IN pursuance of the provisions of the above Act, and subject to the conditions therein prescribed, the Court of Arbitration hereby adjusts and amends the basic wage declarations made on the 7th day of December, 1950, and the 28th day of November, 1951, so as to read and have effect as follows:—

Adults.

(1) Metropolitan Area, which for this purpose shall be taken to be that portion of the State comprised within a radius of fifteen (15) miles from the General Post Office, Perth:

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 13 of 1957.

(Regd. 12th December, 1957.)

Between the Seamen's Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle, Applicant, and Alf E. Tilley and Co. Proprietary Limited, Respondents.

THIS agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1956, this 26th day of November, 1957, between Alf E. Tilley and Co. Proprietary Limited (hereinafter called the "employer") of the one part and the Seamen's Union of Western Australia Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle (hereinafter called the "Union"), of the other part, witnesseth as follows:—

1.-Area and Scope.

This agreement shall have effect on the launches and barges operated by Messrs. Alf E. Tilley and Co. Proprietary Limited, on the Swan River and the Fremantle Harbour and shall replace Agreement No. 25 of 1949.

2.-Rates of Pay.

(a) Basic Wage £13 12s. 9d. per week.

Youths (according to age).

Under 16—50 per cent. of basic wage. Under 17—60 per cent. of basic wage. Under 18½—80 per cent. of basic wage. Over 18½—basic wage. Over 20—£2 per week margin.

- (b) (i) Employees called upon to work at loading or unloading garbage and/or ashes or other like material shall be paid 2s. 6d. per hour or portion thereof in addition to the foregoing rates.
- (ii) Employees called upon to work on slipways slipping, cleaning, scraping, painting or overhauling launches, barges, punts, or any other floating plant shall be paid the percentage appropriate to their age, as set out in this clause, of the basic wage plus a margin of £1 10s. per week.
- (iii) Employees required to work in the bilges shall be paid the rates set out in (b) (ii) of this clause plus the sum of 2s. 6d. per hour.

3.—Hours of Duty.

- (a) Forty hours shall constitute a week's work.
- (b) The hours of labour shall be eight (8) consecutive hours exclusive of meal hours between 7.30 a.m. and 5.30 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive
- (c) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.

4.—Overtime.

- (a) Overtime shall mean and include all time worked in excess or outside of the usual hours of duty and shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) An employee required to work on a Saturday shall be paid at the rate of time and one-half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (c) For all work performed on Sundays and public holidays, double time shall be paid, with a minimum as for two (2) hours.
- $(\mbox{\em d})$ Broken time will be counted to the next quarter hour.
- (e) If an employee is recalled to work after leaving his job he shall be paid a minimum of two (2) hours.

5.—Annual Leave.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by the employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (b) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (c) A worker may be rostered off and granted annual leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed prior to the completion of twelve (12) months' continuous service, in which case, should the services of such worker terminate or be terminated prior to the completion of twelve (12) months' continuous service, the said worker shall refund to the employer the difference between the amount received by him for wages in respect of the period of his annual leave and the amount which would have accrued to him by reason of the termination of his services.
- (d) (i) Subject to paragraph (ii), when computing the annual leave due under this clause, no deduction shall be made from such leave in respect of the period that a worker is on annual leave and/or holidays: Provided that no deduction shall be made for any approved period a worker is absent from duty through sickness, with or without pay, unless the absence exceeds three (3) calendar months, in which case deduction may be made for such excess only.
- (ii) Approved periods of absence from work caused through accident sustained in the course of employment shall not be considered breaks in continuity of service, but the first six (6) months only of such period shall count as service for the purpose of computing annual leave.

- (e) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled to such holidays on full pay as are proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer.
- (f) Any worker who may resign or be dismissed from the service for any cause, other than for peculation or theft, shall be entitled to receive payment for any annual leave which may have been due up to the time of leaving the service: Provided always that if the worker has been dismissed for peculation or theft no claim for annual leave shall be recognised. Misconduct herein referred to shall not effect accumulated annual leave or payment therefor.
- (g) When work is closed down for the purpose of allowing annual leave to be taken, workers with less than a full year's service shall only be entitled to payment during such period for the number of days' leave due to them: Provided that nothing herein contained shall deprive the employer of his right to retain such workers at work during the close down period as may be required.
- (h) "Ordinary wages" for the purpose of subclause (a) hereof shall mean the rate of wage the worker has received for the greatest proportion of the calendar month prior to him taking the leave.
- (i) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

6.-Public Holidays.

- (a) Except as hereinafter provided, each of the following days, or the day in lieu thereof, shall be allowed as a holiday to all workers and be paid for, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, Foundation Day, Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day and Boxing Day: Provided that in lieu of Queen's Birthday, Union Picnic Day, may be allowed and paid for as a holiday under this Award.
- (b) Whenever one of the holidays specified in subclause (a) of this clause falls on an employee's ordinary working day, and the employee is not required to work on that day, he shall be paid for the ordinary hours he would have worked on that day if it had not been a holiday.
- (c) In the case of workers working a five-day week, no payment shall be granted for any public holiday falling on a Saturday.
- (d) Payment for holidays shall be in accordance with the usual hours of work.
- (e) Payment shall not be made for any holiday which occurs whilst a worker is off duty owing to leave without pay, or sickness, including accidents off duty, excepting time for which he is entitled to sick pay.
- (f) When a worker is on duty or available for duty on the whole of the working day immediately preceding a holiday, or resumes duty or is available for duty on the whole of the working day immediately following a holiday, as prescribed in subclause (a), he shall be paid for such holiday.
- (g) Subject to subclause (i) of this clause, a casual worker shall not be entitled to payment for any holiday referred to in this clause.
- (h) The Union shall give the employer not less than fourteen (14) days' notice, in writing, of the date on which it is intended to hold the Union picnic.
- (i) For all work done by a casual worker on any holiday referred to in this clause, double ordinary basic time rates shall be paid.

7.—Wet Work.

- (a) Any worker working in water or "wet places" shall be paid an extra allowance of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day or part of a day.
- (b) "Wet places" shall mean places where, in the performance of the work the splashing of water and mud saturates the worker's clothing, or where protection is not provided to prevent splashings or drippings sufficient to saturate his clothing, and

shall include wet material or wet ground in which it is impracticable for the worker wearing ordinary working boots to work without getting wet feet. Provided this clause shall not apply to men working on natural surfaces made wet by rain.

8.—Payment of Wages.

(a) Workers shall be paid weekly.

- (b) All men whose employment is terminated shall be paid within four (4) office hours from the time of the termination of employment. If this period is exceeded, they shall be paid at ordinary rates from the time of the termination of employment until they are paid.
- (c) When a worker leaves his employment before the usual pay day he shall on giving notice of his intention to leave, be paid his full wages on the day he leaves.

9.—Meal Hours.

- (a) The meal times allowed shall be breakfast—any consecutive sixty (60) minutes between 7 a.m. and 9 a.m.; dinner—any consecutive sixty (60) minutes between 12 noon and 2.15 p.m.; tea—any consecutive sixty (60) minutes between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m.
- (b) For all work performed during the above meal hours, double rates shall be paid and continue to be paid until the employee has been knocked off for a meal.
- (c) Where it is necessary in the opinion of the Master or Officer in Charge of the ship, a member of the crew may be called upon to curtail his meal hour subject to the following provisions:—
 - (i) If the time curtailed exceeds half an hour no meal break will be recognised and the provisions of subclause (b) of this clause shall apply.
 - (ii) If the time curtailed is less than half an hour, payment shall be made as for half an hour at double rates of pay.
- (d) The crew to be worked at the Master's discretion.
- (e) For the purpose of this agreement the time when a ship is under way shall be counted as time actually worked.

10.—Casual Workers.

(a) A casual worker is one for whom work over a period of fourteen (14) consecutive days (not including holidays) is not provided by the employer. Such worker shall be entitled to twenty per cent. (20%) over the ordinary wage for the work performed by him.

11.—Rest Periods.

A rest period of fifteen (15) minutes from the time of ceasing to the time of resumption of work shall be allowed each morning. This interval shall be counted as time off duty without deduction of pay and shall be arranged at a time and in a manner to suit the convenience of the employer. Morning tea may be taken by employees during this interval.

12.—Contract of Service.

- (a) Except in the case of a casual worker whose engagement shall be by the hour, the contract of service of every worker shall be a weekly contract terminable on either side by one (1) week's notice given on any day or by payment on any day of one (1) week's wages in lieu of such notice.
- (b) Any worker not attending for duty shall lose his pay for the actual time of such non-attendance subject to the provisions of clause 13 (sick leave) or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award.
- (c) This clause does not effect the right to dismiss for misconduct in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

13.—Sick Leave.

(a) (i) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service.

- (ii) The liability of the employer shall in no case exceed one (1) week's wages during each calendar year in respect of each worker but the sick leave herein provided shall be allowed to accumulate and any portion unused in any year may be availed of in the next or any succeeding year.
- (iii) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (b) The clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1944.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer or his representative of sickness but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) consecutive working days or more.
- (d) No payment shall be made for any absence due to the worker's own fault, neglect or misconduct.
- (e) (i) Periods of service of less than one (1) month shall not be included as service for the computation of sick leave.
- (ii) Periods of one (1) month and over shall be totalled and payment for sick leave computed on the total of such service during the year.
 - (f) This clause shall not apply to casual workers.

14.—Oilskins, etc.

Upon the request of the employee each deckhand for his own use shall be supplied by the employer with an oilskin, south-wester, overalls and gloves.

15.—Preference.

Preference shall be given to members of the Union with regard to employment. Employment of such members shall be made at the pick-up of the Union between the hours of 10 and 11 a.m. provided that in cases of urgency, or such members not being available to perform the work to be done, outside of the pick-up time and by arrangement with Union, engagement may be made to meet the need of such circumstances.

16.—Board of Reference.

The Board of Reference shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives nominated by the parties.

There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of:—

- (i) Classifying and fixing wages, rates and conditions for any machine, occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in the Award;
 - (ii) adjusting any difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
 - (iii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

17.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the date of signing. Provided that at any time after twelve (12) months from this date the Agreement may be amended, upon the application of any party.

(a) Add a new clause to each of the said Awards as follows:—As to Award No. 11 of 1946—Clause 18A; Award No. 26 of 1947—Clause 11A; Award No. 37 of 1947—Clause 30; Award No. 59 of 1948—Clause 11A; Award No. 33 of 1947—Clause 9A; Award No. 34 of 1947—Clause 10A.

Long Service Leave.

(a) Entitlement to Leave.

A worker shall in respect of continuous service with one and the same employer be entitled to the long service leave as hereinafter prescribed.

(b) Period of Leave.

The amount of such entitlement in the case of a worker who has completed at least twenty (20) years' continuous service with one and the same employer shall be—

- (i) in respect of the twenty (20) years' service so completed—thirteen (13) weeks' leave; and
- (ii) in respect of each ten (10) years' service with such employer completed after such twenty (20) years—six and one-half $(6\frac{1}{2})$ weeks' leave.
- (c) Pro Rata Entitlement on Termination.
- (i) Where a worker has completed at least ten (10) years but less than fifteen (15) years of continuous service with one and the same employer and his employment is terminated by the employer for any cause other than serious misconduct, or by death during his employment, or by the worker on account of personal sickness or injury or domestic or any other pressing necessity where such personal sickness, injury or necessity is of such nature as, in the opinion of the employer or, in the event of a dispute, of the Special Board of Reference, to justify such termination, the worker shall be entitled (or, in the case of death, his personal representative shall be entitled) to such payment as

equals a proportionate amount of leave in respect of the period of completed years of such service, on the basis of thirteen (13) weeks for twenty (20) years' service.

(ii) Where a worker has completed at least fifteen (15) years' continuous service with one and the same employer and his employment is terminated for any reason other than by the employer for serious misconduct, he shall be entitled (or, in the case of death, his personal representative shall be entitled) to such payment as equals a proportionate amount of leave in respect of the period of completed years of such service since the commencement of his continuous service, or since the last accrual of entitlement to leave, on the basis of thirteen (13) weeks for twenty (20) years' service

(d) Calculation of Continuous Service.

- (1) For the purpose of this clause, the following absences (whether before or after the commencement of this clause) shall not break the continuity of service and shall, subject to any limitatation herein, count as service:—
 - (i) Absence in respect of any period during which the worker shall have served as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia (other than as a member of the permanent forces of the Commonwealth of Australia—except where such service occurs after 26th June, 1950, in Korea or Malaya and other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan), or as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939 (as amended), or absence on compulsory service in any of the armed forces under the National Service Act, 1951 as amended): Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such absence.
 - (ii) Absence on any annual leave or long service leave.
 - (iii) Absence following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations under this Award in respect of long service leave or annual leave; and
 - (iv) absence necessitated by personal sickness or injury of which not more than fifteen
 (15) working days a year shall count as service.
- (2) For the purposes of this clause the following absences (whether before or after the commencement of this clause) shall not break the continuity of service, but the period of such absence shall not count as service:—
 - (i) Absence following any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade, if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two (2) months from the date of such termination.
 - (ii) Absence during any standing down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of the relevant clause of this Award.
 - (iii) Absence following any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade, if the worker is reemployed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six (6) months from the date of such termination.
 - (iv) Absence of the worker authorised by the employer at any time;
 - (v) Absence arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute, but only if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute; and
 - (vi) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave

- (3) After the coming into operation of this clause, absence from work by reason of any cause, not being a cause specified in this sub-clause, shall not be deemed to break the continuity of service for the purpose of this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen (14) days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service. Such notice may be given by delivering it to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.
 - (e) Service Before Commencement of Clause.

For the purpose of computing entitlement to leave, continuous service of a worker with one and the same employer immediately prior to the coming into operation of this clause shall be taken into account, but only to the extent of the last twenty (20) completed years of such service.

(f) Time of Taking Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or, in the absence of such agreement, at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.

(g) Notice to Take Leave.

Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to, the ϵ mployer shall give to a worker three (3) months' notice (where practicable), or in any case at least one (1) month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.

(h) Broken Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted and taken in one continuous period or, if the worker and employer so agree, in not more than three (3) separate periods in respect of the first thirteen (13) weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.

(i) Granting of Leave Before Due Date.

- (i) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow long service leave to such worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case, the worker shall not become entitled to any further long service leave in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such long service leave had been taken before it accrued due.
- (ii) Where long service leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to this subclause before the right thereto has accrued due, and the worker subseuently leaves or dies or is discharged from the service of the employer, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment, a proportionate amount on the basis of thirteen (13) weeks for twenty (20) years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he is not at the date of the termination of his employment or prior thereto, entitled

(j) Payment for Period of Leave.

- (i) Each worker shall be paid for each week of leave his ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he enters upon the period of leave. Such ordinary time rate shall be for the standard hours prescribed by this Award, but in the case of casuals and part-time workers for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.
- (ii) Provided that, whereby agreement between the employer and the worker, the taking of the leave due to the worker or any portion of it is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date of accrual, or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the enters upon the period of leave.

- (iii) "Ordinary time rate of pay"-
 - (a) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like, except district allowance when the worker or his family or dependants remain in the award area, and industry allowance:
 - (b) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave.
- (iv) Payment in the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by result shall be at ordinary time rates.

Liberty is reserved to the parties to apply to amend this subclause.

(k) Method of Payment.

Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—

- (i) In full before the worker goes on leave; or
- (ii) at the same times as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
- (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.

(1) Payment on Termination for Leave Not Taken.

Where the employment of a worker is terminated and he has an entitlement to long service leave, the employer shall thereupon pay to the worker a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of long service leave to which the worker would have been entitled if he had taken the same at the time of such termination.

(m) Payment on Death.

Where a worker dies during his employment and any long service leave to which he is entitled under this clause has not been taken or received in full by the worker, the employer shall, upon request by the personal representative of the deceased worker, pay to that representative the amount due in respect of such leave. The obligation of the employer to such worker in respect of long service leave shall be and shall be deemed to have been satisfied by such payment.

(n) Public Holidays and Annual Leave During Period of Leave.

Any long service leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken, but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.

(o) Transmission of Business.

For the purposes of this clause, where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation of this clause, been transmitted from an employer (in this subclause called the transmitter) to another employer (in this subclause called the transmittee) and a worker who at the time of such transmission was a worker employed by the transmittor in that business becomes a worker employed by the transmitter.

- the continuity of the service of such worker shall be deemed not to have been broken by reason only to the transmission; and
- (ii) the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (or any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be continuous service of the worker with the transmittee.

In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer conveyance assignment or succession whether by agreement or by operation of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(p) Transfer of Workers to Associated Companies.

Where a worker, either at the request or with the consent of the employer being a company, transfers his employment to that of another company associated with that of the original employer, the continuity of the worker's service shall not be deemed to have been broken by reason only of such transfer and the period of the continuous service the worker has had with the original employer shall be deemed to be continuous service with the company to which the worker transfers. For the purpose of this subclause, companies shall be deemed to be associated companies when one company is a subsidiary of the other or where two companies are each a subsidiary of a third company.

(q) Records to be Kept.

- (i) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of twelve (12) months (three (3) years in case of death) thereafter keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made in accordance with this clause.
- (ii) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the time and wages record.

(r) Special Board of Reference.

- (i) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose of this clause to which all disputes and matters arising under this clause shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.
- (ii) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of— $\,$
 - (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising out of this clause;
 - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it by this clause.
- (iii) The Special Board of Reference shall consist of the Registrar of the Court or his deputy if he be unable to act as Chairman and one (1) representative nominated by The Chamber of Mines of W.A. (Incorporated) and one by the Union.

(s) Prohibition of Working During Period of Leave.

- (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) of this subclause, no worker shall, without the consent of the employer, during any period when he is on long service leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward. If a worker breaches this provision he shall, at the discretion of the employer, thereupon forfeit all his current leave rights under this clause and the employer shall be entitled to cancel any further payment in respect of those rights and to reclaim at law any payments already made on account of such period during which the worker was so engaged in employment.
- (ii) This subclause shall not apply in the case of former workers who have received payment in lieu of leave on termination of their employment in accordance with subclause (c) of this clause.

(t) Exemptions.

Any employer who provides or proposes to provide a scheme for long service leave which, viewed as a whole, is more favourable to the worker than the provisions herein prescribed, may apply to the Court for exemption from the provisions of this clause and the Court may at its discretion refuse or grant such exemption, subject to such conditions (if any) as to the modification of the scheme or otherwise as the Court thinks desirable.

Fletcher on behalf Drivers and Firemen's Union of Workers of Western Australia, and Mr. R. W. Fletcher on behalf of the Electrical Trades Union of Workers of Australia (Western Australian Goldfields Subbranch), Kalgoorlie, the Court, in pursuance of the powers contained in section 92 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, doth hereby order and declare that Awards Nod. 11 of 1946, 26 of 1947, 37 of 1947 and 59 of 1948 as amended and consolidated, be and the same are hereby further amended by the deletion in each case of the clause relating to "Shift Work" or "shifts," as the case may be, and the substitution of a new clause therefor, and that the clause in each case contained for, and that the clause in each case contained therein relating to "Continuous Process Workers" be also amended in the terms of the attached

- Shift Work or Shifts (as the case may be).

 (a) (i) A worker who does not work at least one (1) week on day shift out of each consecutive three (3) weeks shall be paid for each shift other than day shift at the rate of time and one-quarter. Provided that if he is required to work for more than one (1) week consecutively on afternoon shift or for more than one (1) week consecutively on night shift, such a worker shall be paid at the rate of time and one-quarter for each shift other than day shift in the consecutive second and subsequent weeks of afternoon shift or of night shift. shift.
- (ii) This subclause shall not apply to workers employed on what is known as the Great Boulder Roster, or accepted variations thereof, nor to workers to whom this subclause would only otherwise apply because of a change of shift due to a private arrangement with another worker, nor to workers (known as "rostered relief workers") regularly (known as "rostered relief workers") regularly employed on continuous process work who are required to work shifts to enable other workers engaged on such work to change shifts weekly and to have their days off, if such rostered relief worker is not required to work more night shifts or more afternoon shifts than the number of day shifts worked by him.
- (b) A worker employed on any shift other than day shift shall be paid for afternoon shift five per cent. (5%) and for night shift ten per cent. (10%) in addition to his ordinary rate.

- (c) (i) Where any particular process is carried out on shifts other than day shift, and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon or five (5) consecutive night shifts are worked on that process, then workers employed on such afternoon or night shifts shall be paid at overtime rates.
- (ii) The sequence of work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraph by reason of the fact that work on the process is not carried out on a Saturday or Sunday or on any public holiday.
- (d) (i) A worker who replaces a regular shift worker who is absent for any reason beyond the control of the employer, on afternoon or night shift, shall be paid at the rate of time and one-quarter if he does not work for five (5) consecutive shifts (other than day shift) or, in the case of the Great Boulder Roster, six (6) shifts and the appropriate shift work rate if he works five (5) or more of such shifts consecutively or, in the case of the Great Boulder Roster, six (6) or more shifts consecutively shifts consecutively.
- (ii) A worker who replaces on afternoon or night shift a regular shift worker who is absent by reason of a direction of the employer shall be paid at overtime rates unless he works the number of consecutive shifts prescribed in the next preceding paragraph.
- (iii) The sequence of consecutive shifts shall not be deemed to be broken under paragraph (i) by reason of rostered days off in respect to workers employed on continuous process work or by a Saturday or Sunday in respect to other workers or by any public holiday or any other reason beyond the control of the employer.
- (iv) A worker who does not work five (5) consecutive shifts for any reason beyond the control of the employer shall not be entitled to payment under the provisions of this subclause.
 - (b) Clause 9 (Awards Nod. 26 of 1947 and 59 of 1948) and Clause 10 (Awards Nod. 11 of 1946 and 37 of 1947)—"Continuous Process Workers."

In subclause (g) of each clause insert before the word "Sunday" the words "Saturday and."

(c) General liberty is reserved to the parties to apply to amend the provisions of these amendments relating to matters restricted to those properly to be mentioned at a "speaking to the minutes.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

No. 1 of 1958.

Registered 21st January, 1958.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 24th day of December, 1957, between the Federated Engine Drivers and Firemen's Union of Western Australia (hereinafter called "the Union") of the one part, and Dansk Aktieselskab Christiani & Nielsen and Clouch Contraction Co. Etc. 14th trading on and Dansk Aktieseiskab Christiani & Nielsen and Clough Construction Co. Pty. Ltd., trading as Christiani & Nielsen (Australia) (hereinafter called "the employer") of the other part, witnesseth that, for the considerations hereinafter appearing, the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:—

1.—Title.

This Agreement shall be known as the "Engine Drivers' (Bridge Building) Agreement, 1957."

2.—Arrangement.

3.—Area and Scope.

This Agreement shall operate over the areas actually occupied and controlled by Christiani & Nielsen (Australia) and shall apply to all workers employed in the classifications referred to herein.

4.—Term.

This Agreement shall operate for a period of two (2) years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

5.—Contract of Service.

One (1) week's notice on either side shall be necessary to terminate the contract of service of any worker, other than a casual worker (where the notice shall be one (1) hour). If the required notice is not given, one (1) week's (or one (1) hour's, in the case of a casual worker) pay shall be paid or forfeited, as the case may be.

6.-Breakdowns, Etc.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union or through any breakdown of the employer's machinery, or from any other cause for which the employer is not responsible, with the exception of wet weather, in which case the decision as to whether it is too wet to work shall rest with the engineer in charge, if available, and, in his absence, the foreman.

7.—Casual Workers.

A worker engaged for less than one (1) week (except a worker who is dismissed for inefficiency or misconduct or who leaves the service of the employer of his own volition) shall be deemed a casual hand and whilst engaged as such shall be entitled to receive ten per cent. (10%) in addition to the minimum rate herein prescribed.

8.—Higher Duties.

Any worker carrying out work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary work for two (2) hours in any shift shall be paid at the minimum rate for such work for the whole of that shift. Provided that such minimum is not lower than such worker's regular rate of pay. If he be employed for less than two (2) hours at work classified at a higher minimum than his ordinary rate, he shall be paid his ordinary rate for the whole shift.

9.—Hours.

- (a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work.
- (b) Such ordinary hours shall be worked by day workers in five shifts of eight hours each, Monday to Friday, and by shift workers in eight hour shifts.

10.—Shift Work.

If shifts are worked, workers employed on afternoon shifts shall be paid an additional five per cent. (5%) and if on night shifts, shall be paid an additional seven and a half per cent. $(7\frac{1}{2}\%)$.

A worker employed on shift work, who is not allowed to rotate day shift with afternoon and/or night shift, shall be paid a loading of twenty-five per cent. (25%) on the ordinary rates of pay for such work performed on afternoon and/or night shift. Provided that this provision shall not apply where the period for which afternoon and/or night shift is worked without rotation with day shift does not exceed two (2) weeks.

Any shift commencing before 6 a.m. or after 10 p.m. shall be deemed to be afternoon or night shift.

11.—Overtime.

- (a) (i) All work performed beyond eight (8) hours in any day or on Saturdays shall be deemed overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of one and a half times for the first two (2) hours and double time thereafter.
- (ii) All time worked on Sundays or on the holidays referred to in subclause 13 (a) hereof shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (b) (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates, and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) No organisation party to this Agreement, or worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

12.—Meal Money.

When a worker is required for overtime without having been notified on the previous day he shall be supplied with a meal or be paid three shillings (3s.) for a meal. Provided no such meal or payment is due unless the worker works more than one hour after the usual knock-off time. Provided that a worker who is allowed not less than one hour and a half in which to get a meal before resuming work, and facilities for obtaining a meal are available, shall not be entitled to meal money or a meal under this clause.

13.-Holidays.

- (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be observed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and Building Trades Picnic Day.
- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Agreement, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty, and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.
- (d) If after one (1) week's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period, a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-twenty-sixth (1/26th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed week of continuous service.
- (e) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (f) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (d) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (g) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (h) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

14.-Board of Reference.

(1) For the purpose of this Agreement, a Board of Reference is hereby appointed, which shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

The said Board shall have assigned to it, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of:—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;
- (b) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.
- (2) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

15.—Record.

- (a) Each employer shall keep a time and wages book showing the name of each worker, and the nature of his work, and hours worked each day, and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.
- (b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union, during the usual office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom.

16.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid at least once weekly within fifteen (15) minutes of the worker's knock-off time.

The employer shall not keep more than two days' pay in hand.

17.--Change Rooms.

The employer shall provide a suitable change room where the workers may change their clothes.

18.—First Aid.

An adequate first aid kit, maintained by the employer, shall be provided on the site.

19.—Maximum Rate.

The highest rate to which a worker employed subject to this Agreement shall be entitled is twice the ordinary rate of pay.

20.—Special Conditions.

- (a) Except as provided in this Agreement, the employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day when a worker fails to report for duty.
- to report for duty.

 (b) (i) If a worker is not notified before he leaves the job at the end of the day or shift that his services will not be required on the next day or shift, and such worker presents himself for work at the appointed starting time, he shall be paid for that day: Provided, however, that if the unemployment is on account of causes beyond the control of the management he shall be entitled to only two (2) hours' pay and be notified of the cause why he cannot be employed: Provided further that when the worker lives or resides in such close proximity to the work that he is under no necessity to incur any extra expense by a delayed notification of his services not being required, then such notice shall be deemed sufficient if given at such notice shall be deemed sufficient if given at least one (1) hour before the usual starting time.
- (ii) Employees not required to commence work on Saturdays or Sundays after having been directed to report for work on such days shall be paid two (2) hours at the appropriate rate applicable for such day and shall be paid all fares actually and necessarily incurred in travelling to and from the job and from the job.

21.—Oilskins.

The employer will supply oilskins free of charge to all workers required by the employer to work in the rain or in exposed positions, as approved by the engineer in charge.

22.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health at the rate of one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week's pay for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week's pay in each calendar year.

- (b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.
- (c) This clause shall not apply when the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (e) hereof, a worker, who in any calendar year has already been allowed paid sick leave, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health, if such certificate is demanded by the employer.
