WHEREAS by sections 223 and 225 of the Municipal Corporations Act, 1906-1956 (6 Edwardi, No. 32), it shall be lawful for the Governor, on request of the Council, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street or way, or any place, bridge, or thoroughfare, to be a public highway, and such land shall thereupon and thenceforth, from the date of such Proclamation, become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; and whereas the Albany Municipal Council has requested that certain land named and described in the Schedule hereunder which has been reserved for a street or way within the Municipality of Albany, be declared a public highway: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this my Proclamation declare the said land to be a public highway, and such land said land to be a public highway, and such land shall, from the date of this Proclamation, be abso-lutely dedicated to the public as a highway within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force.

- Under section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954, and for the purposes of that Act, each portion of the State comprised as at the date hereof within a water area referred to in paragraph 1 of this Order is hereby separately constituted a country water area under the same

name or designation as, at the date hereof, such portion had borne as a water area under and for the purposes of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954 (and as respectively appears in the said Schedule), but with the insertion, in each case, of the word "Country" before the words "Water Area."

- Under section 10 of the Country Water Supply Act, 1947-1954, and for the purposes of that Act, the whole of each of the country water areas constituted by or under paragraph 2 of this Order is hereby separately constituted a rating zone under the name or designation respectively directed by paragraph 2 of this Order, but in each case with the substitution of the words "Rating Zone" for the words "Country Water Area."
- 4. This Order in Council shall take effect on the 1st day of July, 1957.

Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, and Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

- 1. UNDER section 4 (6) of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954, each of the several water areas constituted, defined and now subsisting as water areas under and for the purposes of the said Act under the names or designations shown in the Schedule to this Order (and within which areas the Minister for Works is authorised under section 161 of the said Act or under section 4 of Act No. 67 of 1912 to exercise powers conferred on a water board), is hereby abolished; and, under section 3 of Act No. 67 of 1912, any existing water board constituted for any such water area is hereby dissolved.
- 2. Under section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954, and for the purposes of that Act, each portion of the State comprised as at the date hereof within a water area referred to in paragraph 1 of this Order, is hereby separately constituted a country water area under the same name or designation as, at the date hereof, such portion had borne as a water area under and for the purposes of the Water Boards Act, 1904-1954 (and as respectively appears in the said Schedule), but with the insertion, in each case, of the word "Country" before the words "Water Area."
- 3. Under section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954, and for the purposes of that Act, all that land—
 - (a) being land adjacent to the country water areas constituted under paragraph 2 of this Order; and
 - (b) being the strip of land comprised within 50 links on either side of the 30in. water pipeline already constructed and now laid down by the said Minister in, on or over the land referred to in subparagraph (c)

- of this paragraph and up to the points at which the said water pipeline meets the boundaries of each of the said country water areas; and
- (c) being the land delineated and coloured red on the plan being Department of Lands and Surveys registered plan Miscellaneous Roll Plan 186, Sheets 1 to 7, both inclusive, and Department of Public Works Plan P.W.D., W.A., 35070, Sheets 1 to 7, inclusive—

is hereby included within the said country water areas (with the exception of the Allanson Country Water Area) as follows:—

- (i) Within the Collie Country Water Area, so much of the said strip of land as lies between the Northern boundary of the land described in subparagraph (a) of paragraph 4 of this Order and the Collie Country Water Area, less any part of such strip as lies within the Allanson Country Water Area.
- (ii) Within the Williams Country Water Area, so much of the said strip of land as lies between that area and the Collie Country Water Area.
- (iii) Within the Narrogin Country Water Area, so much of the said strip of land as lies between that area and the Williams Country Water Area.
- 4. Under section 3 of the Country Water Supply Act, 1947-1954, and for the purposes of that Act, the following land being land adjacent to the Collie Country Water Area as extended by paragraph 3 of this Order, is included within the Collie Country Water Area, namely—
 - (a) all that portion of land bounded by lines starting at a point on the Westernmost boundary of Wellington Location 56 situate 40 chains from the Southernmost South-Western corner of that location and extending West 40 chains; thence North 40 chains; thence East 40 chains; and thence South 40 chains to the starting point—

being the land delineated and coloured pink on Sheet 1 of the said Plan P.W.D., W.A., 35070, and—

(b) all that portion of Wellington Location 56 bounded by lines starting from a point on the prolongation Westerly of the Southern boundary of that parcel of land as shown coloured green on L.T.O. Diagram 1301 and situate 55 chains 46 links from its South-Western corner and extending 270 deg. 10 min., 25 chains; thence 0 deg. 10 min., 25 chains; thence 90 deg. 10 min., 25 chains and thence 180 deg. 10 min., 25 chains to the starting point—

being the land delineated and coloured pink on Sheet 2 of the said Plan P.W.D., W.A., 35070 less so much of the area of the land referred to in subparagraph (i) of paragraph 3 of this Order as is within the boundaries of the land first described in this subparagraph.

- 5. Under section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954, and for the purposes of that Act the following land, being land adjacent to the Williams Country Water Area as extended by paragraph 3 of this Order, is included within the Williams Country Water Area, namely
 - all that land being the strip of land 50 links wide adjacent to the North-Westerly side of so much of the strip of land referred to in subparagraph (ii) of paragraph 3 of this Order as lies between survey marks 78 and 79 on Sheet 3 of the said Plan P.W.D., W.A., 35070 and indicated by a red arrow and wording on the said plan.

6. Under section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act and for the purposes of that Act the following land, being land adjacent to the Narrogin Water Area, as extended by paragraph 3 of this Order, is included within the Narrogin Country Water Area, namely-

all that portion of Wellington Location 3974 bounded by lines starting from the Westernmost North-Western corner of that location and extending 48 deg. 52 min. along its North-Western boundary for a distance of 40 chains; thence 138 deg. 52 min., 20 chains; thence 228 deg. 52 min. to the Westernmost boundary of that location; and thence Northerly along that boundary to the starting point—

being the land delineated and coloured pink on Sheet 5 of the said Plan P.W.D., W.A., 35070 less so much of the area of the land referred to in sub-paragraph (iii) of paragraph 3 of this Order as is within the boundaries of the land first described in this paragraph in this paragraph.

Under section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954, and for the purposes of that Act, all the said country water areas and all the said adjacent lands referred to in paragraphs 4, said adjacent lands referred to in paragraphs 4, 5 and 6 of this Order, are hereby united into one country water area under the name or designation of "Great Southern Towns Country Water Area."
