## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1956, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corr. No. 1078/53.—That reserve No. 24848 (Collie Lots 1880 to 1886 inclusive, 1893 and 1898) should vest in and be held by the Minister for Native Welfare in trust for the purpose of Use of Natives.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Busselton Water Board—Proposed Loan £4,500.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Harvey Road Board.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL.

L.G. 714/52.

HIS Excellency the Governor acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order under section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1956, namely that the Harvey Road Board is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:—

- (1) Clause (a) of paragraph (1) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prescribing the rules to be observed in respect of any vehicle being driven or used on roads, and the use of footpaths;
- (2) clause (y) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, providing for the placing, erection or installation on roads, or footpaths of traffic signs, lights and directions for the control and direction of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian, and including the driving of animals, for the marking on roads or footpaths of signs for the control and direction of the traffic and for the regulation and prohibition of the traffic in relation to the signs, lights and directions;
- (3) clause (zd) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, appointing stands and parking places for different classes of vehicles and regulate the use thereof;
- (4) clause (zl) and (zm) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles or vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads, or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times, and prescribing a penalty for any breach thereof;

subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has prior to notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.

WHEREAS it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1954, that except with the consent of the Governor signified by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, no company shall be registered by a name which, *inter alia*, includes the word "Imperial"; and whereas it is provided in subsection (4) of that section, *inter alia*, that the consent of the Governor referred to in subsection (2) of that section shall not be granted to a company, whether incorporated in this State or elsewhere, if, in the opinion of the Governor, the use of such name by such company would imply or be likely to convey the impression that such company is wholly or partly authorised or supported by or connected with Her Majesty's Government in any part of Her Majesty's Dominions; and whereas it is provided, *inter alia*, in proviso (a) to subsection (7) of that section that where in the opinion of the Governor (on being satisfied that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to require a company incorporated outside Western Australia to which Part XI of that Act applies to change its name before complying with the requirements of that Part) it is in the circumstances of the particular case expedient, the Governor may authorise the Registrar to accept for filing the documents and particulars specified in subsection (1) of section 329 of that Act; and whereas registration under Part XI of the Act of a company incorporated in the State of Victoria by the name of Imperial Chemical Industries of Australia and New Zealand Limited was refused by the Registrar on the ground that that name included the word "Imperial"; and whereas His Excellency the Governor is satisfied that the use by that company of the name including the word "Imperial" would not imply or be likely to convey the impression that the company is wholly or partly authorised or supported by or connected with Her Majesty's Government in any part of Her Majesty's Dominions: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by proviso (a) to subsection (7) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1954, and having been satisfied that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to require that Company to change its name before complying with the requirements of Part XI of that Act, and being of the opinion that the circumstances of the case render it expedient, doth hereby authorise the Registrar of Companies to accept for filing from Imperial Chemical Industries of Australia and New Zealand Limited the documents and particulars specified in subsection (1) of section 329 of the Act.

WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 14 of 1957.

Between Federated Miscellaneous Workers' Union of Australia, West Australian Branch, Union of Workers, Applicant, and The Association of Employers of Waterside Labour (W.A. Inc.), The Fremantle Harbour Trust Commissioners and the Minister Controlling the State Shipping Service, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

## Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

## 3.—Definition of Watchman.

"Watchman" shall mean a person, other than a member of a ship's crew, employed to watch wharf premises, property or cargo on or about wharf premises, wharves, jetties, docks, slipways, vessels, punts, lighters or places of a like nature, or a person employed on fire prevention duty.

## 4.—Rates of Pay.

The minimum rates of wages payable to workers covered by the Award shall be:—

## (a) Hold Watchmen.

Hold watchmen employed in conjunction with loading or unloading of cargo shall be paid the general cargo rate payable to a member of the Waterside Workers' Federation.

- (ii) The hourly rate of pay shall be calculated as follows:—The sum of the basic wage plus a margin of eighteen shillings (18s.) plus ten per cent. (10%) for casual work, divided by forty (40).

## 5.—Hours of Duty.

## (a) Hold Watchmen.

Where employed in conjunction with the loading or unloading of cargo—same hours as members of the Waterside Workers' Federation working such cargo.

## (b) All Other Watchmen.

(i) Where work is continued throughout the period of twenty-four (24) hours and sufficient competent labour is available shifts to be worked:—

7 a.m. to 3 p.m.

3 p.m. to 11 p.m.

11 p.m. to 7 a.m.

(ii) For work commencing at 4 p.m., subject to sufficient competent labour being available, shifts to be worked from 4 p.m. to 11 p.m. with a relief from 11 p.m. to 7 a.m.

(iii) The foregoing subclause (i) and (ii) are subject to Clause 8 as to minimum period of employment.

## 6.—Overtime.

Overtime shall be paid as follows:—

(a) Hold Watchmen.—At the general cargo rate of pay appropriate to the period of employment for waterside workers.

(b) All Other Watchmen.—All time worked in excess of eight (8) hours in any one shift Monday to Friday inclusive, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.

## 7.—Saturday, Sunday and Holiday Work.

(a) Hold watchmen shall be paid at the general cargo appropriate rate of pay for a waterside worker for all time worked on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday.

(b) Watchmen, other than hold watchmen, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for all work performed on Saturdays, and at the rate of double time for all work performed on Sundays or the holidays specified in subclause (c) hereof.

(c) The holidays herein referred to are:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day, and Waterside Workers' Union Picnic Day.

#### 8.—Minimum Period of Engagement.

(a) Upon engagement and for each day of his employment a watchman shall be entitled to a minimum of four (4) hours pay at the rate appropriate to the period of work for which he was engaged, provided that—

- (i) if a hold watchman is unable to continue or commence work owing to rain or boisterous weather, any standing by time to be paid for at ordinary rates, but if the period is between midnight and 6 a.m. the minimum period shall be two hours ordinary rate, and two hours at the appropriate rate;
- (ii) for both hold and other watchmen waiting for the arrival of a ship to which they have been ordered, shall be paid at all times at ordinary rates;
- (iii) a hold watchman who is directed to continue watching in the hold of a ship which has been covered up owing to rain shall be paid the rate normally paid had loading or unloading operations continued in progress.

(b) Upon engagement, the employer shall state a definite starting time for which the employee is required.

#### 9.—Ferry Service.

When employed at North Wharf, watchmen shall be provided with free transport.

#### 10.—Pick-up Arrangements.

(a) All labour shall be engaged at the recognised pick-up place between the hours of 7.45 a.m. and 9.45 a.m. each day, except Saturdays, Sundays and holidays.

(b) Labour required to commence work between the hours of 7.45 a.m. on Fridays and 7.45 a.m. Mondays shall be engaged at the Friday pick-up.

(c) The Union shall maintain a register of unemployed watchmen who are available for the purpose of meeting emergency requirements outside of pick-up hours. The employer shall secure from this register of unemployed members such labour as is required, provided he is satisfied as to the competency of the men for the particular job or jobs to be filled.

#### 11.—Board of Reference.

(a) For the purpose of this Award, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award or any of them;
- (ii) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

(b) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

#### 12.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Subject to any agreement which may be made between the Union and any individual employer, all wages shall be made up to 11 p.m. on Tuesday night of each week and shall be available for collection by the worker at 11.45 a.m. on Friday.

(b) Wages shall be paid to the time in respect to which they are payable. Broken time shall be paid to the next half hour.

#### 13.—Meal Money.

(a) Payment of three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) meal money shall be paid to hold watchmen for the midday and subsequent meal hour when called upon to work through Sundays.

(b) Other watchmen required to work overtime in excess of two (2) hours, unless the necessary meals are provided by the employer, shall not less than three (3) hours before the commencement of work on the day upon which overtime is to be worked be given notice of the employer's intention to work overtime. If such notice is not given or if the overtime of which notice has been given is not worked, each employee concerned shall be paid three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) for each meal occurring in such overtime hours.

#### 14.—Travelling Time.

Notwithstanding the provisions of subclauses 5 (b) (i) and (ii) of this Award, the following hours of duty shall apply to watchmen employed on ships at the B.H.P. Jetty, Kwinana.

- (a) Day shift, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- (b) Afternoon shift, 5 p.m. to 12 midnight.
- (c) Night shift, 12 midnight to 8 a.m.

Thirty minutes prior to the commencing time of each shift watchmen shall report for duty as required by the employer for conveyance to Kwinana.

When watchmen travel to and from Kwinana outside the hours prescribed in this clause or after the completion of overtime worked on any day or shift they shall be paid 30 minutes travelling time each way at ordinary rates.

Watchmen employed on night shift and being discharged prior to the ordinary finishing time of the shift shall be provided with transport in accordance with the conditions then prevailing for such transport in such hours for waterside workers.

#### 15.—Term.

This Award shall operate for a period of three (3) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

13A.—Hours of Evening Overtime Work.

Subject to the other provisions of this Award:

(a) Overtime will be worked as required by the employer between the hours of 5 p.m. and 8 p.m., or 6 p.m. and 9.30 p.m.

(b) On Friday nights and on those two Monday nights when the Union and the Shipwrights' Union conduct their regular monthly meetings, the employer shall not, except in order to finish a job or in other cases of urgency require employees to work overtime.

(c) On Monday nights, other than those referred to in subclause (b) hereof, any employer may require employees to work overtime in special circumstances or where the employers anticipate that no overtime will be required on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday of that week.
