Municipality of Geraldton.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

P.T.O. 379.

HIS Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, hereby makes the following Order under section 49 of the Traffic Act, 1919-1957, namely that the Municipality of Geraldton is hereby empowered to make by-laws in pursuance of:—

- (1) Clause (y) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, providing for the placing, erection or installation on roads or footpaths of traffic signs, lights and directions for the control and direction of traffic, both vehicular and pedestrian and including the driving of animals, for the marking on roads or footpaths of signs for the control and direction of the traffic and for the regulation and prohibition of the traffic in relation to the signs, lights and directions;
- (2) Clauses (zl) and (zm) of paragraph (i) of subsection (1) of section 47 of the said Act, prohibiting or restricting the parking of vehicles, or vehicles of a specified class or classes in all roads or in specified roads, or specified parts of roads, at all times or at specified times, and prescribing a penalty for any breach thereof.

Subject to the condition that no such by-law shall be valid and effectual unless it has, prior to notification of its making being published in the *Government Gazette*, been submitted to and approved by the Governor.

Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1956.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

M.W.S. 422/58.

WHEREAS by the Metropolitan Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage Act, 1909-1956, it is provided that, subject to the provisions of the Act, the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage shall, with the approval of the Governor, have power to construct, provide and extend Water Works, Sewerage Works and Metropolitan Main Drainage Works; and whereas the preliminary requirements of the said Act have been complied with, and plans, sections and estimates in respect of the works hereinafter mentioned have been submitted to and approved by the Governor in Council: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, does hereby empower the Minister of Water Supply, Sewerage and Drainage to undertake the construction of the following works under the said Act, namely:—

Metropolitan Main Drainage.
Bayswater-Morley Park Area.
Bayswater Metropolitan Main Drain.
Section 5.

Construction of a pipe and open channel drain from Bedford to Bayswater, a distance of approximately 7,800 feet, to provide a drainage outlet for an area in Morley Park and Yokine, which area is at present draining towards the commonly known Brown's Lake.

The above works, together with all other apparatus necessary for the undertaking, as shown on Plan M.W.S.S. & D.D., W.A., No. 8218.

This Order in Council shall take effect from the 6th day of June, 1958.

### Country Areas Water Supply Act, 1947-1954. ORDER IN COUNCIL.

Between Merchant Service Guild of Australia, W.A. Section, Industrial Union of Workers, Fremantle, Applicant, and BP (Kwinana) Proprietary Limited, Respondent.

WHEREAS an industrial dispute existed between the abovenamed parties, and whereas the said dispute was referred into Court for the purpose of hearing and determination, and whereas the said reference of industrial dispute was remitted by the Court to the Conciliation Commissioner, and whereas the parties subsequently met and conferred and have arrived at agreement on all matters in difference, and whereas the parties have this day appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by appeared before the Conciliation Commissioner by their respective representatives and requested the Conciliation Commissioner to make the said Agreement an Award of the Court: Now, therefore, the Conciliation Commissioner, pursuant to section 65 of the Industrial Arbitration Act, 1912-1952, and all other powers therein enabling him, hereby declares the memorandum hereunder written to have the same effect as and be deemed an Award of the Court.

#### 3.—Term.

The term of this Award shall be for a period of three years as from the beginning of the first pay period commencing after the date hereof.

#### 4.—Area and Scope.

'This Award shall operate within the limits of the Port of Fremantle and shall apply to workers engaged in the classification set out in clause 9 of this Award in the employ of the respondent.

#### 5.—Contract of Service.

Except in the case of casual workers who may be put off or leave at any time, the contract of service shall be on a fortnightly basis and shall be terminable by two (2) weeks' notice given on either side on any day. If the employer or a worker fails to give the required notice, two (2)

weeks' wages shall be paid or forfeited. that for the first month of employment the hiring shall be from day to day and during this period a day's notice or a day's pay shall be sufficient.

This clause does not affect the right to dismiss for misconduct.

### 6.-Hours of Duty.

#### (a) Day Workers.

The ordinary hours of work shall be forty (40) per week, to be worked between Monday to Friday inclusive, in shifts of eight (8) consecutive hours between 6 a.m. and 6 p.m.

#### (b) Shift Workers.

The ordinary hours of work shall be forty (40) per week, to be worked on any five (5) days of the week, in shifts of eight (8) hours per day.

#### 7.—Overtime.

### (a) Day Workers.

- (i) Except as hereinafter provided, all work performed in excess of the ordinary hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (ii) Except as hereinafter mentioned, work performed on Sundays or the holidays prescribed in clause 10 (a) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.

# (b) Shift Workers.

- (i) All work performed in excess of the ordinary hours shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half for the first four (4) hours and double time thereafter.
- (ii) Subject to the provisions of subclause (iii) hereof, all work performed on any of the days mentioned in subclause (a) of clause 10 shall be paid for at the rate of time and one-half.
- (iii) All work performed on any of the days mentioned in clause 10 (a) or on Sundays, in excess of the hours prescribed in clause 6 (b) shall be paid for at the rate of double time.
- (c) Overtime on shift work shall be based on the rate payable for shift work in accordance with clause 9 (c). This shall not apply to the week-end penalty rates prescribed in clause 8.
- (d) In the calculation of overtime, each day
- shall stand alone.

  (e) (i) When a worker is recalled to work after leaving the job, he shall be paid for at least three (3) hours at overtime rates.
- (ii) When a worker is required to hold himself in readiness for a call to work after ordinary hours, he shall be paid at ordinary rates for the time he so holds himself in readiness.
- (f) These overtime rates shall not apply to excess time worked due to private arrangement between the workers themselves or owing to a relieving man failing to come on duty at the proper time or where such time is worked to effect the periodical rotation of shifts. - (5) Diesel Engine Ships.—In diesel engine ships, for work below the floor plates, elevenpence (11d.) per hour extra shall be paid. Extra payment in respect of diesel engine ships shall be in lieu of and not in addition to dirt money and confined space money.
- (6) Hot Places.—Workers required to work in a boiler which has not been cooled down, shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for each hour so worked, in addition to any dirt and confined space money payable. Any broken time of less than one (1) hour shall be paid for as one (1) hour.
- (7) Protective Equipment.—(a) The employer shall have available a sufficient supply of protective equipment (as, for example, hand screens, goggles, glasses, gloves, aprons, leggings and gum boots) for use by his workers when engaged on work for which some protective equipment is reasonably necessary. It shall be a defence to an employer charged with a breach of this subclause if he proves that he was unable to obtain either the item of equipment the subject of the charge or a suitable substitute.
