WHEREAS by the Transfer of Land Act, 1893-1950, the Governor is empowered by Proclamation in the Government Gazette to revest in Her Majesty as of her former estate all or any lands whereof Her Majesty may become the registered proprietors and whereas How Majesty is now the proprietor; and whereas Her Majesty is now the registered proprietor of the land described in the Schedule hereto: Now, therefore I, the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do by this Proclamation revest in Her Majesty, her heirs and successors, the land described in the Schedule hereto, as of her former estate.

# Land Act, 1933-1956. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by section 33 of the Land Act, 1933-1956, it is made lawful for the Governor to direct that any reserve shall vest in and be held by any municipality, road board, or other person or persons to be named in the order, in trust for any of the purposes set forth in section 29 of the said Act, or for the like or other public purposes to be specified in such order, and with power of sub-leasing; and whereas it is deemed expedient as follows:—

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby direct that the beforementioned reserves shall vest in and be held by the abovementioned bodies in trust for the purposes aforesaid, subject nevertheless to the powers reserved to him by section 37 of the said Act.

## Forests Act, 1918-1954. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Forests File 577/53, Lands File 7202/07, Vol. 2. WHEREAS by the Forests Act, 1918-1954, it is provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, dedicate any Crown lands as State Forests within the meaning and for the purposes of that Act: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby dedicate the area of Crown land described in the Schedule hereto as Timber Reserve No. 135/25 within the meaning and for the purposes of the said Act.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954. Construction of Cunderdin-Minnivale-Kokardine

Pipe Line-Section 2. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.W.W.S. 185/56.

WHEREAS by the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954, it is provided that before undertaking the construction of water works, the Minister shall submit plans, descriptions, books of reference and estimates of the proposed works to the Governor for approval; and that if they are approved, the Governor may forthwith by Order in Council, empower the Minister to undertake the construction of the proposed works. Now these construction of the proposed works: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby approves of the plans, descriptions, books of reference and estimates marked on Plan P.W.D., W.A., 36080, for the construction of the Cunderdin-Minnivale-Kokardine Pipe Line, Section 2, which was duly submitted for approval, and hereby empowers the Minister to undertake the construction of the said works.

#### ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 8 of the Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954, that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute a Country Water Area; and whereas by section 10 of the said Act it is further provided that the Governor may by Order in Council constitute any number of rating zones in a country water area: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, by and with the consent of the Executive Council, doth hereby constitute the Pithara Country Water Area as defined in the First Schedule hereunder, and doth also hereby constitute the area as defined in the Second Schedule to be a rating zone and to assign the name of "Pithara Rating Zone" thereto.

Traffic Act, 1919-1957.

Municipality of Narrogin.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Police T.O. 58/732.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order under section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1957, namely that the Municipality of Narrogin is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:—

(1) Clause (y) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, providing for the placing, erection, or installation on roads or footpaths of traffic signs,

lights and directions for the control and direction of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian and including the driving of animals, for the marking on roads or footpaths of signs for the control and direction of the traffic and for the regulation and prohibition of the traffic in relation to the signs, lights and directions;

- (2) Clause (zd) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, appointing stands and parking places for different classes of vehicles and regulate the use thereof;
- (3) Clauses (zl) and (zm) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles, or vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads, or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times, and prescribing a penalty for any breach thereof;
- (4) Clause (k) of paragraph (vii) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, regulating the maximum weight of the load that may be carried by any vehicle (inclusive of the weight of the vehicle) on roads other than such roads as are specifically prescribed in any prescribed area, and prohibiting the carriage of any such load exceeding the prescribed maximum weight.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has, prior to notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.

LAND TAX ASSESSMENT ACT, 1907-1956.

Land Tax-Notice to Make Returns.

NOTICE is hereby given that every person who at noon on 30th June, 1958, bought or sold any land whatever in Western Australia during the preceding 12 months and who was deemed the owner within the meaning of the said Act, is required to make and furnish to me at the Office of the Commissioner of Taxation, Perth, on or before the 31st day of July, 1958, a land tax return in the prescribed form.

Prescribed Form of Return.

Form A.—For use by any person who during the year ended 30th June, 1958:—

- (a) bought or sold any land during the year;
- (b) added improvements to land already owned;

(c) acquired any land from the Crown under leasehold conditions.

#### Penalties.

Failure to furnish return.—Not less than £2 nor more than £100.

Making a false return.—Not less than £2 nor more than £100 and treble the amount of the tax.

#### INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

THIS Agreement, made in pursuance of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, this 9th day of April, 1958, between the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers (hereinafter referred to as the Union of the one part) and the Nor'-West Whaling Company Limited (hereinafter referred to as the Employer) of the other part, witnesseth that the parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one parties hereto mutually covenant and agree the one with the other as follows:-

#### 3.-Scope.

This Agreement shall apply to the employment of workers (other than tradesmen and watchmen) engaged for one (1) week or more on maintenance work on the vessels of the Nor'-West Whaling Company Pty. Ltd.

## 4.—Area.

This Agreement shall apply throughout the South-West Land Division of the State of Western Australia.

## 5.—Term.

The term of this Agreement shall be for a period of three (3) years from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

## 6.—Hours.

- (a) Forty (40) hours shall constitute a week's work, to be worked between the hours of 7 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, provided that no day's work shall exceed eight (8) hours. Provided further that the starting and finishing times may be varied by agreement between the workers and the employer.
  - (b) Meal interval shall not exceed one (1) hour.

## 7.—Overtime.

- (a) Subject to subclause (b) hereof, all time worked in excess of eight (8) hours on any one day and all time worked on Saturday shall be deemed to be overtime and shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) All work commenced at or after midnight and within one and a half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  hours of the usual starting time or on Saturday before 7 a.m. shall stand alone and be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) For work performed within one and a half  $(1\frac{1}{2})$  hours of the usual starting time, the rate of time and one-half shall be paid.
- (d) All time worked on Sunday shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (e) In the computation of overtime, each day shall stand alone.

- (f) Where a worker is required for duty during any meal time, whereby his meal time is postponed for one hour or more, he shall be paid at the rate of double time until he gets a meal.
- (g) Notwithstanding anything contained in this Agreement—
  - (i) an employer may require any worker to work reasonable overtime at overtime rates and such worker shall work overtime in accordance with such requirement;
  - (ii) no organisation party to this Agreement, or worker or workers covered by this Agreement, shall in any way, whether directly or indirectly, be a party to or concerned in any ban, limitation, or restriction upon the working of overtime in accordance with the requirements of this subclause.

- (b) Work in peaks, ballast tanks, fresh water tanks, air-tight compartments, refrigerating chambers when operating, between boilers and ship's side, in tunnels (except that portion of a tunnel used as a workshop), limbers, chain lockers, coffer dams, caissons or in any compartment or space, access to which is through a manhole or similar opening—1s. per hour.

Provided that no such pneumatic machine shall be used in any confined place, entrance to which is gained through a manhole or other similar opening, except in cases where the conditions are such as to render the work incapable of performance except with the use of pneumatic machines—two shillings (2s.) per hour.

(f) Work which is unusually obnoxious or of an objectionable nature and for which no other special rates are prescribed shall be paid an extra amount, as agreed upon between the representative of the employer and of the Union. If no agreement can be reached, the matter to be referred to the Board of Reference for decision. No stoppage of work shall take place pending such decision. If in any case for which special rates are prescribed the Board of Reference decides that there exists any obnoxious, nauseating or objectionable feature to a degree which is exceptionally and unreasonably abnormal or unusual for such type of work, the Board may award such extra rate as it thinks fit for such work in addition to those set out in subclause (a) hereof.

(g) Except in regard to subclause (e) of this clause, where more than one of the disabilities entitling a workman to extra rates exist on the same job, the employer shall be bound to pay only one rate, namely, the highest for the disabilities so prevailing.

#### 10.—Contract of Service.

The contract of service shall be a weekly one terminable by one (1) week's notice on either side. This shall not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct, in which case wages shall be paid up to the time of dismissal only.

## 11.—Absence through Sickness.

- (a) A worker shall be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the ground of personal ill-health for one-twelfth of a week for each completed month of service. Provided that, subject to subclause (e) hereof, payment for absence through such ill-health shall be limited to one (1) week in each calendar year. Payment hereunder may be adjusted at the end of each calendar year, or at the time the worker leaves the service of the employer, in the event of the worker being entitled by service subsequent to the sickness to a greater allowance than that made at the time the sickness occurred. This clause shall not apply where the worker is entitled to compensation under the Workers' Compensation Act.
- (b) A worker shall not be entitled to receive any wages from his employer for any time lost through the result of an accident not arising out of or in the course of his employment, or for any accident, wherever sustained, arising out of his own wilful default, or for sickness arising out of his own wilful default.
- (c) No worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to his employer of sickness, but the employer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three (3) days or more.
- (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of subclause (c) hereof, a worker, who in any calendar year, has already been allowed paid sick leave on one occasion for one day only, or less, shall not be entitled to payment for any further absence of one day only or less, unless he produces to the employer a medical certificate stating that he was unable to attend for duty on account of personal ill-health.
- (e) Sick leave shall accumulate from year to year so that any balance of the period specified in subclause (a) of this clause which has in any year not been allowed to any worker by his employer as paid sick leave may be claimed by the worker and, subject to the conditions hereinbefore prescribed, shall be allowed by his employer in any subsequent year without diminution of the sick leave prescribed in respect of that year. Provided that sick leave which accumulates pursuant to this subclause shall be available to the worker for a period of two (2) years but no longer from the end of the year in which it accrues.

## 12.—Holidays and Annual Leave.

- (a) Subject to subclause (b) hereof, the following days or the days observed in lieu thereof shall be allowed as holidays without deduction of pay, namely:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, State Foundation Day, Christmas Day and Boxing Day.
- (b) All work performed on any of the foregoing days shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) On any public holiday not prescribed as a holiday under this Agreement, the employer's establishment or place of business may be closed, in which case a worker need not present himself for duty and payment may be deducted, but if work be done ordinary rates of pay shall apply.
- (d) Except as hereinafter provided, a period of two consecutive weeks' leave with payment of ordinary wages as prescribed shall be allowed annually to a worker by his employer after a period of 12 months' continuous service with such employer.

- (e) If any prescribed holiday falls within a worker's period of annual leave and is observed on a day which in the case of that worker would have been an ordinary working day, there shall be added to that period one day being an ordinary working day for each such holiday observed as aforesaid.
- (f) If after one month's continuous service in any qualifying twelve-monthly period a worker lawfully leaves his employment, or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the worker, the worker shall be paid one-sixth of a week's pay at his ordinary rate of wage in respect of each completed month of continuous service.
- (g) Any time in respect of which a worker is absent from work, except time for which he is entitled to claim sick pay, or time spent on holidays or annual leave as prescribed by this Agreement, shall not count for the purpose of determining his right to annual leave.
- (h) In the event of a worker being employed by an employer for portion only of a year, he shall only be entitled, subject to subclause (f) of this clause, to such leave on full pay as is proportionate to his length of service during that period with such employer, and if such leave is not equal to the leave given to the other workers, he shall not be entitled to work or pay whilst the other workers of such employer are on leave on full pay.
- (i) A worker who is dismissed for misconduct or who illegally severs his contract of service shall not be entitled to the benefit of the provisions of this clause.

#### 13.—Accommodation.

- (a) When practicable, accommodation shall be provided for men to change their clothing, five minutes shall be allowed the men to clean their hands at each break, and suitable material provided for the purpose. Hot water shall be provided at all meal times when practicable.
- (b) Men engaged in cleaning out fuel oil tanks or bilges, when the work is of an exceptionally dirty nature, shall be allowed a reasonable time to cleanse themselves, and shall be provided with hot water when practicable for that purpose.

## 14.—Lighting and Ventilation.

The employer shall provide an efficient system of lighting and ventilation on all jobs, where necessary.

All manhole doors to be removed from tanks and boilers while men are working in them.

## 15.—Ships' Crews.

Bona fide members of the ship's crew, whether on articles or not, shall not be debarred from carrying out any duties in connection with cleaning, chipping, painting, or scraping of any vessel above light float line that they have hitherto been accustomed to perform.

## 16.—Board of Reference.

The Court may appoint for the purposes of the Agreement, a Board or Boards of Reference. Each Board shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties.

There are assigned to each such Board, in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the Agreement, the functions of—

- (i) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise between the parties from time to time, except such as involve interpretations of the provisions of the Agreement or any of them;
- (ii) deciding any other matter that the Court may refer to such Board from time to time.

An appeal shall lie from any decision of such Board in the manner and subject to the conditions prescribed in the regulations to the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1950, which for this purpose are embodied in this Agreement.

#### 17.—Preference.

Preference of employment shall be given to members of the Australian Workers' Union, Westralian Branch, Industrial Union of Workers, available, willing and qualified to perform the work to be done. Provided that any worker or applicant for employment who is not a member of the said Union shall within fourteen (14) days of commencing employment under this Agreement makes and completes an application for membership of the said Union, and provided that any worker who is a financial member of another recognised industrial union shall, upon the expiration of his current membership with such other union, within 14 days of such expiry, make and complete an application for membership with the said Union.

## 18.—Protective Clothing and Equipment.

- (a) Goggles and medical pads for use as respirators, and gloves, shall be supplied where the nature of the employment is such as to warrant their respective use.
- (b) All protective clothing and equipment shall at all times remain the property of the employer and shall be returned at the finish of each job or on the occasion of a fresh issue being made.

## 19.—Long Service Leave.

## (a) Right to Leave.

A worker shall as herein provided be entitled to leave with pay in respect of long service.

#### (b) Long Service.

- (1) The long service which shall entitle a worker to such leave shall, subject as herein provided, be continuous service with one and the same employer.
- (2) Such service shall include service prior to the coming into operation hereof if it continued until such time but only to the extent of the last 20 completed years of continuous service.
- (3) (i) Where a business has, whether before or after the coming into operation hereof, been transmitted from an employer (herein called "the transmittor") to another employer (herein called "the transmittee") and a worker who at the time of such transmission was an employee of the transmittor in that business becomes an employee of the transmittee—the period of the continuous service which the worker has had with the transmittor (including any such service with any prior transmittor) shall be deemed to be service of the worker with the transmittee.
- (ii) In this subclause, "transmission" includes transfer, conveyance, assignment or succession, whether voluntary or by agreement or by operation of law, and "transmitted" has a corresponding meaning.
  - (4) Such service shall include—
    - (a) any period of absence from duty on any annual leave or long service leave;
    - (b) any period of absence from duty necessitated by sickness of or injury to the worker but only to the extent of 15 working days in any year of his employment;
    - (c) any period following any termination of the employment by the employer if such termination has been made merely with the intention of avoiding obligations hereunder in respect of long service leave or obligations under any award in respect of annual leave;
    - (d) any period during which the service of the worker was or is interrupted by service—
      - (i) as a member of the Naval, Military or Air Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia other than as a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces in Japan and other than as a member of the Permanent Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia except in the circumstances referred to in section 31 (2) of the Defence Act, 1903-1956, and except in Korea or Malaya after 26th June, 1950;

- (ii) as a member of the Civil Construction Corps established under the National Security Act, 1939-1946;
- (iii) in any of the armed forces under the National Service Act, 1951 (as amended):

Provided that the worker, as soon as reasonably practicable on the completion of any such service resumed or resumes employment with the employer by whom he was employed immediately before the commencement of such service.

- (5) Service shall be deemed to be continuous notwithstanding—  $\,$ 
  - (a) the transmission of a business as referred to in paragraph (3) hereof;
  - (b) any interruption of a class referred to in paragraph (4) hereof, irrespective of the duration thereof;
  - (c) any absence from duty authorised by the employer;
  - (d) any standing down of a worker in accordance with the provisions of an award, industrial agreement, order or determination, under either Commonwealth or State law:
  - (e) any absence from duty arising directly or indirectly from an industrial dispute, if the worker returns to work in accordance with the terms of settlement of the dispute;
  - (f) any termination of employment by the employer on any ground other than slackness of trade, if the worker be re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding two months from the date of such termination;
  - (g) any termination of the employment by the employer on the ground of slackness of trade, if the worker is re-employed by the same employer within a period not exceeding six months from the date of such termination;
  - (h) any reasonable absence of the worker on legitimate union business in respect of which he has requested and been refused leave:
  - (i) any absence from duty after the coming into operation of this clause by reason of any cause not specified in this clause unless the employer during the absence or within 14 days of the termination of the absence notifies the worker in writing that such absence will be regarded as having broken the continuity of service which notice may be given by delivery to the worker personally or by posting it by registered mail to his last recorded address, in which case it shall be deemed to have reached him in due course of post.

Provided that the period of any absence from duty or the period of any interruption referred to in placita (c) to (i) inclusive of this paragraph shall not (except as set out in paragraph (4) hereof) count as service.

## (c) Period of Leave.

- (1) The leave to which a worker shall be entitled or deemed to be entitled shall be as provided in this subclause.
- (2) Where a worker has completed at least 20 years' service the amount of leave shall be—
  - (a) in respect of 20 years' service completed— 13 weeks' leave;
  - (b) in respect of each 10 years' service completed after such 20 years—six and a half weeks' leave.
- (3) Where a worker has completed at least 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
  - (a) by his death;
- (b) in any circumstances otherwise than by the employer for serious misconduct, the amount of leave shall be—
  - (i) if such termination takes place before the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof such

- proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service bears to 20 years;
- (ii) if such termination takes place after the worker has become entitled to leave under placitum (a) of paragraph (2) hereof, the leave due under such placitum and in addition such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of such service after the accrual of such entitlement bears to 20 years.
- (4) Where a worker has completed at least 10 years' service but less than 15 years' service since its commencement and his employment is terminated—
  - (i) by his death; or
  - (ii) by the employer for any reason other than serious misconduct; or
  - (iii) by the worker on account of sickness of or injury to the worker or domestic or other pressing necessity where such sickness or injury or necessity is of such a nature as to justify or in the event of a dispute is, in the opinion of the Special Board of Reference, of such a nature as to justify such termination;

the amount of the leave shall be such proportion of 13 weeks' leave as the number of completed years of service bears to 20 years.

(5) In the cases to which paragraphs (3) and (4) hereof apply, the worker shall be deemed to have been entitled to and to have commenced leave immediately prior to such termination.

## (d) Payment for Period of Leave.

- (1) A worker shall, subject to paragraph (3) hereof, be entitled to be paid for each week of leave to which he has become entitled or is deemed to have become entitled, the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date he commences such leave.
- (2) Such ordinary time rate of pay shall be the rate applicable to him for the standard weekly hours which are prescribed by this Award (or Agreement), but in the case of casuals and part-time workers shall be the ordinary time rate for the number of hours usually worked up to but not exceeding the prescribed standard.
- (3) Where by agreement between the employer and the worker the commencement of the leave to which the worker is entitled or any portion thereof is postponed to meet the convenience of the worker, the rate of payment for such leave shall be at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable to him at the date of accrual or, if so agreed, at the ordinary time rate of pay applicable at the date he commences such leave.
  - (4) The ordinary time rate of pay-
    - (a) shall include any deductions from wages for board and/or lodging or the like which is not provided and taken during the period of leave;
    - (b) shall not include shift premiums, overtime, penalty rates, commissions, bonuses, allowances, or the like.
- (5) In the case of workers employed on piece or bonus work or any other system of payment by results, payment shall be at ordinary time rates.

## (e) Taking Leave.

- (1) In a case to which paragraph (2) of subclause (c) applies—
  - (a) leave shall be granted and taken as soon as reasonably practicable after the right thereto accrues due or at such time or times as may be agreed between the employer and the worker, or in the absence of such agreement, at such time or times as may be determined by the Special Board of Reference, having regard to the needs of the employer's establishment and the worker's circumstances;
  - (b) except where the time for taking leave is agreed to by the employer and the worker or determined by the Special Board of Reference, the employer shall give to a worker at least one month's notice of the date from which his leave is to be taken;

- (c) leave may be granted and taken in one continuous period or, if the employer and the worker so agree, in not more than three separate periods in respect of the first 13 weeks' entitlement, and in not more than two separate periods in respect of any subsequent period of entitlement;
- (d) any leave shall be inclusive of any public holidays specified in this Award (or Agreement) occurring during the period when the leave is taken, but shall not be inclusive of any annual leave;
- (e) payment shall be made in one of the following ways:
  - (i) in full before the worker goes on leave:
  - (ii) at the same time as his wages would have been paid to him if the worker had remained at work, in which case payment shall, if the worker in writing so requires, be made by cheque posted to an address specified by the worker; or
  - (iii) in any other way agreed between the employer and the worker;
- (f) no worker shall, during any period when he is on leave, engage in any employment for hire or reward in substitution for the employment from which he is on leave, and if a worker breaches this provision he shall thereupon forfeit his right to leave hereunder in respect of the unexpired period of leave upon which he has entered, and the employer shall be entitled to withhold any further payment in respect of the period and to reclaim any payments already made on account of such period of leave.
- (2) In a case to which paragraph (3) or paragraph (4) of subclause (c) applies and in any case in which the employment of the worker who has become entitled to leave hereunder is terminated before such leave is taken or fully taken the employer shall, upon termination of his employment otherwise than by death, pay to the worker, and upon termination of employment by death pay to the personal representative of the worker upon request by the personal representative a sum equivalent to the amount which would have been payable in respect of the period of leave to which he is entitled or deemed to have been entitled and which would have been taken but for such termination. Such payment shall be deemed to have satisfied the obligation of the employer in respect of leave hereunder.

## (f) Granting Leave in Advance and Benefits to be Brought into Account.

- (1) Any employer may by agreement with a worker allow leave to such a worker before the right thereto has accrued due, but where leave is taken in such a case the worker shall not become entitled to any further leave hereunder in respect of any period until after the expiration of the period in respect of which such leave had been taken before it accrued due.
- (2) Where leave has been granted to a worker pursuant to the preceding paragraph before the right thereto has accrued due, and the employment subsequently is terminated, the employer may deduct from whatever remuneration is payable upon the termination of the employment a proportionate amount on the basis of 13 weeks for 20 years' service in respect of any period for which the worker has been granted long service leave to which he was not at the date of termination of his employment or prior thereto entitled.
- (3) Any leave in the nature of long service leave or payment in lieu thereof under a State law or a long service leave scheme not under the provisions hereof granted to a worker by his employer in respect of any period of service with the employer, shall be taken into account whether the same is granted before or after the coming into operation hereof and shall be deemed to have been leave taken and granted hereunder in the case of leave with pay to the extent of the period of such leave and in the case of payment in lieu

thereof to the extent of a period of leave with pay equivalent to the amount of the payment and to be satisfaction to the extent thereof of the entitlement of the worker hereunder.

(4) An employer shall be entitled to off-set any payment in respect of leave hereunder against any payment by him to any long service leave scheme, superannuation scheme, pension scheme, retiring allowance scheme, provident fund, or the like or under any combination thereof operative at the first day of April, 1958.

## (g) Records to be Kept.

- (1) Each employer shall during the employment and for a period of 12 months thereafter, or, in the case of termination by death of the worker, a period of three years thereafter, keep a record from which can be readily ascertained the name of each worker and his occupation, the date of the commencement of his employment and his entitlement to long service leave, and any leave which may have been granted to him or in respect of which payment may have been made hereunder.
- (2) Such record shall be open for inspection in the manner and circumstances prescribed by this Award (or Agreement) with respect to the time and wages record.

#### (h) Special Board of Reference.

- (1) There shall be constituted a Special Board of Reference for the purpose hereof to which all disputes and matters arising hereunder shall be referred and the Board shall determine all such disputes and matters.
- (2) There shall be assigned to such Board the functions of—
  - (a) the settlement of disputes on any matters arising hereunder;
  - (b) the determination of such matters as are specifically assigned to it hereunder.
- (3) The Board of Reference shall consist of one representative or substitute therefor nominated from time to time by the Western Australian Employers' Federation (Incorporated), and one representative or substitute nominated from time to time by the West Australian Trade Unions Industrial Council (A.L.P.), together with a chairman to be mutually agreed upon by the organisations named in this paragraph.

## (i) State Law.

- (1) The provisions of any State law to the extent to which they have before the coming into operation hereof conferred an accrued right on a worker to be granted a period of long service leave in respect of a completed period of 20 or more years' service or employment or an accrued right on a worker or his personal representative to payment in respect of long service leave, shall not be affected hereby and shall not be deemed to be inconsistent with the provisions hereof.
- (2) The entitlement of any such worker to leave in respect of a period of service with the employer completed after the period in respect of which the long service leave referred to in paragraph (1) hereof accrued due shall be in accordance herewith
- (3) Subject to paragraphs (1) and (2) hereof, the entitlement to leave hereunder shall be in substitution for and satisfaction of any long service leave to which the worker may be entitled in respect of employment of the worker by the employer.
- (4) An employer who under any State law with regard to long service leave is exempted from the provisions of that law as at the 1st day of April, 1958, shall in respect of the workers covered by such exemption be exempt from the provisions hereof.

## (j) Exemptions.

The Special Board of Reference may, subject to such conditions as it thinks fit, exempt any employer from the provisions hereof in respect of its employees where there is an existing or prospective long service leave scheme which, in its opinion is, viewed as a whole, more favourable for the whole of the employees of that employer than the provisions hereof.

## (k) Liberty to Apply.

Liberty is granted to any party to this Award to apply to the Court at any time for an appropriate variation of this clause if any of the terms and conditions operating under the code of long service leave being negotiated between the Australian Council of Trade Unions and Federal Employers' Organisations is varied in any way.

## INDUSTRIAL AGREEMENT.

- 6. In advent of the employee being employed under clause (5) for less than seven days, he shall be entitled to proportionate payment in addition to his ordinary wage.

## BETTING CONTROL ACT, 1954-1957.

Transfer of Registration
