WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and whereas the said dis-pute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the par-ties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agree-ment an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

32. Liberty to Apply. Schedule of Respondents.

3.—Scope.

This Award shall apply to all persons employed by the respondents as per list attached and others in the same industries in pursuance of the common rule provision of the Act in or in connection with the conveyance of persons and/or passengers by road.

4.—.Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

5.—Area.

This Award shall operate over the whole of the South-west Land Division of the State of Western Australia: Provided that nothing herein contained Adstrala. Provided that nothing herein contained shall apply to taxi-car proprietors or their em-ployees operating outside a radius of eighty-five (85) miles from the General Post Office, Perth, nor to any person (or his employees) having a con-tract with the Education Department to convey children to and from school in respect to the conveyance of such children.

6.—Definitions.

(a) "Taxi-car driver" shall mean any person employed to drive a motor vehicle registered under the Traffic Act to carry not more than seven (7) persons including the driver, but shall not include any person driving such a vehicle when it is not being used to carry passengers: Provided that it is not available for the use of passengers.

(b) "Omnibus driver" shall mean any person employed to drive a motor vehicle, other than a taxi-car, which is used to carry passengers for hire or reward at separate fares or otherwise but shall not include any person driving such a vehicle when it is not being used to carry passengers: Provided that it is not available for the use of passengers.

(c) "Fare collector" shall mean any person, except the driver, who collects fares from passengers travelling in omnibuses-

- (i) with only one side door for passenger entrance; or
- (ii) which are not articulated or double-decker vehicles.

(d) "Conductor" shall mean any person, except the driver, who collects fares from passengers travelling in omnibuses-

- (i) with two or more side doors for passenger entrance; or
- (ii) which are articulated or double-decker vehicles.

(e) "Casual worker" shall mean any person who is engaged as a casual worker and who is dis-missed or refused work without any fault of his own before the expiration of one (1) week from the date of commencing work.

(f) "Holidays" shall mean the days on which New Year's Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day are observed.

7.-Casual Workers.

(a) Casual workers shall be paid at the rate of two shillings and sixpence (2s. 6d.) per day in the case of male workers and one shilling and threepence (1s. 3d.) per day in the case of female workers, in addition to an hourly rate calculated upon the weekly rate prescribed in clause 14 hereof and on the basis that forty (40) hours constitute a week's work: Provided that the minimum payment to a casual worker for work performed on any one (1) day shall be not less than five shillings (5s.): Provided further, that the rate of payment for casual workers for work done on any Saturday shall be at the rate of time and a half and on any Sunday or holiday shall be at the rate of time and three-quarters of the ordinary rate for casual workers.

(b) The maximum number of casual workers allowed to be employed by any employer shall be in the proportion of one (1) casual worker to every fifteen (15) or fraction of fifteen (15) weekly workers employed under the provisions of this Award: Provided that, where a casual worker is engaged to take the place temporarily of a weekly worker, such casual worker shall for the purpose of this subclause be regarded as and be deemed to be a weekly worker.

8.—Under-rate Workers.

(a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity is unable to earn the minimum wage, may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board, and pending the Board's decision, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

9.—Termination of Employment.

One (1) week's notice at any time on either side shall be required before the engagement of any but a casual hand shall be determined: Provided that an employer may at any time dismiss a worker for refusal or neglect to obey orders, misconduct, carelessness in the performance of his duties, or, if after receiving one (1) week's notice, he does not carry out his duties in the same manner as he did prior to such notice.

Notice given every week to determine the employment without any intention to determine the employment at the end of the week but only with a view of dismissing men at any time, shall not be deemed notice for the purpose of this Award.

10.—Hours.

(a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work to be worked in not more than six (6) days. No worker shall be permitted to be on duty without payment of overtime in excess of—

- (i) forty (40) hours in any week;
- (ii) in the case of omnibus drivers and/or fare collectors, and/or conductors, and/or taxicar drivers, nine (9) hours twenty (20) ininutes in any one (1) day.
- (iii) all other workers, eight (8) hours in any one day.

(b) Provided, however, that at the option of the employer eighty (80) hours shall constitute a fortnight's work to be worked in not more than six (6) days in any one (1) week, in which case no worker shall be permitted to be on duty without payment of overtime in excess of—

- (i) omnibus drivers and/or fare collectors, and/or conductors, and/or taxi-car drivers, forty-eight (48) hours in any one (1) week, or nine (9) hours twenty (20) minutes in any one (1) day;
- (ii) all other workers, forty-eight (48) hours in any one (1) week, or eight (8) hours in any one (1) day;
- (iii) all workers, eighty (80) hours in any fortnight.

Provided further, that in every case where it is intended to work the eighty (80) hours fortnight it shall be the duty of the employer, on the first day of the first week of each fortnightly period to clearly indicate such fortnightly period in the time and wages book.

(c) Any time worked on any day or days to make up the hours of duty in any week shall be worked in a continuous shift except in the case of omnibus drivers and/or fare collectors, and/or conductors, and/or taxi-car drivers, who may be worked in broken shifts to suit the exigencies of the employer's business, but in such case, no shift shall consist of more than three (3) periods of working time with two (2) intervals in one of which the meal interval may be included.

(d) No worker shall be permitted to be on continuous duty for a greater period than six (6) hours without a meal break of at least one-half $(\frac{1}{2})$ hour, and such meal break shall not be included in computing the hours worked each day.

(e) No rostered shift shall consist of more than three (3) periods of working time.

(f) A worker failing to take up his rostered or appointed shift unless such is due to illness or other unavoidable cause (the onus of proof of "unavoidable cause" shall rest upon the worker) shall pay the employer for any extra payment incurred thereby through another worker being called upon to work the shift.

(g) Specials.—Where a worker is required to work off his regular route he shall be deemed to have worked the whole of the time which elapses between the time he leaves the starting place until he returns to that place if such time is less than six (6) hours forty (40) minutes in any one (1) day. If such time is six (6) hours forty (40) minutes or more in any one (1) day he shall be deemed to have worked six (6) hours forty (40) minutes at least on such day. Subject to the provisos hereto, all time in any one (1) day, occupied in waiting, shall stand alone and be paid for at half the time rate applicable for that day: Provided that, any waiting time which is used to make up the six (6) hours forty (40) minutes beforementioned shall not be deemed waiting time for the purpose of this clause: Provided also that a worker who comes within the scope of clause 18 of this Award shall not be entitled to payment for waiting time under this clause.

(h) Whenever a worker commences a period of work on any day whether for the purpose of making up the ordinary weekly hours or for overtime he shall be deemed to have worked not less than one (1) hour for each such period.

(i) Each worker shall be rostered one (1) day off duty in each week.

(j) Subject to subclause (g) of this clause and subject as hereinafter provided all time between the earliest starting time and the latest finishing time, on any day, which is not counted as time of duty shall be deemed to be waiting time, shall stand alone and be paid for at half the time rate applicable to the day for the particular worker concerned. Provided that—

- (i) a worker shall not be entitled to any payment in respect of one hour of waiting time in any one day;
- (ii) when two periods of waiting time occur on any day the maximum waiting time to be paid for shall not exceed three hours for such day; and when only one period of waiting time occurs on any day the maximum waiting time to be paid for shall not exceed two hours for that day.

11.—Spread of Shifts.

(a) The spread of hours for omnibus drivers and/or taxi-car drivers and/or fare collectors and/ or conductors from the beginning to the end of the day's work shall not exceed twelve (12) hours.

(b) No worker shall be required to work outside the daily spread of hours mentioned in subclause (a) hereof except by agreement between the employer concerned and the Union and on payment of overtime rates as prescribed, unless for the purposes of relief in the case of sickness or absence of another worker, specials which take a worker off his regular route for the whole of his shift, or an accident which prevents the proper working of the roster. In the event of disagreement, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

Provided that agreement between the employer and the Union shall not be required for work outside the spread of hours on Saturdays and holidays.

(c) No worker shall be booked off for a lesser period than a half $(\frac{1}{2})$ hour.

(d) No worker shall be called on for duty until he has had nine (9) hours off duty between the shifts, excepting in the case of sickness of a worker, default of a worker, or in case of an accident which prevents the proper working of the roster; or when necessary in order to facilitate a change of shifts, in which case not less than eight (8) hours shall be permitted and in such lastmentioned case no worker shall be subject to same more than once in any calendar week, namely, Sunday to Saturday inclusive.

12.—Minimum Hours Per Day.

Any worker, other than a casual worker, required to report for duty in any day shall be deemed to have worked four (4) hours at least on such day except where such reporting for duty is owing to another worker failing to report for duty at the appointed time.

13.—Posting Roster.

(a) The employer shall post a roster showing the ordinary hours to be worked during each week by weekly omnibus drivers, taxi-car drivers, conductors and fare collectors, other than relief workers, which roster shall be exhibited in each establishment in such a place as it may be conveniently and readily seen by each worker concerned. The hours to be recorded in such roster shall not exceed the spread of hours prescribed in clause 11.

Such roster shall be posted by the employer not less than two (2) days before the start of the working week, and may only be altered on account of sickness or absence of a worker, or on account of any contingency that the employer could not reasonably foresee: Provided that workers may change shifts on any specified day by written joint application to the employer and on his approval. Where workers have changed shifts in accordance with the foregoing, they shall be deemed to have worked, on the specified day, the hours they would have worked had the change not been made.

(b) As far as practicable, rostered shifts shall rotate weekly to the intent that all workers on the roster may receive a proper share of all shifts on the roster. In any proceeding under this clause, the onus shall rest upon the employer to establish that such rotation was not practicable.

(c) The secretary of the Union or any person authorised in writing by him shall be permitted to inspect the roster at any time between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m.

(d) No worker shall be rostered for duty on more than six (6) days in any week.

14.—Wages.

The minimum weekly wage to be paid to and received by all workers, other than casual workers, shall be as follows:—

15.—Overtime.

(a) Omnibus drivers and/or fare collectors and/ or conductors and/or taxi-car drivers shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half for all time of duty—

- (i) in excess of the ordinary hours of duty per week; or
- (ii) in excess of the daily hours of duty as prescribed in clause 10 hereof; or
- (iii) outside the daily rostered hours of duty; or (iv) on the worker's rostered day off; or
- (v) outside the spread of hours as prescribed by clause 11.

(b) All workers other than those mentioned in subclause (a) hereof shall be paid overtime at the rate of time and a half for all time of duty in excess of eight (8) hours in any one (1) day or the ordinary hours of duty in any week.

(c) All overtime shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the weekly or casual wage as the case may be.

(d) Overtime shall not be paid twice for the same hours of work.

(e) Notwithstanding anything contained here-in—

- (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
- (ii) the Union or any worker or workers covered by this Award shall not in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause;
- (iii) this subclause shall remain in operation only until otherwise determined by the Court.

(f) When an employer has the right to alter the roster through the absence of a worker in accordance with clause 13, subclause (a), he shall have the right to make such alteration without payment of overtime to the worker who replaces the absent worker, for working outside his original rostered hours.

16.-Saturday and Sunday Work.

Except in the case of casual workers all time of duty on Saturdays shall be paid for at half-time extra, and all time of duty on Sundays shall be paid for at three-quarter time extra; such halftime extra and three-quarter time extra shall stand alone and be paid for in addition to the weekly wage and, subject to clause 17, shall not be taken into account in the calculation of overtime in any way whatsoever: Provided that this clause shall not apply to workers who finish by 1.30 o'clock a.m. on Saturday. The time so worked shall be deemed to be part of the Friday shift. Work which finishes by 1.30 o'clock a.m. on Sunday shall be deemed to be part of the Saturday shift.

17.—Maximum Rate.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award to the contrary, no time of duty whatsoever shall be required to be paid for at more than double-time rate.

18.—Away from Home Allowance.

Workers engaged on work from which they are unable to return to their homes at night shall be paid such personal expenses as they may reasonably incur: Provided that such expenses shall not be less than seven shillings and sixpence (7s. 6d.) per day.

19.—Payment for Highest Function.

A worker who is called upon to perform two (2) or more classes of work for more than two (2) hours on any day shall be paid for the day at the class for which the highest rate of wage is prescribed. Where the work for which the highest rate is prescribed does not exceed two (2) hours on any day, the worker shall be paid the highest rate for the actual time so worked.

20.—Change.

Where an employer requires a worker to give change to clients, such change shall be supplied by the employer.

21.—Shortages.

If any worker is charged with any shortage in the cash collected by him he shall have the right, when so charged, to check the running sheets, revenue journal, or other record issued to him. A worker shall be notified of any shortage which it is intended to charge against him as soon as possible after same has been discovered. Failing such notice within a reasonable time the worker shall not be held liable for the shortage.

22.—Pay Day.

All wages shall be paid weekly; but in the case of the eighty (80) hour fortnight it shall be permissible for the employer to pay all overtime fortnightly; no employer shall hold more than three (3) days' wages in hand.

Provided that this clause shall be deemed to be complied with if a worker's pay is available at the time his shift finishes or at 2 p.m., whichever is the later on the fourth day following the end of the working week.

23.—Holidays.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided a period of three and two-thirds $(3\frac{2}{3})$ consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of twelve (12) months' continuous service with such employer. Such leave shall be given to and taken by the worker within three (3) months of becoming due.

Provided that where the engagement of any worker is terminated after four (4) weeks' continuous service, or after any period of continuous service from the date on which the previous annual holidays became due, he shall receive a monetary payment in lieu of holidays in proportion to the length of his service.

(b) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay or time spent on annual leave as prescribed by this Award shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.

(c) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

24.—Absence Through Sickness.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelfth (1/12th) of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.

(d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, a worker who has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence in the same year, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.

(e) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker, and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year: Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

(f) The quantum of sick leave which may accumulate to the 31st day of December, 1950, under subclause (e) of this clause, shall not exceed two (2) days.

25.—Contract of Employment.

(a) Weekly hands ready and willing to work for the whole week and not dismissed for any reason set out in clause 9 of this Award shall be paid a full week's wages. (b) Employers shall, when engaging workers, state definitely whether such worker is engaged as a weekly or casual hand. Failing such notice the worker shall be deemed to be engaged as a weekly worker.

(c) The employer shall be under no obligation to pay for any day not worked upon which the worker is required to present himself for duty except such absence from work is due to illness and comes within the provisions of clause 24 or such absence is on account of holidays to which the worker is entitled under the provisions of this Award, or such absence is on account of some other unavoidable cause, the onus of proof of which shall rest upon the worker.

(d) Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause a worker who is engaged to take the place temporarily of another worker who is absent on account of sickness or accident may be dismissed by the giving of one (1) day's notice.

26.-Temporary Change of Garage, etc.

(a) Where an employer transfers a worker after he comes to work from one garage, depot or place situated more than two (2) miles distant from the garage, depot or place at which he usually works, fares to and from such altered garage, depot or place shall be allowed by the employer.

(b) If a worker is transferred temporarily to work at a garage, depot or place which requires him to travel one (1) mile or more from his home beyond the distance he usually travels, the fares to and from and excess time shall be paid for by the employer. Any dispute arising under this clause shall be referred to a Board of Reference for determination.

(c) A relief worker shall have some one depot named as his regular depot and when he is required to work elsewhere he shall be treated as being temporarily transferred and subject to the pro-visions of subclause (b) hereof.

27.—Uniforms.

Employers requiring workers to wear uniforms. or wearing apparel of any specified description shall provide same free of cost to workers; such uniform or wearing apparel shall remain the pro-perty of the employer, and shall be returned to the employer, on demand, in good order and con-dition guided to four wood bodd. dition subject to fair wear and tear.

28.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court appoints for the purposes of the Award a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of-

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpreany of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time

An appeal shall lie from any decision of (b) such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

29.—Time and Wages Book.

Each employer shall provide a time and wages book to be kept at a place where it is easily accesbook to be kept at a place where it is easily accessible to the employer and the worker. The book shall show the name of each worker, the nature of the work performed, the time he starts and finishes work each day, the number of hours worked by and the wages and overtime paid to each worker, and the worker's signature therefor. The employer and the worker shall be severally responsible for the proper posting of the book daily. Such book shall be open to inspection during during the start and the work of the proper daily. daily. Such book shall be open to inspection dur-Monday to Friday inclusive and between 9 a.m.

and 12 noon on Saturdays, by the secretary of the Union or any other person authorised in writing by him: Provided that an employer may, at his option, in lieu of a time book, provide a mechanical clock for the purpose of recording the starting and finishing times of workers in which case a record of the number of hours worked each day by each worker, and the wages and overtime paid to such worker, shall be entered on a card or check (used in connection with such clock) which shall be signed by the worker on receipt of wages each week. The employer and worker shall be severally responsible for the correct keeping daily of such card or check, which shall be open to inspection in the same manner as the time and wages book beforementioned.

30.—Junior Workers' Certificate.

(a) Junior workers shall furnish the employer with a certificate showing the following particulars:-

(i) Name in full.

(ii) Age and date of birth.

(b) The certificate shall be signed by the worker.

(c) No worker shall have any claim upon the (c) No worker shall have any claim upon the employer for additional wages on the ground of age in the event of his age being wrongly stated on this certificate: Provided that this subclause shall operate only for the first three (3) months from the date of the worker's first engagement thereby enabling the employer, if he so desires, to obtain proof of the junior worker's age.

31.—Breakdowns.

The employer shall be entitled to deduct pay-ment for any day or portion of a day upon which the worker cannot be usefully employed because of any strike by the Union or Unions affiliated with it, or because of any stoppage of work by any cause which the employer cannot reasonably prevent.

32.—Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is reserved to either party to apply to amend this Award at any time during its operation in respect to the inclusion in the wages clause of new classifications or a variation of margins and for a variation of the Award to provide for a fiveday week.

INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT

No. 4 of 1958.

Registered 11th March, 1958.

THIS Agreement made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 10th day of March, 1958, between the Honourable Minister for Police of the one part, and the Western Aus-tralian Police Union of Workers of the other part, whereby the parties Covenant and Agree as follows:-

1.—Term of Agreement.

The term of this Agreement shall be three (3) years from the 10th day of March, 1958, subject to the parties having the right to negotiate for any variation of this Agreement within the said term.

2.-Area and Scope of Agreement.

This Agreement shall apply to all members of the Western Australian Police Force (hereinafter referred to as "employees") and shall be binding upon the above-named parties and shall operate over the whole State.

3.-Commissioned Officers.

The ratio of Commissioned Officers to other ranks The ratio of Commissioned Officers to other ranks shall be maintained as one to 33, and the number of Commissioned Officers will include the Deputy Commissioner and the Chief Inspector, but not the Commissioner. Whilst the present strength of the Police Force is maintained, there shall be eight first class, nine second class and 10 third class Inspectors, and in the event of any increase in the strength of the Force, this proportion to each classification shall be maintained. In the event of an increase in 1st Class Inspectors to meet Departmental requirements a corresponding reduction may be made in the 2nd and 3rd class Inspectors.

4.—Classification.

(a) Excluding members of the C.I.B. and Women Police, the ratio of N.C.Os. to less ranks, excluding Probationary Constables, shall be maintained as one to five; and the proportion of 1st and 2nd Class Sergeants to 3rd Class Sergeants shall be not less than at present existing. It may be increased to meet Departmental requirements with a corresponding reduction in the number of 3rd Class ranks.

(b) There shall be the following classified positions for Sergeants:

1st Class Sergeants:

Central Station, Perth, one Sergeant in charge of each shift.

Fremantle Station, one Sergeant in charge of each shift.

Prosecuting Sergeant, Perth.

Prosecuting Sergeant, Fremantle.

Sergeant-in-charge, Staff Office, Perth.

Liquor Inspection Branch, Perth (1).

Traffic Branch, Perth (3).

Traffic Branch, Fremantle (1).

Traffic Branch, Victoria Park (1).

Instructor, Police School (1).

and other stations where District Inspectors have their headquarters.

2nd Class Sergeant:-

Assistant Prosecuting Officer, Perth. District Office Clerk, Perth.

(c) The number of 1st, 2nd and 3rd Class Detective Sergeants shall be no less than seven 1st Class, seven 2nd Class and 13 3rd Class, and the proportion of N.C.Os. to lesser ranks shall be maintained as now existing.

(d) Women Police: The exclusion of the Women Police from general promotion shall not debar them from promotion in their own ranks; and such promotion shall be not less than one (1) non-commissioned officer to five (5) women constables.

This Agreement shall not in itself operate (e) to reduce the present rank of any Commissioned or non-Commissioned Officer.

5.—Brevet Ranks and Special Promotions. Brevet ranks or Special Promotions are not to be included in any classification for the computing of the ratio.

6.-Cancellation of Previous Agreement.

The Agreement supersedes Industrial Agreement No. 5 of 1946 which said Industrial Agreement is hereby cancelled.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 55 of 1958.

In the matter of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and in the matter of the several Awards and Industrial Agreements set out in the First Schedule hereto.

WHEREAS the Court of Arbitration by several summonses each dated the 24th day of March, 1958, called upon the parties to the several Awards and Industrial Agreements hereinafter set out to show cause why the same should not be amended by the insertion therein of provisions relating to Long Service Leave; and whereas the said sum-monses came on for hearing before the Court on monses came on for nearing before the Court on the 1st day of April, 1958; and whereas the Court having heard Mr. F. E. Chamberlain on behalf of Industrial Unions affiliated with the Australian Labour Party, Mr. W. R. Sawyer on behalf of the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, Mr. R. W. Clohessy on behalf of the Brank Officials' Association of on behalf of the Bank Officials' Association of Western Australia Union of Workers, Perth, and Mr. F. S. Cross on behalf of certain employers, the Court determined that each of the said Awards and Industrial Agreements should be amended in the manner following:

Now, therefore, the Court, in pursuance of the powers conferred on it by the Industrial Arbitra-tion Act, 1912-1952, doth hereby order that each of the Awards and Industrial Agreements set out in the First Schedule hereto be and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a clause relating to Long Service Leave in the terms set out in the Second Schedule hereto provided-

- (a) that the said provision shall not apply to workers employed by the Government or by a Government Agency a party to any of the Awards set out; and
- (b) that in relation to Award No. 56 of 1951 (Serial No. 244) the said provisions shall not apply to workers other than "Bank Mèssengers" employed by the Australian and New Zealand Bank Ltd., The Com-mercial Bank, Australia Ltd., The National Bank of Australasia Ltd. and The English Cactician and Australian Bank The English Scottish and Australian Bank Ltd.

Liberty is reserved to Industrial Unions not affiliated with the Australian Labour Party and to employers not represented by the Employer's Fed-eration (W.A.) to apply to amend subclause (h) of the Second Schedule hereto.

Second Schedule.

Long Service Leave Clause.

(a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

(b) Long Service.

(1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.

(2) Such service shall include service prior to the coming into operation hereof if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.

(3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transafter the confing into operation hereof, been trans-mitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the trans service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.

(ii) In this subclause "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession whether voluntary or by agreement or by opera-tion of law and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.

- (4) Such service shall include-
 - (a) Any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave.
 - Any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the work-er but only to the extent of fifteen working days in any year of his employment.
 - (c) Any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave.
 - (d) Any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service-
 - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after June 26, 1950;
 - (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946:
 - (iii) in any of the Armed Forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended).

Provided that the worker as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

(5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding-

- (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
- (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof irrespective of the duration thereof;
- (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
- (d) any standing-down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an Award, Industrial Agreement, Order or Determ-ination under either Commonwealth or State law:
- (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
- (f) any termination of the employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination:

- (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
- (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave;
- (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within fourteen days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service, which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post. Provided that the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

(c) Period of Leave.

(1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.

(2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—

- (a) in respect of 20 years' service so completed—13 weeks' leave;
- (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.

(3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct;

the amount of leave shall be-

- (i) if such determination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.

(4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—

- (i) by his death; or
- (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
- (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years. (5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

(d) Payment for Period of Leave.

(1) A worker shall subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave;

(2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this award (or agreement), but in the case of casuals and parttime workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard;

(3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave;

(4) The ordinary time rate of pay-

- (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
- (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances or the like.

(5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

(e) Taking Leave.

(1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—

- (a) Leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker or in the absence of such agreement at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances.
- (b) Except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken.
- (c) Leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or if the employer and the worker so agree in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement.
- (d) Any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this award (or agreement) occurring during the period when the leave is taken but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave.
- (e) Payment shall be made in one of the following ways---
 - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave;

- (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
- (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker.
- (f) No worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.

(2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative, a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

(f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

(1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.

(2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for twenty years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.

(3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to offset any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.

(g) Records to be Kept.

(1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or in the case of termination by death of the worker a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.

(2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this award (or agreement) with respect to the time and wages record.

(h) Special Board of Reference.

(1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.

- (2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—
 - (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
 - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.

(3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated) and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.) together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

(i) State Law.

(1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

(2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith.

(3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.

(4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the first day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

(j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may subject to such conditions as it thinks fit exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

(k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of Long Service Leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

This agreement shall apply to all salaried officers in the employ of the State Building Supplies (with the exception of the General Manager) through-out the State of Western Australia.

4.—Definitions.

For the purpose of this agreement unless the contrary intention appears-

(a) "Metropolitan Area" shall be taken to include all places within a radius of 15 miles from the General Post Office, Perth.

(b) "Basic Rate" shall mean in the case of-

- (1) Male officers in the metropolitan area, or where any male officers' headquarters are in an area, for which an independent basic wage is declared by the Court of Arbitra-tion, the nearest $\pounds 1$ to the result of multi-plying the male basic wage so declared from time to time by fifty-two and onesixth $(52\frac{1}{6})$.
- (2) Female officers, in the metropolitan area or where any female officers' headquarters are in an area for which an independent basic wage is declared by the Court of Arbitration, seventy-five per cent. (75%)to the nearest £ of the male basic wage so declared from time to time as multiplied by fifty-two and one-sixth $(52\frac{1}{6})$.

(c) "Service" where used in clauses 22, 25 and 26 in addition to meaning service with the State Building Supplies shall include:-

(1) That period of continuous service with any Government Department to the credit of an officer at the date immediately preceding the date he was transferred, taken over or employed by the State Building Supplies. Provided that any such officer shall not have a break of continuous service exceeding seven days after clearance of any leave due.

(d) "Head of Branch" means the Assistant General Manager, Mill Superintendent, Manager Local Trade, Finance Manager, Brickworks Superintendent, with respect to activities coming under their control.

5.-Classification of Offices and Officers.

(a) The classification of offices and officers em-ployed by the State Building Supplies and the fix-ing of salaries of officers shall be vested in the General Manager, subject to the right of appeal as provided in clause 32 of this agreement.

(b) In making a classification under this clause, the General Manager shall classify an office according to the class of work required to be per-formed and shall adhere to the salary scales provided in this agreement.

(c) The amount of the marginal allowance payable from time to time shall be determined as follows:-

(1) Males—(i) Margins of £265 per annum and above—as at the 1st January and 1st July each year, the difference between-

- (i.a) The average to the nearest pound (£) of the margin in each case, between the gross annual salary rate paid on the maximum grade or at the age of 27 years (whichever occurs first) in the male clerical automatic ranges in the Public Services of Queens-land, New South Wales, Victoria, Tas-mania and South Australia and the respective annual equivalent of the Com-monwealth basic wage for the capital city of each of the aforesaid States: and
- (i.b) The margin between the gross annual salary rate payable in the metropolitan area to an officer on the maximum of the automatic range prescribed in Clause 8 (a) of this agreement for Male Clerks and the annual equivalent of the Commonwealth basic wage for Perth: Provided that if the amount determined would result in an adjustment of less than five pounds (£5) per annum from the last current adjustment, if any, then no variation shall be made.

(ii) Margins below £265 per annum—pro rata to the nearest pound (\pounds) , with the gross rate (margin plus basic rate) payable in the metropolitan area to an adult male clerical Division Officer on the maximum of the automatic range; provided that an allowance of less than three pounds $(\pounds3)$ per annum (as calculated under this sub-clause) shall not be payable.

(2) Females—(i) Margins of £150 per annum and above—seventy-five per cent (75%), to the nearest pound (£) of the allowances applicable to male officers on margins of £265 per annum and above.

(ii) Margins below £150 per annum—according to seventy-five per cent. (75%) of any allowances applicable to male officers on the basis of the following table:—

(b) After attaining the age of 19 years and before reaching the age of 21 years all male junior clerks may be required to pass a promotional examination as prescribed by the General Manager or produce satisfactory evidence of passing the Junior University examination or having any other certificate deemed satisfactory to the General Manager.

(c) Subject to the provisions of sub-clause (b) hereof, a clerical officer upon reaching the age of 21 years shall have the provisions of Clause 8 of this Agreement applied to him.

8.---Male Adult Clerical Officers.

(a) Male adult clerical officers shall, subject to the provisions of sub-clause 7 (c) of this Agreement, be paid the following margins over the male basic rate:—

(b) Advancement throughout the male adult clerical officers' range shall, subject to the provisions of Clause 30 of this Agreement be automatic, but advancement beyond the margin prescribed for age 27 years or seventh year of adult clerical experience is subject to promotion to a classified position in Group II and to the following provisions:—

A male adult clerical officer who is not less than 28 years of age and has been in receipt of the maximum margin prescribed by this clause for not less than one year and who has completed not less than three years' continuous service since appointment to the State Building Supplies salaried staff who is eligible for promotion and would be recommended for promotion in the event of a suitable vacancy occurring but has not received promotion to a position classified above the maximum margin prescribed by this clause shall be paid an allowance equivalent to the difference between the maximum margin provided by this clause and the minimum margin in the incremental scale as prescribed by clause 6 (a), Group II, of this Agreement. At the expiration of one year this allowance shall be increased by one step in the incremental scale. Provided that on the officer's promotion to a position classified under Clause 6 of this Agreement the allowance shall be converted to salary or shall cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

(c) An officer who is over the age of 21 years on appointment may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of clerical experience and not on age.

(d) For the purpose of this clause "experience" shall be construed to include experience in clerical work with any employer. Nothing contained in this clause shall be deemed to mean that an officer cannot be promoted to a higher classification under this Agreement until he has attained the maximum grading of this clause.

9.—Female Clerks, Typists, Clerk Typists and Machinists.

Group VI. (a) The rates of pay shall be:----

(b) An officer who is over the age of 21 years on appointment may be appointed at a minimum rate of pay based on years of typing, clerical or machining experience and not on age.

(c) For the purpose of this clause "experience" shall be construed to include experience in the abovementioned occupations with any employer. Nothing contained in this clause shall be deemed to mean that an officer cannot be promoted to a higher classification under this Agreement until she has attained the maximum grading of this clause.

10.—Hours of Duty.

The hours of duty for the various officers covered by this Agreement shall be as follows:-

(a) The hours of duty for Foreman, Yard Mana-gers, Senior Clerk—Orders Carlisle Yard, Brick Yard Managers shall be forty hours per week— Monday to Friday inclusive.

(b) The hours for duty for General Store Managers shall be forty hours per week spread over $5\frac{1}{2}$ days—Monday to Saturday inclusive.

(c) The hours of duty for all other officers shall be thirty-seven and one-half hours per week— Monday to Friday inclusive.

11.—Overtime.

(a) Overtime shall mean all time worked in excess of or outside recognised working hours of the officer and which is worked by direction of the head of the branch or General Manager.

(b) Whenever it is possible to do so time off on the basis specified herein for the period worked shall be recommended by the head of the branch in lieu of overtime payment. In the event of time off not being granted for overtime worked within 14 days of its performance, payment shall be made forthwith, unless the officer elects in writing to make such overtime allowance cumulative to his annual leave.

(c) Overtime as provided in sub-clause (d) here-of shall apply only to male officers whose salary does not exceed the maximum margin over the male basic rate applicable to Class 6, Group II, of this Agreement and/or to female officers whose salary does not exceed the maximum over the female basic rate applicable to Class 6 females.

(d) Automatic Range and Class 1 - 6 Group II Officers (excepting Foremen).

- (1) When overtime is paid for it shall be at the following rates:-

 - (i) Monday to Friday inclusive:—
 For officers whose hours of duty are provided by clause 10 of this Agree-ment. The first five hours in any week—time and a quarter. For excess of five hours in any week—time and one half.
 - (ii) Saturday mornings up to 11.30 when not part of the normal hours of dutytime and one half. Between 11.30 a.m. Saturday and midnight Sundaydouble time.

- (iii) Public holidays when occurring on a non-working day-double time.
- (iv) Public holidays when occurring on an Public holidays when occurring on an ordinary working day—Payment for all time worked within the officer's recognised daily working hours shall be paid in addition to the day's pay, which the officer would ordinarily re-ceive in respect of such working day. Work performed by the officer in ex-pass of his recognized dealy hours shall cess of his recognised daily hours shall be paid at the rate of double time.
- (v) The hourly rate for the purpose of these computations shall be calculated at the amount received at the date of commencement of the overtime. Pro-vided that "Salary" for the purpose of this sub-clause shall not include any personal allowance, qualifications qualifications allowance, and/or allowance for per-forming special duties unless other-wise approved by the General Manager.
- (2) When time off is allowed for instead of payment as provided in sub-clause (d) (1) hereof the same formula shall apply.
- (3) Except in the case of an emergency, a break of at least 30 minutes must be made for meals between 12 noon and 2 p.m. when overtime is worked on a Saturday afternoon, Sunday or Public Holiday and between 5 p.m. and 7 p.m. on any day which overtime is performed. Such breaks shall not be recognised as overtime.
- (e) Foremen:
 - (1) Foremen shall not be entitled to payment for overtime unless called upon to work such overtime with other workers for more than an aggregate of two (2) hours per week.
 - (2) Overtime shall not mean the additional time usually and necessarily worked by Foremen as part of their normal duties prior to and after the usual starting and finishing time.
 - (3) Subject to sub-clauses (e) (1) and (2) hereof all times worked by Foremen in excess of the ordinary hours shall be deemed to be overtime and shall be paid for as follows:-
 - (i) For the first four hours per day Monday to Friday inclusive-time and one half.
 - (ii) Saturday—for the first four hours— time and one half—double time thereafter.
 - (iii) Sunday-double time.
 - (4) Where it is deemed that the provisions of sub-clauses (e) (1), (e) (2) and (e) (3) are not suitable, an allowance mutually agreed upon by the Association and the General Manager may be paid to any Foreman in lieu of overtime. Provided that if agreement cannot be reached between the parties the matter be referred to the Appeal Board by either of the parties to this agreement.
 - (f) Group II Officers-Classes 7-11.

Male officers whose salary exceeds the maximum margin applicable to Class 6 Group II officers but does not exceed the maximum margin applicable to Class Eleven (11) of the group shall be allowed time off equivalent to the overtime worked, such time off to be cumulative to annual leave.

12.-Meal Allowance.

(a) If an officer is required to work prior to the usual commencing time or after the usual time for ceasing duty, he shall, when such additional duty place of residence be reimbursed at the rate of 6s. 6d. for each meal purchased and shall be reimbursed the cost of each meal, necessarily purch-ased on Saturdays, Sundays and Public Service holidays at the rate of 6s. 6d. per meal, provided that in each case the overtime worked before and after the meal break totals not less than two hours. (b) Reimbursements for expenditure on meals as provided in sub-clause (a) shall be in addition to payment for overtime.

13.—Travelling.

(a) The following shall be the scale of allowances payable to officers travelling on official business:—

- (1) Between their headquarters within the metropolitan area and a place outside the metropolitan area; or
- (2) Between their headquarters outside the metropolitan area and a place within the metropolitan area; or
- (3) Between their headquarters outside the metropolitan area and a place outside the metropolitan area.

(b) Where an officer leaves and returns to his or her headquarters or his or her home on the same day, at the rate of 8s. 0d. per meal, provided that in cases where an officer departs from his headquarters before 8 a.m. and does not arrive back at his headquarters until after 11 p.m. reimbursement of expenses shall be made at the appropriate daily rate prescribed by subclause (c) and on the basis set out in subclause (e) of this clause.

(c) Where an officer is obliged to be absent from his headquarters overnight, at the rate of 41s. 0d. per day if in receipt of a margin in excess of the maximum margin applicable to Class 7 of the Male Group II as prescribed by Clause 6 of this agreement and at the rate of 38s. 6d. per day for all other officers. These allowances shall apply for the first 14 days in one place, after which the allowance shall be reduced to 38s. 0d. and 35s. 6d. per day, respectively. Provided that reimbursement of travelling expenses for officers whose headquarters are outside the metropolitan area shall be at the rate of 51s. 6d. per day when visiting Perth if the country officer is required to stay overnight in a city hotel. Where a country officer does not stay in a city hotel or is not absent from his headquarters overnight then normal rates as prescribed herein shall apply. Provided further, that the daily rate of 51s. 6d. is only payable whilst an officer is actually in residence overnight at a city hotel and certifies accordingly. In such cases the normal overnight rate shall apply for journeys to and from Perth.

For the purpose of this sub-clause "city hotel" shall be defined as any hotel included in the area bounded by Wellington Street on the North, the Swan River in the East and South, and George Street, St. George's Place and Mill Street in the West.

(d) In the case of officers in charge of field work, and those whose travelling involves the use of both camp and hotel accommodation, a reduction of 20 per cent shall, unless otherwise approved by the General Manager, be made in the above scale.

(e) The daily rate shall represent in equal portions the expenses for three meals and a bed. For the purpose of computing expenses, in the case of arrival at or departure from the town in which the officer's headquarters are located, breakfast shall be allowed for if the arrival is later or departure earlier than 8 a.m., lunch if arrival is later or departure earlier than 1 p.m., tea if arrival is later or departure earlier than 6 p.m., and bed if arrival is later than 11 p.m.

(f) When a sleeping berth is provided the bed allowance will not apply except when a bed has been paid for elsewhere for a portion of the night and a certificate is made to that effect.

(g) When an officer stays at any Government Institution for which a charge is not made, he shall be reimbursed at the rate of 4d. 0d. per day for the period spent at such institution.

(h) Reasonable incidental expenses, such as tram and bus fares and where these are non-existent motor fare may be paid, provided in the opinion of the General Manager the distance warrants it.

(i) If on account of lack of suitable regular transport facilities any officer necessarily engages lodging for the night prior to commencing travelling in order to travel by an early morning train, he shall be paid the allowance for such lodging in addition to the other allowances authorised by this Agreement.

(5)-14043

(j) First class railway and steamer fares shall be allowed to all officers when travelling on departmental business. Railway sleeping berths shall be provided if available.

(k) When officers travel by steamer or other vessel or by railway between Perth and Adelaide, in which the fare paid includes subsistence, an allowance equal to 15 per cent. of the passage money, calculated on single fare, shall be paid in lieu of the ordinary travelling allowances.

(1) Officers stationed in Western Australia who travel on official business beyond the limits of the State but within the Commonwealth shall be reimbursed at the rate of 70s. per day for expenses incurred; the computation of the rate to be on the basis laid down in sub-clause (e) hereof, provided that for the period when at sea or on rail reimbursement shall be at the rate equal to 15 per cent of the passage money calculated on a single fare.

(m) No certifying officer shall pass for payment to any officer, travelling allowance exceeding 14 days in any one month until the endorsement of the head of the branch has been obtained on the account.

(n) Officers shall travel by railway or State steamship unless otherwise directed by the General Manager.

(o) Whenever an officer does not travel by railway or State steamship, as per sub-clause (n) he shall be repaid the actual cost of the necessary and most economical means of conveyance upon furnishing receipts for such payment. Receipts shall not be required for any amounts under five shillings, but in lieu thereof a certificate on the account form must be made as follows:—

"I certify that the sum of.....

has been actually expended by me on official service."

(p) No officer shall engage other vehicles when there are public conveyances available when required.

(q) When circumstances necessitate the hire of a motor car, or other special means of transport, a special report shall accompany the account.

(r) Unless specially authorised by the head of the branch, taxi fares will not be allowed when the distances can be traversed by the ordinary modes of conveyance by rail, tram, motor or omnibus.

(s) Sub-clauses (n) to (r) above shall not apply to officers whose maximum exceeds Class 11 Group II.

14.—Transferred and/or Relieving Officers.

(a) An officer who is transferred to a new locality shall be reimbursed in respect of his living expenses at the rate stated in Clause 13 (c), as the case may require for a period of fourteen days after arrival at his new headquarters: Provided that, if an officer is required to travel on official business during the said period of fourteen days, such period shall be extended by the time spent in travelling. Under no circumstances, however, shall the provisions of this sub-clause operate concurrently with those of Clause 13, so as to permit an officer to be reimbursed in respect of both travelling and transfer expenses for one and the same period.

(b) for the purpose of this clause the headquarters of an officer engaged on more than one work shall be considered to be the place in which the principal work is located as defined by the head of the branch, and while at such headquarters the officer shall not be entitled to any travelling allowance.

(c) When an officer is relieving another or is on special work away from his usual headquarters, and in consequence has in addition to his own maintenance to maintain an establishment elsewhere, he shall:—

Be reimbursed in respect of his living expenses for a period up to a maximum of 21 days after arrival at the new locality, at the rates per day applicable for the first 14 days in one place as prescribed by clause 13 (c) of this agreement.

(2) If the period at the new locality exceeds 21 days, be reimbursed at the rate of 20s. per day if married and 12s. per day if single for the period in excess of 21 days, provided that if the latter period exceeds four weeks the approval of the General Manager shall be obtained to the continuance of the reimbursement.

An officer who cannot claim to maintain an establishment elsewhere but who is put to expense which otherwise would not be necessary for him to incur, shall, on satisfactory proof to the General Manager, be granted an allowance to reimburse such expenses at a sum per day, not exceeding the above amounts.

(d) Where it is considered advisable to do so an officer's headquarters may be changed to a new locality in which case the allowance under subclause (a) may be granted for a period up to 14 days. In cases where the officer is put to expense on return to his former headquarters the allowance may also be paid up to 14 days.

(e) Subclauses (n) to (s) in clause 13 shall also apply to this clause.

15.—Allowance for Vehicles, etc., Owned by Officers.

(a) The General Manager may authorise a commuted allowance for the keep, or hire, of horses, traps, motor bicycles or any other conveyances belonging to officers.

(b) Officers who are required to maintain a motor car or motor cycle for travelling on official business, and who are not in receipt of a commuted allowance in which the whole or portion of the cost of locomotion is included, shall, for journeys approved by the head of the branch be paid a mileage allowance to cover all expenses in connection with the car or motor cycle in accordance with the tables hereunder:—

The rates set out in the preceding tables shall be increased by one-half penny per mile where an officer who has not at any time received any form of financial assistance from the Government of Western Australia to purchase a motor vehicle, uses his own private vehicle to travel on official business. Claims for the payment of hire at the increased rate of one-half penny per mile shall be endorsed with the following certificate—

"I certify that I have not at any time rereceived any form of financial assistance from the Government of Western Australia to purchase a motor vehicle."

(c) The General Manager may increase the rates prescribed in subclause (b) in any case in which he is satisfied that the rates are inadequate.

(d) Where an officer, in course of a journey, travels through two or more separate areas, payment of hire at the rates prescribed by subclause (b) shall be made at the appropriate rate applicable to each of the separate areas traversed.

(e) A year for the purpose of this clause shall commence on the 1st day of July and end on the 30th day of June next following.

16.—Travelling Time.

Officers who, in the course of their duty, are called upon to travel after their usual office hours may, on special occasions and at the discretion of the General Manager, be granted time off in respect of such time or part of such time spent in travelling.

17.—Higher Duties Allowance.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, an officer, other than one classed as a Relieving Officer, who is required to act in a position classified higher than that in which he himself is classified shall be paid higher duties allowance on the basis defined in subclause (c) for the whole period that he acts in such higher position: Provided that he performs the full duties and accepts the full responsibilities of the higher position—

- for a continued period of two weeks or more for a reason other than the absence of the classified occupant of the position on normal annual leave, or
- (2) For a continuous period in excess—of a period of normal annual leave in the case of the classified occupant of the position clearing leave including a period of normal annual leave.

(b) For the purpose of this clause the expression "normal annual leave" shall mean the annual period of recreation leave as referred to in this agreement and shall include any Public Service holidays taken in conjunction with such annual leave.

(c) An officer who acts in a higher position under the conditions prescribed in subclause (a) shall be paid higher duties allowance on the following basis:—

- (1) When acting in a higher position the minimum classified margin of which exceeds his own margin over the basic rate an allowance equivalent to the difference between his own margin over the basic rate and the minimum classified margin of the position in which he is acting; or
- (2) when acting in a higher position the minimum classified margin of which does not exceed his own margin over the basic rate—an allowance equivalent to the difference between his own margin over basic rate and the margin he would receive if he were permanently appointed to the position in which he is acting.

(d) No officer under the age of 21 years shall be permitted to relieve or act in a position classified higher than his own without the prior approval of the General Manager and the Association.

(e) An allowance under this clause shall not be payable to a male or female officer under the age of 21 years.

(f) An allowance under this clause shall not be payable to a female officer when acting in a male position classified within the male clerical automatic range. (g) A female officer who acts in a male position classified above the male clerical automatic range under the conditions prescribed in subclause (a) shall be paid higher duties allowance on the basis of the female basic rate plus the female margin relative to the position in which she is acting.

(h)—

- (1) If an officer classified as a Relieving Officer acts or relieves in a position one class higher than his own for a continuous period exceeding four weeks and during such period performs the full duties and accepts the full responsibilities of such higher position, he shall be paid higher duties allowance on the basis set out in subclause (c) for the period in excess of four weeks.
- (2) If an officer classified as a Relieving Officer acts or relieves in a position classified two or more classes higher than his own under the conditions prescribed in subclause (a), he shall be paid higher duties allowance on the basis prescribed in subclause (c).

(i) An officer who is in receipt of an allowance granted under this clause shall, if he acts in a higher position continuously for a sufficiently long period, be entitled to receive an increased higher duties allowance equivalent to the annual increment he would have received had he been permanently appointed to such higher position for the whole time he has been acting therein: Provided that in the case of a Relieving Officer acting or relieving in a position only one class higher than his own, the first four weeks of service in the higher position shall not be taken into account.

(j) An officer who is in receipt of an allowance granted under this clause shall continue to receive such allowance during his absence on normal annual leave or whilst absent on approved sick leave for a period of less than two weeks' duration, provided that he had qualified for payment of the allowance by serving the required continuous period before proceeding on such leave and provided further that he resumes after such leave in the position in respect of which he was paid higher duties allowance.

(k) If an officer who is acting in a higher position proceeds on:—

- (1) Any period of long service leave;
- (2) A period of recreation leave in excess of the normal annual leave period.
- (3) A period of sick leave of two weeks' duration or more; or
- (4) A period of normal annual leave preceded or followed by a period of sick leave, long service leave or leave without pay—

he shall not be entitled to receive payment of an allowance under this clause for the whole or any part of the period of such leave and the continuity of his acting service in the higher position shall be deemed to be broken by his proceeding on such leave.

18.-Dirty Work.

A special allowance shall be paid to an officer when engaged in any dirty work (including moving or sorting old books and documents), which is not part of the usual duty of the officer concerned, and which, in the opinion of the head of the branch could be classed as dirty work; such allowance to be assessed by the General Manager.

19.—Qualifications Allowance—Clerical.

- (a) A male adult clerical officer who obtains:-
 - (1) A Diploma of Commerce or passes in five units (including English) of a degree course in Arts, Science, Economics or Law at the University of Western Australia, or passes the final examination in all subjects of a recognised Institute of Accountants or Cost Accountants or Secretaries, or the Commonwealth Institute of Valuers, or obtains the Diploma in Public Administration at the Perth Technical College, or

who obtains an equal qualification approved by the General Manager, shall be paid, whilst in receipt of the salary margin shown in Column "A" of the schedule hereunder, the per annum allowance indicated in Column "B" of the schedule, or

(2) A degree at the University of Western Australia in Arts, Science, Economics or Law, or who obtains an equal qualification approved by the General Manager shall be paid, whilst in receipt of the salary margin shown in column "A" of the schedule hereunder, the per annum allowance indicated in column "C" of the schedule.

(b) An officer who obtains more than one of the qualifications mentioned in this clause shall only be entitled to payment of this allowance prescribed in either column "B" or "C" of the schedule as the case may require, and no payment shall be made for more than one of the qualifications obtained.

(c) Payment of the allowance shall vary in the manner indicated in the Schedule according to variations in the officer's salary margin and shall cease either as a result of the officer becoming entitled to a salary margin for which no qualifications allowance is provided or by the effluxion of a period of 10 years from the date on which the officer first became entitled to payment of the allowance.

20.—Allowances: Clerical Division Officers— Females.

(a) A female officer who has been in receipt of the maximum margin prescribed by Clause 9 (a) for not less than five years and who is eligible for promotion and would be recommended for promotion in the event of a suitable vacancy occurring but has not received promotion to a position classified above the maximum margin prescribed by Clause 9 (a) shall be paid an allowance equivalent to the difference between the maximum margin provided by Clause 9 (a) and the minimum margin in the incremental scale as prescribed by Clause 6 Group II Females of this Agreement. Provided that on the officer's promotion to a position classified under Clause 6 of this Agreement the allowance shall be converted to salary, or shall cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion. (b) A female clerical officer classified in either Class 1, 2, 3 or 4 of Group II shall be paid the allowance set out hereunder subject to the head of the branch giving a certificate each year as to the good conduct, diligence and efficiency of the officer:—

- (1) Upon completion of twelve months of continuous service on the maximum of her classification—an allowance of one grade in the incremental scale.
- (2) Upon completion of 20-years of continuous permanent service: An allowance equal to the difference between the maximum margin of the class in which she is classified and the second higher grade in the incremental scale. Provided she has been in receipt of the allowance referred to in sub-paragraph (1) for a continuous period of 12 months.

An officer shall not be entitled to receive approval to the payment of more than one allowance under the provisions of this paragraph in any period of 12 months and provided further—An officer who, upon promotion, is in receipt of both of the allowances referred to in paragraph (1) and (2) of this sub-clause shall retain the allowance under paragraph (2) but shall not be again eligible for the allowance under paragraph (1) until she has completed twelve months of continuous service on the maximum of her new classification.

(c) An officer within the automatic range as enumerated in Clause 9 (a) of this Agreement shall be paid an allowance of £25 per annum provided that—

- (1) In the case of a Clerk, Clerk Typiste or Typiste, she passes an efficiency examination in shorthand writing at a speed of 100 words per minute and typewriting at 50 words per minute.
- (2) In the case of a Machinist, she passes an examination in typewriting at a speed of 35 words per minute and in the operation of accounting and listing machines.

Provided further that—

- (3) Such allowance shall be converted to salary on promotion to a higher position or to cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion; and
- (4) An adult who has passed either of the examinations referred to in this clause and who has been retained on the maximum of the automatic range (excluding allowance) as a permanent officer for four (4) years, shall be paid an allowance to bring her total remuneration to a margin of £205 per annum: Provided the General Manager certifies as to the good conduct, efficiency and ability of the officer to perform higher duties; such allowance to be converted to salary on promotion to a higher position or to cease should the officer refuse to accept promotion.

21.-Married Men's Allowance.

A male clerk who is a married man or who is the support of those related to him, on the approval of the General Manager shall be entitled to an allowance equivalent to the difference between his margin and the next higher margin as prescribed in Clause 7 (a) and 8 (a) of this Agreement as the case may require until he attains the maximum margin of his grading, when such allowance shall cease and be converted to salary.

22.—Annual Leave and Holidays.

(a) The following days shall be observed as paid holidays: New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Foundation Day, Royal Show Day (for officers stationed in the metropolitan area and any alternative day observed as a Public Holiday in any town outside the metropolitan area where officers are stationed) Queen's Birthday, Christmas Day, Boxing Day and other days which may be proclaimed as Public Service holidays. (b) The General Manager shall grant to every officer of the State Building Supplies leave of absence, for recreation, for two weeks in each calendar year, exclusive of public holidays, except as hereinafter provided. Leave of absence for recreation shall be taken in one period unless specially approved by the General Manager.

(c) For the purpose of arranging leave, a programme shall be prepared in the month of January of each year, and an officer may be permitted to take his leave at any time during the year; that is to say, an officer may be permitted to take his annual leave in January for the year which is then commencing.

The programme shall be submitted to the General Manager for approval, but may be departed from in detail at his discretion.

(d) When an officer cannot take his leave in the year in which it accrued because the "convenience of the Trading Concern" renders his absence undesirable, the General Manager will approve of its accumulation, provided always that no accumulation of annual leave shall exceed six weeks, excluding the leave for the year in which it is taken. In other cases leave not taken during the year in which it accrues shall lapse.

(e) When an officer enters the Service after the 1st January he may be granted annual leave for that year at the rate of one day for each complete month of service, and when an officer leaves the Service before the 31st December he may be granted for that year one day for each complete month of service.

(f) An officer may be paid his salary in advance when going on recreation leave.

23.—Leave Without Pay.

(a) On the application of any officer, leave of absence without pay may be granted for any period not exceeding 12 months. The General Manager may approve such leave up to a period of four weeks, but leave for longer periods up to 12 months must be submitted to the Minister for approval.

(b) The period during which any officer is absent on leave granted pursuant to sub-clause (a) hereof shall not for any purpose be included as part of such officer's period of service.

24.—Short Leave.

(a) The General Manager may, on sufficient cause being shown, grant an officer leave of absence not exceeding two days, but all such periods of leave shall be properly recorded and at the discretion of the General Manager shall or shall not be deducted from the officer's next annual leave or accumulated annual leave.

(b) Provided that if the leave granted under sub-clause (a) hereof exceeds three days in any one year the excess shall be deducted from the officer's next annual leave or accumulated annual leave.

25.-Sick Leave.

(a) An officer who is incapacitated for duty in consequence of illness or injury shall as soon as possible advise his superior officer in sufficient time to admit of arrangements being made for the performance of his duties. Any such officer who fails to do so shall be treated as absent without leave.

(b) An officer so incapacitated for duty shall also notify his superior officer in sufficient time of the date on which he will resume duty, to enable any necessary arrangements to be made.

(c) Should the absence be prolonged beyond two days, the officer shall forward to his superior officer as soon as possible thereafter, a certificate from any legally qualified medical practitioner, showing the nature of the illness and the probable duration.

(d) An officer who finds that he is unable to resume duty on the expiration of the period shown on the first certificate shall thereupon furnish a further certificate and shall continue to do so upon the expiration of the period respectively covered by such certificates; Provided, however, that the maximum period between the dates of furnishing any two medical certificates shall be 14 days. (e) Any officer shall if so directed present himself for examination by a medical officer at such time and place as may be fixed. All expenses incurred by the officer undergoing such examination may be paid by the General Manager.

(f) The basis of determining the leave which may be granted shall be ascertained by crediting officers with the following periods, such leave to be cumulative:— Working

g) Where an officer has been gran	ted for	urteen

(g) Where an officer has been granted fourteen (14) months' continuous leave with pay, he shall not be entitled to receive further leave with pay until he has completed a period of duty of not less than four weeks.

(h) The maximum period allowable with pay in respect of any continuous absence shall not exceed nine (9) months on full pay and five (5) months on half pay.

(i) In exceptional cases the scale set out in subclause (f) hereof may be varied by the Minister on the recommendation of the General Manager to allow a greater period of sick leave on full pay or half pay.

(j) Persons temporarily employed for a continuous period of less than three years may be granted sick leave as follows:—

- (1) Where continuous service does not exceed six months, three working days on full pay.
- (2) Where continuous service exceeds six months but does not exceed eighteen months, ten working days on full pay less any leave granted under paragraph (a).
- (3) Where continuous service exceeds eighteen months, but is less than three years, ten working days on full pay and ten working days on half pay less any leave granted under paragraphs (a) and (b).

(k) Indisposition not necessitating confinement to the house shall not be regarded as illness in respect of which leave of absence may be granted under this clause excepting under special circumstances as may be approved by the General Manager.

(1) Sick leave shall not be granted in respect of any absence due to an officer's own fault, neglect or misconduct.

(m) Where an officer is absent as the result of injuries sustained in the discharge of his duties and is paid compensation in accordance with the provisions of the Compensation Act, half the period of absence shall be debited against sick leave entitlements.

26.—Promotions.

(a) All promotions shall be subject to the provisions of the Government Employees' (Promotions Appeal Board) Act, (b) The selection of officers for promotion to a position of higher classification shall be governed by relative ability, suitability, record and experience. If everything else is deemed equal, the senior officer shall be selected.

(c) Where the General Manager considers it necessary in the interests of the Trading Concern, a person from outside the service may be appointed to any position: Provided there is no officer in the service considered capable of filling such position.

(d) An officer promoted to a higher position shall be paid the minimum rate of salary prescribed for that position, provided that an officer who has been in receipt of a salary equivalent to such minimum rate for 12 months or over shall be paid on the basis of the next higher grade. If in receipt of such minimum salary for a period of less than 12 months then advancement to the higher grade shall be made 12 months from the date the officer first received the salary equivalent to the minimum of his new position.

(e) All vacancies and new positions shall be notified to the staff by a notice exhibited on the salaried staff notice board in the head office and all depots where salaried officers are employed for at least seven days prior to filling of such vacancies or new positions.

(f) The Association shall be notified of all promotions and new appointments within 14 days of such promotions and new appointments.

27.—Payment of Salaries.

Salaries shall be paid fortnightly on each alternate Friday except where the usual pay day falls on a public holiday when payment shall be made on the previous Thursday.

28.—Channel of Communication.

The Association shall be recognised as the channel of communication within the ambit of this Agreement between the Staff of the Trading Concern and the General Manager or the Minister, subject to procedure as may be agreed upon in dealing with complaints or other matters arising. No complaint or other communication from any other organised body will be received.

29.—Probationary Service prior to Appointment to Staff.

Each newly engaged officer shall serve to the satisfaction of the General Manager a probationary period of six months before he or she is considered for appointment to the permanent salaried staff. All notices of engagements and appointments shall be given in writing.

30.—Annual Increments.

Subject to the receipt by the General Manager of a report from the head of the branch regarding good conduct, diligence and efficiency, officers classified in the classes referred to in sub-clauses 6 (a), 7 (a), 8 (a) and 9 (a) of this Agreement shall proceed from the minimum to the maximum of respective classes by annual increments according to the grades in such classes. In the case of all other officers, progression from year to year shall be subject to the submission of a similar report.

31.-Persons Temporarily Employed.

(a) A person temporarily employed shall be paid at a rate of pay equivalent to the annual rate that would be payable in accordance with this Agreement to a permanent officer on similar duties, provided that:—

- (1) A male adult, temporarily employed in a clerical capacity, shall be paid on appointment an amount at least equivalent to the following rates:—
 - (i) 22 years of age and under—the rate prescribed for age in Clauses 7 (a), 8
 (a) as the case demands.
 - (ii) 23 years of age and over—the rate prescribed for the third year of adult clerical experience as prescribed in Clause 8 (a);

- (2) A female officer temporarily employed in a clerical capacity, shall be paid on appointment an amount at least equivalent to the following rates:—
 - (i) 21 years of age and under—the rate prescribed for age in Clause 9 (a).
 - (ii) 22 years of age and over—the rate prescribed for second year of adult clerical experience as prescribed in Clause 9 (a).

(b) In no case shall the provisions of Clauses 8 (b), 9 (b), 19, 20, 21, 26 and 32 of this Agreement apply in respect of a person temporarily employed.

(c) Other conditions of service for persons temporarily employed shall be as for temporary officers in the State Public Service.

(d) Nothing in this Agreement shall prevent the vacational employment in a temporary capacity of persons following a degree or diploma course at a University, Technical College or similar Institute on such terms and conditions as may be determined by the General Manager.

32.—Rights of Appeal.

(a) An Appeal Board consisting of a Chairman mutually agreed upon between the parties to this Agreement or, failing agreement, selected by the President of the Court of Arbitration from the nominess of the parties, and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties, shall be set up, as may be required from time to time, to hear and determine any appeal by a member of the Association against a decision of the General Manager in respect of:—

- (1) The title, classification, reclassification or salary of such member.
- (2) The application of any provision of this Agreement affecting such member.

(b) Written notice of appeal shall be lodged with the General Manager as follows:—

- (1) In respect of appeals under (a) (1) within one month of the publication of such title, classification, reclassification or salary.
- (2) In respect of appeals under (a) (2) within one month from the time when the cause of action arose.

(c) The decision of the Board shall be final and binding on all the parties.

33.—Recognition of Association.

Any officer appointed, who at the date of engagement is not a member of the Association, shall within fourteen (14) days of commencing duty apply and complete an application for membership of the Association.

34.—Variation of Provisions.

Any provision contained in this Agreement based on similar provisions applicable to the State Public Service, shall be deemed to be varied and amended within the terms so amended or varied in the State Public Service from time to time.

35.—Preservation of Accrued Rights.

Nothing contained in this Agreement shall affect any rights or privileges relating to entitlement to annual leave, sick leave or long service leave accrued to any officer prior to the date of this Agreement.

36.—Resignations, Retirements and Dismissals.

(a) No officer, other than a temporary officer or an officer serving a probationary period, shall leave the service of the Trading Concern until the expiration of one month's written notice of his intention so to do without the approval of the General Manager: Provided that a temporary officer or an officer serving a probationary period shall give two weeks notice.

(b) Except as hereinafter provided one month's written notice shall be given by the General Manager to an officer, other than a temporary officer or an officer serving a probationary period, whose services are no longer required and the reason for such termination shall be stated in such notice: Provided that in the case of a temporary officer or an officer serving a probationary period, two weeks' notice shall be given. (c) (1) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (b) hereof the General Manager may summarily dismiss an officer for wilful misconduct committed during the course of or in connection with the performance of the officer's duties: Provided that the officer shall be charged in writing with the offence and shall be allowed 24 hours in which to make his written answer to the charge: Provided further that the General Manager shall consider the charge and answer before a decision to dismiss becomes effective.

(2) The 24 hours referred to in sub-paragraph (1) hereof shall not include weekends, service holidays or days on which an officer is rostered off duty.

(d) Unless the head of the branch recommends and the General Manager certifies that her continuance in office is required in the Trading Concern's interests, a female officer upon her marriage shall tender her resignation as an officer of the Trading Concern subject to the provisions of subclause (a) hereof: Provided that nothing in this clause shall debar the General Manager from subsequently re-employing such officer.

38.—Term of Agreement.

This Agreement shall be for a term of three (3) years commencing from 1st July, 1957: Provided that resulting classification shall date from 1st January, 1958, and provided that either party to this Agreement may at any time after the date of this Agreement negotiate with the other party and, if both parties agree, such Agreement may be amended by a supplementary Agreement which shall be concurrent with this Agreement.

IN THE COURT OF ARBITRATION OF the WESTERN AUSTRALIA.

No. 3 of 1956.

Between Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch, Applicant, and W. J. Begley, E. H. Tidy, P. B. Healy, E. E. Oates, G. E. A. Wright, J. S. Cornell, C. T. Derby and H. Solley, Respondents.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties; and Whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination; and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference; and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Court by their respective representatives and requested the Court to make the said agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Court pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling it hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

Memorandum of Agreement.

(Note.—Wherever the word "Award" occurs herein it shall be taken to mean and include "Agreement.")

1.—Title.

This Award shall be known as the Clerks' (Betting Shops) Award.

3.-Division.

This Award shall be divided into sections as hereinafter appear. The clauses numbered 1 to 16 inclusive are applicable to all workers covered by the Award (except where expressly excluded); the clauses numbered 17 to 22 inclusive are applicable to permanent clerks, and the clauses numbered 23 to 26 inclusive are applicable to part-time clerks.

4.—Area.

This Award shall have effect over the area comprised within the State of Western Australia.

5.-Scope.

This Award shall apply to all workers licensed under the provisions of the Betting Control Act, 1954, employed on registered betting premises.

6.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

7.—Definitions.

(a) "Permanent clerk" shall mean a clerk en-gaged full-time who is not merely engaged for work on race days and work directly incidental thereto.

(b) "Part-time clerk" shall mean a clerk who is specially engaged for work on race days and work directly incidental thereto.

(c) "Race day" shall mean any day upon which a race or trotting meeting on which the employer is allowed to operate under the provisions of the

(d) "The Union" shall mean the Federated Clerks' Union of Australia Industrial Union of Workers, W.A. Branch.

8.—Hours.

(a) The ordinary hours of duty exclusive of meal hours shall not exceed forty hours in any one week provided that this provision shall be complied with if the ordinary hours exclusive of meal hours do not exceed eighty per fortnight.

(b) The hours prescribed in subclause (a) hereof shall be worked on any five days, Monday to Saturday inclusive, between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6 p.m. on race days except that where any trotting meeting is held on such days, the finishing time may be extended up to 11.15 p.m. In respect to days other than race days, the said hours shall be worked between 9.45 a.m. and 5.30 p.m.

(c) (i) On race days a meal break of at least thirty minutes shall be allowed between the hours of 11.30 a.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between the hours of 5.30 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. on those race days when a trotting meeting is held.

(ii) On other days, a meal break of one hour shall be allowed between the hours of 12 noon and 2 p.m.

9.—Overtime.

(a) All work done outside the hours prescribed in clause 8 of this Award shall be paid for at the rate of time and a half for the first three hours and double time thereafter.

(b) All work done during the meal break shall be paid for at overtime rates.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Award:-

- (i) An employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement.
- (ii) No organisation, party to this Award, or worker or workers covered by this Award shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

(d) In the calculation of overtime, each day shall stand alone.

(e) All time worked on Sundays, Christmas Day, Good Friday and Anzac Day shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

(f) Any clerk in receipt of a salary at the rate of £52 per annum or more in excess of the rate herein prescribed for a senior clerk shall not be entitled to payment of overtime rates for any over-time worked. Liberty is reserved to the Union to apply in respect to this subclause.

10.—Meal Money.

When a clerk is required to continue working after 6.30 p.m. on any day other than a race day, he shall be provided with any meal required or shall be paid three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) in lieu thereof.

11.-Reference.

On leaving the employ of an employer the worker shall be given a reference setting out at least the length of service and duties performed.

12.--Time and Wages Record.

A record shall be kept in each establishment by the employer, wherein shall be entered-

- (i) the name of each worker;
- (ii) designation, whether a part-time or per-manent clerk;
- (iii) the nature of the work performed by each clerk;
- (iv) the classification of each clerk;
- (v) the wages or salary, and the overtime (if any), paid each week and such record shall, if correct, be signed at least once weekly by the clerk.

Such record shall be open to the inspection of a duly accredited representative of the Union during the usual business hours.

13.—Right of Entry.

A duly accredited representative of the Union shall be permitted to interview any worker on legitimate Union business on the business premises of his employer during the recognised meal hour of the worker with the permission of his employer (which permission shall not be unreasonably with-held), but this permission shall not be exercised more than once in any one week without the consent of the employer.

14.---No Reduction.

No clerk shall, as a result of the operation of this Award, suffer any loss of salary which he may have enjoyed at the date of this Award.

15.-Board of Reference.

(a) The Court hereby appoints for the purpose of this Award a Board of Reference.

(b) The Board shall consist of a chairman and two (2) other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

(c) There are assigned to such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Award, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matter of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Award or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

(d) An appeal shall lie from any such decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, which for this purpose are embodied in this Award.

16.—Aged and Infirm Workers.

(a) Any worker who, by reason of old age or infirmity, is unable to earn the minimum wage may be paid such lesser wage as may from time to time be agreed upon in writing between the Union and the employer.

(b) In the event of no agreement being arrived at, the matter may be referred to the Board of Reference for determination.

(c) After application has been made to the Board of Reference, and pending the decision of the Board, the worker shall be entitled to work for and be employed at the proposed lesser rate.

17.—Permanent Clerks.

The following provisions in clauses 18 to 22 inclusive, shall apply only to permanent clerks.

18.—Holidays.

(a) Subject to subclause 9 (e) and subclause (b) hereof, the following days, or the days observed in lieu thereof, shall be observed as holidays without deduction of pay namely, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, State Foundation Day, Show Day in the metropolitan area from 12 o'clock noon, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.

(b) All work done on any of the days prescribed in subclause (a) hereof other than Christmas Day, Good Friday and Anzac Day shall be paid for at the ordinary rate and an additional day on full pay shall be added to the amount of annual leave to which the worker is entitled under clause 19 for each day or part of a day so worked: Provided that, if, by agreement between the employer and the clerk, or as a result of the clerk's own default, only part of a day is worked by the clerk on any such day, an addition shall be made to such annual leave equivalent only to the time actually worked on such day: Provided further that by agreement between the employer and the clerk, the foregoing provision shall be deemed to have been complied with if all work performed on the holidays prescribed in subclause (a) hereof is paid for at the rate of double time.

19.—Annual Leave.

(a) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two (2) consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.

(b) If any Award holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day, being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.

(c) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying 12 monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.

(d) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by the Award, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave. (e) A worker who is dismissed for gross misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

(f) No worker shall be required to go on holidays unless at least two weeks' prior notice is given. The employer shall, as far as practicable, arrange to grant annual leave to suit the convenience of the worker.

(g) In the event of the death of a worker the cash equivalent of all annual leave due at the time of death shall be paid to the worker's dependants or personal representative.

20.-Sick Leave.

(a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal illhealth for one-twelfth of a week for each completed month of service: Provided that, subject to subclause (f) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one week in each calendar year.

(b) Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred.

(c) This clause shall not apply when a worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.

(d) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through any accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment or for any accident wherever sustained arising out of his own wilful default or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.

(e) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three days or more.

(f) If the full period of sick leave as prescribed in subclause (a) of this clause is not taken in any year, such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding three weeks.

21.—Contract of Service.

The contract of service shall be by the week and shall be terminable by one week's notice on either side or by the payment or forfeiture of one week's pay as the case may be.
