- (a) the administration by the Western Australian Government Railways Commission of the Government Railways in Western Australia and of the Government Railways Act, 1904-1954, including the management and control of the Railways, the problems, difficulties and behaviour of the said Commission and of each of the three Commissioners thereof, their due compliance with and observance of the provisions of the said Act, and generally the system of constants. said Act, and generally the system of control, administration, operation and workings of the said Railways;
- (b) any allegation, or suspected allegation of misbehaviour or misconduct which may be misbehaviour or misconduct which may be made or which at any time since the 15th day of December, 1956, has been made by any of the Commissioners, or by any of the departmental heads or sub-heads of the Department of Government Railways (or employed by the Commission) against another or others of them;
- (c) measures for improvement and action which should be taken in relation to the foregoing matters.

And I hereby declare that by virtue of this Commission you may, in the execution hereof, do all such acts, matters and things and exercise all such powers as a Royal Commission and the Chairman and members thereof may lawfully do and exercise, whether under or pursuant to the Royal Commissioners' Powers Act, 1902-1956, or otherwise.

WHEREAS by section 5 of the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1956, it is provided, inter alia, that the Gov-1914-1956, it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Governor may by Proclamation prohibit either absolutely or except in accordance with regulations the bringing into the State of Western Australia from any specified State of any specified kind of plant, fruit, or other thing which would in his opinion be likely to introduce any disease into this State or of anything which is infected with disease or which is infected with any specified disease as defined in that Act; and whereas, in my opinion, the bringing into this State from the State of Tasmania of any kind of plant or fruit would be likely to introduce into this State the disease known as, or caused by European Red Mite (Paratetranychus or caused by European Red Mite (Paratetranychus pilosus): Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby

- (a) prohibit absolutely the bringing by any person into this State of anything which is infected with the disease known as, or caused by, European Red Mite (Paratetrapyehus silome) tetranychus pilosus) and
- (b) prohibit the bringing by any person into this State from the State of Tasmania of any kind of plants or fruits, except in accordance with the European Red Mite Regulations, 1957, made under and pursuant to the Plant Discress Act, 1914, 1956. suant to the Plant Diseases Act, 1914-1956.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, this 12th day of June, 1957, the following Orders in Council were authorised to be issued:—

Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1956.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1956, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office approved by the Minister a policy of insurance for the full amount of liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Tracerum sequifice charged with all presents. the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of the said section; and whereas The Australasian Temperance and General Mutual Life Assurance Society Limited, of St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the Act, and as such subject to the section and having made application in accordance with the Act and the regulation made thereunder for exemption from the operation of section 13, has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against its liability to pay compensation under the Act to all workers employed by it, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Commonwealth of Australia Consolidated Stock to the face value of five thousand pounds, bearing interest at the rate of 4½% maturing on 15th November, 1968, charged with all payments by the Company to become due under its liability aforesaid: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Act, doth hereby exempt The Australasian Temperance and General Mutual Life Assurance Society Limited from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1956, until and including the 30th day of September, 1958.

Marketing of Onions Act, 1938-1956.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 7 of the Marketing of Onions Act, 1938-1956, it is enacted that the members of the Board constituted under that Act (other than a nominated member who may be in the public service) shall be paid such remuneration and allowed such expenses from the funds of the Board as may be fixed by the Governor: Now therefore, His Excellency the Governor by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, doth hereby and with effect from the 1st March, 1957, fix the fees, expenses and allowances to be paid to the members of the Board as follows:—

- 1. To the Chairman, except when he is a public service officer, a sitting fee of £4 4s. for each meeting of the Board he attends: Provided that the aggregate amount of fees to be paid to the Chairman under this paragraph in any financial year of the Board shall not exceed two hundred and fifty pounds.
- 2. To a member of the Board other than the Chairman, and except when the member is a public service officer, a sitting fee of £3 3s. for each meeting of the Board which he attends.
- 3. The fees, expenses and allowances payable to the Chairman and members of the Board other than the sitting fees mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Order shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Order in Council fixing such fees, expenses and allowances, which was authorised to be issued on the 2nd November, 1950, and was published in the Government Gazette on the 24th November, 1950.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1956.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 275/57.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1956, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, divide the respective parts of the Metropolitan Water, Sewerage and Drainage Area, which parts are served by a Metropolitan Main Drain, into Metropolitan Main Drainage Districts and define the boundaries of such Districts; and whereas under the said Act the Governor, by Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on 16th day of July, 1948, divided the said Area into two Stormwater Districts to be known as No. 1 Stormwater District and No. 2 Stormwater District as respec-tively defined in the Schedule to the said Order in Council, and by subsequent Orders in Council published in the issues of the Government Gazette of the 10th day of September, 1948, and the 5th day of August, 1949, altered the boundaries of the said No. 2 Stormwater District, by including therein certain portions of the said No. 1 Stormwater District as respectively defined in the Schedules to the said Orders in Council, and thereby redefined the boundaries of the said No. 2 Stormwater District as delineated and shown in blue, green, and yellow on plan M.W.S.S. & D.D. W.A. No. 7087; and whereas the several parts of the said Area so redefined as the said No. 2 Stormwater District are served by a Metropolitan Main Drain: Now therefore I, the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby divide the said Area by constituting therefrom the Metropolitan Main Drains District No. 1 appreciation of the tan Main Drainage District No. 1 consisting of the respective parts of the said Area which together comprised the said No. 2 Stormwater District as redefined as aforesaid, and define the boundaries of the said Metropolitan Main Drainage District No. 1 as identical with the boundaries of No. 2 Stormwater District as redefined as aforesaid.

Schedule of Amendments.

Clause 7—Hours.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

7.—Hours.

- (a) Day Workers.
- (i) Subject to clause 8 hereof, forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five (5) days of eight (8) hours per day, Monday to Friday inclusive, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.
 - (ii) Lunch interval shall not exceed one (1) hour.
- (b) Shift Workers.

Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in five (5) shifts of eight (8) hours each: Provided that this clause shall be deemed to have been complied with if the ordinary working hours do not exceed eighty (80) hours per fortnight to be worked in shifts of eight (8) hours each. For the purposes of this clause a "fortnight" means any two (2) consecutive pay weeks.

Clause 8—Overtime.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

8.—Overtime.

(a) Day Workers.

(i) Except as hereafter mentioned, all work performed in excess of eight (8) hours in any one (1) day, Monday to Friday inclusive, and all work performed on Saturday, shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.

- (ii) Except as hereafter mentioned, work performed on Sundays or the holidays prescribed in clause 14 (a) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (b) Shift Workers.
- (i) All work performed in excess of the hours prescribed in clause 7 (b) shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (ii) Rest Period After Overtime.—When overtime work is necessary, it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

Where a worker (other than a casual worker) has not had at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between his usual finishing time on one day and his usual starting time on the next day, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (a) He shall, if he so desires, be entitled to have eight (8) consecutive hours off duty from the completion of his overtime work until he next commences work, but shall not be paid for such time off duty.
- (b) If, on the instructions of the employer, he continues or resumes work at his ordinary starting time without having such eight (8) hour break, he shall be paid at overtime rates for the balance of the hours less than eight (8) which he has not had off duty. Hours of overtime actually worked since his last usual finishing time shall be counted in computing the actual rate of overtime under this paragraph.
- (c) If, of his own volition, he continues or resumes work at his ordinary starting time without such break, he shall be paid at ordinary rates.
- (iii) Subject to the provisions of subclause (iv) hereof, all work performed on any of the days mentioned in clause 14 (a) shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half.
- (iv) All work performed on any of the days mentioned in clause 14 (a) or on Sundays in excess of the hours prescribed in clause 7 (b) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (v) Overtime on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work in accordance with clause 9. This shall not apply to the week-end penalty rates prescribed in clause 10.
- (c) In the calculation of overtimes rates, each day shall stand alone.
- (d) (i) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.
- (ii) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time he so holds himself in readiness.
- (e) When a worker, other than a shift worker, is required for duty during any meal time, whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates until a full meal break is allowed.
- (f) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break for a meal.
- (g) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangement between the workers themselves or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole of the extra time worked.
- (h) (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) No organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award, shall, in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

Clause 9—Shift Work.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

9.—Shift Work.

- (a) Workers employed on other than day shift shall be paid five per cent. (5%) for afternoon shift and ten per cent. (10%) for night shift in excess of the rates prescribed in clause 25 hereof.
- (b) Where a shift commences between 10.45 p.m. and midnight, then the whole shift shall be paid for at the rate which applies to the major portion of the shift.

Clause 10—Week-end Penalty Rates.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

10.-Week-end Penalty Rates.

- (a) All work performed by shift workers during ordinary hours on Saturday or Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half.
- (b) The rates prescribed in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid in lieu of the shift allowances prescribed in clause 9 of this Award.

Clause 12—Meal Allowance.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

12.—Meal Allowance.

When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than two (2) hours or (in the case of a day worker or worker on day shift) after 6 p.m., whichever is the later, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) in lieu thereof. Provided that such payment need not be paid to workers living in the same locality as their place of employment who can reasonably return home for a meal.

Clause 14—Holidays.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

14.—Holidays.

(a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to clause 8 hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

Any worker absenting himself from work without reasonable cause, proof of which shall lie upon him, on the whole or any portion of the working day succeding a holiday provided for herein, shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (d) Seven-day shift workers, that is, shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed one (1) week's leave in addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (c) hereof. Where a worker with twelve (12) months' continuous service is engaged for part of a qualifying twelve-monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of two (2) consecutive weeks' annual leave prescribed in subclause (c) hereof increased by one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.
- (e) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which, in the case of that worker, would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

- (f) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (h) In the event of a worker being employed by the employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (j) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

Clause 15—Absence Through Sickness.—Delete this clause and insert in lieu thereof:—

15.—Absence through Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, a worker who, in any calendar year, has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only, or less, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.
- (e) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year, so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

Delete Clause 20—Representaive Interviewing Workers, and insert in lieu thereof:—

20.—Inspections.

Subject to the observance of the security and safety regulations in force from time to time at the Refinery, the Secretary or other full-time representative of the Union, authorised in writing by

the President or Secretary of the Union, shall be allowed to enter the Refinery not more than once in any week for the purpose of inspecting working places and shall be permitted to interview workers during the recognised meal period and at the change of shifts.
