Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1956.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 1433/57.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1956, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act, have been complied requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections, and estimates in respect

of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister for Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Main Drainage.

#### South Belmont Area.

#### M.1 and Part M.4 Main Drains.

- (a) Three compensating basins numbered C.3, C.11 and C.15.
- (b) Reinforced concrete pipe drains of 60-inch diameter consisting of two sections comprising 530 feet approximately in length for the first section and 720 feet approximately in length for the second section. Each having inlet and outlet structures.
- (c) Open channel sections with varying bottom widths from eight feet to two feet.
- (d) Bridge and culvert structures with necessary inlet and outlet apparatus at all existing road intersections.
- (e) Drop structures and bank protection for checking soil erosion as necessary.

The above works, together with all other apparatus necessary for the undertaking, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A. No. 8211.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 18th day of April, 1958.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1956, inter alia, that it shall be obligatory for every employer to obtain from an incorporated insurance office, approved by the Minister, a policy of insurance for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may by Order in Council exempt such employer from the operation of the raid section 12: and whereas the Bank tion of the said section 13; and whereas the Bank of New South Wales, of St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section, has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, a bond of five thousand pounds (£5,000) given by the Bank, charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, actives. ing with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt the Bank of New South Wales from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912-1956, for a period expiring on the 31st day of March, 1960.

for the full amount of the liability to pay compensation under the said Act to all workers employed by him, but that if an employer proves to the satisfaction of the Minister that such employer has established a fund for insurance against such liability and has deposited at the Treasury securities charged with all payments to become due under such liability, the Governor may, by Order in Council, exempt such employer from the operation of the said section 13; and whereas The Mutual Life and Citizens' Assurance Company Limited, of 179A St. George's Terrace, Perth, being an employer within the meaning of the section, has duly, in accordance with the Act and the regulations made thereunder, made application for exemption from the operation of the section, and has satisfied the Minister that it has established a fund for insurance against the said liability, and has deposited at the Treasury a security, to wit, Commonwealth Government Securities of the value of £5,000 charged with all payments to become due under the said liability: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby exempt The Mutual Life and Citizens' Assurance Company Limited, of 179A St. George's Terrace, Perth, from the operation of section 13 of the Workers' Compensation Act, 1912–1956, for a period expiring on the 28th day of February, 1960.
