WHEREAS by section 11 of the Native Welfare Act, 1905-1954 (Reprinted), it is provided that the Governor is empowered by Proclamation to alter the boundaries of a Reserve for Natives; and whereas it is deemed desirable to alter the boundaries of reserve number 17614 in Central Australia: Now, therefore I, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby amend the boundaries of the said reserve as more particularly described in the Schedule hereto.

Schedule.

Of the amendment of reserve No. 17614 (Natives) to exclude the area now designated as Milyuga Location 1 (Meteorological Station Site), and of its area being reduced to about 15,010,669 acres accordingly.

AT a meeting of the Executive Council, held in the Executive Council Chamber, at Perth, on the 14th day of May, 1958, the following Order in Council was authorised to be issued:—

Companies Act, 1943-1954.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS it is enacted, *inter alia*, by subsection (1) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1954, that no company shall be registered by a name which is identical with that by which a firm is registered and is carrying on business under the Business Names Act, 1942-1946, or, in the opinion of the Registrar of Companies, so nearly resembles that name as to be calculated to deceive; and whereas it is provided in paragraph (a) of the proviso to subsection (7) of that section that where, in the opinion of the Governor (on being satisfied that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to require any company formed or incorporated outside Western Australia to which Part XI of the Act applies to change its name, style, title or designation before complying with the requirements of such Part) it is in the circumstances of the particular case expedient, the Governor may, authorise the Registrar to accept for filing the documents and particulars specified in paragraphs (a) to (f) inclusive of subsection (1) of section 329 of the Act; and whereas registration under Part XI of the Act of a company incorporated in the State of New South Wales by the name of Sterling Industries Pty. Ltd. was refused by the Registrar on the ground that, in his opinion that name so nearly resembles the name by which a firm (namely, The Sterling Manufacturing Co.) is already registered and carrying on business under the Business Names Act, 1942-1946, as to be calculated to deceive; and whereas His Excellency the Governor is satisfied that it would be inequitable or unreasonable to require Sterling Industries Pty. Ltd. to change its name before complying with the requirements of Part XI of the Act and is of the opinion that the circumstances of the case render it expedient: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by paragraph (a) of the proviso to subsection (7) of section 28 of the Companies Act, 1943-1954, doth

hereby authorise the Registrar of Companies to accept for filing from Sterling Industries Pty. Ltd. the documents and particulars specified in paragraphs (a) to (f) inclusive of subsection (1) of section 329 of the Act.

Notice Requiring Persons to Submit to X-ray Examination.

PURSUANT to the provisions of the abovementioned section, persons who are included in the class specified hereunder, and to whom the provisions of that section apply, are required to undergo x-ray examination for tuberculosis at the time and place specified.

Class.

Persons 16 years of age and over who are residents of the municipal district of the City of Perth.

Time.

Within the period 20th June, 1958, to 14th November, 1958, inclusive.

Place.

Persons may report to the Perth Chest Clinic, 17 Murray Street, Perth, or the Fremantle Chest Clinic, 91 High Street, Fremantle, or at any of the temporary clinics to be established at the places mentioned hereunder, during the periods

shown. As far as possible, persons should attend the clinic operating in the ward within which they reside. Alphabetical call-up lists will be published to assist in avoidance of delay at the temporary clinics.
