to that of the adjacent one.
- (i) "Electric pump attendant (G.W.S.)" means a worker who is responsible for the operation of electric pumping units on the Goldfields Water Supply scheme and who in the course of his duties takes charge of a shift.
- (j) "Engineer" means the engineer in charge of the job in question.
- (k) "Chief Engineer" means the officer occupying for the time being the position of Chief Engineer of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department.

- (1) "Executive Engineer" means the officer occupying for the time being the position of Executive Engineer for the Goldfields Water Supply.
- (m) "Fireman" means a worker employed in Pumping Stations who does the work of a boiler attendant in accordance with the Machinery Act, and other duties as required, associated with the operation of the Station.
- (n) "Ganger" means a worker placed in charge of four (4) or more other workers.
- (0) "Gardener-Caretaker (Mundaring)" means a worker employed to maintain the area and garden of Mundaring Weir.
- (p) "Greaser" means a worker employed in Pumping Stations who does the work of a greaser and other duties as required, associated with the operation of the Station.
 - (q) "Home Station"-
 - (i) in the case of an electric pump attendant (G.W.S.) means the pumping station where he is usually employed;
 - (ii) in the case of a fireman or greaser (G.W.S.) means the pumping station where he is usually employed;
 - (iii) in the case of a water supply controller means the reservoir or premises where he is usually employed;
 - (iv) in the case of a worker (G.W.S.) employed in a store or depot or permanent workshop, means the store, or depot or workshop where he is usually employed;
 - (v) in the case of a leading maintenance man or a maintenance man, means the store, depot or yard ordinarily regarded as his base, or where there is no such store, depot or yard, the place of residence of the worker, if such residence is of a reasonable standard but, if not, then the nearest store, depot or yard;
 - (vi) in the case of electric and oxy welders and their offsiders employed on maintenance of the 30-inch main or extensions therefrom, the home station shall be the particular section of work which has been allotted to them by the executive engineer, G.W.S., for their normal employment.
- (r) "Leading maintenance man (G.W.S.)" means a worker whose duties include service laying, meter reading, installing and removing meters, oiling meters, stopping leaks in mains or extensions, and keeping the time of, and directing not more than three (3) maintenance men, and includes any worker in charge of a section of any water main or extensions thereof.
- (s) "Maintenance man (G.W.S.)" means any worker who works under the supervision of a leading maintenance man. His duties include the reading and oiling of meters, installing and laying services, effecting repairs to watermains, giving attention to the preservation and maintenance of the main conduit and all extensions reticulating therefrom.
- (t) "Miner" means a worker employed sinking or driving in rock, or in any other material in a shaft or tunnel, and includes any such worker using a hammer and drill, hammer and gad, or explosives, or employed breaking through between open cut trenches where the worker is employed within the connecting tunnel, and in "cut and cover" work, when holing through in rock, or by the use of timber sets in other material.
- (u) "Minister" means "The Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage."
- (v) "Packer" means a worker who packs sand or other material in a drive or tunnel.
- (w) "Pipe jointer" means a worker who joints concrete or stoneware pipes.
- (x) "Pipe setter" means a worker who sets concrete or stoneware pipes in sewerage or drainage works to line and grade.
- (y) "Pipe setter's assistant" means any worker actually engaged assisting the pipe setter in laying concrete pipes twelve inches (12in.) diameter or over.

- (z) "Pipe setter's attendant" means a worker engaged mixing mortar and supplying mortar, pipes, or other material to the pipe setter or jointer.
- (aa) "Plant attendant" means a worker engaged in the starting of the crusher motors and all conveyor motors; the lubrication of the primary and secondary crushers, and the cleaning of the oiling wicks; the tightening of all bolts as required; the replacing of bolts on pulleys while plant is working; and reporting anything unusual to the foreman-fitter, and freeing stone doors as necessary.
- (ab) "Platelayer (light tram tracks)" means a worker who performs the various operations of plate laying (irrespective of the weight of the rail), but does not include a worker who merely shifts sets of rails from one place to another.
- (ac) "Powder monkey" means a worker in charge of and engaged upon the preparation of a number of charges and/or the charging and firing of a series of holes in a quarry or excavation.
- (ad) "Reinforcement worker" means a worker engaged in cutting, bending or setting reinforcements for concrete.
- ments for concrete.
 (ae) "Rise" means a shaft excavated upwards from a tunnel or drive.
- (af) "Senior tester" means a tester who assists the Inspector in Charge, Testing Room, Loftus Street.
- (ag) "Service layer" means a worker employed laying, repairing and renewing services, changing and fixing meters, reading meters, replacing valves, stop cocks and Ferrel cocks and fire hydrants and repairing broken mains. The service layer shall have a sound knowledge of the reticulation mains and control valves.
- (ah) "Service layer's assistant" means a worker who works under the supervision of the service layer.
- (ai) "Sewerage maintenance man" means a worker employed cleaning out and washing down manholes, sighting along and clearing blockages, flushing, scraping (by rodding or use of tackle) in sewers and drains, removing sand and debris from sewers through manholes, cleaning out stormwater drains, repairing and replacing broken pipes and fittings, altering manholes, pipes and other appurtenances and doing the necessary excavation incidental thereto, doing repair work generally of fittings, plant, sewers and drains, and at treatment works and pumping stations, doing concrete and cement work in connection with any of the foregoing types of work, and all other work incidental to the maintenance of sewers, drains and appurtenances. Typical examples of the work of a sewerage maintenance man are set out in the Third Schedule.
- (aj) "Sewerage pumping station attendant" means a worker who patrols from station to station in his allotted district, reads electric meters and enters the number of units used and gallons pumped, on to running sheets daily, keeps all stations under his control in a clean condition, attends to glands on pumps and grease caps on bearings, flushes pumps and derags when necessary and reports to the Foreman in Charge, Sewerage Pumping, any breakdown in plants.
- (ak) "Shaft" means any hole sunk for the purpose of opening up a drive or tunnel but does not include cut and cover work.
- (al) "Timber cutter" means a worker employed cutting piles, laths, keels and sets and includes a worker who prepares and places kerbing in position.
- (am) "Timber man" means a worker who hangs centres and fixes sets and poles off laths, lays keels, fixes frames, or lays decking, or who is employed handling timber in shafts when buildings are being underpinned.
- (an) "Tipman" means a worker directing the tipping of and levelling off to definite lines or pegs of spoil from any vehicle or other container.
- (ao) "Treatment works attendant" means a worker employed at a sewerage treatment works with sedimentation tanks, detritus tanks, and sludge digestion tanks, whose duty is to keep the channels to and from sedimentation tanks free,

clean screens, rod or clean out pipes or channels, skim tanks, break up the scum in the digesters, attend to work in connection with the sludge drying beds, and perform all other work necessary for the efficient operation of the system, including the operation of machinery.

- (ap) "Union" means the Government Water, Sewerage and Drainage Employees' Industrial Union of Workers.
- (aq) "Wet places" means places where the splashings of water and mud saturate the worker's clothing in the performance of work, and where protection is not provided to prevent splashings or drippings sufficient to saturate his clothing, and includes wet material or wet ground in which it is impracticable for the worker wearing ordinary boots to work without getting wet feet.

Part II.—Application.

4.-Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers employed by the Minister under the provisions of the Metropolitan Water Supply Act, 1909-1954, and to workers employed by the Minister on the construction and maintenance of such water supplies under the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1951, as are controlled by the Executive Engineer, as part of or in connection with the Goldfields Water Supply Scheme, with the exception of those workers whose wages and conditions are governed by Award No. 6 of 1947.

5.—Contract of Service.

- (a) The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by seven (7) days notice on either side, except in the case of a casual worker, when one (1) day's notice shall suffice.
- (b) The Minister shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked on which the worker is required to present himself for duty except such absence is due to illness and comes within the provisions of Clause 22 (Sick Leave) or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct and in such case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.
- (d) The Minister shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day on which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it or by any other association or union or through the breakdown of the Minister's machinery or any stoppage of work by any cause which the Minister cannot reasonably prevent, with the exception of wet weather, in which case the decision as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest with the engineer in charge, if available, and, in his absence, the foreman

6.—Term.

This Award shall have effect for a period of three (3) years as from the date of issuance.

7.—Preference.

Preference of employment in respect of the classes of workers covered by this Award shall be given to financial members of the Government Water, Sewerage and Drainage Employees' Industrial Union of Workers, but any worker or applicant for employment who is a member of another recognised industrial union, and who produces proof of such membership, shall be entitled to equal preference: Provided that such worker or applicant, unless a member of a craft union not covered by this Award shall, within fourteen (14) days of the expiry of his current ticket with the other union, make and complete an application for membership with the Union party to this Award.

8.—Wages.

(a) The minimum rates of wages payable to workers under this Award shall be as set out in the Wages Schedule.

- (b) Wages are set out for convenience sake at weekly rates and, where it is necessary to adjust wages on an hourly basis, adjustments should be made to the nearest penny.
- (c) Casual workers, with the exception of casual watchmen, shall be paid ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the rates otherwise payable under this Award.
- (d) When a worker is discharged before the usual pay day, he shall be paid his wages when he leaves work or his wages shall be forwarded to his address the next day by registered post at the Minister's expense.

Part III.—Special Rates and Provisions.

9.—Special Rates and Provisions.

- (a) Higher Duties.—Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate for two (2) hours in any shift shall be paid at such higher minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift. If he be employed for less than two (2) hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.
- (b) Leading Hand Tradesman.—Any tradesman placed in charge of—
 - (i) three (3) and not more than ten (10) other workers shall be paid fifteen shillings (15s.) per week extra;
 - (ii) more than ten (10) and not more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid thirty shillings (30s.) per week extra;
 - (iii) more than twenty (20) other workers shall be paid forty-five shillings (45s.) per week extra.
- (c) Leading Hand.—When four (4) or less men are working together away from the foreman or ganger and instructions for them are given to one of them, such worker shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day, i.e. ten shillings (10s.) per week as a leading hand, in addition to the rate prescribed for the work being performed by such worker.
- (d) Carpenter Setting Out.—A carpenter setting out shall receive three shillings and ninepence (3s. 9d.) per day allowance. "Setting out" means a carpenter or joiner who sets out work other than wood blocks and parquetry flooring for three (3) or more carpenters.
- (e) Concretors Packing Around Reinforcements.—Where, in the opinion of the Engineer, the concretor packing around reinforcements is called upon to exercise greater skill than is ordinarily entailed in such work, the concretor shall receive one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day above the normal rate. In case of dispute as to whether the concretor is entitled to the allowance under this subclause, the same may be determined by a Board of Reference.
- (f) Labourers Lining or Marking Out.—Labourers lining or marking out shall be paid one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day above their ordinary rate; provided that this shall not apply when the foreman or ganger takes part in the operation.
- (g) Chainmen and Meter Fitters' Vehicle Allowance.—Chainmen and meter fitters who in the course of their duties have to ride a motor cycle or drive a motor vehicle shall receive ten shillings (10s.) per week extra.
- (h) License for Motor Lorry Drivers.—A worker definitely employed as a motor lorry driver shall pay his own license fee, except where the driving of the truck is incidental to other duties, in which case the Minister shall pay the license fee.
- (i) Trailer Allowance.—A driver of a loaded motor wagon (except a tractor) drawing a loaded trailer also (not to include a mechanical horse) shall be paid an allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day extra.
- (j) Attending Horses.—Feeding horses during week days will be carried out during eight (8) hours' working time. When the driver comes in early, he will be granted equivalent time off and

- shall also be paid an allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day. For week-end feeding he shall be paid fifteen shillings (15s.) i.e., seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per day plus any fares necessarily incurred by the worker.
- (k) Watchmen Controlling Traffic.—Watchmen or other workers who regulate and control vehicular traffic in busy thorough-fares shall receive an allowance of two shillings (2s.) per shift above their usual rate.
- (1) Offensive Allowance.—(i) An allowance of five shillings (5s.) per day shall be paid to all workers other than treatment works attendants, who come into contact with filth during the operation of cleaning out septic tanks, sand pits, ripple chambers, suction chambers of sewerage pumping stations and in de-ragging of sewerage pumps.
- (ii) Works other than sewerage maintenance men employed on offensive work in connection with old sewers, or excavating in ground where fumes arise from decomposed material or from any other cause, shall be paid an allowance of twenty-five per cent. (25%) of the ordinary time rate.
- (iii) An offensive allowance of five shillings (5s.) per day shall be paid to sewerage maintenance men only in accordance with the provisions of the Third Schedule.
- (iv) When working in excavation trenches an allowance up to two shillings (2s.) per day shall be granted to workers in water from which, in the opinion of the engineer in charge of the job, obnoxious fumes or odours arise, and in the case of a dispute, the matter shall be referred to a Board of Reference.
- (v) Septic tank attendants cleaning out tanks at Fremantle Treatment Works shall be paid an additional One Pound (£1) per day while so employed.
- (vi) Other workers cleaning out tanks at Fremantle Treatment Works shall be paid at the same total wage rate as septic tank attendants doing such work.
- (vii) Workers cleaning out septic tanks (G.W.S.) shall be paid double time rates.
- (m) Dirt Money.—(i) Firemen and Greasers: When brushing out and scraping boiler drums, when scraping soot off outside of diagonal tubes or when inside removing soot from combustion chambers and flues, firemen and greasers shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per day extra.
- (ii) Other workers. Twopence (2d.) per hour extra shall be paid to workers when engaged on work of an unusually dirty nature where clothes are necessarily unduly soiled or injured or boots are unduly injured by the nature of the work done.
- (n) Wet Places.—Any worker working in wet places shall be paid an allowance of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per day or part of a day unless his classification expressly includes an allowance for wet pay: Provided that—
 - (i) this allowance shall not be payable to workers working on natural surfaces made wet by rain;
 - (ii) where watertight boots and/or oilskins are provided by the Minister, no claim shall be allowed under this provision for wet feet or clothing, but where, notwithstanding this protection and the exercise of reasonable care by the worker, his clothing or or feet become wet, he shall be paid the appropriate rate of wet pay;
 - (iii) where a worker is compelled to work in water to the thighs, he shall receive the allowance notwithstanding the previous paragraph (ii) of this proviso;
 - (iy) this allowance shall not be payable to treatment works attendants.
- (o) Wet Pay for Workers on Staging.—Workers on staging when shovelling wet material shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day if and when the bottom men are being paid one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) per day for wet work. Such workers shall not be entitled to any allowance under subclause (n) of this clause.

- (p) Overhead Welding in Wet Places.—Oxywelders and electric welders engaged on overhead welding in wet places shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day extra when waterproof mats are not provided.
- (q) Dismantling Timber in Wet Ground.—Workers engaged in dismantling wet timber or handling wet timber in and around wet trenches shall receive an allowance of one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day and in dry ground below a depth of ten feet (10ft.) from the natural surface, an allowance of ninepence (9d.) per day.
- (r) Deep Shovelling.—Workers shovelling more than six feet (6ft.) in untimbered trenches or excavations shall receive one shilling (1s.) per day allowance. This allowance shall also apply to shovellers in stone trenches when working more than six feet (6ft.) from the surface.
- (s) Shovelling Wet and Sticky Clay.—Workers employed shovelling clay which is wet and sticky but which does not come within the definition of "wet places" as contained in this Award shall be paid one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day allowance.
- (t) Dollying on Scaffolding.—Workers engaged using a dolly on scaffolding shall be paid one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day above their usual rate.
- (u) Under Wharves.—Workers working under wharves at Fremantle shall be paid two shillings and eightpence (2s. 8d.) per day allowance.
- (v) Handling Cement, Lime or Flyash.—(i) All workers (other than treatment works attendants, concretors or other workers receiving a margin for work which involves the use or handling of lime, cement or flyash) who are engaged—
 - (a) tipping dry cement, lime or fiyash into trucks or handling cement, lime or fiyash in machine mixing shall be paid two shillings (2s.) per day allowance;
 - (b) handling dry cement, lime or fiyash in bags shall be paid one shillings (1s.) per day allowance;
 - (c) opening and emptying dry cement, lime or flyash on mixing board shall be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) per day which shall include the allowance of one shilling (1s.) per day referred to above;
 - (d) handling ten (10) or more bags of cement, lime or flyash in the day solely within the confines of a building, shall be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) per day which shall include the allowance of one shilling (1s.) referred to in subparagraph (b).
- (ii) Olive oil shall be provided for the use of concrete, cement or fiyash workers.
- (w) Concrete Drippings.—Where in the opinion of the engineer, a worker is unduly exposed to concrete drippings, such worker shall receive an allowance of one shilling (1s.) per day.
- (x) Spraying with Copper Sulphate.—A worker employed spraying the walls of service reservoirs with copper sulphate or other comparable compounds shall receive an allowance of two shillings (2s.) per day.
- (y) Tarring.—(i) Workers engaged on tarring, except when employed on tarring pipes under subclause (z) of this clause, shall be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) per day in addition to the ordinary wage.
- (ii) Tar workers shall be provided with gloves and overalls and where, in the opinion of the engineer, it is necessary, with oil or other solvents suitable for the removal of tar from the skin.
- (z) Tarring, Scraping or Brushing Pipes.—(i) Workers engaged on one or more of the operations of tarring, scraping, brushing or cleaning cast iron or steel pipes, other than pipes laid in position and connected, shall—
 - (a) if required to work wholly within the pipe be paid an allowance of four shillings (4s.) per day;
 - (b) subject to paragraph (a), when operating by hand on the inside of pipes be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) per day.

- (ii) Workers engaged in tarring, scraping, brushing or cleaning the outside of cast iron pipes shall be paid an allowance of two shillings (2s.) per day.
- (iii) No allowance shall be made to maintenance men for tarring joints of mains on the outside when such work is part of their duties.
- (iv) Workers (G.W.S.) tarring outside of pipes by mechanical tar spray shall be paid an allowance of seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per day.
- (aa) Working Inside Pipes.—(i) Welders working inside pipes other than those laid in position and connected shall be paid an allowance of three shillings (3s.) per day, provided this shall not apply to the frabrication of specials.
- (ii) A worker engaged as a plasterer, working inside a water main, i.e., a main laid, connected and used as such, shall be paid an allowance of three shillings (3s.) per day.
- (ab) Welders Allowance for Fitters and Other Tradesmen.—A fitter or other tradesman, not specially employed as a welder, who in addition to his employment as such is also required to do welding, shall be paid one shilling (1s.) per day extra whilst so employed.
- (ac) Patrolmen on Contour Channels.—Patrolmen on contour channels shall receive an allowance of three shillings (3s.) per day (inclusive of wet pay).
- (ad) Chlorine Operators.—A chlorine operator who also cleans screens and patrols shall receive an allowance of three shillings (3s.) per day (inclusive of wet pay).
- (ae) Caulking at Odd Times.—A maintenance man who caulks at odd times in the ordinary course of keeping joints tight shall not be entitled to caulker's rate.
- (af) Stacking Firewood.—Firewood shall be stacked as close to the boilers as the machinery superintendent considers practicable.
- (ag) Sweat Rags.—An adequate supply of sweat rags or material suitable for sweat rags shall be supplied free to pumping station workers.
- (ah) Fuel, Kerosene and Water.—Steam pumping station workers (G.W.S.) shall be supplied with free fuel, kerosene and water. Electric pump attendants (G.W.S.) shall be supplied with free water and ten shillings (10s.) per week in lieu of fuel and kerosene.
- (ai) Alteration of Plod Cards or Time Dockets.—Each worker shall be responsible for the filling in of his plod cards or time dockets and no erasure shall be permitted. Alterations will be permitted provided the original entry is not rendered illegible and the reason is explained to the worker, who shall initial the alterations. All dockets and plod cards to be filled in in the Minister's time.

10.—Special Equipment.

- (a) Rubber Boots and Oilskins.—(i) An oilskin coat and a pair of rubber boots at the rate of one coat and one pair of boots every two (2) years shall be supplied to treatment works attendants, sewerage maintenance workers and service layers and their assistants and to maintenance men (G.W.S.) or in such other cases and circumstances that the chief engineer or executive engineer considers necessary. In the case of a dispute arising as to the issue, the matter to be referred to a Board of Reference.
- (ii) A separate issue shall be made to each worker who shall acknowledge receipt in writing and be responsible for the safekeeping and condition thereof, reasonable wear and tear excepted. When the worker leaves his employment or when the worker's services are terminated, he shall return the issue in a condition consistent with his observance of this paragraph.
- (iii) No worker shall lend the issue, or any part of the issue made to him, to another worker or borrow the issue made to another worker. Any breach of this paragraph shall be deemed to be serious and wilful misconduct and render the worker committing the breach liable to summary dismissal.

- (iv) No worker shall be called upon to wear boots formerly issued to another worker unless and until same have been effectively sterilised and fumigated.
- (b) Overalls and Gloves.—(i) Overalls—Overalls shall be provided by the Minister where and when considered necessary by the engineer, for sewerage maintenance men called upon to go into dirty manholes, tanks, pumping chambers or similar places, and for workers using ferric chloride or other corrosive chemicals, or any other work where same is considered necessary by the chief engineer or executive engineer.
- (ii) Gloves.—Gloves shall be provided by the Minister where and when considered necessary by the chief engineer or executive engineer.
- (iii) If a dispute arises as to whether the issue of gloves or overalls is necessary for any particular work, it shall be referred to a Board of Reference.
- (c) Handling Rock (Plums).—Where workers are engaged in the handling of rock (plums) and where such handling of rock goes with the ground or floor of rock or concrete, suitable leather or rubber protectors for the hands shall be supplied.
- (d) Gloves for Concrete Machine Mixer Men.—Concrete machine mixer men shall be provided with suitable gloves.
- (e) Crash Helmets.—Workers engaged in positions exposed to falling material shall be provided with crash helmets.
- (f) Respirators.—Men employed on stone crushing plants shall be supplied with respirators.
- (g) Soft Soap.—Soft soap or other suitable soap shall be supplied to pumping station workers, yards and workshops.
- (h) Water Bags.—Water bags shall be provided by the Minister on each job, the number and type to be decided by the engineer in each case.

(i) Electric Torches.

- (i) Workers working inside and cleaning out pipe mains shall be provided with electric torches for lighting purposes during and in connection with cleaning operations.
- (ii) Every worker shall sign for the torch issued to him and be responsible for its safe custody and return at the end of the shift.

(j) Protection from Welding.

The Minister shall supply for the protection of welders and their assistants and other employees working in the vicinity, such protective equipment as the chief engineer or executive engineer shall consider necessary. Such equipment shall be used by the workers concerned for the purposes for which it is issued. In the event of any dispute as to the necessity for any particular equipment, the matter shall be referred to a Board of Reference.

- 11.—First Aid and Accident Transportation,
- (a) Where practicable, one of the employees in each gang exceeding ten (10) shall be qualified in first aid.
- (b) First aid outfits shall be provided and maintained by the Minister on all jobs to which this award applies. Such outfits shall consist of at least the following:—Boracic acid, iodine, picric acid (bottle solution), 1-inch bandages, 2½-inch bandages, 4-inch bandages, lint, cotton wool, triangle bandages, lysol, permanganate of potash, snake bite scarifier, 12-inch, 18-inch, 24-inch and 30-inch splints, and one pair of scissors.
- (c) Any employee appointed by the Minister to perform first aid duty in any gang exceeding ten (10) men shall be paid one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day in addition to his ordinary rate: Provided that a special rate of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day shall be paid to the man in charge of the first aid room, Loftus Street Yard.
- (d) Where a worker camped on the job in a construction camp, or any member of his family living with him in the camp, becomes sick or sustains an accident, the Minister shall convey such sick or injured person free of charge from the camp to the nearest hospital.

12.—Change and Shelter Shed.

Where practicable, a change and/or shelter shed shall be provided for workers at the commencement of the work and shall be used exclusively for that purpose; but on tunnel work a change shed, equipped with hot and cold showers, shall be provided by the Minister. Each isolated gang shall be provided with a shelter. Change and shelter sheds shall be erected in a location beyond risk of injury to employees from blasting operations.

13.—Tea Breaks, Meal Hours, Refreshments.

- (a) Subject to the provisions hereinafter contained, a rest period of seven (7) minutes from the time of ceasing to the time of resumption of work shall be allowed each morning. This interval shall be counted as time off duty without deduction of pay and shall be arranged at a time and in a manner to suit the convenience of the Minister. Morning tea may be taken by workers during this interval but the period of seven (7) minutes shall not be exceeded under any circumstance. Upon proof of breach by any worker of any provision hereinbefore expressed or implied, the Court may grant the Minister exemption from liability to allow the rest period aforesaid. Provided that the present practice in regard to firemen and greasers in the Goldfields Water Supply shall continue.
- (b) Workers engaged on essential emergency work or on some process in course (e.g., concreting) may be required to take the prescribed teabreak at such time and in such manner as considered necessary by the engineer in charge of the job or, in his absence, by the foreman or ganger.
- (c) Workers in metropolitan section working on large bursts shall be permitted to partake of a meal every four (4) hours, such times to be included in their working time, and the Minister shall provide hot soup between the hours of 5 p.m. and 8 a.m.
- (d) Where practicable, workers (G.W.S. section) working overtime on bursts in mains shall be supplied with hot coffee at least once every four (4) hours and be permitted to partake of food at reasonable intervals and such times shall be included in their working time.
- cluded in their working time.

 (e) Any worker required to work overtime for more than one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ hours after the ordinary ceasing time without being notified the previous day, shall be provided with a meal or be paid three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) for each meal, in addition to his overtime payment and time taken for such meal shall not be paid for: Provided, however, that this clause shall not apply when workers are camped.

Part IV-Fares and Travelling Provisions.

14.—Fares and Travelling Time.

(a) Fares for Construction Workers.

- (i) In respect of all fares of construction workers who are required to start and finish on the job the Minister shall pay the worker fares actually and reasonably incurred in excess of one shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per day of the return fare, provided that the Minister or his representative shall have the right to require evidence of fares actually and reasonably paid.
- (ii) In the case of maintenance workers who are employed on construction work, the provisions of paragraph (i) hereof shall not apply.
- (iii) A construction worker shall have no claim for recoup of fares under this clause when a conveyance other than a public conveyance is provided by the Minister.
- (iv) This subclause shall not apply to maintenance workers nor to workers who regularly start and finish at the Department's yards, or stores, nor to workers required to camp on the job.

(b) Fares.

When instructed to travel on duty, workers shall be provided with necessary fares, except when the Minister provides the means of conveyance or makes a bicycle allowance to the worker, such bicycle allowance to be one shilling (1s.) per working day.

(c) Time Occupied in Reporting from Job to Job.

The time occupied by workers when instructed to report from one job to another during working hours shall be paid for at ordinary rates.

(d) Travelling Time.

- (i) When the work necessitates that the workers shall live in camp, and the camp site selected by the officer in charge is more than a quarter of a mile from the job, workers shall be paid full pay for the time taken in walking from camp to work one way only: Provided that when the distance exceeds two (2) miles a similar allowance shall be made for the distance in excess of two (2) miles for return to camp.
- A time limit shall be allowed at the rate of twenty (20) minutes per mile necessarily walked but, where portion of the workers employed on a particular job live in camp and another portion of the workers travel from their homes to the job, the starting time for all workers on the job shall be uniform.
- (ii) Workers engaged on construction work or reconstruction work situated more than one (1) mile by the shortest possible route from the nearest railway station or public transport facility shall receive one shilling (1s.) per day in addition to their ordinary pay, plus one shilling (1s.) per day for every additional half mile walked, unless travelling in the Minister's time.
- (iii) Maintenance men at Fremantle, brought out to clean the tank opposite the Fremantle Railway Station, shall be allowed walking time to their homes, if the work is not completed in time to enable them to get home by train or tram.
- (iv) Where the Minister provides transport to the nearest railway station or public transport facility, workers (except maintenance men) shall travel in their own time and receive no allowance: Provided, however, that in the Goldfields section when the Minister provides such transport or transport between the job and the camp or depot the workers shall be paid at ordinary rates for all time in excess of half $(\frac{1}{2})$ an hour per day spent in such travelling.

(e) Fares and Sustenance Allowance on Engagement or Dismissal.

The Minister shall pay railway and other transport fares, or shall provide transport free of charge from the place of engagement to the place of work, and on completion of the job return fares or transport to place of engagement shall also be paid or be provided by the Minister: Provided that in the event of any worker leaving the work of his own accord, or being dismissed on account of misconduct, or unsatisfactory work, within six (6) weeks of the time of engagement, the amount of the fare to the job may be deducted from any amounts due to such worker at the time of dismissal and he shall forfeit privileges of free return to place of engagement.

15.—Travelling and Away from Home Allowances.

- (a) Travelling Allowance.—Except as hereinafter provided, when a worker is instructed to proceed on duty from the place where he is then or is usually employed, to any place where he cannot return to his abode at night, he shall receive reasonable out-of-pocket expenses for meals and bed, with a minimum of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per item* per day.
- (b) The time necessarily occupied by all workers in travelling on duty (including waiting time) shall, if instructed to travel by train or other means of conveyance, be paid as from time of departure to arrival at the destination at ordinary rate of wages attached to the departure station, but not to exceed eight (8) hours per day. Overtime rates shall not apply.
- (c) Where, in the opinion of the engineer, workers are required to travel an excessive time in their own time they shall be paid such allowance as shall be agreed between the engineer and the Union.

- (d) Away from Home Allowance.—Firemen and greasers: When relieving away from home station, to be paid twelve shillings and sixpence (12s. 6d.) per day at Station No. 4 and fifteen shillings (15s.) per day at Stations 5, 6, 7 and 8.
- (e) Workers other than Firemen and Greasers: For each night necessarily absent from home station on duty they shall be paid reasonable out-of-pocket expenses for meals and bed, with a minimum of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per item.*
- (f) The preceding subclauses (a), (b), (c) and (d) of this clause shall not apply—
 - (i) to workers who are mainly employed in travelling about and engaged upon the work of maintaining and constructing water supplies on stock routes, or elsewhere away from the Goldfields Water Scheme, except when travelling by rail and without their usual equipment;
 - (ii) to workers on construction and reconstruction where the following conditions shall apply—
 - (a) outside the metropolitan area the time necessarily occupied by all workers in travelling on duty (including waiting time) shall, if instructed to travel by train or other means of conveyance, be paid as from time of departure to arrival at the destination, at ordinary rate of wages applying to the departure station, but not to exceed eight (8) hours per day. Overtime rates shall not apply;
 - (b) in addition to the above they shall be paid reasonable out-of-pocket expenses for meals and bed, with a minimum of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) per item* per day. *"Item" means breakfast, dinner, tea and bed.

Part V.—Hours, Shift Work, Overtime, Leave and Holidays.

16.-Hours.

- (a) Except where otherwise provided, a week's work shall consist of forty (40) hours and the normal hours of labour shall be eight (8) per day from Monday to Friday inclusive.
- (b) The following special provisions shall apply:—
 - (i) For stablemen the week's work shall consist of seven (7) shifts in a week's work of fifty-two (52) hours when required by the engineer.
 - (ii) Caretakers provided with residence rent free shall be on duty as required.
 - (iii) Night officers at Loftus Street and Fremantle Yards shall be on duty as required.
 - (iv) For watchmen, a week's work shall consist of seven (7) shifts in a week's work of fifty-six (56) hours.
 - (v) Septic tank attendants and treatment works attendants shall work thirteen (13) shifts of six (6) hours forty-three (43) minutes in a fortnight. The shift shall include thirty (30) minutes for crib, and a fortnight's shifts shall include one (1) shift on alternate Sundays.
 - (vi) Sewerage pumping station attendants shall complete the working week of forty (40) hours in five and a half $(5\frac{1}{2})$ days: Provided that all time worked in excess of forty (40) hours in any week, or on Saturday after 12 noon, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half and all work on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
 - (vii) The working hours of workers working continuously underground in tunnels or shafts shall include crib time not exceeding thirty (30) minutes in each shift.

(viii) The Minister may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker or workers shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

> The union or worker or workers covered by this Award shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this paragraph.

- (c) Starting and finishing places.—(i) Workers shall start and finish their day's work at the depot or on the job as required: Provided, however, that maintenance workers shall start and finish their day's work at the department's yards or stores where they are usually employed.
- (ii) Workers usually employed as maintenance workers shall, when employed on construction work, be entitled to start and finish at the said yards or stores or on the job as may be required: Provided that, if required to start on the job, compensation for the extra time involved shall be paid them at ordinary rates but such extra time shall be the time necessarily occupied by taking the shortest and most convenient route and shall not be included for the purposes of overtime.
- (d) The following provisions shall apply to firemen and greasers who shall be paid the appropriate shift penalty rates:—
 - (i) The normal hours of work shall be eighty (80) hours per fortnight, equal to a total of seventy-two (72) hours from Monday to Friday inclusive and four (4) hours each Saturday.
 - (ii) By mutual arrangement, these hours may be worked in nine (9) days of eight (8) hours or ten (10) days of seven and one-fifth (7-1/5th) hours during week days and four (4) hours on Saturdays in each respective pay period, exclusive of meal times when the workers do not remain on shift.
 - (iii) Payment shall be made for the full period of eighty (80) hours in the fortnight's work, notwithstanding that the firemen or greasers may not have been required to work the full eighty (80) hours of the fortnight's work if in fact they were available for duty.
- (e) Electric pump attendants (G.W.S.) and water supply pump attendants (Metropolitan) shall work five (5) shifts of eight (8) hours on seven (7) days a week and shall receive the appropriate shift penalty rates.

17.—Shift Work.

(a) The loading on the ordinary rates for shift work other than continuous process work shall be as follows:—

A worker employed on shift work who is not allowed to rotate day shift with afternoon and/or night shift shall be paid a loading of twenty-five per cent. (25%) on the ordinary rates of pay for afternoon and/or night shift: Provided, however, that this provision shall not apply in cases where the period for which afternoon and/or night shift is worked without rotation with day shift does not exceed two (2) weeks.

- (b) Work shall not be recognised as shift work but shall be regarded as overtime unless at least five (5) consecutive afternoon and/or night shifts are worked.
- (c) The sequence of shifts shall not be deemed to be broken by a holiday.
- (d) Any shift starting before 6 a.m. or after 10 a.m. shall be deemed to be a night or afternoon shift.
- (e) Starting and finishing times of shifts may be fixed to suit the efficient working of the particular job, provided transport facilities are available or arranged.

- (f) On construction jobs where shift work is worked in two (2) shifts, the first shift shall work eight (8) hours, exclusive of crib time, but the second shift shall work eight (8) hours inclusive of a period not exceeding thirty (30) minutes for crib.
- (g) All shifts shall be worked continuously but, in the following cases, need not be continuous:—
 - (i) Breakdown of machinery.
 - (ii) Interruption in connection with the thirtyinch main conduit.
 - (iii) Mutual arrangement between the parties to suit the requirements of any particular Station.

18.—Overtime.

- (a) Except where otherwise specified, all work performed by any worker outside the usual working hours of such worker shall be regarded as overtime and the rates payable for overtime shall be as follows:—
 - (i) Except in the case of firemen, greasers, caretakers, night officers and water supply controllers, where the worker commences the overtime within the period of one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ hours prior to his usual starting time—time and one half for the time worked in such one and a half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ hour period.
 - (ii) Except in the case of firemen, greasers, caretakers, night officers and water supply controllers, where the worker works overtime in any portion of the period commencing five (5) hours or more after his usual stopping time but commences the overtime prior to one and a half (1½) hours before his usual starting time—double time for all time worked up to his usual starting time and after his next usual stopping time.
 - (iii) Except in the case of firemen and greasers, caretakers, night officers and water supply controllers, and subject to the preceding paragraphs—time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter. Provided that any time worked after 5 p.m. on a Saturday by a five (5) day week (Monday to Friday) worker shall be paid at double time rates.
 - (iv) This subclause shall not apply to repairs of burst water mains.
- (b) A worker called back after completing a day's work or called out on a Saturday or on a Sunday (subject to the exceptions specified in subclause (h), shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at overtime rates, but if he is called out more than once within any period of two (2) hours of a call, he shall not be entitled to any further payment for time worked within a period of two (2) hours from when he commenced work in response to such first call.
- (c) Subject to the other provisions of this clause for all work done on Sunday double time rates shall be paid, with a minimum of two (2) hours, provided that this subclause shall not apply to—
 - (i) casual watchmen on Saturdays and Sundays when they shall receive ten per cent.(10%) in addition to the ordinary watchman's rate; and
 - (ii) septic tank attendants, treatment works attendants, stablemen, caretakers, night officers and watchmen, who shall take such day as an ordinary shift day or as otherwise specifically provided in this Award;
 - (iii) firemen and greasers (G.W.S.) whose rights are defined in subclause (j) and water supply controllers at West Northam and Mt. Charlotte, who shall take such day as an ordinary shift day, and electric pump attendants, Goldfields Water Supply, whose Sunday rates shall be as prescribed in subclause (h).
- (d) Any worker (other than a regular Saturday or Sunday worker) who is notified that he has to work on a Saturday or Sunday shall be paid a minimum of three (3) hours at overtime rates.

- Provided that the worker shall not be obliged to work the three (3) hours if the job for which he has been brought on has been completed in less time.
- (e) In the metropolitan section, water supply service layers required to stand by shall be rostered on a system to be mutually agreed for each depot and any such service layer and shall be paid two (2) hours at ordinary rates for such stand-by on any day from Monday to Friday and three (3) hours for Saturday or Sunday or a public holiday, in addition to any overtime to which he is entitled under this Award and shall also receive a day in lieu of any public holiday on which he is on stand-by.
- (f) A caretaker or night officer called back to work on his Sunday off shall be paid double time for the time he works.
- (g) Except as hereinafter provided, all work performed during the recognised meal time shall be paid at time and a half, and such rate shall continue until the worker knocks off for his meal.

The exceptions before referred to are as follows:—

- (i) Powder monkeys and their assistants.
- (ii) Workers engaged not more than fifteen (15) minutes of the meal time on some process in course (e.g., concreting).
- (iii) Workers engaged on emergency repairs to plant, etc., or other essential emergency work to enable the job to restart at the expiration of the lunch hour.
- (iv) Shift workers.
- (v) Horse drivers performing duties covered by their attendance allowance.
- (vi) Pump attendants and electric pump attendants.
- (vii) A worker who is engaged continuously for more than one week between the hours of 12 noon and 1 p.m.; provided the lunch time is taken between 11 a.m. and 2 p.m. at the same regular hour each day.
- (h) In the case of bursts in water mains, workers called out during working hours who continue working after the usual stopping time and workers called out after their usual stopping time shall be paid overtime at the prescribed rates until the completion of the actual repairs to the burst.
- (i) The following special provisions shall apply in the case of firemen and greasers:—
 - (i) All time worked in excess of the normal number of working hours constituting each respective pay period shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time for the balance.
 - (ii) All time worked on Sundays shall stand by itself and be paid for at time and one half.
- (j) The following special provisions shall apply to electric pump attendants, Goldfields Water Supply, and water supply pump attendants (Metropolitan).
 - (i) All work performed on Saturdays shall be at time and a quarter, and all work performed on Sundays shall be at time and a half in substitution for and not cumulative upon shift penalty rates.
 - (ii) Overtime rates shall be at time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter in any one day; provided the maximum payment shall be double time
- (k) If a fireman, greaser or electric pump attendant (G.W.S.) has completed his shift for the day, and is called back for any purpose (other than valve operation) he shall receive a minimum of two (2) hours overtime for each call out, provided that in the case of valve operation he shall receive one (1) hour at time and a half rates.

19.—Annual Leave.

- (a) (i) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by the Minister after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with the department.
- (ii) Septic tank attendants, treatment works attendants, stablemen, caretakers, caretaker-gardener (Mundaring) water supply controllers, night officers, watchmen and rangers, after twelve (12) months' continuous service shall be granted twenty-eight (28) consecutive days' leave with payment at ordinary rates as prescribed.
- (b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (c) A worker may be rostered off and granted annual leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed, prior to his having completed a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service, in which case, should the services of such worker terminate or be terminated prior to the completion of twelve (12) months' continuous service, the said worker shall refund to the Minister the difference between the amount received by him for wages in respect of the period of his annual leave and the amount which would have accrued to him by reason of the length of his service up to the date of the termination of his services.
- (d) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause, no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect to the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deductions shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness with or without pay, unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deductions may be made for such excess only.
- (ii) approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six (6) months only of any such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.
- (e) In the event of a worker being employed by the Minister for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.
- (f) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service; provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft, no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not affect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.
- (g) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them, provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the Minister of his right to retain such workers during the close-down period as may be required.
- (h) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to his taking the leave.
- (i) Seven day shift workers and shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays shall be allowed, in addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (a)(i) hereof, one weeks' leave: Provided however that where an employee with twelve (12) months' service is engaged for part of the twelve (12 months' period as a seven day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the part of two (2) weeks' annual leave prescribed in

- subclause (a)(i) hereof increased by a half $(\frac{1}{2})$ day for each month he is continuously employed as aforesaid.
- (j) Greasers normally employed at Pumping Stations Nos. 5 to 8 who may be called on to work a pumping shift on Sundays shall receive an extra half day's leave for each four (4) Sundays worked in the year on pumping duties.
- (k) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

20.-Public Holidays.

- (a) With the exception of septic tank attendants, treatment works attendants, stablemen, caretakers, night officers, watchmen, and water supply controllers, who shall work public holidays as ordinary shift days, each of the following days or the days observed in lieu thereof shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and Union Picnic Day which shall be the last Monday in November: Provided that for workers employed within a radius of six (6) miles from the Post Office at Kalgoorlie, Kalgoorlie Cup Day shall be substituted for Union Picnic Day.
- (b) Whenever any holiday falls on an employee's ordinary working day and the employee is not required to work on such day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on such day if it had not been a holiday. Subject to paragraph (a) hereof, if he is required to work on a holiday, he shall be paid for the time worked as if it were an ordinary working day and shall, in addition, be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to the annual leave or to be taken at some subsequent date if the worker so agrees: Provided that if he is called upon to work on Labour Day or Christmas Day he shall be paid at the rate of double time for all time worked on such days. Provided further that, in the case of casual watchmen, for all work performed on holidays they shall receive twenty-five per cent. (25%) in addition to the ordinary watchmen's rate.
- (c) In the case of workers working a five day week, no payment or a day in lieu shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.
- (d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.
- (e) When a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay or sickness, including accidents on or off duty, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, any holiday falling during such absence shall not be treated as a paid holiday. Where the worker is on duty or available on the whole of the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty or is available on the whole of the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in this clause, the worker shall be entitled to a paid holiday on all such holidays
- (f) Except as herein provided, a casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.

21.—Special Leave for Certain Workers.

- (a) Caretakers (metropolitan) who are provided with residence rent free and who are obliged to be on duty as required, shall be allowed one (1) full Sunday off per fortnight. The caretakergardener at Mundaring shall be allowed one (1) day off a week.
- (b) Night officers at Loftus Street, and Fremantle who under this Award are obliged to be on duty as required, shall be granted one (1) day's special leave on pay at the completion of each fortnight. Such leave shall not be allowed to accumulate.
- (c) Workers employed as night officers at Loftus Street and Fremantle on any of the holidays specified under this Award shall be granted a day in lieu of any such holiday.

- (d) Watchmen shall be granted four (4) days special leave with pay at the completion of each calendar month of service. Such leave shall not be allowed to accumulate.
- (e) When required to live in quarters at the reservoirs, water supply controllers (G.W.S.) shall be on duty as required: Provided that twenty-four (24) consecutive hours each week shall be allowed as leave, the commencing time to be mutually arranged between the Minister and the employees concerned and, failing agreement, to be referred to a Board of Reference.

22.-Sick Leave.

- (a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.
- (ii) The liability of the Minister shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.
- (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the Minister, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (b) This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1956.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefit of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to the Minister or his representative of sickness, but the Minister shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.
- (d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.
- (e) (i) Periods of service of less than one (1) month shall not be included as service for the computation of sick leave.
- (ii) Periods of one (1) month and over shall be totalled and payment for sick leave computed on the total of such service during the year.

23.-Long Service Leave.

The conditions governing the granting of long service leave to full-time Government wages employees generally shall apply to workers covered by this Award.

Part VI.—Camping Provisions and Allowances and District Allowances.

24.—Camping Areas.

- (a) When camping areas are necessary for the employees, such shall be provided by the Minister and the area shall be enclosed with a stockproof fence where necessary.
- (b) (i) When employees camp out, the Minister shall provide sufficient tent with fly, huts or cubicle accommodation. Cubicle accommodation shall be at rates to be fixed, or failing agreement, as decided by a Board of Reference: Provided that in the case of tents and huts a minimum weekly rental of one shilling and sixpence (1s. 6d.) shall be charged: Provided further that in the case of non-static camps, as determined by the Minister, no tent hire or hut hire shall be charged.
- (ii) When it is estimated an employee in the normal course of events will be required to live on the same section of any work for a period estimated to be for the duration of more than one (1) week and less than three (3) months, an 8 x 10 high-sided tent, suitably rigged, shall be provided for two (2) employees or, if at his own request, for one (1) employee only. Provided that in lieu of the 8 x 10 tent, an 8 x 7 hut for one (1) employee only may be provided. A gravel, matting, malthoid or other temporary type of flooring shall be provided.

- (iii) When it is estimated that an employee in the normal course of events will be required to live on the same section of work for a period estimated to be of duration of more than three (3) months and less than one (1) year, an 8 x 10 high-sided tent on a suitable frame with suitable floor shall be provided for two (2) employees or, if accommodation can reasonably be made available, a worker may, at his own request, occupy the accommodation singly. Provided that in lieu of the 8 x 10 tent an 8 x 7 hut for one (1) employee only may be provided.
- (iv) When it is estimated that an employee in the normal course of events will be required to live on the same section of any work for a period estimated to be of a duration of more than one (1) year, a framed hut to accommodate one (1) or more men, shall be provided. The floor space shall be based on fifty (50) square feet per man.
- (c) All time occupied in erecting tents and/or huts or in shifting camp shall be paid for at ordinary rates, two (2) hours to be allowed where camps are already erected and four (4) hours where camps are to be erected, provided that overtime rates shall be paid when the work is performed outside ordinary working hours. In shifting camp, provision shall be made by the Minister for the transport of the employees living in the camp, together with their personal property, free of charge up to four (4) cwt.
- (d) The Minister shall supply free of charge a stretcher with mattress or palliasse, and a hurricane lamp with kerosene as considered reasonable by the engineer in charge, or other suitable lighting as approved by the engineer in charge, for all employees occupying a tent, hut or cubicle, provided that after thirty (30) days' continuous service, a suitable mattress with detachable cover shall be provided.
- (e) The Minister shall provide potable water for workers. Tanks shall be fitted with taps. Boiling water shall also be provided by the Minister for the workers' midday meal.
- (f) The Minister shall, if required by the men, provide free of charge on each work, water bags which in the opinion of the engineer in charge are suitable. Firewood shall be supplied free of charge where considered necessary by the engineer in charge.
- (g) The Minister shall provide bath-houses fitted with showers, one to every ten (10) employees. Water shall be available for use in the showers or bath, where baths are provided, at work ceasing time, provided an adequate supply of water is available. Where an attendant is provided, hot water shall be provided where practicable.
- (h) The Minister shall provide sufficient facilities, including copper and tubs, to enable employees to wash their clothes. Such facilities shall be as considered necessary by the engineer in charge.
- (i) The Minister shall install flyproof sanitary conveniences (one seat to every ten (10) employees and each seat to be partioned off) in all camps and on the job, and shall maintain these conveniences in a clean condition. Sufficient covering to ensure decency, and shade and protection from the weather, shall be provided. The Minister shall also supply sufficient and proper material to keep the sanitary accommodation innocuous. Such sanitary accommodation to be so situated as to preclude all possibility of contamination of the water supply and/or foodstuffs of the employees.
- (j) The Minister shall provide adequate drainage for all camps.
- (k) The Minister shall make provision for the disposal of garbage and nightsoil. The Minister shall keep the camping area reasonably free from undergrowth, long grass and dangerous trees and, where considered necessary by the engineer in charge, a camp attendant shall be supplied, whose duty it shall be to maintain the camp in a clean and sanitary condition.
- (1) Where a store is not available at the camp to supply commodities to the employees, and where tradespeople do not call, the Minister shall provide free transport up to three (3) times per week, if

necessary, to enable commodities to be obtained by the employees from the nearest town. Employees shall elect a delegate, who shall be responsible for the collection and distribution of orders and supplies. The Minister shall not be liable for loss or damage to stores during transport.

(m) The Minister shall, when necessary, give an advance by way of procuration order on the store to the amount of one (1) day's pay against wages earned, to a new employee to enable him to obtain foodstuffs.

25.—Camping Allowance.

(a) Employees who are required to camp at the site of the work, either by direction of the Minister or because no reasonable transport facilities are available to enable them to proceed to and from their homes each day, shall be paid a camping allowance of one pound fifteen shillings (£1 15s.) for every complete week they are available for work. Such weekly allowance is to cover any fares incurred at the week-end by men travelling away from camp to their homes and return, but an employee who is absent from duty without the Minister's approval on the working day immediately prior to or succeeding a week-end shall be paid as provided in the following sentence.

If required to be in camp for less than a complete week, they shall be paid five shillings (5s.) per day including any Saturday or Sunday, if in camp and available for work on the working days immediately preceding and succeeding each Saturday and Sunday.

- (b) Provided, however, where the Minister at his own cost, provides the employee with a proper mess room and cooks the employee's food free of charge, the allowance provided in subclause (a) of this clause shall be reduced to seventeen shillings and sixpence (17s. 6d.) per week or two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day, as the case may be.
- (c) When satisfactory accommodation, other than tents or huts, is made available by the Minister, the allowance mentioned in subclause (a) may be reduced in the case of any worker, however short his occupation, when the camp location is fixed for a period of six (6) months or longer; the amount of such reduction to be agreed upon by a representative of the Minister and of the Union, and in the event of a dispute or difference, to be referred to a Board of Reference for determination. Provided that where satisfactory accommodation other than the provision of tents or huts, as referred to in clause 24, is made available in the case of married men by the Minister, the allowance mentioned in the preceding paragraph shall not be payable however short his occupation of such accommodation, when the camp location is fixed for a period of six (6) months or longer. Such accommodation shall not be deemed satisfactory for the purpose of this subclause unless it is sufficient to reasonably provide for the accommodation of the worker, his wife and any of such worker's dependants who shall be nominated by him. Any dispute as to the accommodation provided under this subclause may be referred to the Board of Reference.
- (d) The foregoing provisions of this clause shall not apply to electric and oxy welders and their offsiders employed on the maintenance of the 30-inch main or extensions therefrom whose home station is defined in paragraph (vi) of subclause (q) of clause 3 but these workers shall be paid a camping allowance of ten shillings (10s.) per day.

26.—Cooks at Camps.

- (a) In all camps containing twenty (20) or more employees, where the camp location is fixed for a period of six (6) months or longer, one of the following methods of catering shall be adopted at the discretion of the Minister:—
 - (i) The Minister shall provide a boarding housekeeper, in which case no cooking or eating utensils will be provided.
 - (ii) Where a boarding housekeeper is provided, full camp allowance as provided in clause 25 (a) shall be paid to the worker.

- (iii) A cook shall be employed by the Minister in which case the Minister shall supply cooking and eating utensils.
- (b) A cook so engaged shall be remunerated at the following rates:—
 - (i) A cook required to work seven (7) days per week shall be paid a margin of twentyfive shillings (25s.) plus one-third of the basic wage and margin to cover all overtime and week-end work.
 - (ii) A cook required to work six (6) days per week shall be paid a margin of twentyfive shillings (25s.) plus one-quarter of the basic wage and margin to cover all overtime and week-end work.
 - (iii) A cook required to work five (5) days per week shall be paid a margin of twenty-five shillings (25s.) plus one-sixth of the basic wage and margin to cover all overtime,
 - (iv) The decision as to whether a cook shall be employed five, six or seven days per week shall rest with the officer in charge of the job.
- (c) The number of cooks and cooks' offsiders to be employed shall be in accordance with the following schedule:—

Where the number of employees in the mess does not exceed twenty (20) or under—one (1) cook.

Exceeds twenty (20) and not thirty (30)—one (1) cook and one (1) offsider.

Exceeds thirty (30) and not fifty (50)—one (1) cook, two (2) offsiders.

For each additional twenty (20)—one (1) additional offsider.

Provided that where the number does not exceed twenty (20) the cook shall receive a special allowance of two shillings (2s.) per day for each person in excess of twenty (20), each day to stand alone.

- (d) Subject to subclause (b) (iv) of this clause, the cook's offsider shall be paid the following rates:—
 - (i) Cook's offsider required to work seven (7) days per week shall be paid the basic wage plus a margin of six shillings (6s.) plus one-third of the basic wage and margin, to cover all overtime and week-end work.
 - (ii) Cook's offsider required to work six (6) days per week shall be paid the basic wage plus a margin of six shillings (6s.) plus one-quarter of the basic wage and margin to cover all overtime and week-end work.
 - (iii) Cook's offsider required to work five (5) days per week shall be paid basic wage plus a margin of six shillings (6s.) plus one-sixth of the basic wage and margin, to cover all overtime.
- (e) Each mess shall have a Committee of management appointed by the workers. Such committee shall be responsible to the engineer in charge for the running and discipline of the mess and the actual engagement of the cook. The mess shall be kept to the satisfaction of the engineer in charge.
- (f) The Minister shall provide what is considered suitable mess accommodation.
- (g) The cook and his offsider will be responsible for contributing towards the cost of food in accordance with the formula adopted by the committee.

27.—District Allowances.

- (a) For the purpose of this clause a map and a description of the several areas marked 1, 2 and 3 are set out in the Second Schedule.
- (b) District allowances shall be payable as under:—
 - (i) For that portion of the State situated within the area marked No. 1 and delineated on the map in the Second Schedule hereto the sum of five shillings and three pence (5s. 3d.) per week, except within a radius of five (5) miles of the towns of Southern Cross, Coolgardie, Kalgorlie and Boulder, where the allowance will be two shillings and fourpence (2s.

4d.) per week and except along the main conduit between Ghooli and Ubini where the allowance will be nine shillings (9s.) per week, other than at pumping stations.

(ii) For that portion of the State situated within the area marked No. 2 and delineated on the map in the Second Schedule hereto, the sum of seven shillings (7s.) per week.

(iii) For that portion of the State situated within the area marked No. 3 in the Second Schedule hereto, the sum of ten shillings and sixpence (10s. 6d.) per week.

Part VII-General.

28.—Board of Reference.

- (a) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
 - (ii) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time;
 - (iii) classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award.
- (b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

29.—Apprentices.

- (a) The Apprenticeship Regulations under the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, shall apply to all apprenticeship agreements under this Award.
- (b) Apprentices shall be allowed to all trades covered by this Award, in the proportion of one (1) apprentice to every two (2) or fraction of two (2) journeymen: Provided that the fraction of two (2) shall not be less than one (1).

30.-Under Rate Workers.

- (a) Any worker who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as from time to time may be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the Minister.
- (b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.
- (c) After application has been made to the Board and pending the Board's decision the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

31.—New Classifications.

The future rate for any class of labour not specifically mentioned in this Award shall be fixed by mutual arrangement between the parties hereto and, failing agreement, by the Board of Reference: Provided, however, that the rate so fixed shall, if the date from which it is to take effect has not been agreed upon, be determined by the Board of Reference.

32.—Inspection of Wages Sheets.

The wages sheets of the Minister will be open for inspection at head office by the secretary of the Union upon reasonable notice being given of his desire to inspect same.

33.—Living Quarters.

Reasonable living quarters shall be provided for the caretakers at Loftus Street yard and at Fremantle yard.

34.—Union Stewards.

Union stewards appointed by the Union shall be recognised by the Chief Engineer of the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Department, or his deputy, and the Executive Engineer, Goldfields Water Supply or his deputy. The Union shall notify in writing the name of the steward and any subsequent alteration. The Union representative shall not be paid for any time occupied on Union business during working hours.

35.—Appeals.

- (a) Any worker dismissed or reduced to a lower grade shall have the right of appeal to the Chief Engineer or Executive Engineer, as the case may be, and may authorise the secretary of the Union to act as his agent.
- (b) When a transfer is ordered by the Minister the worker shall have a right of appeal to the Chief Engineer or Executive Engineer and may be represented by the secretary of the Union. If, after inquiry, it is found that a transfer can be arranged with another worker without inconveniencing the Minister, such other transfer shall be effected.

36.—Recognition of Union Secretary.

The Minister shall recognise the secretary of the Union and confer with him on matters affecting the members of the Union and its Awards or Agreements.

37.—Leave Without Pay for Union Delegates.

Provided three (3) days' notice is given to the local officer in charge that leave is required, and the work of the Minister is not interfered with, leave of absence without pay shall be granted to members of the Union to attend as delegates, conferences for the transaction of Union business.

38.—Sanitary Services.

An efficient sanitary service shall be instituted and maintained by the Minister on each job.

39.—Removals and Transfers.

- (a) All workers shall be prepared to remove to any locality where their services may be required by the Minister subject to a right of appeal under Clause 35 of this Award.
- (b) When a removal or transfer involves a train journey, second class fares shall be allowed to workers and, if married, their wives and children under sixteen (16) years of age; also freight charges for the conveyance of a reasonable quantity of furniture and personal effects.
- (c) The time occupied in travelling by any worker transferred from one locality to another to suit the requirements of the Minister, shall be paid for as for ordinary working hours only, but not more than eight (8) hours' pay at ordinary rates of wages attached to the station of departure shall be allowed for each day's travelling: Provided that, when travelling time immediately follows on working time the worker shall be paid for such travelling time at ordinary rates up to but not exceeding eight (8) hours on any single journey.
 - (d) No worker shall lose any time by a transfer.

40.—Transferred Tradesmen.

Tradesmen temporarily transferred shall be paid the ruling rate in the district, subject to the conditions thereof applying.

41.—Fixation of Rent for Quarters.

A Board shall be appointed, consisting of a representative of the Minister, a representative of the Union and a chairman to be mutually agreed upon. Failing agreement, the chairman shall be a person appointed by the State Arbitration Court.

The said Board shall have assigned to it the function of fixing and reviewing the rent to be charged for quarters supplied by the Minister. No appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board.

The Board may be called together at any time upon a request from the Union or the Executive Engineer, Goldfields Water Supply.



SECOND SCHEDULE.



Area No. 1:

Commencing at the intersection of longitude 123° E. and latitude 30° 40′ S. and proceeding South along the meridian to latitude 30° S.; thence West to the No. 1 Rabbit-Proof Fence near Mile-Post 141; thence along the Rabbit-Proof Fence to its intersection with longitude 118° 40′ E.; thence North through the Western boundary of Carrabin Townsite, along the meridian to its intersection with latitude 30° 40′ S.; thence East to longitude 123° at the point of commencement.

Area No. 2:

Commencing at the intersection of latitude 27° S. and longitude 123° E. and proceeding South along the meridian to its intersection with latitude 30° 40′ S.; thence West to the intersection with longitude 118° 40′ E.; thence North along the meridian to its intersection with latitude 30° S.; thence West to longitude 117° 30′ E.; thence in a direct line North-Westerly to longitude 116° 17′ E., and latitude 29° S.; thence North along the meridian through Wurarga to latitude 26° 33′ S.; thence East to longitude 118° 33′ E.; thence South of latitude 27° S.; thence East to longitude 123° E. at the point of commencement.

Area, No. 3:

Commencing at the intersection of latitude 26° S. and the meridian passing through Wiluna (longitude 120° 14′ E.) and proceeding South along the said meridian to its intersection with latitude 27° S.; thence West to longitude 118° 33′ E. (three miles East of Meekatharra); thence North to latitude 26° S.; thence East to the point of commencement.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

Typical conditions under which sewerage maintenance men work on main sewers:-

- (a) Entering a manhole for a short period, e.g., placing toms, collecting samples, measuring depths, changing bottles, etc., with flow on.
- (b) Working in manhole, e.g., waiting on sand scraper, removing debris, lifting out sand, etc., with flow on.
- (c) Entering sewer one pipe length—for scraping off corrosion product samples when flow is held back or at low flow.
- (d) Entering sewer for inspection—inspections
- made at low flow or with flow held back.

 (e) Entering sewer for clearing blockages for direct connections.
- (f) Entering sewer between manholes—cleaning out sand, lifting on to hand trucks in sewer and transporting to manholes and lifting out. Cleaning down soft corrosion product by air-water jet. Assisting with installation of lighting. Carrying out temporary repair work as necessary. These operations to be carried out under flow conditions if required.
- (g) Entering sewer for reconditioning workfixing reinforcement, plastering by hand or machine, transporting material, removing rebound and cement material, curing, removing lights, spikes, final cleaning up, etc. Walls and bottom of sewer all clean of sewerage material and flow off.
- (h) Entering sewer in clean or newly reconditioned state—for chipping corrosion product control samples. Flow held back and pipe clean. This special test section upstream and downstream of M.H. 5028A.

General.

The duties enumerated from (a) to (h) are those contemplated as that of a maintenance man under this Award and for which allowances are not paid except where work of the nature set out in paragraphs (e) and (f) is carried out in unfavourable circumstances or when work of the nature set out in paragraph (h) is carried out when a corrosion of a puggy nature appears on the walls of the pipe, when in each case an allowance of five shillings (5s.) per day shall be paid.

Form 31 (Reg. 28).

INDUSTRIAL ARBITRATION ACT, 1912-1952.

Notice before Cancellation of Registration.
