WHEREAS by section 3 of the Perth Gas Company's Act, 1886-1937, it is enacted that the limits of that Act shall extend to and include the City of Perth, and every place being within a circle of five miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth, and every other place outside the circle of five miles to which the Governor may from time to time by Proclamation declare that the Act shall extend; and whereas it is also provided by that section that the Governor shall not make or issue any Proclamation under that section to extend the limits of that Act to any place situated within the district of any municipal council or of any road board outside the said circle of five miles unless and until the municipal council or the road board concerned (as the case may be) has by resolution consented thereto; and whereas the Canning Road Board and the Belmont Park Road Board have by resolutions passed on the 22nd July, 1957, and the 1st July, 1957, respectively, consented to the extension of the limits of the Act to those portions of the Canning Road District and the Belmont Park Road District described in the Schedule hereunder: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers aforesaid and of every other power in this behalf me enabling, do hereby proclaim and declare that the limits of the Act shall extend to and include those portions of the Canning Road District and the Belmont Park Road District described in the Schedule hereunder which are outside the circle of five miles from the General Post Office in the City of Perth.

The Schedule.

Portion of the Canning Road District
Referred to Above.

All that portion of the Canning Road District bounded by lines starting at the intersection of an arc of a circle having a radius of five miles from the General Post Office (as defined in the Perth Gas Company's Act, 1886) and the north-eastern boundary of lot 97 of Canning Location 2 (L.T.O. Plan 2653) and extending south-easterly along the latter boundary and onwards to the south-eastern side of Division Street (road No. 8219); thence north-easterly along that side to a point situate in prolongation north-westerly of the north-eastern boundary of lot 70; thence south-easterly to and along that boundary and that of lot 69; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundaries of lots 336, 335 and 334 (L.T.O. Plan 2430); thence south-easterly along the north-eastern boundaries of lots 334, 339, 340, 341 and 342 and onwards to the south-eastern side of Newburn Road (road No. 248); thence generally southerly along that side; thence generally east-south-easterly along the northern side of Welshpool Road to the southern corner of location 247; thence south-westerly to and along the north-western side of Williams Street to the eastern corner of location 315; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundary of that location to a point situate in prolongation north-easterly of the centre of Lacey Street (road No. 2764); thence south-westerly and generally south-south-westerly to and along the centre of Lacey Street, the north-western boundaries of locations 316 and 6 and the centre of Nicholson Road (roads numbered 1352, 357, 461 and 639) and onwards to the north-eastern side of Acourt Road (road No. 8945); thence generally north-westerly along that side; thence generally northerly along the eastern sides of Johnston Road to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the north-eastern side of Clifton Road; thence north-westerly to and

along that side and onwards to the north-western side of Beasley Road; thence north-easterly along that side to the northern side of road No. 441; thence generally westerly along that side to the southern boundary of location 28; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of locations 28 and 26 and the eastern side of Fifth Avenue to the northern side of Bulls Creek Road (road No. 1614); thence westerly along that side to the right bank of Bulls Creek; thence generally northerly and generally north-easterly downwards along the right bank of Bulls Creek and upwards along the left bank of the Canning River to an arc of the circle as aforesaid; and thence generally north-easterly along that arc to the starting point.

Portion of the Belmont Park Road District
Referred to Above.

All that portion of the Belmont Park Road District bounded by lines starting at the junction of the left bank of the Swan River and the north-eastern boundary of Swan Location 28 and extending south-easterly along that boundary and onwards to and along the south-western boundary of location 1307 to the western side of Newburn Road (road No. 168); thence generally south-westerly along the western sides of Newburn Road (roads numbered 168 and 248) to the eastern corner of lot 342 of Canning Location 2 (L.T.O. Plan 2430); thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundaries of lots 342, 341, 340, 339 and 334; thence south-westerly along the north-western boundaries of lots 334, 335 and 336; thence north-westerly along the north-eastern boundaries of lots 69 and 70 (L.T.O. Plan 2653) and onwards to the south-eastern side of Division Street (road No. 8219); thence south-westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation south-easterly of the north-eastern boundary of lot 97; thence north-westerly to and along that boundary to an arc of a circle having a radius of five miles from the General Post Office (as defined in the Perth Gas Company's Act, 1886); thence generally northerly along that arc to the left bank of the Swan River aforesaid; and thence generally north-easterly, upwards, along that bank to the starting point.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 2 of the Unfair Trading and Profit Control Act Amendment Act, 1957, that that Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby fix the 30th day of December, 1957, as the day on which the Unfair Trading and Profit Control Act Amendment Act, 1957, shall come into operation.

Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1939.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by section 15 of the Wheat Products (Prices Fixation) Act, 1938-1939, that the Governor may, from time to time, on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee constituted pursuant to that Act, by Proclamation, fix the minimum and the maximum price at which substances included in the definition of wheat products may be sold in the State, or in any specified part of the State, by the manufacturer thereof or by any person, and that the Governor may from time to time revoke or vary any Proclamation under the section by a subsequent Proclamation; and whereas the Governor, by Proclamation dated the 8th day of August, 1956, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 10th day of August, 1956, fixed the prices at which bread, being a wheat product within the meaning of the Act, may be sold by any person in the various parts of the State specified in that Proclamation; and whereas that Proclamation was varied by Proclamations dated the 5th day of September, 1956; the 3rd day of April, 1957, and the 7th day of August, 1957, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 7th day of September, 1956; the 5th day of April, 1957, and the 9th day of August, 1957, respectively: Now, therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and on the recommendation of the Wheat Products Prices Committee, and in exercise of the power conferred upon me by the Act, do hereby—

- revoke those Proclamations dated the 8th day of August, 1956, the 5th day of September, 1956, the 3rd day of April, 1957, and the 7th day of August, 1957, and
- fix as the maximum price at which bread, being a wheat product within the meaning of the Act, may be sold by any person in the various parts of the State specified in the First, Second, Third and Fourth Schedules of this Proclamation, at the respective maximum prices set out in those Schedules.

For the purposes of this Proclamation, unless inconsistent with the context—

“Perth Metropolitan Area” means that portion of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of 25 miles from the General Post Office at Perth;

“South-West Land Division” means that portion of the State defined in the Land Act, 1933-1956, as the South-West Land Division, excluding the Perth Metropolitan Area;

“Kalgoorlie-Boulder Area” means all that area of the State comprised in an imaginary circle having a radius of eight miles from the principal post office at Kalgoorlie;

“bread” means white bread, wholemeal bread, wholewheatmeal bread and brown bread;

“delivery town” means a townsite in which a door to door delivery of bread to consumers is made within the boundary of that townsite, by one or more bakers operating a bakery or bakeries in that townsite;

“non-delivery town” means a townsite in which no door to door delivery of bread to consumers is made within the boundary of that townsite by any baker operating a bakery in that townsite;

“cash sale” means in relation to a sale of bread, a sale where payment is made for the bread so sold within seven days of the sale;

“booked sale” means a sale where payment is not made for the bread so sold within seven days of the sale;

“placed on public transport” means the delivery of bread packaged and labelled, to rail, carrier or public transport;

“freight paid” means any charge or payment which is paid or payable by any person, other than a consumer in the transportation or delivery of bread by rail, carrier, or public transport from any town in the South-West Land Division or any town specified in the Fourth Schedule to this Proclamation in which that bread is baked, to any place beyond the boundaries of such towns;

“prescribed margin” in relation to the sale of bread means, in respect of a 1 lb. loaf of bread, a margin of three farthings and in respect of a 2 lb. loaf of bread, a margin of three half-pence;

“1 lb. loaf” means a No. 1 loaf within the meaning of section 4 of the Bread Act, 1903-1949;

“2 lb. loaf” means a No. 2 loaf within the meaning of section 4 of the Bread Act, 1903-1949.

For the purposes of this Proclamation—

- where two 1 lb. loaves are sold together to the same person at the same time, the price shall not exceed the maximum price fixed for one 2 lb. loaf;
- where any maximum price calculated in accordance with the provisions of the Proclamation is not an exact multiple of one half-penny, then such maximum price shall be computed to the nearest upward half-penny.

- (2) does hereby revoke the determination of the areas in and for which each court shall exercise jurisdiction as effected by the same Order in Council; and
- (3) does hereby revoke the appointments of special magistrates for particular courts as made by Orders in Council published in the *Government Gazette* on the 6th December, 1957; and
- (4) does hereby establish as special courts to be called Children's Courts, courts at the places and by the names set out in column one of the First Schedule to this Order in Council; and
