1. These by-laws may be cited as the Fremantle Hospital By-laws.
2. In these by-laws, unless the context otherwise requires—
“the Board” means the Fremantle Hospital Board constituted under the Hospitals Act, 1927, as amended.
3. The rules and regulations and by-laws numbered 68 to 80, both inclusive, adopted by the Board of Management of the Fremantle Public Hospital, as published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st March, 1929, and as amended from time to time thereafter are revoked and a new by-law is inserted as follows:—
68. The Board may from time to time, in addition to the duties, if any, prescribed by by-law, assign to all or any members of the Honorary Medical Staff, such duties, and responsibilities as it considers necessary or expedient.

The above by-laws were duly passed by the Fremantle Hospital Board at a meeting of the Board held on the 16th day of December, 1957.

HEALTH ACT, 1911-1956.

Serpentine Jarrahdale Road Board.

P.H.D. 635/47, Ex. Co. No. 921.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1957, a local authority may make or adopt by-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore, the Serpentine-Jarrahdale Road Board, being a local authority within the meaning of the Act, and having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series “A” as published in the *Government Gazette* on 4th December, 1944, doth hereby amend the said adopted by-laws as follows:—

After Part IX, insert a new Part to be known as Part X as follows:—

Part X.—Storage of Inflammable Materials.

1. In these by-laws—
“firebreak” means a strip of ploughed or cleared land, which is devoid of all “bush” as defined in the Bush Fires Act, 1954, and is so maintained;
“inflammable liquid” means liquid petroleum, and any other oil, liquid, spirit or any similar liquid spirit, which will flash or emit an inflammable vapour at or below a temperature of 150 degrees Fahrenheit, Abel Close Test;
“prescribed area” means and includes the townsites of Mundijong, Serpentine, Jarrahdale and Jarrahdale prescribed area as constituted under the Land Act, 1933.

2. These by-laws shall operate and have effect on and after the 1st day of October, 1958.

3. No person shall store on any premises within the prescribed area more than 60 (sixty) gallons of inflammable liquid, except under the following conditions:—

- (a) It shall be stored at least 20 feet from any boundary fence of the said lot.
- (b) a firebreak of at least 20 feet shall be provided immediately around the storage area.
- (c) Two 2-gallon capacity foam fire extinguishers shall be kept at the storage area and maintained ready for immediate use.
- (d) Two signs bearing the wording specified hereunder shall be conspicuously displayed at the storage area, clearly marked in red letters not less than six (6) inches in height:—

Danger Inflammable Liquids
No Smoking, No Matches, No Naked Lights.

WHEREAS under the provisions of the Health Act, 1911-1957, a local authority may make or adopt by-laws and may alter, amend or repeal any by-laws so made or adopted: Now, therefore, the Mosman Park Road Board, being a local authority within the meaning of the Act and having adopted the Model By-laws described as Series "A" as reprinted pursuant to the Reprinting of Regulations Act, 1954, in the *Government Gazette* on the 9th August, 1956, doth hereby resolve and determine that the said adopted by-laws shall be amended as follows:—

Part 1.—General Sanitary Provisions.

By adding after subparagraph (2) of by-law 4A, a new subparagraph to be known as subparagraph (3) and to read as follows:—

(3) At least one sink which shall be installed in the kitchen or scullery or some other place approved by the local authority. Such sink shall be properly supported so that the height of the top of the front edge of the sink shall be between 34 and 39 inches above floor level, and shall be provided with draining board or boards integral with or affixed thereto; such draining boards shall have an impervious upper surface and shall be so constructed and installed that water falling thereon shall drain into the sink.

11. The hours for burial shall be between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m.
