Bunbury Water Board-Proposed Loan of £33,000.

#### IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

#### No. 10 of 1957.

Between Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, Applicant, and Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court:-

#### Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement."

#### 1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the "Fremantle Harbour Trust Clerks" (Head Office Staff) Award 1957," and replaces Award No. 19 of 1948 as amended by No. 293 of 1951 and No. 141 of 1952.

#### 3.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to permanent and temporary officers of the Fremantle Harbour Trust engaged upon clerical work and not provided for by any other Agreement or Award.

The area covered by this Award shall be the whole of the premises controlled by, vested in, or for the time being occupied by the Commissioners.

#### 4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years as from the date of delivery of this Award.

#### 5.—Definitions.

"Officer" shall mean any member of the clerical staff of the Fremantle Harbour Trust, male and female, covered by this Award, including typists, operators of office machines and telephonists.

"Commissioners" shall mean the Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners.

"Union" shall mean the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A.

#### 6.—Hours of Duty.

The ordinary hours of duty shall be:-

- (a) Head Office Staff.—Thirty-seven and one-half  $(37\frac{1}{2})$  hours shall constitute the week's work, and the ordinary hours of duty shall be seven (7) hours thirty (30) minutes daily from 8.30 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one (1) hour for lunch between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m.
- (b) Telephonists.—Thirty-seven and one-half  $(37\frac{1}{2})$  hours shall constitute the week's work, and the ordinary hours of duty shall be seven (7) hours thirty (30) minutes daily between the hours of 7 a.m. and 6 p.m.
- (c) Gate Check Clerks and Store Staff.-Forty (40) hours shall constitute the week's work, and the ordinary hours of duty shall be eight (8) hours daily from 8.0 a.m. to 5.0 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive, with an interval of one (1) hour for lunch between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m.
- (d) (1) The Commissioners may require any officer to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such officer shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (2) The Union or officer or officers covered by this Award shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be party to, or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- (3) This subclause shall remain in operation until otherwise determined by the Court.

### 7.—Overtime.

- (a) Overtime shall mean and include all time worked in excess of or outside of the ordinary hours of duty as prescribed in clause 6 of this Award.
- (b) All time worked between the usual finishing time and midnight on an ordinary working day shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, provided that an officer recalled to duty after the usual finishing time shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours at the appropriate rate.
- (c) All time worked between midnight and the usual starting time shall be paid for at the rate of double time, with the minimum payment as for four (4) hours, except where the period of duty commences at or within four (4) hours of the usual starting time when the payment shall be from the time duty actually commences until the usual starting time, provided that where the work performed after midnight is worked in consecutive extension of overtime performed prior to midnight or after a meal interval taken at midnight, payment shall be made for the actual time worked.
- (d) All time worked on Saturdays between the ordinary starting time, as prescribed in clause 6 of this Award, and noon shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half, with a minimum payment as for two (2) hours.
- (e) All time worked between noon and midnight on Saturdays shall be paid for at the rate of double time with a minimum as for two (2) hours except where such time is worked in consecutive extensions (apart from meal breaks) with work performed prior to noon, when payment shall be made for the actual time worked.
- (f) All time worked on Sundays shall be paid for at the rate of double time, with a minimum as for four (4) hours.

(g) All time worked on public holidays which occur on non-working days shall be paid for at the rate of double time, with a minimum as for four (4) hours.

(h) On public holidays which occur on days which normally would be ordinary working days, all time worked outside the normal daily hours of duty, as prescribed in clause 6 of this Award, shall be paid for at the rate of double time, with a minimum as for four (4) hours; provided that where such time is worked in consecutive extension (apart from meal breaks) with work performed during the normal daily hours of duty, as prescribed in clause 6 of this Award, under conditions which entitle an officer to a day in lieu as prescribed in clause 18 (c) of this Award, payment shall be made for the actual time worked at the rate of double

#### 8.-Meal Allowance.

In addition to the payment for overtime prescribed in clause 7, a meal allowance of 6s. 6d. shall be paid to each officer in the following circumstances:-

- (a) On an ordinary working day-where an officer is required to commence duty earlier than two (2) hours prior to the usual starting time, or is required to work for at least two (2) hours after the usual finishing time.
- (b) On other than an ordinary working daywhere an officer is required for duty and works before and after a usual meal time, provided that the actual period of work exceeds two (2) hours. #### 12.—Annual Increments.

Advancement from the minimum to the maximum of the classified ranges shall be by annual increment in accordance with the foregoing classifications, and nothing in this Award shall entitle any officer to an advancement in salary unless and until such officer shall have served for twelve months at the lower rate. twelve months at the lower rate. Any such advancement shall be by appropriate annual increment, and shall be subject to the satisfactory conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer.

#### 13.—Marginal Adjustments.

The salaries specified in Clauses 10 and 11 of the Award may be adjusted by a marginal allow-ance at such rate and under such conditions as the Commissioners may from time to time deter-mine: Provided the review of the marginal allowance for adjustment of salaries prescribed herein shall be half-yearly, and such adjustment, if any, shall operate from 1st January and 1st July in each year.

#### 14.—Qualifications Allowance.

A male adult clerical officer who obtains a Diploma of Commerce at the University of Western Australia, or passes the final examination of a recognised Institute of Accountants or Secretaries or Cost Accountants, or passes in five units (including English I) of a degree course in Arts, Science or Law at the University of Western Australia, or obtains an equal qualification approved by the Commissioners, shall be paid, whilst in receipt of a salary not exceeding the maximum margin prescribed by Clause 10 subclause (d) of this gin prescribed by Clause 10, subclause (d) of this Award for a Grade 6 officer, an allowance equiva-lent to the difference between his margin and the next higher margin prescribed in the incremental scale.

#### 15.—Married Men's Allowance.

A male clerk who is a married man or who is the support of those related to him, shall on the approval of the Commissioners be paid an allowance equivalent to the next higher grade than that to which he would otherwise have been entitled, with a maximum margin inclusive of such allowance of £265 per annum. The allowance shall not be treated as part of salary when determining an officer's seniority position as a member of the staff.

#### 16.—Appointments.

Should a vacancy occur in any of the classified positions set out in the schedule attached to this positions set out in the schedule attached to this Award, such vacancy shall be advertised by notice on the office notice board and in such other manner as the Commissioners may deem fitting, and appointment to such vacancy shall, where practicable, be made from officers already in the service of the Commissioners. Any officer may have the right of appeal to the Commissioners against the commissioners against the commissioners. any such appointment.

#### 17.—Higher Duties.

- (a) An officer who is required to perform the duties of a position higher than that in which he himself is classified for a continuous period of not less than one week shall be paid the minimum salary of the range of the position being relieved for the whole of the time he is so relieving.
- (b) An officer continuing to act in a higher position shall be entitled to receive the annual increments he would have received had he been permanently appointed to such higher position for the whole time he is acting.
- (c) A higher salary granted under this clause (c) A higher salary granted under this clause shall continue to be paid during periods of annual leave and sick leave not exceeding three weeks, provided that the officer had qualified for payment of the allowance by serving the required continuous period before taking such leave, and provided further, that after such leave he resumes in the position in respect of which he was paid higher salary. Payment of such higher salary shall not be made for any period of long service. shall not be made for any period of long service leave, or for any part of a period of annual leave or sick leave exceeding three weeks.

#### 18.—Public Holidays.

- (a) All gazetted holidays and picnic day shall be observed as public holidays.
- (b) Whenever a holiday falls on an ordinary working day and an officer is not required to work on that day, he shall be paid for the day as though it were an ordinary working day.
- (c) Whenever a holiday falls on an ordinary working day, and an officer is required to work during ordinary hours, as prescribed in Clause 6 of this Award, on that day, he shall be paid for the day as though it were an ordinary working day and shall in addition be allowed a day's leave with pay to be added to his payt annual layer or with pay to be added to his next annual leave, or taken at some other mutually convenient time.

#### 19.—Annual Leave.

- (a) A period of two (2) weeks' leave, with pay, shall be granted to an officer after each period of twelve (12) months' continuous service.
- (b) Should any of the holidays referred to in Clause 18 hereof occur during the period an officer is on annual leave and is observed on a day which would have been an ordinary working day a day in lieu of any such holiday shall be added to the period of annual leave.
- (c) Annual leave shall, at all times, be taken at a time convenient to the Commissioners.
- (d) An officer who serves continuously for more than one month but for less than twelve (12) months, shall be entitled to receive payment for the proportion of two (2) weeks' leave as his length of service is to the full year.
- (e) The Commissioners may, upon special application, permit any officer to accumulate his annual leave for three (3) years, but no longer.

#### 20.-Long Service Leave.

- (a) An officer who has completed seven (7) years' continuous service in a permanent capacity or ten (10) years' continuous service in a temor ten (10) years' continuous service in a temporary capacity, or eight and one-half years' continuous service, of which not less that eighteen months shall have been served in a temporary capacity, and the balance in a permanent capacity, shall be granted three (3) calendar months' long service leave on full pay or six (6) calendar months on half pay.
- (b) For each subsequent period of seven years' continuous service an officer shall be granted an additional three calendar months' long service leave on full pay or six calendar months on half pay.
- (c) An officer who resigns or is retired for any reason other than misconduct or unsatisfactory service, and who has served continuously in a permanent capacity for at least 12 months next prior thereto, shall be paid for long service leave pro rata to the date of resignation or retirement.

(d) Continuous service shall not include the period during which an officer is on long service leave, or any period exceeding two weeks an officer is absent on leave without pay.

- (e) Any public holidays occurring during the period in which an officer is on long service leave will be treated as part of the long service leave and extra days in lieu thereof shall not be granted.
- (f) Long service leave shall be taken as it falls due at the convenience of the Trust, but the Commissioners may approve the accumulation of long service leave not exceeding six (6) months in all in any particular case.

#### 21.—Sick Leave.

All officers shall be entitled to sick leave with pay as though within the appropriate provisions of the Regulations of the Commissioners.

#### 22.—Short Leave.

On sufficient cause being shown, an officer may on sumcient cause being shown, an officer may be granted leave of absence with pay for a period not exceeding three (3) days (not more than two (2) days of which may be consecutive) in any one year. Such leave may, at the discretion of the Commissioners, be deducted from the officer's next annual leave.

#### 23.—Engagement.

- (a) The engagement of any officer, other than one in a temporary or relieving capacity, shall be terminable by one month's notice on either side, excepting that an officer deemed guilty of gross misconduct or neglect of duty may be in-stantly dismissed or suspended, and shall not be entitled to any such notice or payment in lieu.
- (b) Temporary officers may be engaged at such daily or weekly rate as may be appropriate to the particular class of work, and shall be subject to one day's or one week's notice as the case may be, provided that any such officer engaged on a daily basis but whose period of engagement has exceeded one week shall be subject to one week's notice, and provided further that the minimum wage payable to a temporary officer shall not be less than the rate prescribed for similar work under this Award.

#### 24.—Preference of Employment.

All officers shall be members of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, provided that any officer who at the time of engagement is not a member of such Union shall become a member thereof within fourteen (14) days of such engagement, and provided also that the Union shall not refuse to accept as member any such officer who is eligible, and applies in the manner prescribed, under the rules of the Union, to become a member thereof.

#### 25.—Preservation of Accrued Rights.

Nothing herein contained shall affect the rights or privileges accrued to any officer prior to this Award.

26.—Times and Wages Record.

Records shall be kept by the Commissioners showing the name of each officer under this Award, the nature of the work performed, the hours worked each day, and the amount of wages received each pay. The said records shall be open to the inspection of an accredited representative of the Union during working hours.

#### 27.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint for the purpose of the Award a Board of Reference. Such Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties hereto, as prescribed by the regulations. There are assigned to the Board, in the event of agreement not being arrived at between the said parties, the functions of .---

- (a) Adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award, or any of them.
- (b) Classifying and fixing salaries, rates and conditions for any position, occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award.
- (c) Deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board, in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

#### 28.—Temporary Officers.

A person employed in a temporary capacity in accordance with the provisions of Clause 23 (b) of this Award shall not be entitled to the provisions of Clauses 10 (c), 14, 15, 22.

#### 29.—Under-rate Officers.

Any officer who by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon between the Commissioners and the Union. If agreement cannot be reached, the matter shall be referred to a Board of Reference for determination
