Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1951.

ORDER IN COUNCIL.

C.S.D. 179/52.

WHEREAS it is enacted by section 5 of the Fire Brigades Act, 1942-1951, that the municipal and road districts mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Act are, for the purposes of the Act, constituted fire districts, by the names as in the said Schedule stated, provided that the Governor may, by Order in Council, excise from any fire district any specified portion thereof, and thereupon such portion shall, for the purposes of the Act, be no longer included in or be part of such district; and whereas by an Order in Council made by the Governor and published in the Government Gazette on the 5th September, 1952, the Bunbury Fire District was reconstituted by including in that district as part thereof portion of an area which had been annexed to the Municipality of Bunbury; and whereas it is now deemed advisable and expedient to enlarge the Bunbury Fire District by including a further portion of the area so annexed: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting with the advice and consent of the Executive Council and in exercise of the powers conferred by the Act, doth hereby—

- (a) revoke the Order in Council published in the Government Gazette on the 5th September. 1952:
- (b) excise from the Bunbury Fire District the portion described in the Schedule to this Order in Council.

Preston River; thence generally southerly and south-easterly upwards along that bank to a point situate in prolongation north-easterly of the south-eastern side of Wilson Road (road No. 7462); thence south-westerly to and along that side and generally southerly along the eastern side of that road and onwards to the northern boundary of Wellington Location 337; thence west-south-westerly to the intersection of a prolongation easterly of the southern side of Brittain Road and a prolongation southerly of the western boundary of reserve 10056; thence westerly to and along the southern side of Brittain Road and onwards to the western side of Brittain Road and onwards to the western side of Bussell Highway; thence generally north-westerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern side of Adam Street; thence westerly to and along that side to the eastern side of Minninup Road; thence northerly along that side to a point situate in prolongation easterly of the southern side of Hastie Street; thence westerly to and along that side to an eastern boundary of reserve 670; thence north-north-easterly along that boundary to the southern boundary of that location 4167 (reserve 19633); thence west-north-westerly along the southern boundary of that location and onwards to the low water mark of the Indian Ocean; and thence generally north-easterly along that low water mark and the low water mark of Koombana Bay aforesaid to the starting point. (Public Plans Bunbury Sheets 1, 2, 3 and 4, Bunbury Central.)

- (b) No employee shall be compelled to break shift except for meals, and no shift shall exceed five hours without a break for meals.
- (c) Where an employee is required to work during his usual meal hour, he shall be paid one-half extra at the hourly rate of his weekly wage for the time so worked, and be allowed his usual meal period as soon as it can be arranged, but no extra payment shall be made for periods worked of less than 15 minutes.
- (d) The lunch period of any employee shall be between the hours of noon and 2 p.m.

8.—Roster of Hours.

(a) A roster of daily and weekly hours of shift is to be permanently displayed in the various sections of the factory. (b) Work performed outside rostered hours shall be paid for at overtime rates in accordance with clause 9.

9.—Overtime.

- (a) Overtime shall be paid at the rate of time and a half for the first three hours and double time thereafter.
- (b) An employee starting before his usual rostered shift shall be paid time and a half.
 - (c) Each day shall stand by itself.
- (d) Work done on Saturday afternoon or Sunday and all holidays shall be paid for at double time rates
- (e) Any employees required to work overtime for more than one hour shall be entitled to three shillings and sixpence (3s. 6d.) tea money if not notified twenty-four (24) hours prior to such overtime being worked.
- (f) The employer shall not require or permit an employee to work overtime in a department using power driven machinery unless he works in company with at least one other person in the same department, not necessarily a worker covered by this Agreement.

10.—Public Holidays.

Public holidays shall be in accordance with those granted by the State Government to the employees of the Government Printing Office and observed over a period of years.

11.—Annual Leave.

Each employee shall be entitled to two working weeks' annual leave each year on full pay, or should the period of continuous employment be less than one year, the worker shall be paid holiday pay proportionate as his length of service is to the full year's employment.

12.-Long Service Leave.

Long service leave shall be granted to all employees in accordance with the conditions applying from time to time to full time Government wages employees generally.

13.—Sick Pay.

Sick pay shall be paid in accordance with the conditions granted to the employees of the Government Printing Office by the State Government on the 14th April, 1927, and at present existing in the Government Printing Office. Provided no worker shall be entitled to the benefits of this clause unless he produces proof satisfactory to the Government Printer of sickness, but the Government Printer shall not be entitled to a medical certificate unless the absence is for three days or more.

14.—Record Book.

The employer shall keep at his office a record of-

- (a) The names of all workers employed by him and to whom this Agreement applies, and
- (b) The class of work performed, the hours worked (including overtime) and the wages paid to each such worker. On notifying the officer in charge, the secretary of the Union may inspect such record at any time during the ordinary business hours, and he shall have power to enter and inspect during working hours any part of the printing factory and to interview all employees in regard to rates and conditions of employment: Provided, however, he shall not hamper or otherwise hinder the workers in the carrying out of their work. The officer in charge shall determine whether workers are being hampered or hindered in their work.

15.—Miscellaneous Provisions.

(a) The employer shall provide suitable washing facilities for his workers and a suitable place for each worker to keep clothes. Where the ficors are composed of materials known as granolithic or

- concrete, or combinations of cement, stone or asphalt, employers shall provide suitable materials upon which the workers may stand whilst at work
- (b) A tradesman, who in addition to his employment as such, is also required to do welding, shall be entitled to receive one shilling and fourpence (1s. 4d.) per day in addition to his ordinary rate of pay whilst so engaged.
- (c) A copy of this Agreement shall be placed in a convenient place in each workroom.

16.-No Reduction.

It is understood and agreed by both parties to this Agreement that nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed so as to destroy or undermine any existing condition or privilege at present existing in the Government Printing Office, neither shall it be a medium of reducing any employee below the rate he is at present receiving or be the means of increasing his hours.

Any condition or circumstance arising that is not covered by this Agreement shall be dealt with by the Government Printer and the Union, and failing agreement shall be referred to a Board of Reference for decision.

17.—Board of Reference.

For the purpose of this Agreement a Board of Reference is hereby appointed which shall consist of a chairman and two other representatives, one to be nominated by each of the parties. The said Board shall have assigned to it in the event of no agreement being arrived at between the parties to the dispute, the functions of—

- (a) adjusting any matters of difference which may arise from time to time, except such as involve interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement or any of them;
- (b) classing and fixing wage rates and conditions of any occupation or calling not specifically mentioned in this Agreement;
- (c) dealing with any other matter which the Court may refer to the Board from time to time.

18.—Pay Day.

Pay day shall be Friday of each week, and on that day employees covered by this Agreement shall be paid for all time worked up to the finishing time of the usual shift on the preceding Wednesday. This clause overrides any privilege, etc., claimed under clause 16.

19.—Overalls.

Overalls to be provided where considered necessary by the Government Printer.

20.—Apprentices.

Apprentices may be taken to the trades of-

- (i) Electrical fitting;
- (ii) Fitting and turning.
