PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1956, that for the purposes of the Act the word "Town" or "Townsite" means and includes, inter alia, any land (including privately owned subdivided land) which the Governor may see fit, as he is thereby empowered to declare by Proclamation, to be a town or townsite for the purposes of the Act; and whereas the Governor, by Proclamations dated the 11th June, 1937, the 31st March, 1939, and the 29th September, 1939, de-clared portions of the Bayswater Road District to be townsites within the meaning of section 5 of the Act; and whereas the whole of the land situate within the Bayswater Road District is land which the Governor may by virtue of section 5 of the Act declare by Proclamation to be a town or townsite for the purposes of the Act: Now, therefore I, the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, and in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Road Districts Act, 1919-1956, do hereby-

- (a) revoke those proclamations dated the 11th June, 1937, the 31st March, 1939, and the 29th September, 1939, and
- (b) declare that the whole of the land comprising the Bayswater Road District shall be a Townsite, to be known as "Bayswater Townsite," within the meaning and for the purposes of the Road Districts Act, 1919-1956.

> Health Act, 1911-1957. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.H.D. 1448/57.

WHEREAS in accordance with section 60 of the Health Act, 1911-1957, His Excellency the Governor has received details of a plan for the general installation of apparatus for the bacteriolytic treatment of sewage in the townsite of Kellerberrin by the Kellerberrin Road Board, and is satisfied that the scheme is formulated in accordance with the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1957, and that the cost and provisions for repayment justify the undertaking, and that the works, if carried out in the manner designed, will be of benefit to that portion of the district which the works are intended to serve: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby order that the Kellerberrin Road Board being the local authority for the Kellerberrin District, is empowered to undertake the construction of the said works.

Jetties Act, 1926-1957. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 5 of the Jetties Act, 1926-1957, that regulations made under the Act shall not, except where subsections (2), (3) and (4) of section 5 provide otherwise, apply to jetties forming part of any Government railway or under the control of the Commissioner of Railways; and whereas it is enacted by subsection (2) of section 5 that where the Governor, as he is hereby empowered to do by Order in Council, declares regulations made under the Act, whether before or after the coming into operation of the Jetties Act Amendment Act, 1957, shall apply in respect of the jetty accordingly: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the power conferred upon him by section 5 of the Jetties Act, 1926-1957, doth hereby declare that regulations made under the Act shall apply to the jetties at Geraldton, Busselton and Esperance.

Land Act, 1933-1956. ORDERS IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1956, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order in trust for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order: And whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Corr. No. 3622/15.—That reserve No. 16229 should vest in and be held by the Mount Marshall Road Board in trust for the purpose of Recreation.

(The Order in Council issued under Executive Council Minute No. 642, and dated 5th March, 1929, is hereby superseded.)

Corr. No. 1101/56.—That reserve No. 24473 should vest in and be held by the Lake Grace Road Board in trust for the purpose of Children's Play-ground

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by Section 37 of the said Act.

Land Act, 1933-1956. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Corr. No. 854/58.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1956, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of subleasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient that reserve 24978 should vest in and be held by the Midland Junction Municipality in trust for Infant Health Centre: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserve shall vest in and be held by the Midland Junction Municipality in trust for an Infant Health Centre with power to the said Midland Junction Municipality to lease the whole or any portion of the said reserve for any term not exceeding 21 years from the date of the lease.

Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954. Country Water Area.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954, that the Governor may, by Order in Council, extend a Country Water Area; and whereas by section 10

of the said Act it is further provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, extend a Rating Zone in a Country Water Area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby extend the Brunswick Country Water Area as defined in the Schedule hereunder and doth also hereby extend the Brunswick Rating Zone.

This Order in Council shall take effect on the 2nd day of April, 1958.

Extension of Brunswick Country Water Area and Brunswick Rating Zone.

location 16962 and onwards to and along the eastern boundaries of locations 17119 and 17116 and onwards to and along the eastern boundary of location 17108 to the north-eastern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence generally westerly along the northern boundaries of that location and along the northern boundaries of that location and of location 17107 and onwards to and along the northern boundaries of locations 17051, 17050 and 17094 and onwards to and along the northern boundaries of locations 17091, 17086 and 17083 to the north-western corner of the lastmentioned location; thence west-south-westerly to and along the northern boundaries of locations 17073, 17072, 17071, and 17070 to the south-western corner of 17071 and 17070 to the south-western corner of location 17077; thence north-north-westerly along the western boundary of that location to a point situate in prolongation east-north-easterly of the southern boundary of location 11411; thence westsouth-westerly across the Bruce Rock-Merredin Railway Reserve to and along the southern boundary of location 11411 aforesaid and that of location 11410 and onwards to the eastern boundary of location 11403; thence south-south-easterly and westerly along the eastern and southern boundaries of that location and the southern boundaries of locations 11402 and 27446 to the southernmost south-western corner of the lastmentioned location; thence northerly, westerly and again northerly along western, southern and western boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 16005; thence westerly and northerly along southern and western boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the northern boundary of location 18857; thence generally westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to and along that boundary and onwards to and along the northern boundaries of locations 26929 and 8509 to the western side of road number 9876; thence northerly to and along the western side of a one chain road passing along the eastern boundaries of locations 10745, 26671 (reserve 21196), 10745 aforesaid and 10744 to the north-eastern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence north-westerly to the south-eastern corner of location 18936; thence generally northerly along the western side of a two chain road passing along the eastern boundaries of locations 18936, 18937, 10722, 13311, 13221, 13209, 13230, 10716 and 13218 and onwards to the southern side of the Great Eastern Railway Reserve; thence easterly along that side to the western boundary of Baandee Townsite lot 31 (reserve 13872), a point on the western boundary of Baandee Townsite; thence southerly, south-easterly, again southerly, easterly and northerly along boundaries of that townsite to the northern side of the Great Eastern Railway Reserve aforesaid; thence generally easterly and north-easterly along that side to a point situate in pro-longation southerly of the eastern boundary of location 15614; thence northerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the southern boundary of location 10507; thence westerly, northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to the south-eastern corner of location 9911; thence northerly, easterly and again northerly along boundaries of that location to its north-eastern corner and onwards along eastern boundaries of locations 11397 and 11392 to the north-eastern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence westerly along the northern boundary of that location and onwards to a point situate in prolongation south-westerly of the south-eastern boundary of location 19156; thence north-easterly to and along that boundary to the south-eastern corner of that location; thence northerly along the eastern boundary of that location and onwards to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southernmost boundary of location 22940; thence westerly to and along that boundary and onwards to and along boundaries of locations 19263 and 22090 to the south-western corner of the lastmentioned location; thence northerly along the western boundary of that location to a south-western corner of location 19263 aforesaid; thence northerly, westerly, again northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western boundary of location 16647; thence northerly to and along that boundary and onwards to the southern boundary of location 12187; thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of that location and onwards to the southern boundary of location

12195; thence easterly along that boundary and the southern boundary of location 12194 to its the southern boundary of location 12194 to its south-eastern corner; thence generally northerly along the eastern boundary of that location and the eastern boundary of location 12193 to the north-eastern corner of the lastmentioned location and onwards to and along eastern and north-eastern boundaries of locations 23000 and 25439 to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of location 11085; thence northern boundary of location 11085; thence easterly to and along that boundary and onwards along the northern boundary of location 11084 to its north-eastern corner and onwards to and along northern boundaries of locations 11083, 20009, 20008, 20007 and 25021 and onwards to the western boundary of location 20006; thence generally northnorth-westerly and northerly along boundaries of that location and of locations 11095 and 11094 to the north-western corner of the lastmentioned location; thence easterly along the northern boundary of that location to its north-eastern corner than a north-eastern and the second to corner; thence north-easterly to the north-western corner of location 11105; thence east-north-easterly and easterly along the northern boundary of that location and of location 25664 and onwards to the south-western side of the Kununoppin-Merredin Railway Reserve; thence generally north-westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation westerly of the northern boundary of location 15194; thence easterly to and along that boundary and onwards to and along the northern boundary and onwards to and along the northern boundary of location 15188 and onwards to and along the northern boundaries of locations 14061 and 15168 to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the eastern boundary of location 14059; thence northerly to and along that boundary southern boundary of location 14052; to the thence easterly and northerly along boundaries of that location to the southernmost corner of location 14010; thence north-easterly along the southeastern boundary of that location and onwards to a south-western boundary of location 14042; thence generally north-westerly, northerly and easterly along boundaries of that location to a point situate in prolongation southerly of the western boundary of location 14043; thence northerly and southeasterly to and along boundaries of that location to the westernmost corner of location 14032; thence north-easterly along the north-western boundary of that location and onwards to and along the north-western boundaries of locations 14033 and 14035 to the north-western corner of the lastmentioned location; thence generally easterly along the northern boundary of that location and the northern boundary of location 14011 and onwards to and along the northern boundary of location 14029 to the northernmost north-eastern corner of the lastmentioned location; thence north-easterly to the north-western corner of location 14008; thence easterly to the northernmost north-eastern corner of that location; thence easterly to the north-western corner of location 14007; and thence easterly along the northern boundary of that location and onwards to the starting point. THE Court of Arbitration of Western Australia doth hereby make the following Award in connection with the industrial dispute between the abovenamed parties:-

This Award shall be known as the "Steel Industry Workers' (The Broken Hill Proprietary Company Limited) Award."

3.—Area and Scope.

This Award shall apply to the workers employed by the respondent in the vocations mentioned in Schedule "A" (i), (ii), (iii), (iv) and (v) hereof in the steel industry in the area occupied and controlled by the respondent at Kwinana.

4.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the date hereof.

5.--Hours.

(a) Day Workers.—The ordinary working hours of day workers shall be forty (40) per week, to be worked eight (8) hours per day, Monday to Friday inclusive, between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m.

Provided that, for workers engaged in connec-Provided that, for workers engaged in connection with the loading or unloading of ships, the ordinary working hours or any part thereof may be worked outside the spread of hours set out in this subclause, in which case overtime rates shall be paid for all time worked outside the specified hours: And provided further that the ordinary working hours of the heater's assistant shall commence not earlier than 4 a.m.

- (b) Lunch interval shall be thirty (30) minutes.
- (c) Shift Workers (Non-continuous Work).— The ordinary working hours of shift workers on non-continuous work shall not exceed eight (8) hours in any one day or forty (40) hours in any week and may be worked on any of five (5) days from Monday to Saturday inclusive.
- (d) Shift Workers (Continuous Work).ordinary hours of shift workers on continuous work shall not exceed forty (40) hours of five (5) shifts each of eight (8) hours in any week, provided that this clause shall be deemed to have been complied with if the ordinary working hours do not exceed eighty (80) hours worked in shifts of eight (8) hours each in any fortnight. For the purpose of this clause "fortnight" means any two (2) consecutive pay weeks.

6.—Overtime (Day Workers).

- (a) For all work done outside the hours of duty on any ordinary day, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) For all work done on Saturdays, payment shall be at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (c) Work done on Sundays and holidays shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (d) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.
- (e) Meal Allowance.—When a worker, without being notified on the previous day, is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour or after 6 p.m., whichever is the later, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.
- (f) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break of the customary period, for a meal.
- (g) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time that he holds himself in readiness.
- (h) When a worker is required for duty during any meal time whereby his meal time is postponed for more than one (1) hour, he shall be paid at overtime rates from the time his meal time should have commenced until the meal break is allowed.

- (i) In the calculation of the overtime rates, each day shall stand alone: Provided that, when a worker continues working beyond midnight on any day, the hours worked after midnight shall be counted as part of the previous day's work for the purpose of calculating the rates to be paid.
- (j) (i) The employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) No organisation party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award shall, in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.
- (k) Rest Period After Overtime.—When overtime work is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

Where a worker (other than a casual worker) has not had at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between his usual finishing time on one day and his usual starting time on the next day, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (i) He shall, if he so desires, be entitled to have eight (8) consecutive hours off duty from the completion of his overtime work until he next commences work, but shall not be paid for such time off duty.
- (ii) If, on the instructions of the employer, he continues or resumes work at his ordinary starting time without having such eight (8) hour break, he shall be paid at overtime rates for the balance of the hours less than eight (8) which he has not had off duty. Hours of overtime actually worked since his last usual finishing time shall be counted in computing the actual rate of overtime under this paragraph.
- (iii) If, on his own volition, he continues or resumes work at his ordinary starting time without such break, he shall be paid at ordinary rates.
- (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, for work done on Saturdays, Sundays or the holidays prescribed in clause 12 in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations, the rate of time and a half shall apply to the work done on such days.

7.—Overtime (Shift Workers).

- (a) For all time worked in excess of or outside the ordinary working hours prescribed by this Award or on a shift other than a rostered shift, payment shall be made—
 - (i) to shift workers on continuous work—at the rate of double time;
 - (ii) to shift workers on non-continuous work at the rate of time and a half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter, except on Sundays and the holidays prescribed by clause 12, when payment shall be made at the rate of double time.
- (b) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangement between the workers themselves or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts. The time for which any worker may be paid at ordinary rates instead of overtime due to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time, shall not exceed two (2) hours, after the expiration of which overtime rates shall apply for the whole of the extra time worked.
- (c) Overtime payments on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work in accordance with subclause (b) of clause 8, provided that this shall not apply to work done on Saturdays, Sundays, or any holidays prescribed by clause 12.
- (d) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the premises, he shall be paid for at least two (2) hours at overtime rates.

- (e) If a worker without being notified the previous day is required to continue working after the usual knock-off time for more than one (1) hour, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.
- (f) Rest Period After Overtime.—When overtime work is necessary it shall, wherever reasonably practicable, be so arranged that workers have at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between the work of successive days.

Where a worker (other than a casual worker) has not had at least eight (8) consecutive hours off duty between his usual finishing time on one day and his usual starting time on the next day, the following provisions shall apply:—

- (i) He shall, if he so desires, be entitled to have eight (8) consecutive hours off duty from the completion of his overtime work until he next commences work, but shall not be paid for such time off duty.
- (ii) If on the instructions of the employer, he continues or resumes work at his ordinary starting time without having such eighthour break, he shall be paid at overtime rates for the balance of the hours less than eight (8) which he has not had off duty. Hours of overtime actually worked since his last usual finishing time shall be counted in computing the actual rate of overtime under this paragraph.
- (iii) If, on his own volition, he continues or resumes work at his ordinary starting time without such break, he shall be paid at ordinary rates.
- (g) Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, for work done outside the ordinary hours on Saturdays, Sundays or the holidays prescribed in clause 12 in connection with repairs to the employer's machinery which has broken down and has caused a stoppage of operations, the rate of time and a half shall apply to the work done on such days.

8.-Shift Work.

- (a) (i) A worker who does not work at least one (1) week on day shift out of each consecutive three (3) weeks shall be paid for each shift other than day shift at the rate of time and one-quarter: Provided that if he is required to work for more than one (1) week consecutively on afternoon or night shift, such a worker shall be paid at the rate of time and one-quarter for each shift other than day shift in the consecutive second or subsequent weeks of afternoon or night shift.
- (ii) This subclause shall not apply to workers to whom it would only otherwise apply because of a change of shift due to a private arrangement with another worker, nor to workers (known as "relief workers") regularly employed on continuous process work who are required to work shifts to enable other workers engaged on such work to change shifts weekly and to have their days off, if such relief worker is not required to work more night or afternoon shifts than the number of day shifts worked by him.
- (b) A worker employed on any shift other than day shift shall be paid for afternoon shift, five per cent. (5%) and for night shift, ten per cent. (10%) in addition to his ordinary rate.
- (c) (i) Where any particular process is carried out by workers on shifts other than day shift and less than five (5) consecutive afternoon or five (5) consecutive night shifts are worked on that process, then such workers shall be paid at overtime rates. A worker who replaces a regular shift worker on afternoon or night shift, absent for any reason beyond the control of the employer, shall be paid at the rate of time and a quarter if he does not work for five (5) consecutive afternoon or night shifts and at the appropriate shift work rate if he works five (5) or more of such shifts consecutively.
- (ii) The sequence of work shall not be deemed to be broken under the preceding paragraph by reason of the fact that work on the process is not carried out on a Saturday or Sunday or on any public holiday.

- (d) A worker shall not be compelled to work for more than six (6) hours without a break of the customary period for a meal.
- (e) Shift workers on continuous work shall be allowed a twenty (20) minute crib time in each shift without deduction of pay, to be taken in relays at such times as not to cause a stoppage of work.
- (f) All work performed by shift workers during ordinary hours on Saturdays shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.
- (g) All work performed by shift workers on continuous work during ordinary hours on Sundays and the holidays prescribed in clause 12 shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half.
- (h) All work performed by shift workers on non-continuous work on Sundays and the holidays prescribed in clause 12 shall be paid for at double time.
- (i) The rates prescribed in subclauses (f), (g) and (h) hereof shall be paid in lieu of the shift allowance prescribed in subclause (b) of this clause.
 - (j) For the purpose of this Award-
 - "afternoon shift" means any shift finishing after 6 p.m. and at or before midnight; "night shift" means a shift finishing at or after midnight and before 8 a.m.;
 - "continuous work" means work carried on with consecutive shifts of men throughout the twenty-four (24) hours of at least five (5) consecutive days without interruption except during breakdowns or meal breaks or due to unavoidable causes beyond the control of the employer.

9.-Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double time rate.

10.—Rosters.

- (a) A roster showing the shifts to be worked and the commencing and finishing times of ordinary working hours of the respective shifts shall be posted on a notice board.
- (b) Such roster shall not be altered unless by agreement between the shift workers concerned and the employer or, failing agreement, by seven (7) days' notice of alteration given by the employer to the worker.
- (c) Shift workers shall not be rostered to work more than six (6) consecutive shifts, unless the Union concerned consents to such roster.

11.—Higher Duties.

A worker engaged for more than half of one (1) day or shift on duties carrying a higher rate than his ordinary classification shall be paid the higher rate for such day or shift. If employed for not more than half of one (1) day or shift he shall be paid the higher rate for the time so worked.

12.-Holidays and Annual Leave.

- (a) The following days, or the days observed in lieu, shall, subject to clauses 6 and 7 hereof, be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely: New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Award, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done, ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (c) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer.

- (d) Seven-day shift workers, that is, shift workers who are rostered to work regularly on Sundays and holidays, shall be allowed one (1) week's leave in addition to the leave prescribed in subclause (c) hereof.
 - (i) Where a worker with twelve (12) months' continuous service is engaged for part of a qualifying twelve-monthly period as a seven-day shift worker, he shall be entitled to have the period of two (2) consecutive weeks' annual leave prescribed in subclause (c) hereof increased by one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month he is continuously engaged as aforesaid.
 - (ii) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period, a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-quarter of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wages in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (e) If any award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one (1) day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (f) If after one (1) month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period, a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth (1/6th) of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.
- (j) The provisions of this clause shall not apply to casual workers.

13.—Special Rates and Provisions.

- (a) In respect of workers classified in Schedules A (ii) and (iii) hereof, the following shall apply:—
- (i) Height Money.—Workers engaged in the erection of steel frame buildings or other structures at a height of fifty (50) feet or more above the nearest horizontal plane shall be paid at the rate of two shillings (2s.) per day extra.
- (ii) Dirty or Offensive Work.—Fourpence (4d.) per hour extra shall be paid to workers when engaged on work of an unusually dirty or offensive nature, where clothes are necessarily unduly soiled or injured or boots are unduly injured by the nature of the work done.
- (iii) Confined Space.—Sixpence (6d.) per hour extra shall be paid to workers when working in a "confined space," which means a compartment or space, the dimensions of which necessitate a worker working in a stooped or otherwise cramped position or without proper ventilation.
- (iv) Hot Places.—Working for more than one (1) hour in the shade in places where the temperature is raised by artificial means to between 115 and 130 degrees Fahrenheit—fourpence (4d.) per hour extra; in places where the temperature exceeds 130 degrees Fahrenheit—sixpence (6d.) per hour extra. Where work continues for more

than two (2) hours in temperatures exceeding 130 degrees Fahrenheit, employees shall also be entitled to twenty (20) minutes' rest after every two (2) hours' work, without deduction of pay. The temperature shall be decided by the Chief Electrician or Chief Mechanic, as the case may be, after consultation with the employees who claim the extra rate.

- (v) When working pneumatic riveter of the percussion type and other pneumatic tools of the percussion type, workers shall be paid sixpence (6d.) per hour extra whilst so engaged.
- (vi) A fitter or other tradesman, not specially employed as a welder who, in addition to his employment as such, is also required to do welding, shall be entitled to receive one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day extra whilst so employed.
- (b) In respect of workers classified in Schedule A (i) of this Award, the following shall apply:—

When the temperature is raised by artificial means above 120 degrees Fahrenheit, for work done in connection with the demolition of the mill furnace, workers shall be paid an allowance of fourpence (4d.) per hour.

(c) Rates Not Subject to Penalty Additions.— The special rates herein prescribed shall be paid irrespective of the times at which the work is performed and shall not be subject to any premium or penalty additions.

Liberty to apply is reserved for the insertion of a subclause "Special Rates not Cumulative."

14.—Payment of Wages.

Wages shall be paid at least once each fortnight.

15.—Contract of Service.

- (a) Except as provided in subparagraph (i) of this subclause, the contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one (1) week's notice given on any day by either side. If the employer or a worker fails to give the required notice, one (1) week's wages shall be paid or forfeited.
 - (i) For the first month of employment the hiring shall be from day to day and during this period a day's notice shall be sufficient. If the employer or a worker fails to give the required notice, one (1) day's wages shall be paid or forfeited.
- (b) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty, except when such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of clause 17, or such absence is on account of holidays prescribed by this Award.
- (c) This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct.

16.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct payment for any day or portion of a day upon which a worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or unions affiliated with it, or by any other association or union, or through the breakdown of the employer's machinery, or any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

17.—Payment for Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service. Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, a worker who, in any calendar year, has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only, or less, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.
- (e) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year, so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

18.—Representative Interviewing Workers.

In the case of a disagreement existing or anticipated concerning any of the provisions of this Award, an accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview the workers during the recognised meal hour, on the business premises of the employer, but this permission shall not be exercised, without the consent of the employer, more than once in any one (1) week.

19.—Record.

- (a) Each employer shall keep a time and wages book showing the name of each worker and the nature of his work, the hours worked each day and the wages and allowances paid each week. Any system of automatic recording by means of machines shall be deemed to comply with this provision to the extent of the information recorded.
- (b) The time and wages record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited official of the Union, during the usual office hours, at the employer's office or other convenient place, and he shall be allowed to take extracts therefrom. The employer's works shall be deemed to be a convenient place for the purpose of this subclause and, if for any reason the record be not available when the official calls to inspect it, it shall be made available for inspection by not later than the next working day when the office is open.

$20. {\color{red}\textbf{--}} Union \ \ \textbf{Notices}.$

Notices previously approved by the employer and an official of the Union may be posted by representatives of the Union at approved places in the plant.

21.—Board of Reference.

- (a) The Court hereby appoints, for the purposes of this Award, a Board or Boards of Reference.
- (b) Each Board shall consist of a chairman who, failing agreement between the parties, shall be appointed by the Court, and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.
- (c) There shall be assigned to each such Board the functions of—
 - (i) adjusting any matters of difference that may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Award, or any of them;
 - (ii) deciding any other matters that the Court may refer to such Board or Boards from time to time.

(d) An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in and form part of this Award.

22.—Long Service Leave.

(a) Entitlement to Leave.

A worker shall, in respect of continuous service with the employer, be entitled to the long service leave as hereinafter prescribed.

(b) Period of Leave.

The amount of such entitlement in the case of a worker who has completed at least twenty (20) years' continuous service with the employer shall be—

- (i) in respect of the twenty (20) years' service so completed—thirteen (13) weeks' leave: and
- (ii) in respect of each ten (10) years' service with the employer completed after such twenty (20) years—six and one-half $(6\frac{1}{2})$ weeks' leave.
- (c) Pro Rata Entitlement on Termination.
- (i) Where a worker has completed at least ten (10) years but less than fifteen (15) years of continuous service with the employer and his employment is terminated by the employer for any cause other than serious misconduct, or by death during his employment, or by the worker on account of personal sickness or injury or domestic or any other pressing necessity where such personal sickness, injury or necessity is of such nature as, in the opinion of the employer or, in the event of a dispute, of the Special Board of Reference, to justify such termination, the worker shall be entitled (or, in the case of death, his personal representative shall be entitled) to such payment as equals a proportionate amount of leave in respect of the period of completed years of such service, on the basis of thirteen (13) weeks for twenty (20) years' service.
- (ii) Where a worker has completed at least fifteen (15) years' continuous service with the employer and his employment is terminated for any reason other than by the employer for serious misconduct, he shall be entitled (or, in the case of death, his personal representative shall be entitled to such payment as equals a proportionate amount of leave in respect of the period of completed years of such service since the commencement of his continuous service, or since the last accrual of entitlement to leave, on the basis of thirteen (13) weeks for twenty (20) years' service.

(d) Calculation of Continuous Service.

- (1) For the purpose of this clause, the following absences (whether before or after the commencement of this Award) shall not break the continuity of service and shall, subject to any limitation herein, count as service:—
 - (i) Absence in respect of any period during which the worker shall have served as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia (other than as a member of the permanent forces of the Commonwealth of Australia (except where such service occurs after 26th June, 1950, in Korea or Malaya) and other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan), or as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939 (as amended), or absence on compulsory service in any of the armed forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended): Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumes employment with the employer;
 - (ii) absence on any annual leave or long service leave;
 - (iii) absence following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the

- intention of avoiding obligations under this Award in respect of long service leave or annual leave; and
- (iv) absence necessitated by personal sickness or injury of which not more than fifteen (15) working days a year shall count as service.
- (2) For the purposes of this clause the following absences (whether before or after the commencement of this Award) shall not break the continuity of service, but the period of such absence shall not count as service:—
 - (i) Absence following any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed within a period not exceeding two (2) months from the date of such termination;
 - (ii) absence during any standing down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of the relevant clause of this ward;
 - (iii) absence following any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade, if the worker is re-employed within a period not exceeding six (6) months from the date of such termination;
 - (iv) absence of the worker authorised by the employer at any time;
 - (v) absence arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute, but only if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute; and
 - (vi) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate Union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave.
- (3) After the coming into operation of this clause, absence from work by reason of any cause not being a cause specified in this subclause shall not be deemed to break the continuity of service for the purpose of this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen (14) days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service. Such notice may be given by delivering it to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

(e) Service Before Commencement of Clause.

For the purpose of computing entitlement to leave, continuous service of a worker with the employer immediately prior to the coming into operation of this clause shall be taken into account but only to the extent of the last twenty (20) completed years of such service.

(f) Time of Taking Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or, in the absence of such agreement, at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.

(g) Notice to Take Leave.

Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to, the employer shall give to a worker three (3) months' notice (where practicable) or, in any case, at least one (1) month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.

(h) Broken Leave.

Long service leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or, if the worker and employer so agree, in not more than three (3) separate periods in respect of the first thirteen (13) weeks' entitlement, and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.

(i) Granting of Leave before Due Date.

- (i) The employer may by agreement with a worker allow long service leave to such worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case, the worker shall not become entitled to any further long service leave in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such long service leave had been taken before it accrued due.
- (ii) Where long service leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to this subclause before the right thereto has accrued due, and the worker subsequently leaves or dies or is discharged from the service of the employer, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable on the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of thirteen (13) weeks for twenty (20) years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he is not at the date of the termination of his employment or prior thereto, entitled.

(j) Payment for Period of Leave.

- (i) Each worker shall be paid for each week of leave his ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he enters upon the period of leave. Such ordinary time rate shall be for the standard hours prescribed by this Award but, in the case of casuals and part-time workers, for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.
- (ii) Provided that where, by agreement between the employer and the worker, the taking of the leave due to the worker or any portion if it is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he enters upon the period of leave.
 - (iii) "Ordinary time rate of pay"-
 - (a) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like;
 - (b) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave.
- (iv) Payment in the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by result shall be at ordinary time rates. Where no ordinary time rates are prescribed for the classification of the worker concerned, such rate shall be deemed to be the average of his earnings during the preceding three (3) months.

(k) Method of Payment.

Payment shall be made in one of the following ways:—

- (i) In full, before the worker goes on leave;
- (ii) at the same times as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
- (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.

(1) Payment on Termination for Leave Not Taken.

Where the employment of a worker is terminated and he has an entitlement to long service leave, the employer shall thereupon pay to the worker a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of long service leave to which the worker would have been entitled if he had taken the same at the time of such termination.

(m) Payment on Death.

Where a worker dies during his employment and any long service leave to which he is entitled under this clause has not been taken or received in full by the worker, the employer shall, upon request by the personal representative of the deceased

worker, pay to that representative the amount due in respect of such leave. The obligation of the employer to such worker in respect of long service leave shall be and shall be deemed to have been satisfied by such payment.

(n) Public Holidays and Annual Leave During Period of Leave.

Any long service leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award occurring during the period when the leave is taken, but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.

(o) Transmission of Business.

For the purposes of this clause, where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation of this clause, been transmitted from an employer (in this subclause called the "transmittor") to another employer (in this subclause called the "transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was a worker employed by the transmittor in that business becomes a worker employed by the transmittee—

- (i) the continuity of the service of such worker shall be deemed not to have been broken by reason only of the transmission; and
- (ii) the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (or any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be continuous service of the worker with the transmittee.

In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession, whether by agreement or by operation of law, and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

(p) Transfer.

Where a worker, either at the request or with the consent of the employer being a company, transfers his employment to that of another company associated with that of the original employer, the continuity of the worker's service shall not be deemed to have been broken by reason only of such transfer and the period of continuous service the worker has had with the original employer shall be deemed to be continuous service with the company to which the worker transfers. For the purpose of this subclause, companies shall be deemed to be associated companies when one company is a subsidiary of the other, or where two companies are each a subsidiary of a third company.

(q) Records to be Kept.

- (i) Each employer shall, during the employment and for a period of twelve (12) months (three (3) years in case of death) thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made in accordance with this clause.
- (ii) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award with respect to the time and wages record.

(r) Special Board of Reference.

- (i) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose of this clause, to which all disputes and matters arising under this clause shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.
- (ii) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—
 - (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising out of this clause;
 - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it by this clause.
 (iii) The Special Board of Reference shall con-
- (iii) The Special Board of Reference shall consist of the Registrar of the Court or his deputy, if he be unable to act as Chairman, and one (1) representative nominated by the employer and one by the Union.

(g)	Prohibition	of	Working	during	Period	of

- (i) Subject to paragraph (ii) of this subclause, no worker shall, without the consent of the employer, during any period he is on long service leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward. If a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit all his current leave rights under this clause and the employer shall be entitled to cancel any further payment in respect of those rights and to reclaim at law any payments already made on account of such period during which the worker was so engaged in employment.
- (ii) This subclause shall not apply in the case of former workers who have received payment in lieu of leave on termination of their employment in accordance with subclause (c) of this clause.

(t) Exemptions.

Any employer who provides or proposes to provide a scheme for long service leave which, viewed as a whole, is more favourable to the worker than the provisions herein prescribed, may apply to the Court for exemption from the provisions of this clause and the Court may, at its discretion, refuse or grant such exemption, subject to such conditions (if any) as to the modification of the scheme or otherwise as the Court thinks desirable.

23.—Wages.

The minimum rates payable to workers shall be in accordance with Schedules "A," "A (i)," "A (ii)," "A (iv)" and "A (v)" hereinafter appear-

24.—Apprentices.

- (a) Apprentices may be taken to-
 - (i) Engineering, electrical fitting, fitting and/ or turning, first-class machining;
 - (ii) Boilermaking

in the proportion of one (1) apprentice to every two (2) or fraction of two (2) journeymen: Provided that the fraction of two (2) shall not be less than one (1). Provided further that in an "approved" shop or factory the proportion shall be one (1) apprentice to every one (1) journeyman. For the purpose of this proviso, an "approved" shop or factory shall be one to which approval (as regards one or more particular trades) has been given by the Board of Reference appointed under clause 21 hereof.
